I should tell you that when I found out NJDOT intended to demolish the old tavern on Camden Avenue, I made an 11th hour effort to save it, but the bulldozers won out. I was well aware of what that building meant to MLK's career as an activist for civil rights.

Regarding the house in Camden, I remain a bit of a skeptic. I have viewed the police report and the Nichols statement a couple of years ago and noted that the crossed out address for MLK was the same as McCall's address. I have heard the stories from the Hunts that he lived at 753 while attending Crozer Seminary, but I have also heard they recanted the accounts of MLK's days in Camden. I have extensive experience working on black history in southern New Jersey, but as a documentary historian, I have learned that I cannot rely solely on the oral traditions of people, which is more often than not incorrect. What I have suggested to several people now concerning MLK and 753 Walnut is to contact the newly minted Congressman, Donald Norcross, and work with his staff to have the United States Census Bureau research the address in the 1950 federal decennial census population schedules for Camden. This story is too important not to do all the 's and cross all the t's. The event at the tavern and the 1950 enumeration should coincide and it would be vitally important to find documentation to back up the story. The 1950 census will not be released for public access for another seven years, but the census bureau will conduct limited research for a compelling reason arises and MLK's presence in the city is very compelling, in my opinion.

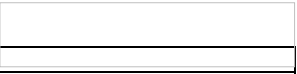

Timeline of 1945-1961

- September of 1945: K ng starts h s schoo ng at Morehouse co ege after graduat ng from High Schoo at the age of 15.
- 1945, date unknown: McCa g ves K ng a ha rcut but K ng forgot h s money. Th s caused a wrest ng match between the two where K ng bested McCa , caus ng McCa to ga n respect for the younger and sma er K ng, and they soon became best fr ends. For years to come they were known as “Mac and Mke”.
- May of 1948, Morehouse Co ege: K ng and McCa graduate from co ege and both dec de to go to Crozer Theo og ca Sem nary, n Up and, PA. K ng s Father bestows upon h s son a Brand new Cad ac to drive h mse f and McCa to Crozer.
- June of 1948, Haverford Co ege: K ng and fe ow Morehouse Graduate, June Butts work w th Dr. Ira Dea Re d earn ng nterv ew techn ques. They ater trave ed around the south and nterv ewed b ack preachers dur ng the summer months.
- September of 1948, Crozer and 753 Wa nut: K ng starts h s fr st semester as a student at Crozer. One semester ater he s jo ned by McCa . Most b ographers thought McCa stayed n At anta and fo owed K ng after need ng to save enough money for tu t on, wh ch s ha f true. Instead, McCa was stay ng at 753 Wa nut Street and work ng n Camden, NJ as a subst tute teacher to save money.
- 1948, Camden Schoo D str ct, date yet unknown: Wa ter McCa nterv ew w th Herbert Homes: McCa states that “I worked for three months n the pub c schoo system n Camden, NJ” Th s shows that McCa was stay ng n Camden n 1948 and that he was not n the At anta area as has been prev ous y wr tten n the h story books. The ma “Hunt”, Daughter of Benjam n Hunt, says that McCa worked as a subst tute teacher n the Camden Schoo s.
- 1948, 753 Wa nut Street n Camden, Quotes by Benjam n Hunt, L y Hunt and The ma Lawrey: A report K ng and McCa as stay ng at 753 Wa nut off and on for about 2 years.
- October of 1949, Zon Bapt st Church n Camden:, date yet unknown, Cour er Post art c e: K ng s Crozer c assmate, Rev. LLoyd Burrus, becomes pastor at Zon Bapt st Church.
- Spr ng of 1950, date yet unknown: Dr. K ng hears Mordeca Johnson, who s sa d to be one of the most pro f c orators of the 20th century, speak n Ph ade ph a at a fe owsh p house meet ng, after the speech Dr. K ng went out and bought every book on Gandh and h s techn ques of nonv o ence that he cou d f nd. In these teach ngs he wou d earn about such th ngs as “s t ns”, an dea that he wou d soon emp oy n h s own fe, and other forms of nonv o ent res stance.
- May of 1950, Crozer: K ng and McCa comp ete the r second year of sem nary schoo . It was ment oned n the Ph ade ph a Tr bune art c e that K ng and McCa were stay ng n the area after the schoo year for the summer to work on a project w th Dr. Ira Dea Re d at Haverford Co ege.
- June 11th, 1950 Mary s Cafe Sunday n ght: K ng, McCa , Pear E. Sm th and Dor s W son wak nto Mary s Cafe around 11:30 pm. Pear , Dor s and K ng a took a seat wh e McCa went up to the bar and asked for 1, or 2 quarts of beer and 4 g asses. The Bartender, Ernest Ncho s, de y responded, “Ncho s”. K ng ag n to quest on Ncho s as to whether he was n t serv ng them based on the r co or, so Ncho s responded by say ng t s ega to se packaged goods on a Sunday after 10 pm, and a quart of beer was cons dered packaged goods. So McCa , armed w th th s new b t of nformat on, wa ks back

