2. When Stopped or Arrival at Scene:

Upon arrival Officer Ravaioli #276 already had the vehicle stopped. It should be noted that upon my arrival Officer Ravaioli had the vehicle stopped in the opposite lane of traffic. When I exited my patrol vehicle the driver later identified as Katherine Deibel was already out of her vehicle speaking with Officer Ravaioli. Officer Ravaioli instructed Katherine to stand on the white shoulder line to which she complied. I asked Katherine where she was heading, and her response was home. I also asked Katherine if she has had anything to drink tonight to which her response was no.

3. Field Sobriety Tests:

The first test that was performed was the one leg stand test.

First I instructed Katherine to stand with her feet together hands at her side. I asked Katherine if she had any injuries that would effect her from being able to lift her foot six inches off the ground. Katherine stated in effect that she has bad hips and bad knees. I then advised Katherine that the first test I would be asking her to perform is the one leg stand.

I instructed Katherine that while I am explaining the instructions to stand with her hands at her side; feet together. Also that when I tell her to begin she will start by lifting her foot of choice approximately six inches off the ground, and count one-thousand one, one- thousand two, one- thousand three, one- thousand four and so on until I instruct her to stop.

I demonstrated the test, and I asked Katherine if she understood the instructions her response was "Yes." It should be noted that while I was explaining/ demonstrating the instructions Katherine adjusted her feet by separating them after being instructed to stand with her hands at her side; feet together and also placing her hands in front of her body.

When I told Katherine she may begin the test, she began to shuffle her feet in a up and down motion as if she was unsure of which foot to lift off the ground. Katherine then began to lift her right foot off the ground but began to lose balance and crossed her right foot over her left foot and placed it on the ground to regain balance. After placing her right foot on the ground Katherine side stepped almost losing her balance but was able to separate her feet again to regain balance.

Katherine uttered that "I cant do it", so I reiterated what she said asking her "You can't do this one?" To which her response was "I can." Katherine tried to lift her left leg now off the ground but was unsuccessful by placing it right back on the ground and did not count out loud.

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The next test was the walk and turn test.

I advised Katherine that the next test I was going to have her complete was the walk and turn. I first advised Katherine to start again with her feet together hands at her side. Then instructed Katherine to stand with her right foot in front of her left; hands at her side while I explain the instructions. It should be noted that Katherine did not place her right foot in front of her left foot as instructed. I also stated to Katherine "If you can do that for me now that would be great." To which she still did not follow the instructions.

I instructed Katherine that when I tell her to begin she will start by placing her left foot in front of her right foot heel to toe. I demonstrated heel to toe steps while counting out loud "One, Two" and explained to Katherine to continue count out loud all the way to nine. When she gets to nine to take a series of small steps. Which is for her to turn around which I demonstrated, and go back "One, Two, Three" and count all the way to nine.

Katherine was swaying front to back while I was explaining the instructions to the point where Officer Ravaoli reached out several time to assist Katherine just incase she were to completely lose her balance. It should be noted that I was not able to instruct Katherine to begin the test because as I was finishing explaining the test she started to begin the test on her own.

Katherine began walking forward in a stumbling motion not completing a heal to toe step. It appeared that Katherine at one point stopped to regain balance but was unsuccessful and continued to walk forward in a stumbling motion. Myself and Officer Ravaoli had to stop Katherine from walking forward and assist her walking back towards her car so I can explain the next test.

The last test I performed was the alphabet test.

Before beginning the test I asked Katherine what her highest level of education was and she stated in effect college. I continued to ask if Katherine graduated with an associates or Bachelors degree and she stated "I did not graduate." When asking Katherine if she knew the English alphabet her reply was "Yes."

I instructed Katherine to recite the English alphabet from "B" to "O" without singing it. Katherine then asked "from B to O?" a couple times to which my reply was yes from B to O. Katherine then attempted to recite the English alphabet from "B" to "O" reciting it as, "B,F,C,H,I,J,K,L,M,N,O,P,Q,R,S,T,U,V,W,X,Y,Z." Katherine recited the alphabet out of order, missed the letters "D","E" and "G" also continuing past the letter "O" as instructed.

