Narrative

On 1/9/19 at approximately 0152 hours I was patrolling the area of E. Kennedy Blvd and I was stopped at a red traffic light at the intersection of E. Kennedy Blvd & Clifton Ave. A few moments later I noticed a black Mazda (NJ-J34KDM) approaching the intersection of E. Kennedy Blvd & Clifton Ave, the vehicle was traveling east on E. Kennedy Blvd. The vehicle went through the intersection while the traffic light was red and made a left turn onto Clifton Ave. At this time I made I right turn onto Clifton Ave and immediately activated my emergency lights to conduct a motor vehicle stop on the black Mazda that went through the red traffic light. When the vehicle came to a complete stop, I approached the vehicle from the driver's side. Once I got to the driver's window I asked the driver (Craig Deutsch) for his driving credentials and while talking to Craig, I noticed that his eyes were watery and bloodshot and odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath. Once Officer J. Ganley #362 arrived on scene as my back-up Officer, I asked Craig to exit the vehicle. Craig opened the door and he stumbled while exiting the vehicle. I told Craig to stand behind his vehicle, I asked Craig if he was drinking or doing drugs. Craig stated he drank one Yuengling beer and a shot of Jameson whisky. I told Craig to stand in front of my patrol vehicle to perform sobriety tests.

Walk and Turn:

I demonstrated the test and verbally explained the test to Craig. I advised Craig to stand with his hands by his side and to place his left foot in front of his right foot touching heel to toe and to stay in that position until I tell him to begin the test. I explained to Craig that once I tell him to begin, he needed to walk in a straight line while touching heel to toe and counting aloud each step till he reached his 9th step. Once at the 9th step he needed to take a series of small steps to turn around and to walk another 9 steps heel to toe while staying in a straight line. I asked Craig if he understood and he stated that he did.

At this time I told Craig to begin the test. Craig attempted the walk and turn test, while attempting to do so he was unable to walk in a straight line was losing his balance, did not touch heel to toe. I gave Craig another opportunity to complete the test. Craig attempted to perform the walk and turn test, Craig was again unable to complete the test correctly as he failed to walk in a straight line and kept losing his balance as he attempted to walk. I advised Craig to stand in front of my patrol vehicle.

One-Leg Stand:

I demonstrated the test and verbally explained the test to Craig. I advised Craig to stand with his feet together and his hands by his side and to not begin the test until I tell him to start. I told Craig that with the foot of his choosing to lift his foot approximately six inches off the ground while pointing his toes up and counting aloud each second until I tell him to stop. I asked Craig if he understood and he stated that he understood. Craig began the test, he failed to raise his foot off the ground during his first attempt. I told Craig again he could do with whatever leg he chooses. Craig attempted the test and when he raised his leg off the ground he kept losing his balance and putting his foot down. Craig attempted the test a third time and during the last attempt, Craig lost his balance almost causing him to fall but I was next to him to prevent him from falling. Craig was unable to complete the test.

At this time I placed Craig under arrest for driving under the influence of alcohol. I put handcuffs on Craig and placed him in the rear of my patrol vehicle. I transported Craig to Police Headquarters. While in the booking room I started the 20 minute observation where Craig did not have any foreign objects in his mouth and he did not vomit or regurgitate. Once the 20 minutes were up, Officer W. Hunter #333 administered the Alcotest (See Officer Hunter's report for further information). Once the test was completed Officer Hunter advised me that Craig's blood alcohol concentration was a 0.23%. Craig was placed in a holding cell as he waited for a responsible party to pick him up per the Potential Liability warning (NJSA 39:4-50.22).

A Caitlyn Deutsch came into Headquarters and took responsibility of Craig as she signed the Potential Liability warning form. Craig was released to Caitlyn. Craig was issued the following traffic summonses: Driving while intoxicated, failure to observe signal (red light), reckless driving and careless driving.

The black Mazda (NJ-J34KDM) was impounded per John's Law by Total Auto care (Unit 20). End of report.

Supplement

On Wednesday 01/09/2019 at approximately 0152 hours, I Patrolman W. Hunter Badge #333 reported to Police Headquarters to operate and administer a chemical breath test for subject Craig A. Deutsch arrested for D.W.I. by Arresting Officer Eric S. Vega badge #348. At Police Headquarters, The subject Craig A. Deutsch underwent a twenty minute observation period prior to the chemical breath test. Craig Deutsch was advised of his Miranda Rights and asked did he understand his rights. Craig Deutsch stated that he did understand his rights. I chemical breath test operator asked the arrestee Craig Deutsch would he indulge in taking a chemical breath test. He complied with his participation. A complete function test was performed with the chemical breath test apparatus for its maximum operation. The function test was a success. Prior to the operational test, my Police radio was turned off and secured out of the operational test vicinity to ensure there would not be malfunctioning errors for the test. Inside of the testing room, there were separate mouth pieces placed stationary for individual breath samples. The test was performed with three attempts. The first test was unsuccessful with an inadequate breath sample. The final two breath samples were performed by the arrestee Craig A. Deutsch with success. The breath test samples comprised yielded a final breath test result of 0.23% BAC. Upon completion of the chemical breath testing, The breath test samples were relayed to Police Dispatch for calculation for State Police record. Custody of Craig Deutsch was relinquished from myself Patrolman W. Hunter badge #333, the administering Chemical Breath Test Operator to Arresting Officer Eric S. Vega badge #348 for further processing for Craig Deutsch's traffic infraction.

Narrative

On January 12, 2018 at approximately 02:05 hours I, Ptl. Rusk #388 operating Lakewood Police vehicle 3384 was located at Oak Street and New Hampshire Avenue for a road closure due to a crash that took place earlier in the evening. See Case #19-002716 for further details.

