Call To Order And Roll Call

Attendance was taken by roll call. A sign in sheet was available to the attendees.

No Approval of Minutes

Reports

Kelsay Stephensen, Health Education & Outreach

Kelsay Stephensen reported there are three new free Evidence Based Programs provided by the Ocean County Health Department: Parenting Wisely, 1st Special for 3rd and 4th graders and Footprints for Life. Kimberly Reilly suggested if any facilities are running summer camp at the YMCA or at the library these programs would be a great addition. Flyers were made available to the committee. Some members requested electronic copy of the program and flyer.

Kimberly Reilly, County Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Coordinator

Kimberly Reilly reported the Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services has changed the rates for the two day IDRC class from \$230 to \$264 effective April 1, 2015.

Kimberly discussed the IME Referrals

The DMHAS is looking at the DUI and SJI encumbering issue which may change in July 1st when the IMC begins. The cap for the two totals of funds may remain the same.

PACADA was emailed the flow chart for the IME.

Kimberly reiterated that the Health Department has HIV Counseling, Testing and Referral services. The Health Department is available to go to your location to setup testing. Please contact Kimberly Reilly if interested.

Anthony Castellano, PACADA Chairman - No Report

Suzanne Kossman, Drug Court

Suzanne Kossman reported that the next Drug Court graduation is May 19th. There will be 13 people graduating. Drug Court started a new incentive, where the Drug Court team could nominate someone for the month, on each probation officer's case load. Presently there are about 437 people currently being supervised at Drug Court.

Evelyn Sullivan - The Facing Addiction Task Force. No Report

The Facing Addiction Task Force will meet again on March 25th.

Roberto Flecha, PAC

Roberto Flecha reported that he did not attend last month's PAC meeting. The DMHAS did discuss the referral system.

Joni Whehan, Hendricks/Hansen House, South Jersey Coalition

Joni Whehan reported that the last SJI meeting had a better attendance. The committee decided to continue the SJI meetings. No date was discussed for the next meeting. An email will be sent out with the information.

Donna DeStefano, Prevention First, & Opiate Task Force
Donna discussed the Post NARCAN pilot program that the Ocean County Task Force is hoping to start up on April 1, 2015. Dr. Tunega has his information in the computer program for the emotional intelligence component of the program. There will be follow-up after the 12 weeks. The NARCAN program is for adults 18 and over. This will be an outpatient program, structured for 6 days a week and there will be Suboxone medication. The program is all private and grant funding.

Round Table

Michele Miller, Alcohol and Drug Abuse Counselor, announced to date the OCHD has admitted 120 persons for inpatient treatment with most referrals for opiates (heroin) and alcohol. For alcohol admissions, the average age is 40 to 50.

Richard Fallon, Lighthouse at Mays Landing, announced there is still Sandy Grant funding for Ocean County adolescents that are under the age of 18 in need of detox. If they were in Ocean County at the time of Sandy, they would qualify for the funding. Richard mentioned the problem Florida is having issues with the powdered alcohol.

Dave Roden, New Hope Foundation, Inc., reported the facility has halfway house services, for women, Epiphany House and for men Phillip and Mattie House and also halfway house for women and children. Dave wanted to raise awareness that people are coming to the inpatient with catastrophic insurance plans.

Evelyn Sullivan, Daytop Village of New Jersey, reported in the Pittsgrove residential there are currently have 6 kids from Ocean County. On March 25, 2015, there will be a ribbon cutting in the Manahawkin facility. Governor Christie will be the Keynote speaker. Evelyn also thanked Lighthouse for all their help. Frank Zrinsky, LACADA commented, appreciated being a LACADA representative on the PACADA.

Roger Desch, Discovery Institute for Addictive Disorders, announced there are all services available for men including halfway house and detox. For females there are outpatient, intensive outpatient and detox services and also four Drug Court beds.

Toni Whelan, Hendricks/Hansen House, announced the facility is doing a little restructuring, referral calls can go to Hendricks House and they will do the screenings and decide which house has the available bed.

William Wilder, Seashore Family Services, reported the facility opened an adolescent service in Toms River for Intensive Outpatient and Outpatient service.

Kurtis Rowe, Sunrise House, reported the facility is busy and full.

Donna DeStefano, Prevention First, reported having a meeting with the Monmouth County Prosecutor and Douglas Collier, DEA who are working together on the "Do No Harm" seminar on June 9, 10, and 11. Prevention First still has the Verizon grant to provide prevention services to Monmouth and Ocean County.