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Katherine did not pass the Field Sobriety Tests and was placed under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated. I ordered Katherine to turn around and place her hands behind her back to which she complied. Katherine was handcuffed (Double Locked) without incident and was secured in the back of my patrol vehicle, vehicle #174.

Special Officer Parise #057 stayed on the scene awaiting the tow truck which was Jerry's Towing and Recovery. A 12 hour hold was placed on the vehicle as per John's Law. A tow report was completed and attached to this case.

3. Enroute to the station:

Katherine was calm, she remained quite and did not have any spontaneous uttering. During the transport I did not detect an odor of an alcoholic beverage.

4. At the station:

After arriving at the station and escorting Katherine out of the back of my patrol vehicle was when I detected a strong odor of alcoholic beverage emanating from Katherine's facial area. Katherine was escorted from the back of my patrol vehicle to the cell block area where I conducted a pat down of Katherine and also began my twenty minute direct view observation. Officer Delatorre #283 then conducted a secondary search yielding negative results.

Officer Riso #275 was the Alcotest operator for this incident. See Officer Riso's supplementary report for full details to include the procedure and results of the Alcotest machine for breath testing.

Once testing was finished and Katherine was done being processed she was given back all of her property and signed off on the prisoner property form. Katherine was released to her husband Glenn Deibel. Glenn signed the potential liability form agreeing to take custody of Katherine. Glenn was also able to keep the completed form for his personal records after I made a copy and scanned and attached it to this file. Glenn was made aware that he is fully responsible for Katherine. I advised Glenn that Jerry's Towing and Recovery had Katherine's vehicle and there was a 12 hour hold on the vehicle as per John's law.

On 2/9/2019 at approximately 14:16 hours this officer (Schmidt #260) was on patrol in the uniform of the day driving marked patrol unit #314 when I observed a white Mercury Mountaineer conduct an illegal left turn from North Cooksbridge Road onto Brookfield Drive. My patrol unit was on Brookfield drive at the time near the Cooks Landing Plaza approaching the stop sign for North Cooksbridge Road. I observed the Mercury Mountaineer make the left turn, having to travel on the wrong side of the roadway around the center median and turn left onto Brookfield Drive. After the Mercury Moutaineer turned and approached my patrol unit on Brookfield Drive, I was able to get the operator's attention and instructed him to pull over in the parking lot of the plaza.

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I pulled my patrol unit behind his vehicle, activated my overhead emergency lights and conducted a motor vehicle stop. The Mercury Mountaineer bearing New Jersey registration: [REDACTED] had pulled to a stop on the entrance access road into Cooks Landing Plaza and the driver, identified to be (arrested) Joseph D'Angelo, had immediately exited from the drivers-side door and had to be instructed to sit back inside his vehicle. My patrol unit is equipped with a camera and the motor vehicle stop was recorded.

I exited my patrol unit and approached the drivers door. I asked the driver (Mr. D'Angelo) for his drivers license, registration and insurance card. I spoke with Mr. D'Angelo about the illegal left turn and he stated his father does it all the time and he was sorry. While speaking to Mr. D'Angelo I observed his hand movements to be slow and his answers to be short. Mr. D'Angelo indicated he was getting food and was on his way to pick it up inside Cooks Landing Plaza. Mr. D'Angelo had to be reminded to retrieve his drivers license, registration and insurance card after he had paused and had seemed to forget what I had originally asked him for. I then asked Mr. D'Angelo if he had been drinking and he again paused and stated he had a vodka earlier about an hour ago. His answer was vague and he did not go into any further detail. Leaning closer to the drivers window an odor of an alcoholic beverage was present inside the vehicle while Mr. D'angelo was speaking with me. I then returned to my patrol unit and verified Mr. D'angelo's drivers license to be sure it was valid and any history. P.O. Mabey (#287) responded to the motor vehicle stop to assist during this time.

I then returned to the drivers side window and instructed Mr. D'angelo to exit his vehicle to conduct field sobriety tests. Mr. D'Angelo exited his vehicle slowly and was instructed to walk towards the back near the rear bumper. While standing at the back I observed Mr. D'Angelo was swaying as he stood while he placed his hands in his pockets. Mr. D'Angelo was instructed to remove his hands from his pockets and stand with his hands down by his side. I then instructed Mr. D'Angelo to remove his hat and eye glasses to conduct the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test.