- up to the bar and says that he wants 4 beers or 4 Gnger Aes, Ncho s asks them to leave and they decided to perform a s t n. Ncho s oses t and begs to ye at K ng and h s group. A coup e of wh te co ege students from Penn tr ed to ca m down Ncho s and have them served, but Ncho s goes back to h s apartment and grabs a gun. He returns to the bar where K ng and h s group were st eated. He points the 45 n McCa s face and orders them out but they st refused to eave. Ncho s takes one step out the front door and fres the gun off a coup e of t mes nto the a r and screams “I K for Less”. At th s po nt, w th the r ves be ng threatened, the four eave the bar and go to the Map e Shade po ce stat on.
- June 11th 11:45 pm: Map e Shade Po ce Stat on: K ng and the group go to the po ce stat on to f e charges. Pear Sm th s quoted as say ng “we attempted to prefer charges”. My be ef s the po ce refused to prefer charges, caus ng Dr. K ng to reach out for some he p. Benjam n Hunt s quoted as say ng that “It was K ng s dea to ca a doctor who was very act ve n c v r ghts”, and that doctor was Dr. U ysses S. W gg ns. Hunt a so sa d that they got ocked up that n ght, wh ch cou d have been the reason why W gg ns eft h s home n the m dd e of the n ght. W gg ns was one of the peop e respons b e for he p ng to make sure that the new y drafted NJ Const tut on, wh ch was mp emented n 1947, nc uded a sect on mak ng refusa of serv ce based upon co or ega .
 - June 12th, 1950 12:45 am: Map e Shade Po ce Stat on: Pres dent of the Camden NAACP comes to he p K ng and the group prefer charges. K ng s sa d to have been ntroduced to W gg ns by Loyd Burrus, a fe ow C assmate of K ng and McCa at Crozer and the pastor at Zon Bapt st Church n Camden, wh ch was on y b ocks from Dr. W gg ns house, and a so a p ace that K ng preached at severa t mes. A comp a nt s f ed for the refusa of serv ce, some one hour and 15 m nutes after the nc dent occurred. The nterest ng part of the actua comp a nt was the charge was or g na y wr tten “Refusa to serve a coho c beverage n pub c p ace”, but the word “a coho c” was ater crossed out, most ke y by the mag strate judge. Th s s nterest ng because the very comp a nt tsef was attempt ng to ncr m nate K ng and h s group by say ng they were try ng to buy a coho on a Sunday after 10. Another nterest ng part of the comp a nt was the address that K ng sted as h s home, wh ch was 753 Wa nut St. Camden, NJ. Wh ch we now know was h s part t me res dence wh e he attended Crozer. We a so know that c asses had ended at Crozer for over a month at th s po nt n June, so t s safe to assume that he was stay ng at the address he sted on the sworn po ce comp a nt at that t me.
 - June 12th, 1950 ater n the morn ng, Map e Shade Mun c pa Court: The restaurant owner, Ernest Ncho s, appears before Judge Percy Char ton w th h s attorney Thomas McGann. McGann asks for a contnuat on and the hear ng s postponed t Thursday n ght, June, 15th.
 - June 15th, 1950 Thursday n ght, Map e Shade mun c pa court house: A forma comp a nt s made aga nst Ncho s for brand sh ng a weapon, us ng obscene nguage and refusa of serv ce. Ernest Ncho s s hed on \$500 ba y Judge Char ton on for the refusa charge and found gu ty on the brand sh ng a weapon and obscene nguage charges and pa d a \$50 f ne. The refusa charge s sent to the Grand Jury for further proceed ngs. K ng and McCa are represented by Robert Burk Johnson who s ass sted by U ysses S. W gg ns. Three wh te w tnesses test fy on beha f of K ng and h s group, say ng they tr ed to ca m down Ncho s and have them served. Th s shows that the wh te peop e were be ng served at the same t me he refused to serve K ng and the group, otherw se, why wou d they ask K ng s group be served?