As I was at my post, with my patrol vehicles over head lights fully activated, I was closing off the South bound lanes on New Hampshire Avenue at Oak Street. I observed a Silver Nissan Altima bearing New Jersey registration ZFE-53W driving South bound on New Hampshire directly towards my patrol vehicle. I activated the audible siren on the patrol vehicle and the vehicle continued traveling in my direction. Finally, the vehicle came to a stop for a brief moment and then proceeded to speed up around my patrol vehicle into the road closure.

Ptl. Milano #381 initiated the traffic stop just South of Oak St. on New Hampshire Avenue where I took over the investigation. As I approached the drivers side and contacted the driver, later identified as Erika Swensson, I asked for her documentation. As Miss Swensson was gathering her documents, I could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from inside the vehicle. After Miss Swensson provided her documents for me I asked her where she was coming from. She stated that she got off of work at Buffalo Wild Wings and then went to Fridays for a few drinks. She then advised me that she had two shots of Jack Daniels and a tall Miller Lite beer.

Due to Miss Swensson admitting to have been drinking and the smell of the alcoholic beverage emanating from inside the vehicle, I asked her to step out of the vehicle, walk to the rear of her vehicle where I performed Standardized Field Sobriety Tests.

Firstly, I asked Miss Swensson if she has ever had any injuries to her back or either of her legs that would impact the outcome of the tests and she stated no. The first test I administered was the Walk and Turn test. I asked Miss Swensson to stand with her right foot in front of her left foot and keep her hands at her sides while I explain the instructions. I explained to walk in a straight line touching heel-to-toe counting her steps up to nine. Once at nine, turn around and walk in a straight line back touching heel-to-toe and counting to nine. I asked her if she understood the directions and she stated she did. Miss Swensson began the test. She lost her balance directly at the beginning of the test and again at the end of the first series of nine steps. She slightly stumbled turning around and had trouble maintaining her balance, stepping off the line. She also used her hands for balance throughout the test.

The next test I administered was the One Leg Stand test. I asked Miss Swensson to stand straight up with her feet together and her hands at her sides while I explained the directions. I explained to choose either foot of her choice, left or right, raise it six inches off of the ground with her toe facing the sky and count to thirty or until told to stop counting. She was also advised to keep her hands at her sides throughout the test. I asked her if she understood the directions and she stated she did. Miss Swensson started off by only raising her foot slightly off the ground. She raised it higher when again asked to do so. Throughout the test she did not look down at her toe and was using her arms for balance. She was also swaying while performing the test, however she was able to complete the test. Miss Swensson stated several times that she has bad balance. The weather conditions were also very windy which could have possibly effected the test in some way.

With Miss Swensson admitting to have been drinking, the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from inside her vehicle, failing the Walk and Turn and the difficulties with the One Leg Stand test, I placed Miss Swensson under arrest, utilizing the double lock mechanism on the handcuffs, for 39:4-50 Driving While Intoxicated. I searched the rear of my patrol vehicle yielding negative results before placing her in the vehicle. I then transported her to Lakewood Police Headquarters in vehicle 3384 for processing.

At Lakewood police headquarters Miss Swensson was very cooperative. I read her the New Jersey State Police Standard Statement which Miss Swensson agreed to provide breath samples. Once the twenty minute observation period ended, Sgt. M. Zrebiec #236 operated the Alcotest in the Lakewood Police booking room. Miss Swensson blew a 0.17% which is 0.09% higher than the legal limit. See Sgt. M. Zrebiec #236 Supplement Narrative for further.

Miss Swensson was issued summons for 39:4-50 Driving While Intoxicated, 39:4-97 Careless Driving and 39:4-97 Reckless Driving. Miss Swensson was then released to her boyfriend Anthony Quintana. The vehicle was impounded by Barina Towing as per John's Law. No further action was taken. End of report.

Supplement

On 01/12/2019 this Officer was requested to operate the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C to determine the blood alcohol content (BAC) of Erika Swensson who had been arrested by Ptlmn. Joseph Rusk III #388 for Driving while Intoxicated.

After Rusk called the Watch Commander's Office to inform me that the twenty minute observation period had passed I went to the Booking Room of the Lakewood Police Department to run the Alcotest. Rusk informed me that Swensson did not burp, regurgitate, vomit or put anything into her mouth during the observation period.

I entered Alcotest Room #2 without any portable electronic devices such as a radio, mobile phone, microphone, or watch. Before walking into the Alcotest Room I asked Swensson if she was in possession of any electronic device to which she answered that she did not, with Rusk confirming this from his search.

I then prepared the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C for operation by entering the required information pertaining to Swensson and the incident as prompted by the Alcotest. As we waited for the Alcotest to complete the opening purges I physically showed Swensson what was expected of her in giving the breath samples.

With that I read the instructions for providing a breath sample to Swensson in English. The instructions are posted in both English and Spanish on the Alcotest Room wall. Swensson indicated to me that she understood the instructions and was willing to provide the breath samples.

Upon indication that the Alcotest was ready to accept a breath sample Swensson was brought into the Alcotest Room. Swensson provided two (2) breath samples in which a new mouthpiece was utilized for each sample.

An Alcotest Influence Report Form was generated which indicated a result of 0.17% BAC. The results of the test were provided to Lakewood Police Dispatch for entry into the Alcotest Calculator with a result of "Results are within acceptable tolerance."

Both the Alcotest Influence Form and the Alcotest Calculator results were given to Ptlmn. Rusk for submission with his report.

Narrative

On 01/12/2018 at approximately 0120 hours I, Officer Ganley 362 was parked on New Hampshire Avenue just South of Oak Street with my overhead lights activated; blocking the south bound traffic due to a motor vehicle accident. (Ref: 19-002707) As I blocked both south bound lanes to divert traffic to Oak Street, I could see a vehicle travelling at a high rate of speed south bound approaching by patrol vehicle. When I realized the vehicle wasn't slowing up, I quickly put my patrol vehicle into reverse to avoid a collision. As I did this, I witnessed the vehicle in question NJ: R67HKA slam on their brakes to a point that I could hear the brakes screech. The vehicle then turned onto Oak Street to travel west.

