Vincent,

Could you please pass this request on to the Public Works Department? As you know, CCHS is developing "Castle on the Hill" Sculpture Park and one of the Camden High tower turrets is to be delivered within 2 weeks (delayed due to snow storms in March). There are two trees that present a problem to developing the park and I have attached photos. The first dead tree blocks a curb cut and the delivery entrance for the very large architectural elements from the high school demolition. The South Jersey Port Corporation will be providing the transportation. Second, the large tree in the back corner beyond our fence hangs ominously with dead limbs over the Camden Water System well head, part of the Camden High Baseball Field, and our new to-be-developed park. Can you pass this request on to the Public Works Department to cut the street tree to ground level and cut the large dead branches endangering the City water system well head, the baseball players and the new park in the making?

Thank you and Public Works for your consideration. I have copied CCHS Board Member Steve Ayscue as our government liaison.