 - June 16th, 1950, C aymont DE: K ng s arrested for speed ng n C aymont De aware on h s way to h s Brother s wedd ng. H s brother's wedd ng was on the next day, so K ng was rush ng back to make sure he was there, espec a y cons der ng he was the best man.
 - June 17th, 1950: Ph ade ph a Tr bune art c e about the Map e Shade s tuat on. K ng s sted as Mchae K ng. Other art c es from the same t me per od about K ng have h s name sted as Mart n Luther K ng Jr., or M.L. K ng Jr, but th s c ear y states h s name as Mchae, why? The art c e a so states they were be ng he ped by Dr. W gg ns, who they were ntroduced to through LLoyd Burrus.
 - June 20th, 1950: Ph ade ph a Tr bune art c e about the map e shade nc dent where K ng s sted aga n as, Mchae .
 - Unknown date: Camden NAACP f ed a awsu t aga nst the restaurant owner for d scr m nat on. I be eve th s was done to ga n some everage because McCa faced be ng nd cted too for try ng to buy what cou d be cons dered packaged goods on a Sunday after 10pm.
 - Ju y 1st, 1950: Ba t more Afro Amer can art c e about the nc dent. K ng s myster ous y eft out of the art c e. Dr. U ysses W gg ns s quoted at say ng “Our organ zat on expects to aunch a dr ve soon aga nst pub c p aces wh ch refuse accommodat ons so e y on the bas s of race and co or”. W gg ns wou d ater go on to ead a dr ve n the Southern NJ area to he p desegregate p aces of pub c accommodat on. Prov ng that th s event was not just s gn f cant to K ng as a person, but a so to southern NJ as a cata yst.
 - August 28th, 1950, Bur ngton County Detect ves off ce, Mount Ho y NJ: Pear Sm th g ves an nterv ew to Bur ngton County Ch ef Detect ve, C fford D. Ca n, and n do ng so she ncr m nates McCa by say ng he was try ng to buy “one, or two quarts of beer, and four g asses”, and adm tt ng t was a Sunday after 10 pm. She a so te s the story of what happened ns de Mary s cafe that n ght. Pear , who was sted n a of the art c es found about her as Mrs. Pear Sm th, was a po ce woman at the t me, and wou d have known that her statement ncr m nated McCa . Interest ng y, Detect ve Ca n was under an nvest gat on of h s own for ook ng the other way on a Cas no that operated out of Map e Shade for many years unt t was busted r ght around the same t me of th s nc dent.
 - Date unknown, p ace unknown: A short wh e after Pear g ves the statement, the case s dropped by K ng and McCa , and they a wa k away. McCa says the case was thrown out when three wh te w tnesses refused to test fy, K ng says that t was two wh te w tnesses. McGann says that t was K ng and McCa that refused to show up. McCa a so sa d n that K ng and h msef cou dn t act as the r own p a nt ff and defense at the grand jury, wh ch shows that they were a so fac ng be ng charged at the grand jury. Was t that the wh te students who or g na y test f ed on the r beha f d not show up, as K ng and McCa sa d? Or was t K ng and McCa who dec ded to not r sk be ng nd cted at the grand jury and wa ked away? It be ng 1950, and them be ng Afr can Amer can s, t was probab y best not to take that chance.
 - Between September and December of 1950, Crozer Campus: K ng begs to court the g r fr end of one of h s professors, Kenneth Lee Sm th, and wound up w nn ng her heart. Her name was Betty Moatz, she was the daughter of the cook on campus and she a so just happened to be wh te. K ng fe n ove and asked for her to marry h m. H s fr ends and mentors stressed that he cou d not poss b y return to the south w th a wh te w fe, Moatz, a so thought the same, and they had to g e off. The angered K ng sa d Moatz, but he went through w th t n the end and they broke t off.
 - January 6th, 1951: Cour er Post c pp ng show ng Wa ter McCa gave a sermon at Zon Bapt st Ch h n Camden, NJ