I then immediately conducted a motor vehicle stop to check the driver of NJ: R67HKA who was later identified as Noe Hernandez. As I approached the passenger side of the vehicle to make contact with the driver, I could see Mr. Hernandez reaching around aimlessly and confused. I then tapped on the window for Mr. Hernandez to roll it down. As Mr. Hernandez rolled his passenger side window down, I could smell a strong odor of alcoholic beverages emanating from his person and the interior of the vehicle. I then asked Mr. Hernandez for his credentials which he provided me. When I realized he did not have a license included, I asked Mr. Hernandez if he had a license. As he turned to answer me unintelligibly, I could see that his eyes were blood shot and watery. Mr. Hernandez was still seated however, his upper body was swaying. I then asked Mr. Hernandez to step out of the vehicle and walk to the rear.

As I realized that Mr. Hernandez's English language was broken, I request Officer Mahecha 390 to respond so there was no confusion. While at the rear of the his vehicle, I could see that Mr. Hernandez was having trouble keeping his balance. He would sway back and forth and stumble around. At one point, he held his arms straight out for no reason. A short time later, Officer Mahecha arrived to translate field sobriety testing. I asked Mr. Hernandez if he had any leg problems and he stated that he did not. I then began testing.

The first test was the Walk and Turn Examination. I explained to Mr. Hernandez that while I explained the test, I wanted him to stand with the heel of one foot in front of the toe of his other foot. I then demonstrated to Mr. Hernandez what I was asking of him. Mr. Hernandez stated that he understood however, he did not connect heel-to-toe and swayed in his own position. I then explained that I would like Mr. Hernandez to take nine steps, heel-to-toe while counting out loud. I explained and demonstrated that at the ninth pace, I wanted Mr. Hernandez to pivot on one foot and take nine steps heel-to-toe back while counting out loud. I then told Mr. Hernandez to begin the test.

Mr. Hernandez began casually walking and did not meet his feet heel-to-toe. As he made his paces, his feet were approximately five inches from meeting heel-to-toe. He counted six paces, skipped numbers seven, eight and continued counting ten, ten and eleven. He then turned around and casually walked back and counted aloud one, two, paused counting but took several steps; then seven, eight and ended his test.

I then explained and demonstrated the second test, which was the One-Leg-Standing Examination. I explained to Mr. Hernandez that I would like him to stand straight with his feet together and his hands at his sides. I explained and demonstrated to Mr. Hernandez that with the foot of his choosing, I wanted him to raise his foot approximately six inches from the ground. I also explained and demonstrated that I wanted Mr. Hernandez to count out loud by Mississippi's until I told him to stop. I could see that Mr. Hernandez was swaying back and forth while I explained the test. I then told Mr. Hernandez to begin the test.

Mr. Hernandez once again just took casually steps and counted out loud. He walked approximately 12 paces and then stopped in place. I then placed Mr. Hernandez under arrest for driving while intoxicated. He was handcuffed utilizing the double lock and placed into the rear of patrol vehicle 3325. Just prior to placing Mr. Hernandez into the patrol vehicle, I visually inspected the illuminated compartment which was negative for any

contraband. Mr. Hernandez was then transported to the Lakewood Police Department without incident. Mr. Hernandez' vehicle was impounded by Barinas Towing for Johns Law.

Once at the Lakewood Police Department, I began the 20 minute observation of Mr. Hernandez prior to his breath sample. The observation was face to face and uninterrupted to ensure there was no residual mouth alcohol. I asked Mr. Hernandez if he graduated high school and he stated that he did. I then played the audio version of the Miranda Rights in the Spanish language and Mr. Hernandez stated that he understood his rights and was willing to answer my questions. I then played the Spanish audio version of the N.J. Attorney General's Standard Statement and Mr. Hernandez agreed to submit a breath test.

Sergeant Marzocca then responded to the booking area and conducted a breath sample on the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C without incident. Mr. Hernandez had a reading of 0.16% BAC. I then offered Mr. Hernandez to call a sober person to pick him up. A short time later, Stevet Hernandez-Espana responded and I read the Potential Liability Warning to him. He stated that he understood and signed the Potential Liability Warning taking responsibility for Mr. Hernandez. I then released Mr. Hernandez to his brother Mr. Hernandez-Espana. Mr. Hernandez was also given his summons' and a copy of his Alcotest 7110 reading. Mr. Hernandez was issued the following summons':

On 1/12/19 at 0120 hrs. I, Sgt. Michael Marzocca #314, was asked to assist Ptl. Ganley with operating the Alcotest Machine. I spoke to Ptl. Ganley who stated he had just completed his minimum twenty minute observation of Mr. Noe Hernandez. During the observation period, Mr. Hernandez did not burp, regurgitate, vomit or place anything into his mouth. Mr. Hernandez stated he was willing to provide breath samples that are required of him by law.

I removed all electronic devices from my person including my cell phone, wrist watch, police radio and MVR microphone. I started Alcotest machine #1, allowed it to warm up and entered the required information. I brought Mr. Hernandez into the Alcotest room and read him the statement on the wall which contains instructions for blowing into the mouth piece. He stated he understood and he gave two good breath samples. A new mouth piece was used before each of the samples were given. The Alcotest Influence Report printed out and stated that Mr. Hernandez's blood alcohol content was a 0.16%. At this time I called the Electrochemical and Infrared results from both breath samples into dispatch who entered them into the NJSP Alcotest Calculator. Dispatch notified me that the numbers were within acceptable tolerances.

