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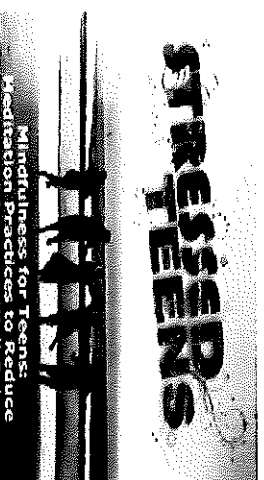

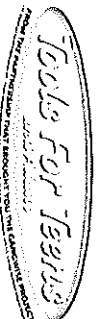

Anthony V. Pierro: Anthony V. Pierro is the Chief Juvenile Attorney of the Juvenile Justice Division of the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office located in Toms River, New Jersey. Mr. Pierro earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminal Justice from Seton Hall University and his Juris Doctor, *Magna Cum Laude*, from New England Law-Boston.

Anthony has been Chief of the Juvenile Justice Division since 2003. During that time he has been involved in a variety of initiatives aimed at the prevention and reduction of juvenile delinquency. In addition to his primary responsibility of prosecuting juvenile offenders, he speaks at conferences across the country regarding the juvenile prosecutor's role in juvenile justice reform and the many ethical dilemmas facing the juvenile prosecutor. Anthony has also been invited to speak nationally on the topics of disproportionate minority contact and access to treatment in the juvenile justice system; and at colleges and universities on the issues of juvenile law, policy, and competency. Anthony continues to be active locally throughout Ocean County's schools delivering presentations ranging from Bullying Prevention and Gang Violence to Safe Driving Alternatives.

In 2014 Anthony was appointed by New Jersey Governor Chris Christie to the New Jersey Governor's Juvenile Justice & Delinquency Prevention Committee and is also currently a member of the New Jersey Council on Juvenile Justice System Improvement. In 2013 Anthony was selected as a member of the Juvenile Prosecutor's Leadership Network, National Juvenile Justice Prosecution Center, Georgetown University, which serves as a small group of the most innovative and dedicated juvenile justice prosecutors. Anthony remains active on numerous state and local committees and is a member of

the New Jersey Attorney General's Education and Law Enforcement Working Group, the Ocean County Council on Juvenile Justice System Improvement and the Ocean County Human Services Advisory Council. He is also the President of the Ocean County Juvenile Officer's Association and is a Certified Instructor by the New Jersey Division of Criminal Justice Police Training Commission.

Lt. Shaun O'Keefe: Has served with the Toms River Township Police Department for 21 years. Lt. O'Keefe experience includes Patrol / Emergency Services Unit, Narcotic / Street Crimes Units, Ocean County Prosecutor's Office Narcotic Strike Force, Toms River Police Department Special Enforcement Team.

A graduate of the Drug Enforcement Administration's Drug Unit Commanders Academy. Lt. O'Keefe was named the 2004 Ocean County Narcotic Officer of the Year.

Lt. O'Keefe, is a resident of Toms River, where he lives with his wife Jill and their two children.

James Patten: Jim holds a Masters degree in Social Work from Rutgers University and is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker. He is one of the original Student Assistance Counselors in New Jersey and has been developing alcohol and drug prevention programs for the Toms River School District for over 30 years. He was recently named "Employee of the Year" by the Toms River board of education and Student Assistance Counselor of the year by the Association of Student Assistance Professionals. He is currently the Student Assistance Coordinator at Toms River North High School.

Background: Available in all 50 states for adults, peer support is considered best practice by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration (SAMHSA). Research shows that peer support:

- Reduces triggers and relapses
- Increases social support and participation in the community
- Increases access to substance abuse services
- Decreases length of inpatient treatment and cost of services
- Decreased stigma, improved self-esteem and social functioning

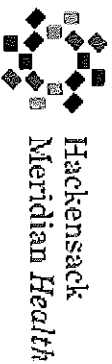

Subject: Toms River Support & Health Coalition Update

Good Afternoon,

There have been several changes since the last Substance Abuse Subcommittee Meeting on 9/12. Lee Karen has stepped away as the Subcommittee Chair but will remain an active subcommittee member. I assumed the Chair position with Jill Messina as Co-Chair.

As of 9/12, the subcommittee had yet to produce realistic, measurable goals for this project. With the feedback Jill and I received after the meeting, we created the attached goals. They have room for some tweaking/additional ideas but they are this subcommittee's goals moving forward. The overwhelming consensus was the most imminent issue seen in our community is treatment not readily accessible to those suffering with Substance Use Disorder. These residents are often at the highest risk for overdose. We recognize the need for SUD education and will continue to overlap the Mental Health subcommittee who is heavily school based focused. Please review the attached goals, think about how you/your agency can contribute and provide feedback.

Attendance was low at today's meeting. If there is a more accommodating day/time, please let me know ASAP as we would like to reconvene in approximately 2 weeks. We also did not want to name the projects or create a hashtag without feedback from the group.

I look forward to your input.