- January 13th, 1951 2:20 pm: Courier Post clipping showing Dr. King gave a sermon at Zion Baptist Church in Camden, NJ. The oral history of the church has spoke about Dr. King visiting and preaching there, but this clipping so defined it.
- September 15th 1952: Courier Post clipping showing Dr. King and Walter McCa were guests for the weekend at Zion Baptist Church in Camden, NJ. This is the last documented time of King in Camden.
- October 28th, 1961: Philadelphia Tribune Article with Dr. King speaking about what happened in Maple Shade. King said it was a very painful experience because they decided to "sit in". This proves that this was the first recorded time in which King would perform a sit in.
- 1960s, unknown date: Thomas McGann reports hearing a report by Fulton Lewis Jr that said Dr. King's interest in civil rights began while he was staying with friends in Camden and he was refused service at a restaurant in the suburbs of the city. This caused McGann to call Robert Burk Johnson to ask him to look into his files and see if he had the case they had together. Johnson called McGann back and confirmed that it was Dr. King who was involved in the incident.
- 1970 interview with Walter McCa : McCa very clearly states that the first civil rights struggle Dr. King was in was in Maple Shade in the year 1950. He also states that he worked in the Camden, NJ school system for three months in 1948.
- 1976 article by George Anastasia: It is reported that the spokesperson for the SCLC said that Dr. King would frequently mention the situation in Maple Shade as what inspired him to become involved in civil rights.
- Jan 16th, 1981 article in the Courier Post by Eileen Stewe : Interview of Benjamin Hunt, cousin of Walter McCa , speaking about King and McCa living on and off at 753 Walnut St. in Camden, NJ. Reporter talks about seeing Dr. King in the pictures on the wall. Hunt states that he believed that what happened in Maple Shade started to change him into the leader he became.