Narrative

On 1/11/2019 at approximately 2349 hours, I observed a green Chevrolet Trailblazer, bearing NJ Registration F64ECM, traveling west on Ocean Avenue while swerving in and out of the shoulder and the oncoming traffic lane. I pulled behind the Trailblazer in my patrol vehicle, 3346, and I activated the overhead lights to initiate a traffic stop before the intersection of Ocean Avenue and Clover Street. The Trailblazer continued to travel west on Ocean Avenue and then made a left hand turn into the driveway of 308 Ocean Avenue and parked behind the residence. I exited my patrol vehicle and approached the front driver's side window of the Trailblazer. I introduced myself as Officer Cusanelli and spoke to the driver, later identified as Alvaro Tejada. I immediately smelled the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from the vehicle. I then asked Alvaro if he had consumed alcoholic beverages prior to operating his vehicle to which he admitted that he consumed "one drink and one beer" prior to operating his vehicle. Alvaro also stated that he did not possess an NJ Driver's License.

I instructed Alvaro to exit his vehicle, walk to the rear, and stand in front of my patrol vehicle, 3346. I advised Alvaro that I would conduct the Field Sobriety Testing and to ask questions if he did not understand any portion of the tests. I immediately smelled the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his breath. I also observed that Alvaro's eyes were bloodshot and his speech was slurred which, in my training and experience, are indicative of being under the influence of alcohol. I asked Alvaro if he had any injuries or medical issues that would inhibit his ability to complete FST's, to which he stated that he did not have any medical issues or injuries.

I advised Alvaro that the first test would be the "Walk and Turn Examination" and I instructed him to stand in the starting position; right foot in front of his left foot, touching heel to toe, keeping his arms at his side, while standing straight up. Alvaro could not maintain his balance while listening to my instructions. Alvaro also attempted to lean on the rear bumper of his vehicle. I explained and demonstrated the test in which I instructed Alvaro to; walk nine steps in a straight line, touching heel to toe on each step, count each step out loud, keeping his arms at his side, turn around after the ninth step, and walk nine steps back to the starting position. Alvaro attempted to begin the test before the instructions were completed. I then told Alvaro to begin the test and I observed; he stopped walking to steady himself, he did not touch heel to toe, he lost his balance while walking, he raised his arms off his side for balance, he walked an incorrect amount of steps each way, and he did not count each step out loud.

I then advised Alvaro that the second test would be the "One Leg Standing Examination" and I instructed him to stand in the starting position; feet together, keeping his arms at his side, while standing straight up. I explained and demonstrated the test in which I instructed Alvaro to; lift one foot six inches off the ground, point the elevated foot upward, look at the elevated foot, keeping his arms at his side, and hold that position for thirty seconds or until he was told to stop. I told Alvaro to begin the test and I observed; he was swaying while balancing, he put his foot down multiple times, and he could not complete the test as instructed.

I informed Alvaro that he was under arrest for Driving Under the Influence 39:4-50 and placed him into handcuffs utilizing the double locking mechanism. A search incident to arrest yielded negative results and I placed him into the rear passenger compartment of my patrol vehicle, 3346. The rear passenger compartment of my patrol vehicle was searched prior to and after the arrest.

which yielded negative results for any contraband. I notified our police tow truck unit #20, Barina's Automotive, to impound the Trailblazer for John's Law. I then transported Alvaro to headquarters to be booked and processed.

At headquarters, I played the Spanish audio recording of the "Miranda Rights Form" and the "Attorney General's Standard Statement for Motor Vehicle Operators" for Alvaro. He stated that he understood his rights and replied "Si, Yes" when asked to provide breath samples for the Alcotest. I completed the minimum twenty minute face to face observation period and continued to observe Alvaro for the duration of the booking process. In that period, Alvaro did not spit, vomit, regurgitate, or place anything into his mouth. Sgt. Marzocca #314 conducted the Alcotest, refer to his supplemental report. Alvaro's Blood Alcohol Content was .10%.

Alvaro was charged with Driving Under the Influence 39:4-50, Reckless Driving 39:4-96, Careless Driving 39:4-97, Failure to Stay in Marked Lane 39:4-88A, Failure to Yield to an Emergency Vehicle 39:4-91, Unlicensed Driver 39:3-10 and released on the above summonses. Narrative

On 1/12/2019 at approximately 0308 hours, I observed a red Jeep, bearing PA Registration JZL9779, traveling south on New Hampshire Avenue. I introduced myself as Officer Cusanelli and spoke to the driver, later identified as Guillermo Carbajal-Gonzalez. I immediately smelled the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from the vehicle. I then asked Guillermo if he consumed alcoholic beverages prior to operating his vehicle to which he admitted that he consumed "a couple of beers" prior to operating his vehicle. I also observed seven open "Corona" beer bottles in the front and rear passenger compartments in the Jeep. I instructed Guillermo to exit the Jeep, walk to the rear, and stand in front of my patrol vehicle, 3346.

I advised Guillermo that I would conduct the Field Sobriety Testing and to ask questions if he did not understand any portion of the tests. I immediately smelled the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his breath. I asked Guillermo if he had any injuries or medical issues that would inhibit his ability to complete FST's, to which he stated that he did not have any injuries or medical issues. I also observed that Guillermo's eyes were bloodshot and his speech was slurred which, in my training and experience, are indicative of being under the influence of alcohol.

I advised Guillermo that the first test would be the "Walk and Turn Examination" and instructed him to stand in the starting position; right foot in front of his left foot, touching heel to toe, keeping his arms at his side, while standing straight up. Guillermo could not maintain his balance while standing in the starting position. I explained and demonstrated the test in which I instructed Guillermo to; walk nine steps in a straight line, touching heel to toe on each step, count each step out loud, keeping his arms at his side, turn around after the ninth step, and walk nine steps back to the starting point. Guillermo attempted to begin the test before the instructions were completed. He then stated that he could not complete the test due to the fact that he consumed "a couple of drinks." I then told Guillermo to begin the test and I observed; he stopped walking to steady himself, he did not touch heel to toe multiple times, he used his arms to balance, he walked an incorrect number of steps each way, and he did not count each step out loud.