Jennifer Marziale, Barnabas Health/Institute for Prevention, the facility is sponsoring a pharmacy training on March 21st at Community Medical Center. There are over 100 pharmacists attending statewide. Douglas Collier and Prosecutor Coronato are attending. It should be a very exciting event.

Krista DeFilippo, Barnabas Health/Institute For Prevention, announced their prevention program is up and running in Ocean County, Barnegat, Lacey Elementary School, and the Walnut Street School in Toms River. Scott Subelka, Ocean County Probation, reported Adult and Juvenile Supervision are at full staff. The case loads have stabilized.

Roman Karpel, Maryville, Inc., reported the facility is very busy, they have a lot of Drug Court clients but not from Ocean County.

Kim Veith, Ocean Mental Health, the Co-occurring Partial Care is busy so there is wait time. OP and IOP are doing well, we also now have Level I for adolescent. The facility is providing evaluations for the Youth Service Commission, just fee for service.

New Business

Kimberly Reilly reported that PACADA should review the PACADA By-laws for a motion at the May meeting. Also, that suggestions for topics for the July PACADA/PAC Networking and November PACADA Conference should be emailed.

Joni Whelan, Hendricks/Hansen House, on May 23, 2015 at the Atlantic City Boardwalk there is going to be an Anti-Human Trafficking, walk for freedom. Support and join in the walk.

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Ocean County Trauma Informed Treatment Training Initiative

Training and Consultation for Clinicians in Evidence-Based Trauma Interventions

Seeking Safety – A present-focused therapy to help people attain safety from trauma/PTSD and substance abuse, for individuals or groups, adolescents and adults. The treatment is available as a book, providing both client handouts and guidance for clinicians, which includes a total of 25 treatment topics. The treatment was designed for flexible use in a variety of settings, for both substance abuse and dependence, and has been used with people who have a trauma history but do not meet criteria for PTSD. Some programs/agencies in Ocean have this training.

50 clinicians, 2-day initial session followed by telephonic consultation for 12 months and a 1 day follow-up session. Includes training DVDs for 10 agencies. **Trauma-Focused CBT** – For children and their families, is an alternative treatment approach delivered individually or in groups designed to help children and adolescents who have experienced trauma overcome PTSD, depression, and other behavioral and emotional difficulties. Emphasizes support and involved of parents/ caregivers and effective parent-child communication.

40 clinicians, 4-day session followed by telephonic consultation for 6-12 months. **Preschool PTSD Treatment** – 12-session manualized treatment protocol using a

strategic combination of CBT (relaxation training, graded systematic exposure, and homework) and parent-child relational treatment suited for the developmental needs of very young children (age 3-6). Can be focused on PTSD symptoms (depression, separation anxiety, oppositional defiant behavior, parent depression) from any type of trauma. Adaptations for children up to 12 years. 15 clinicians, 2-day session followed by telephonic consultation for 6-12 months. * Each clinician must agree to serve 4 non-violent justice-involved clients during grant period. Receives all materials and training at no cost.

Training and Consultation for Justice & Mental Health Professionals in Evidence-Based Trauma Informed Approaches to Care

Risking Connection – Teaches a relational framework and skills for working with

survivors of trauma. The focus is on relationship as healing and on self-care with emphasis on empowerment, connection, and collaboration. For all levels of staff in diverse settings including corrections, substance abuse, children's programs, non-degreed direct care, advanced degrees, and front line staff. Total of 80 individuals in two classes of 40, 2.5-day sessions followed by 12-16 months telephonic consultation and a 1-day follow up session.

Professional Orientation to introduce each of the 4 training models for potential trainees and referents, discuss local and State initiatives regarding trauma

Community Awareness Event to raise awareness about trauma, its influence on behavior, the interaction with mental illness and delinquency/ criminal behavior, and appropriate treatment

Data Analyst to track treatment fidelity, outcome measures, and federal reporting requirements

PACADA - BY-LAWS

OCEAN COUNTY PROVIDERS ADVISORY COMMITTEE
ON ALCOHOLISM AND DRUG ABUSE

ARTICLE I

Section A Authorization and Appointment

- A.1 In accordance with the By-laws of the Ocean County Local Advisory Committee on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse (L.A.C.A.D.A.), it has been determined there shall be a providers advisory committee consisting of not less than five (5) members. This committee shall be approved by the Local Advisory Committee on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse (L.A.C.A.D.A.)
- A.2 The name of this provider's committee shall be the Providers Advisory Committee on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse (P.A.C.A.D.A.).
- A.3 A representative of each agency that receives funds from the L.A.C.A.D.A. must be a member.