Field Sobriety Tests

1.) Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus Test

After removing his eye glasses and hat, I instructed Mr. D'Angelo to place his hands down by his side and so that I could check his eyes. Using my index finger as a stimulus, I asked Mr. D'Angelo if he was able to follow my index finger with his eyes only without moving his head. Mr. D'Angelo acknowledged he would be able to follow my index finger with his eyes only and not move his head. I then checked that Mr. D'Angelo's eyes to be the same size, shape and tracked together. Mr. D'Angelo had difficulty keeping his head still while following the stimulus and was told multiple times not to move his head but to follow the stimulus with his eyes only.

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Lack of smooth pursuit was present as both eyes had failed to track the stimulus in a seamless consistent manner. Distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation was present in both eyes. Onset nystagmus prior to 45 degrees was then observed in both eyes. This concluded the test.

2.) Walk and Turn Test

I then instructed Mr. D'Angelo that I would have him conduct a walk and turn test. I had Mr. D'angelo step over to the sidewalk where the ground was even and clear from debris. I asked Mr. D'Angelo if he had any issues with his legs, knees or hips to prevent from conducting a walk and turn test. Mr. D'Angelo acknowledged he did not have any problems with his legs but indicated he takes medication.

Prior to explaining the walk and turn test, I instructed Mr. D'Angelo how to stand in the proper starting position with his right foot in front of his left foot, touching heal to toe with his hands down by his side. I then demonstrated how to stand in the proper starting position multiple times. Mr. D'Angelo was unable to follow my instructions and was unable to differentiate his left from his right foot. Mr. D'Angelo could not touch his feet heal to toe and was observed having difficulty maintaining his balance. Mr. D'Angelo was unable to stand in the starting position after being instructed to do so several times.

I then provided instruction on how to conduct the walk and turn test to Mr. D'Angelo. I demonstrated for Mr. D'Angelo on how to perform the walk and turn test. I explained to Mr. D'Angelo how to take nine(9) steps in a straight forward direction, with his hands down by his side. I explained and demonstrated how to properly turn around, taking small steps while leaving his left foot on the ground turning around and taking an additional nine(9) steps back to the beginning where he started again touching heal to toe. The walk and turn test was explained multiple times to Mr. D'Angelo who attempted to begin the test before I was finished giving him instruction. Mr. D'Angelo finally acknowledged he understood my instruction. Mr. D'Angelo began the test. Mr. D'Angelo failed to step heal to toe, specifically crossing his feet while walking and stepping with his feet wide apart. Mr. D'Angelo also had taken too many steps. Mr. D'Angelo failed to turn around properly as instructed and walked ten steps back to the beginning again failing to touch heal to toe. This concluded the walk and turn test.

3.) One Leg Stand Test

Mr. D'Angelo was instructed to stand with his feet together and hands down by his side. I then instructed and demonstrated to Mr. D'Angelo how to perform the one leg stand test. I explained to Mr. D'Angelo that he could choose either foot he wanted and how to raise his foot off the ground approximately six(6) inches and how to count out loud from one-thousand-one up to one-thousand-thirty or until instructed to stop. I demonstrated to Mr. D'Angelo who acknowledged and attempted to perform the test.

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Mr. D'Angelo raised his foot off of the ground however was unable to maintain his balance after only two counts before losing his balance and placing his foot back down on the ground. Mr. D'Angelo attempted again however determined he was unable to perform one leg stand test. This concluded the test.

4.) Alphabet Test

I asked Mr. D'Angelo if he had completed high school and understood the english alphabet. Mr. D'Angelo acknowledged he understood the alphabet and began to state the alphabet before I had given any further instruction. I stopped Mr. D'Angelo and explained that I wanted him to begin from a specific letter. I instructed Mr. D'Angelo to begin from the letter "C" and stop at the letter "O". Mr. D'Angelo acknowledged and started from the letter "C" however continued past the letter "O". This concluded the alphabet test.

I then advised Mr. D'Angelo he was under arrest for driving while intoxicated with handcuffs that were placed on his wrists which were double locked, he was searched and placed in the rear seat of my patrol unit. Mr. D'Angelo was transported to headquarters without incident.