I then advised Guillermo that the second test would be the "One Leg Standing Examination" and instructed him to stand in the starting position; feet together, keeping his arms at his side, while standing straight up. I explained and demonstrated the test in which I instructed Guillermo to; lift one foot six inches off the ground, point the elevated foot upward, look at the elevated foot, while keeping his arms at his side, and hold that position for thirty seconds or until he was instructed to stop. I then told Guillermo to begin the test and I observed; he was swaying while balancing, he used his arms to balance, he put his foot down multiple times, and he failed to complete the test.

as instructed.

I informed Guillermo that he was under arrest for Driving Under the Influence 39:4-50 and placed him into handcuffs utilizing the double locking mechanism. A search incident to arrest yielded negative results and I placed him into the rear passenger compartment of my patrol vehicle, 3346. The rear passenger compartment of my patrol vehicle was searched prior to and after the arrest which yielded negative results for any contraband. I notified our police tow truck unit #20, Barina's Automotive, to impound the Jeep for John's Law. I then transported Guillermo to headquarters to be booked and processed.

At headquarters, I played the Spanish audio recording of the "Miranda Rights Form" and the "Attorney General's Standard Statement for Motor Vehicle Operators" for Guillermo. He stated that he understood his rights and replied "Yes" when asked to provide breath samples for the Alcotest. I completed the minimum twenty minute observation period and continued to observe Guillermo for the duration of the booking process. In that period, Guillermo did not spit, vomit, regurgitate, or place anything into his mouth. Sgt. Marzocca #314 conducted the Alcotest, refer to his supplemental report. After his first two unsuccessful breath sample attempts, Guillermo regurgitated. I then completed a second twenty minute observation period. In that second period, Guillermo did not spit, vomit, regurgitate, or place anything into his mouth. Guillermo successfully provided two adequate breath samples. Guillermo's Blood Alcohol Content was a 0.15%.

Guillermo was charged with Driving Under the Influence 39:4-50, Reckless Driving 39:4-96, Careless Driving 39:4-97, Driving on Closed Roadway 39:4-94.2B, Failure to Obey Direction W Emergency 39:4-215, Failure to Yield to Emergency Vehicle 39:4-91, Unlicensed Driver 39:3-10, Open Alcoholic Beverage in a MV 39:4-51B and released on the above summonses. I advised Guillermo to appear in the Lakewood Municipal Court on 1/21/2019 at approximately 0930 hours for this matter. All of the subsequent paperwork was filed accordingly with the Court Office and the Records Department. No further action was taken at this time.

I was informed by Ptl Cusanelli that he just completed his minimum twenty minute face to face observation of Mr. Carbajal-Gonzalez where he did not burp, vomit, regurgitate or place anything into his mouth. Mr. Gonzalez stated he would provide me with breath samples in order to determine his level of intoxication.

I removed all electronic devices from my person including my police radio, wrist watch, cell phone and MVR microphone. I started Alcotest machine #2 and entered the information which was required. I brought Mr. Gonzalez into the Alcotest room and read him the statement on the wall explaining the instructions for blowing into the mouth piece and he stated he understood. Mr. Gonzalez gave two unacceptable samples. The first sample gave an error message of "Minimum volume not achieved" and the second sample was "Blowing time too short". As Mr. Gonzalez was exiting the Alcotest room I observed him burp. At this point the twenty minute observation period was restarted. At the conclusion of the second observation period I attempted to administer the Alcotest again.

Mr. Gonzalez then gave two unacceptable breath test and was told he needs to blow with a longer duration and to blow continuously without blowing too hard. Dispatch notified me that the numbers were within acceptable tolerances.

Narrative

On 01/13/2019 at approximately 2153 hours I observed a 2015 white Nissan Altima bearing NJ registration C86GRR traveling east on Ocean Ave stopped at the traffic signal at New Hampshire Ave. I pulled up alongside the vehicle and observed the headlamps were not illuminated. When the traffic signal turned green the Nissan proceeded straight at a high rate of speed east on Ocean Ave. I pulled behind the Nissan and activated my overhead lights. The Nissan continued for about a half of a mile and then pulled into the parking lot of 1380 Ocean Ave. I exited my patrol vehicle and approached the driver side of the vehicle. I asked the driver, later identified as Diego Barajas, for his driver license, registration and insurance. I immediately detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the vehicle. I also noticed that Diego's eyes were glassy and bloodshot. Diego did not turn over any identification. He began to look in the glove box for his documents but could not find them. I asked Diego why he did not pull over right away and he stated he did not see the police lights until he was in the parking lot of 1380 Ocean. He then picked up his cell phone and began to make a phone call. I asked Diego to get off the phone and to give me some identification. Diego did not comply.

I ordered Diego to exit his vehicle and stand at the rear of it. I asked Diego if he had any alcoholic beverages tonight. He stated yes. I asked him how many and he stated enough. I next advised Diego that I would be conducting Standard Field Sobriety Tests. I asked Diego if he had any problems with his legs and he said yes sometimes they are sore because he lifts a lot of weight but stated that he did not have any injuries to his legs.

I advised Diego that the first test would be the "Walk and Turn." I instructed him to stand in the starting position; right foot in front of left foot with his hand at his sides while I explained the instructions. I next explained and demonstrated the test. I instructed him to, in a straight line, take nine heel-to-toe steps, each step counting aloud, keeping his arms at his sides, and after the ninth step to take a small series of steps to the left and walk nine heel-to-toe steps back. Diego could not maintain his balance while listening to my instructions, he began the test before my instructions were completed, he did not touch heel-to-toe on some steps, lost balance while walking and did incorrect number of steps (11).

During both tests Diego continually tried to talk over me while giving him instruction and was verbally combative.

I advised Diego the second test would be the "One Leg Standing." I instructed him to stand in the starting position; feet together and hands at his sides while I explained the instructions. I next explained and demonstrated the test. I instructed him to pick either his left or right leg, lift it 6 inches off the ground, stare at the foot that is raised and count aloud until I tell him to stop. I instructed Diego to begin the test. Diego refused to take the test.