Section B Purpose

- B.1 The purpose of this committee shall be to advise the L.A.C.A.D.A. on appropriate methods and techniques which can be used to prevent and treat alcohol, tobacco and other drug abuse (ATOD). This purpose will be served through the performance of research on substance abuse problems, and through policy and program recommendations designed to address substance abuse problems including, prevention, early intervention, treatment, recovery supports and co-occurring disorders.

- B.2 The goals of the Committee shall be as follows:

- 2.1 Advise L.A.C.A.D.A. on the establishment and maintenance of a County Plan for the treatment and/or prevention of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs of abuse as well as co-occurring disorders.
- 2.2 Evaluate the impact which existing programs have on the prevalence and incidence of ATOD abuse, as well as persons at-risk
- 2.3 Increase public awareness of the dangers of ATOD abuse.

ARTICLE II **POWERS AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

Section A Powers

- A.1 The powers of the Committee are derived from the authority invested in the Local Advisory Committee on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse as derived from the Board of Chosen Freeholders. The Committee therefore has the power to advise the L.A.C.A.D.A. on those matters expressly pertaining to the treatment and prevention of ATOD abuse.

Section B. Responsibilities

- B.1 In order to provide appropriate advice to the L.A.C.A.D.A., the Committee must have certain responsibilities which relate to the performance of essential research, and the establishment of appropriate treatment modalities and other public service strategies/project designed to control, abate and otherwise manage ATOD abuse. The responsibilities of the Committee are enumerated below.

- 1.1 Assist and advise the L.A.C.A.D.A. in coordinating all phases of plan development for the County's treatment and prevention programs.
- 1.2 Attend meetings within the County or the State on matters pertaining to the County's Comprehensive Plan and system for administering treatment and prevention of ATOD abuse.

- 1.3 Increase public awareness of the dangers of ATOD abuse.
- 1.4 Ensure coordination with local public and private agencies concerned with ATOD prevention and treatment in the development and implementation of the County's comprehensive plan.

ARTICLE III COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS, STRUCTURE, THE ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES

Section A Committee Appointments

- A.1 Members of the committee that are funding providers are appointed by the L.A.C.A.D.A by virtue of being given funding for that calendar year. All other community members that are on PACADA will be given the by-laws upon becoming a member and must adhere to the requirements.

- 1.1 The executive committee will serve a two (2) year term.
- 1.2 Attendance will be monitored by Ocean County Health Department staff. If a member fails to meet the attendance requirement, a letter of interest in continued participation will be sent in the beginning of the new calendar year.

Section B Committee Structure

- B.1 The Committee shall have officers and appropriate committees to ensure adequate performance and coordination of work assigned by the L.A.C.A.D.A.

- 1.1 The officers of the Committee shall be Chairperson and two Co-Chair positions.
- 1.2 The office of the Chairperson shall not be held by the same individual for more than one (1) consecutive term. A term being defined as two years.
- 1.3 The Chairperson shall appoint such standing or ad hoc committees as may be required either by statute or the business of the Committee.
- 1.4 The Executive Committee shall consist of current officers of the Providers Advisory on Alcoholism Committee and the County Coordinator of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Services. The Committee will meet at the call of the Chairperson and Coordinator to transact any necessary business that will not conflict with the duties of the entire Committee.
- 1.5 One member of the L.A.C.A.D.A. shall serve as a non-voting member of the Providers Advisory Committee on Alcohol and Drug Abuse.

Section C The Election of Officers

- C.1 The Committee shall conduct an election on an annual basis at the second meeting of the calendar year.
- 1.1 A nominating committee will be comprised of participants that volunteer to take on the task of determining the executive board for upcoming terms. The committee will be made at the January meeting.
- 1.2 The nominating committee shall be responsible for informing Committee members of the election and soliciting nominations for available offices.
- 1.3 The nominating committee shall screen all nominees for available offices, determine committee nominations for each available office and recommend a slate of officers to the full Committee at the second meeting of the calendar year.
- 1.4 If there is only one officer for each position, the names will be given at the second meeting of the calendar year for a motion and a vote. If there are several candidates then the election of each office shall be by secret ballot and the result shall be provided in the meeting where the election is held.