While en route to headquarters Mr. D'Angelo repeatedly asked why he was under arrest and was told multiple times that he was arrested for driving while intoxicated. Mr. D'Angelo asked why I could not just drive him home.

Upon arrival at headquarters Mr. D'Angelo was searched again before being placed on the bench in the cell block area. A twenty minute uninterrupted observation was then conducted. There were no objects or any foreign contaminants in Mr. D'Angelo's mouth at the time of the uninterrupted observation.

P.O. Notare (#237) whom is a certified Alcotest operator had responded to the cell block area to assist this officer. P.O. Notare then read out loud in my presence the N.J Attorney General's Standardized Statement for Motor Vehicle Operators to Mr. D'Angelo. After reading the statement Mr. D'Angelo stated he wanted his lawyer. Again P.O. Notare continued and explained that his answer was unacceptable and he would be issued an additional summons for refusing to submit to breath samples. Again Mr. D'Angelo stated he wanted his lawyer.

I then reread the entire statement again to Mr. D'Angelo. Mr. D'Angelo repeated he would want to speak with his lawyer. Mr. D'Angelo stated he wasn't sure what he should do and I repeated that the statement that was read to him required him to submit his breath samples. Mr. D'Angelo continued to not provide an answer and was advised that he would be issued an additional summons for the refusal. Mr. D'Angelo stated he just wanted to go home. After several requests I determined Mr. D'Angelo was refusing to provide his breath samples and was later issued an additional summons for refusing.

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Mr. D'Angelo was photographed and placed on the bench in the interview room. Mr. D'Angelo was advised of his miranda rights and signed the miranda declining to speak with this officer any further. Copy of the miranda form was scanned into case file and place into evidence locker.

Mr. D'Angelo was issued the following summonses:

Mr. D'Angelo was advised on his initial court date which was set for 2/14/2019 at 09:30 hours at the Jackson Municipal Court. During his time in my custody Mr. D'Angelo kept asking why was he arrested and kept asking where his vehicle was located. Mr. D'Angelo was told several times that his vehicle was towed and would not be available for release for twelve(12)hours and had been towed by Tilton's Auto.

Mr. D'Angelo's father, Albert D'Angelo, was unable to drive to the police station therefore this officer transported Mr. D'Angelo home to his residence where his father (Albert D'Angelo) signed the Potential Liability Warning form and was also provided his original copy. All related paperwork including the signed miranda forms were scanned into case file and placed into the evidence locker. There is nothing further to report.

On 02/16/2019 at 0348hrs Officer Thompson #301 and I were dispatched to East Veterans Highway and Cross Street to investigate a report of a single car crash with unknown injuries. While I was enroute to investigate the crash, I observed a silver SUV, with significant front end damage and one headlight, traveling North on North Hope Chapel Road. I then turned my patrol vehicle around and to further investigate.

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Once I closed the distance with the the vehicle, I observed the silver GMC bearing New Jersey registration [REDACTED], not maintaining the vehicle in between the fog line and center painted lines. I then activated my overhead lights to effect the motor vehicle stop.

As I approached the vehicle, I confirmed that the license in the rear of the SUV matched the rear license plate. Based on the observations of the condition of the vehicle, I requested a wrecker to my location in order to remove the disabled vehicle form the roadway. As I was approaching the vehicle, I observed through the rear window, what looked like the front bumper with the license plate still attached, with significant damage. As I spoke with the driver, Fausto Alvarez-Morales. I asked Mr. Alvarez-Morales, what had happened to his vehicle? He informed me that he had left a concert and someone had hit his vehicle. When Mr. Alvarez-Morales spoke, I noticed the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating form his facial area. Further, I observed his speech to be very slow and slurred. Mr. Alvarez stated that he did not have anything to drink earlier in the night. While making observations I also noticed his eyes were bloodshot and watery. Due to my training and experience these were all prominent symptoms observed in dealing with persons under the influence of alcohol. While speaking to Mr. Alvarez-Morales, I also observed an open Modelo's beer can in the drivers cup holder.