I next asked Diego to turn around and put his arms behind his back. I advised Diego that he was under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated (39:4-50). I placed Diego in handcuffs utilizing the double lock. He was placed in the rear of my patrol car 3385. I notified dispatch to contact unit #20 Barina's automotive for John's Law. Sgt. M. Lorenc #316 stayed with the vehicle until Barina's arrived. An empty tall can of beer was found in the vehicle.

At headquarters I offered Diego to take the Field Sobriety Tests again. He agreed. Again I gave him the instructions for the "Walk and Turn." He did the incorrect number of steps (12) and lost his balance. Again I gave him the instructions for the "One Leg Standing." Diego attempted the test twice. The first and second time he could not maintain his balance and put his foot down before I told him to do so. Sgt. C. Messer #332 conducted the "Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus" (see his supplemental narrative)

I next read the "Miranda Rights Form" to him. He answered yes. Diego was asked how much he had to drink tonight and he stated 2 beers which he consumed at the Community Center. Next I played the "Attorney General Standard Statement" on the computer in English. Diego replied "go ahead" to submitting breath sample. When asked again he stated "go ahead yes." I completed the minimum twenty minute observation period and I continued to observe Diego during the booking process. In that period, Diego did not spit, vomit, regurgitate, or place anything into his mouth. Sgt. Lorenc #316 conducted the Alcotest (see Sgt. Lorenc's supplemental report) Diego's Blood Alcohol Content was 0.14%.

Diego was issued 7 summons for Driving While Intoxicated (39:4-50), Carless Driving (39:4-97), Reckless Driving (39:4-96), Headlamps Required (39-3-47), Failure to Display Documents (39:3-29), Driving While Suspended (39:3-40) and Open Container in MV(39:4-51b). Brianne Johnson signed off on the "Potential Liability Form" and was given a copy of the form. Diego was then released to Brianne.

On 01/13/2019 at approximately 22:51 hrs., I arrive at police headquarters to assist PO Kicki #383 with a DWI arrest. Kicki had Diego Barajas in custody for Driving While Intoxicated and she asked that I attempt to take samples of his breath for testing utilizing the Alcotest instrument. Upon my arrival, I was informed by Kicki that Diego waived his Miranda Rights and agreed to supply samples of his breath for testing. Kicki stated that she had successfully completed the minimum 20 minute observation of Diego and continued to observe him throughout the booking process.

I removed the electronic equipment from off my person and stored it in a place separate and away from the room the Alcotest is located in. I allowed the Alcotest sufficient time to warm up and, when prompted to, entered the pertinent information in to it. Prior to each attempted sample gathering, I placed a new mouth piece on the breath hose and read the Alcotest instructions out-loud to Diego until he stated he understood them.

On his first attempt, Diego's breath did not meet the minimal volume necessary for a testable sample. He was advised to take a deeper breath and blow into the mouth piece for a longer period of time. As the Alcotest prepared to accept another sample, I realized that I still had my MVR mic on my person. I immediately removed it and stored it in the same location as my other electronic property (separate and away from the Alcotest room). On Diego's next two breaths, he provided adequate samples for testing, resulting in a calculated Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) of 0.14%.

Lakewood Police dispatch checked the Alcotest results utilizing the Alcotest Calculator, which is located on the New Jersey State Police website, and they were found to be within the acceptable tolerances.

While within close proximity of Diego (approximately one arm's length), I could detect the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath as he spoke to me. I observed his eyes to be blood shot (red) and glassy (watery) in appearance. Diego was also combative and verbally abusive to Officers on scene and in the booking area. Based on my training and experience, I know these physical characteristics, as well as his demeanor, are indicative of someone under the influence of Alcohol.

An Alcohol Influence Report was generated. The original was supplied to Kicki for reporting purposes and a copy was given to Diego for his records. End*

On January 13, 2019 at approximately 22:30, Ptl. Kicki #383 arrived at the Lakewood Police Department booking room with a party under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated. The party that was under arrest is Diego Barajas. I went into the booking room to ensure that the male party was not going to be combative once his handcuffs were removed. While in the booking room, Ptl. Kicki asked me to administer the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus examination on the subject.

At this time started the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (HGN) examination by having Barajas stand with his feet together and his hands at his sides on the floor in front of the booking room counter. I then utilized a ball point pen as the stimulus and placed it approximately 15 inches from his face and slightly above eye level. I then asked him if he could see the tip of the pen and he stated yes. I requested Barajas to touch the tip of the stimulus with his index finger and he then reached up with his right index finger pointed and touched the pen. I instructed him to remain motionless during the duration of the examination and only use his eyes to follow the stimulus. I then observed that his pupils were of equal size and shape and tracked the pen equally. At this time, I started the test. Barajas displayed a lack of smooth pursuit in both his left and right eyes. He displayed a distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation in both his left and right eyes. He also had the onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both of his eyes. I informed Ptl. Kicki of the results of the HGN examination for documentation purposes.

Narrative

On 01/18/2019 at approximately 2255 hours I, Officer Ganley 362 was travelling East bound on East Kennedy Boulevard in marked patrol vehicle 3325. As I was patrolling, I noticed a vehicle pull onto East Kennedy Boulevard to travel east from the apartment complex located in the area of 1700 block of Lexington Avenue. As the vehicle began to travel east on East Kennedy Boulevard, I noticed it began to accelerate to a speed higher than the posted speed limit quite rapidly. As I got closer to the vehicle, I noticed that the driver was having difficulty maintaining a straight course of travel in the marked lane.

I could see that the vehicle, NJ: T82DXK- a 2010 Toyota Tacoma, then came to a stop in the right lane of East Kennedy Boulevard at the intersection of Squankum Road. While approaching the red light with its right signal activated, the vehicle suddenly pulled into the left lane to change its course of travel without utilizing its signal. I then notified Lakewood Communications that I would be conducting a motor vehicle stop once traffic light turned green. Once the traffic light turned green, I activated my overhead lights to conduct a motor vehicle stop. Just prior to activating my lights, the vehicle in question suddenly accelerated enough for the tires to screech. It then took the vehicle approximately 100 yards to come to a complete stop. At this point, I felt as though the occupant of the vehicle was attempting prolong pulling over and advised Lakewood Communications of my heightened caution.