Section D Committee Officers and Their Duties

D.1 The Committee shall elect a Chairperson and two co-chairs.

- 1.1 The Chairperson will preside at Committee meetings, appoint committees and chairpersons and present the annual recommendations on the comprehensive plan to the L.A.C.A.D.A.
- 1.2 The co-chairs shall assume the duties of the Chairperson when that person is unable or unwilling to serve, and shall otherwise assume duties as assigned by the Chairperson on a routine basis.
- 1.3 The LACADA representative is a non-voting member that will be a liaison between the PACADA and LACADA bringing important information and issues to the meetings.
- 1.4 The Secretary will be from the Ocean County Health Department Alcohol and Drug Unit and shall be responsible for notifying all Committee Members of meetings, for maintaining a record of Committee business, for determining attendance at Committee meetings and for the editing and the distribution of minutes and notification to Committee members on absenteeism. This is a non-voting member.

ARTICLE IV MEETINGS, ATTENDANCE AND VOTING

Section A Regular and Special Meetings

A.1 The Committee must attend four (4) meetings including the Annual Networking Session Meeting but not including the Annual PACADA/PAC Conference.

- 1.1 Committee members shall be notified of the regular meeting at least five (5) working days in advance by regular mail or e-mail with receipt acknowledged at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the meeting. The Secretary will insure that a quorum is probable and shall inform the Chairperson of which and how many members will be in attendance.
- 1.2 A quorum shall be required to conduct all business. A quorum shall be at least 50% of the Committee membership, excluding vacancies

Section B Special Meetings

B.1 Special meetings may be called by the Chairperson, or one-third of the Committee membership.

- 1.1 Committee members shall be given at least forty-eight (48) hours notice when a special meeting is required.
- 1.2 Business conducted at a special meeting, shall be limited to items expressed in the notice of the meeting.

Section C Attendance

C.1 As per the Annex A, all funded providers are required to attend at least seventy-five (75%) of PACADA meetings during the contract period.

- 1.1 Failure to comply shall result in the Chairperson requesting the L.A.C.A.D.A. replace the member in question.
- 1.2 Exceptions to the attendance requirements shall be long term illness, personal and/or professional crises, or a leave of absence granted by the L.A.C.A.D.A. at the request of the Committee Chairperson or the member in question.

Section D Voting

- D.1 All PACADA membership members (not others in attendance) must identify one (1) primary member and one (1) designated alternative. Each funded provider is entitled to one vote per issue.
- D.2 All members on the main roster for PACADA are voting members. Those that are others in attendance are not voting members.

ARTICLE V COMMITTEE MEMBERSHIP COMPOSITION AND COMMITTEES

Section A Composition and Membership

- A.1 The Committee shall be composed of no less than five (5) and no more than twenty-five (25) members.
- A.2 Members shall be selected from a variety of organizations concerned with providing services for Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug Abuse.

Section B Committees

- B.1 The Committee shall organize at least two (2) committees, one to assume responsibility for education and prevention activities and the other to assume responsibility for rehabilitation and treatment activities.
- 1.1 The Committee Chairperson shall be responsible for establishing all other committees, either permanent or ad hoc and with approval of a majority of Committee members.

ARTICLE VI WORK PROCEDURE AND AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS

Section A

All Committee sessions shall be conducted in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order.

Section B

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the L.A.C.A.D.A. or P.A.C.A.D.A. Committee by affirmative vote of two-thirds of those present, provided the call to the meetings has stated that an amendment to the By-laws is to be voted upon, and named the Article and Section number affected if each exists; if none exists, then a brief description of the subject matter shall be given.

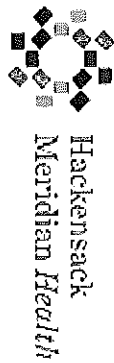

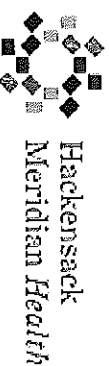

Safe Haven: We will hold a meeting with faith based leadership when blueprint is approved and we are ready to go live.

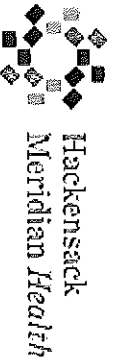

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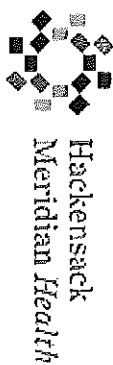