Based on the operation of his vehicle, as well as my observations as described of Mr. Alvarez-Morales, during conversation, I explained to him, that I was going to be administrating Standard Field Sobriety Tests (SFST) to determine if he was intoxicated. Mr. Alvarez-Morales stated he understood and understood the English language.

The first test I administered was the one-leg stand test. Prior to beginning the test I asked Mr. Alvarez-Morales if he had any injuries or physical ailments that would prevent him form taking a minor physical walking and balance test, which he stated "no."

One Leg Stand Test (OLS):

This officer then had Mr. Alvarez-Morales stand with his feet together and his hands at his side. He was instructed to remain in this position while I explained the test. I then asked if he understood to which he replied that he did. During the instruction portion of the test Mr. Alvarez-Morales swayed front to back and continued to have a strong odor of consumed alcoholic beverage emanating from his person.

When told to begin he was to raise whichever leg he chose approximately six (6") inches off of the ground with his foot parallel to the ground. While his foot was raised he was to keep his hands at his side and count out load one-one thousand, two-one thousand and so on until I instructed him to stop. I further instructed him to ensure both legs were completely straight during this test. I then asked if he had any questions and if he understood my instructions to which he replied he had no questions and understood.

During the one leg stand test, I observed Mr. Alvarez-Morales lean back at the waist slightly to aid his balance, placed his foot down on two separate occasions, did not keep his arms at his side, and

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During the one leg stand test, I observed Mr. Alvarez-Morales lean back at the waist slightly to aid his balance, placed his foot down on two separate occasions, did not keep his arms at his side, and occasionally hopped.

Walk and Turn Test (WAT):

This officer then instructed Mr. Alvarez-Morales to stand with his left foot on an imaginary line and then he was to place his right foot in front of his left, heel to toe with his hands at his side. I demonstrated the proper position and then told him to remain in that position while I explained the test. I asked if he understood to which he replied that he did. Mr. Alvarez-Morales was unable to hold the starting position with his feet stepping apart more than three times. His arms raised for balance at this time and he eventually removed himself completely from the starting position. He also attempted to start the test while I was demonstrating it and was reminded twice to stop and wait until he was told to begin.

Mr. Alvarez-Morales was then instructed that when told to begin he was to take nine heel to toe steps down the imaginary line, he was then told to take a series of controlled steps to turn around and then take nine heel to toe steps back in the same direction. He was further instructed to keep his hands at his side, count each step out loud one through nine and not to stop walking once he began the test. This officer then demonstrated the test to him ensuring he understood my directions. I then asked if he understood and he replied that he did..

During the walk and turn test, I observed that Mr. Alvarez-Morales was unable to touch heel to toe on all steps. His feet were more than two inches in space in relation to heel to toe distance. Further he took the incorrect number of steps up the line, as well back down the line and stepped off the line several times.

Based on the poor operation of his vehicle which culminated in a motor vehicle accident, my observations involving his consumption of alcoholic beverages, and poor performances on the sobriety tests It was determined that he was unable to operate a motor vehicle safely. I then placed Mr. Alvarez-Morales under arrest for driving while intoxicated (39:4-50). He was secured into handcuffs, searched, and placed into the rear of marked unit 175 for transport and processing at headquarters. The duty tow, Accurate auto was contacted for Mr. Alvarez-Morales's vehicle under John's law 12 hour hold.

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While en-route to Police Headquarters an overwhelming odor of an alcoholic beverage consumed the right interior of my patrol car. This odor was not present prior to securing him within my patrol vehicle.

At this time Sgt. Kelly #243 a certified "Alco-test" instrument operator, responded to the processing area in order to administer the Alco-test instrument. (SEE SGT. KELLY'S REPORT FOR MORE INFORMATION)

Officer Thompson #301 had located the front grille to the GMC at the crash scene. (SEE OFFICER THOMPSON'S MVA REPORT FOR MORE INFORMATION)

An alcohol influence report was generated indicating Mr. Alvarez-Morales's blood alcohol content to be 0.05%. I completed the other required reports and forms associated with the incident. Mr. Alvarez-Morales was released to his wife, Mariana Aguilar-Chachon. Mrs. Aguilar-Chachon signed the Potential Liability form and was given her own copy.