When other patrol units were closer, I began my approach to the passenger side of the vehicle; which was now on the east side of 605 East County Line Road. (WaWa Convenience store) I then asked the driver, later identified as Bartlomie Kozikowski, for his credentials. I could immediately smell alcoholic beverages emanating from the interior of the vehicle, which was occupied solely by Mr. Bartlomie. As he shuffled throughout his vehicle for his credentials, I could see that Mr. Bartlomie's eyes were glassy and bloodshot.

I could also see that his hand-eye coordination seemed to be off when he reached for paperwork. Once I retrieved his documentation, I advised Mr. Bartlomie the reasons for my stop and asked where he was coming from. Mr. Bartlomie's only response was that he was coming from Lakewood. I then asked Mr. Bartlomie if he had been drinking and she stated that he had not. I then asked him to exit his vehicle for field sobriety testing and he did so without incident.

Once we were safely at the rear of the vehicle, I explained and demonstrated the first test; The Walk and Turn Examination. I demonstrated that I wanted Mr. Bartlomie to place his hands at his sides and his feet heel-to-toe while I explained the test. I then explained and demonstrated that I wanted Mr. Bartlomie to take nine steps heel-to-toe while counting each step out loud. After completing the ninth step, I wanted Mr. Bartlomie to pivot on one foot and take small steps with the other to turn around. I then explained that I wanted him to take nine steps heel-to-toe back while counting out loud back to where the test started. I then asked Mr. Bartlomie if he understood the instructions and he stated that he did. Mr. Bartlomie then started the test without being told to.

Mr. Bartlomie then began the test and took ten paces heel-to-toe. On his tenth step, he spun around in one motion and began his paces back. While on his way back, his shoelace caused him to lose his balance so I allowed him to attempt the test again; after his lace was tied. He again took ten paces and stumbled on his eighth pace. As Mr. Bartlomie turned around, he lost his balance causing him to almost fall. He then took ten paces back to where the test began.

I then explained and demonstrated the second test; The One-Led-Standing Examination. I demonstrated and explained that, with the foot of his choosing, I wanted Mr. Bartlomie to raise on leg approximately six inches while counting out loud until I said stop. Due to Mr. Bartlomie's thick accent, I told him he did not have to recite "Mississippi" in between each number. I then asked Mr. Bartlomie if he understood and he stated that he did. I then told Mr. Bartlomie to begin the test.

Mr. Bartlomie then began to take a pace forward so I told him to stop the test. I again explained and demonstrated the test to Mr. Bartlomie and told him to begin the test. Mr. Bartlomie then raised his right leg and dropped it to the ground on the count of two. Mr. Bartlomie then placed his left hand on his truck and began the test again without me telling him to. At the count of seven, Mr. Bartlomie had to drop his leg for balance. I then placed Mr. Bartlomie under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated and handcuffed him utilizing the double locking mechanism. Because of Mr. Bartlomie's size, I had utilize two sets of hinged handcuffs to affect the arrest. I then searched him and his vehicle for contraband or open alcohol containers with negative results.

Due to Mr. Bartlomie's large stature, he was placed into Officer Ortiz's marked vehicle which had a larger back seat and transported to Lakewood Police Department without incident. The rear compartment of Officer Ortiz's vehicle was checked prior to Mr. Bartlomie's placement for contraband with negative results. Once at the Lakewood Police Department, Officer Ortiz's rear compartment was again checked for contraband when Mr. Bartlomie was removed, which yielded negative results. Mr. Bartlomie was then escorted to the booking area where the 20 minute observation was successfully conducted. The observation was face to face and uninterrupted to ensure there was no residual mouth alcohol. I read Mr. Bartlomie his Miranda Rights which he stated that he understood and agreed to answer my questions. Due to the technicality of verb age in the N.J Attorney General's Standard Statement, I asked Mr. Bartlomie what his primary language is; and he stated that it was Polish. I played the audio version of the N.J. Attorney General's Standard Statement in Polish and Mr. Bartlomie stated that he fully understood it. He then agreed to submit samples of his breath for testing.

Sergeant Zrebiec 236 then responded to the booking area and conducted a breath sample on the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C. After several attempts, Sergeant Zrebiec advised me that Mr. Bartlomie was not blowing breath into the machine as instructed. It appeared that when asked to blow into the machine, Mr. Bartlomie would clench his lips but not blow air into the machine. Due to his lack of cooperation with instructions, Mr. Bartlomie was charged with refusing to submit breath samples and issued a summons for the same. Once the breath sample portion was completed, I asked Mr. Bartlomie where he had his last alcoholic beverage. Mr. Bartlomie again stated that he did not drink at all and that he was just tired from working so much.

Tilton Auto Body was called to impound the vehicle under John's Law.

Supplement

On 01/18/2019 this Officer was requested to operate the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C to determine the blood alcohol content (BAC) of Bartolomie Kozikowski , who had been arrested by Ptlmn. John Ganley #362 for Driving while Intoxicated.

I arrived at Lakewood Police Headquarters shortly after Ganley called the Watch Commander's Office to inform that the twenty minute observation period had passed. I made my way to the Booking Room of the LPD to run the Alcotest. Ganley informed me that Kozikowski did not burp, regurgitate, vomit or put anything in to his mouth during the observation period. Ganley also told me that Kozikowski was not in possession of any type of electronic device on his person.

I entered Alcotest Room #2 without any portable electronic devices such as radio, mobile phone, microphone, or watch. I then prepared the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C for operation by entering the required information pertaining to Kozikowski and the incident as prompted by the Alcotest. As we waited for the Alcotest to complete the opening purges I read the instructions for providing a breath sample to Kozikowski in English before physically demonstrating to him what was expected of him. Kozikowski verbally indicated to me that he would provide the breath samples.

