I thought the Stockton study and report on MLK in Camden was academically impressive - yet incomplete - how could you spend so much money and not conduct any original interviews - except one?

As an academic paper it might get an A - but the purpose was to establish MLK's residency in Camden - that he himself does in listing his 753 Walnut Street address on the legal complaint.

The recollections of other residents of him being there and McCall's relationship with the owner solidify the fact he lived there in the back bedroom whose regular occupant - according to this 1998 newspaper account - was away in the army for two years.

His return on the very day MLK and McCall went to Maple Shade and were warned not to go - is emphasized by King's determination that they had to be able to "go anywhere."

The idea that because most of the books and bios of King fail to mention his time in Camden and the Maple Shade incident at Mary's Place only makes these facts more deeply significant rather than depreciating, as you make it seem as "the best possibility."

Instead of certifying King's time in Camden as an important but neglected period and the Maple Shade incident as King's first legal entanglement and what sparked him to make civil rights a part of his ministry is extremely significant. But you belittle it - and only belittle yourselves. I think the Stockton study is incomplete and should be continued and properly conducted with interviews and oral histories as it should have been.

This story did not begin with Patrick Duff - but you should have paid him for all the real research he did and you failed to do.

The Camden house will be saved, restored and made into the backbone of a new, revised community, but not because of anything you did, and still can do.

In addition - if you are serious about MLK's time in South Jersey please try to locate the lost tape recording of his landmark speech to the Quaker conference in Cape May where he spoke of adopting non-violent protests as a means of social change.

Now that would be significant.

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As an academic paper it might get an A - but the purpose was to establish MLK's residency in Camden - that he himself does in listing his 753 Walnut Street address on the legal complaint.

The recollections of other residents of him being there and McCall's relationship with the owner solidify the fact he lived there in the back bedroom whose regular occupant - according to this 1998 newspaper account - was away in the army for two years.

His return on the very day MLK and McCall went to Maple Shade and were warned not to go - is emphasized by King's determination that they had to be able to "go anywhere."

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The idea that because most of the books and bios of King fail³⁶² mention his time in Camden and the Maple Shade incident at

Mary's Place only makes these facts more deeply significant rather than depreciating, as you make it seem as "the best possibility."

Instead of certifying King's time in Camden as an important but neglected period and the Maple Shade incident as King's first legal entanglement and what sparked him to make civil rights a part of his ministry is extremely significant. But you belittle it - and only belittle yourselves. I think the Stockton study is incomplete and should be continued and properly conducted with interviews and oral histories as it should have been.

This story did not begin with Patrick Duff - but you should have paid him for all the real research he did and you failed to do.

The Camden house will be saved, restored and made into the backbone of a new, revised community, but not because of anything you did, and still can do.

In addition - if you are serious about MLK's time in South Jersey please try to locate the lost tape recording of his landmark speech to the Quaker conference in Cape May where he spoke of adopting non-violent protests as a means of social change.

Now that would be significant.