Upon indication that the Alcotest was ready to accept a breath sample Kozikowski was brought into the Alcotest Room. Kozikowski gave a poor sample for 3.3 seconds which resulted in an Error Message of "MIN. VOL. NOT ACHIEVED". I again physically showed Kozikowski how to provide a good breath sample before giving him a second attempt. The second attempt lasted for .4 seconds and also resulted in the Error Message of "MIN. VOL. NOT ACHIEVED". During the second attempt it appeared as though Kozikowski did not give a good effort in trying to provide an actual sample. I heard no air expelling form his mouth.

I gave Kozikowski a third attempt to provide a good breath sample. In the third attempt he put his mouth against the mouthpiece and had his face actually turn red as he pretended to provide a legitimate breath sample. At this point I terminated the test and informed Ptlmn. Ganley that Kozikowski would be charged with a Refusal.

It should be noted that a new mouthpiece was utilized for each breath sample.

An Alcotest Influence Report Form was generated for this test. The original was signed by me and given to Ptlmn. Ganley for inclusion with his report.

Narrative

On 1/19/2019 at approximately 0036 hours, I observed a black Nissan Rogue, bearing NJ Registration A45JZK, traveling west on Ocean Avenue while swerving in and out of the oncoming traffic lane. The Nissan nearly struck my patrol vehicle, 3311, head on as I passed it traveling east on Ocean Avenue. I then pulled behind the Nissan in my patrol vehicle, 3311, and activated the overhead lights to initiate a traffic stop. The Nissan then came to a complete stop on Ocean Avenue outside of Ocean County Park. I exited my patrol vehicle and approached the front passenger side window. I introduced myself as Officer Cusanelli and spoke to the driver, later identified as YanCarlo A. Polanco-Reyes. I immediately smelled the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from the vehicle. I asked YanCarlo if he had consumed alcoholic beverages prior to operating his vehicle to which he admitted that he consumed "three Corona's" prior to operating his vehicle. YanCarlo was unable to produce his Driver's License on scene, however I was able to locate and confirm that he had a valid NJ Driver's License.

I instructed YanCarlo to exit his vehicle, walk to the rear, and stand in front of my patrol vehicle, 3311. I advised him that I would conduct the Field Sobriety Testing and to ask questions if he did not understand any portion of the tests. I immediately smelled the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his breath. I also observed that YanCarlo's eyes were bloodshot and his speech was slurred which, in my training and experience, are indicative of being under the influence of alcohol. I then asked YanCarlo if he had any medical issues or injuries that would inhibit his ability to complete FST's to which he stated that he did not have any medical issues or injuries.

I advised YanCarlo that the first test would be the "Walk and Turn Examination" and I instructed him to stand in the starting position; right foot in front of his left foot, touching heel to toe, keeping his arms at his side, while standing straight up. YanCarlo was unable to maintain his balance standing in the starting position while listening to my instructions. I explained and demonstrated the test in which I instructed YanCarlo to; walk nine steps in a straight line, touching heel to toe on each step, count each step out loud, keeping his arms at his side, turn around after the ninth step, and walk nine steps back to the starting point. I then told YanCarlo to begin the test and I observed; he stopped walking to steady himself, he did not touch heel to toe multiple times, he lost his balance while walking, he raised his arms off of his side for balance, he lost his balance while turning, he walked an incorrect number of steps each way, he did not count each step out loud, and he could not complete the test as instructed.

I then advised YanCarlo that the second test would be the "One Leg Stand Examination" and I instructed him to stand in the starting position; feet together, keeping his arms at his side, while standing straight up. I explained and demonstrated the test in which I instructed YanCarlo to; lift one foot six inches off the ground, point the elevated foot upward, look at the elevated foot, keeping his arms at his side, and to hold that position for thirty seconds or until he was instructed to stop the test. I then told YanCarlo to begin the test and I observed; he was swaying while balancing, he raised his arms off of his side for balance, he put his foot down multiple times, and he could not complete the test as instructed.

I informed YanCarlo that he was under arrest for Driving Under the Influence 39:4-50 and placed him into handcuffs utilizing the double locking mechanism. A search incident to arrest yielded negative results and I placed him into the rear passenger compartment of my patrol vehicle, 3311. The rear passenger

compartment of my patrol vehicle was searched prior to and after the arrest which yielded negative results for any contraband. I notified our police tow truck unit #20, Tilton's Autobody, to impound the Nissan for John's Law. The registered owner of the Nissan, Merian D. Ozoria, arrived on scene shortly after, paid an undisclosed amount of money to Tilton's Autobody, and Tilton's released the vehicle into her custody, which has also been documented on the property table accordingly. I then transported YanCarlo to headquarters to be booked and processed.

At headquarters, Ptl. Mahecha #390 assisted in translation from English to Spanish. Ptl. Mahecha read the "Miranda Rights Form" and the "Attorney General's Standard Statement for Motor Vehicle Operators" to YanCarlo. YanCarlo stated that he understood his rights, and replied "Yes, Si" when asked to provide breath samples for the Alcotest. I completed the minimum twenty minute observation period and I continued to observe YanCarlo for the duration of the booking process. In that period, YanCarlo did not spit, vomit, regurgitate, or place anything into his mouth. Sgt. Marzocca #314 conducted the Alcotest, refer to his supplemental report. YanCarlo's Blood Alcohol Content was .17%.

YanCarlo was charged with Driving Under the Influence 39:4-50, Reckless Driving 39:4-96, Careless Driving 39:4-97, Failure to Stay in Marked Lane 39:4-88A, Following too Closely 39:4-89 and released on the above summonses. I advised YanCarlo to appear in the Lakewood Municipal Court on 1/28/2019 at approximately 0930 hours for this matter. YanCarlo's sister in law, Yasiry Ozoria-Ayala, signed off on the "Potential Liability Form" and she was given a copy of the form. All of the subsequent paperwork was filed accordingly with the Court Office and the Records Department. No further action was taken at this time.