Cast of characters associated with Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr

- **Water McCa :** McCa was one of King's closest friends. Before meeting King at Morehouse, McCa was in the Military. They met at as classmates at Morehouse College in 1945 and both chose to go to Crozer once they graduated. McCa was the barber for the Dorm and King got his haircut but forgot his money. This caused McCa and King to have a wrestling match outside of the Dorm, where King bested the older and bigger McCa. McCa and King would become great friends for years to come.
- **Herbert Holmes:** Herbert Holmes was hired by the King Center to provide interviews as a part of the oral history project for the remembrance of Dr. King.
- **Benjamin Hunt:** Hunt was cousins with Water McCa. He allowed for King and McCa to stay at his home (753 Walnut St. Camden, NJ) on and off for two years while they went to Crozer theological Seminary in Up and, PA.
- **L y Hunt:** Mrs. Hunt is the daughter in law of Benjamin Hunt. She was married to his Son, Jethroe Hunt, and would frequently see Dr. King at the home in Camden during a two and a half year period.
- **Rev. Lloyd Burrus:** Burrus also went to Crozer with King. Burrus was the Reverend of the Zion Baptist Church in Camden beginning in October of 1949. Burrus helped Dr. King get into contact with Dr. Wiggins. Burrus also allowed King to preach at his church in Camden.
- **The ma Lawrey:** The ma is the Daughter of Benjamin Hunt and a witness that ascertains that Dr. King lived at 753 Walnut. The ma lived at 753 Walnut Street during the time that King and McCa stayed at the home. She said that King and McCa were inseparable and were always together.
- **Mordecai Johnson:** Johnson was the President of Howard University and the person said to be responsible for convincing King that Gandhi's nonviolent methods could also work for black and brown people in America. Johnson is also said to be one of the most prolific orators of the 19th century.
- **Pearl E. Smith:** Smith was the second African American woman to become a Philadelphia Police Officer. She was sworn in in May of 1950 and was with King the night of the Maple Shade incident.
- **Doris Wilson:** Wilson, a Philadelphia social worker, was also with King the night of the Maple Shade incident.
- **Dr. Ulysses S. Wiggins:** Wiggins was the President of the Camden NAACP from 1941 to his death in 1966. Wiggins was one of the greatest civil rights activists in the NJ, even before he became President of the NAACP. He was responsible for getting thousands of black people jobs they would not otherwise have at industries in Camden that before Wiggins' intervention, either refused to hire black people or would only employ them in the unskilled positions. Wiggins was also partly responsible for helping to desegregate the Camden School System along with the areas in which black people could reside. Wiggins personally helped King and the group navigate the situation in Maple Shade and also filed a lawsuit against the restaurant owner for refusing to serve King and the three others.

- Robert Burk Johnson: Johnson was the lawyer for King and the other three, he was the first African American to serve as editor of the Penn Law Review, to be elected to the Camden School Board and also the first African American New Jersey Supreme Court Justice. Johnson also served as counsel for the Camden branch of the NAACP. McCauley is quoted as saying that Johnson was a good friend of his.
- Ernest Ncho s: Ncho s was a former German Soldier who fought in World War 1. He immigrated to America and later bought Mary's Cafe. Ncho s is the one who refused King service and threatened him and the group with a gun.
- Percy Charleston: Charleston was the Magistrate for Maple Shade. He is the one who officially charged Ncho s and also found him guilty of brandishing a weapon.
- Thomas McGann: McGann was the attorney for Ncho s after Ncho s refused King service. McGann later became a Judge in Burlington County and has written many times about the incident that took place in Maple Shade to King.
- Eileen Stewe: Stewe was a reporter for the Courier Post who wrote the story in 1981 entitled "City Man Housed Activist".
- George Anastasia: Anastasia wrote an article entitled "For Lack of a Beer--King rocked Americas bars" in 1976 about the incident in Maple Shade. In that article a spokesperson for the SCLC said that King "often recounted the incident as one example of what stirred his interest in the civil rights movement."

Instead, McCauley was staying at 753 Walnut Street and working in Camden, NJ as a substitute teacher to save money.
- 1948, Camden School District, date yet unknown: Walter McCauley interview with Herbert Homes: McCauley states that "I worked for three months in the public school system in Camden, NJ" This shows that McCauley was staying in Camden in 1948 and that he was not in the Atlanta area as has been previously written in the history books. The ma "Hunt", Daughter of Benjamin Hunt, says that McCauley worked as a substitute teacher in the Camden Schools.
- 1948, 753 Walnut Street in Camden, Quotes by Benjamin Hunt, Lily Hunt and Thelma Lawrey: A report King and McCauley as staying at 753 Walnut off and on for about 2 years.
- On February 23rd of 1949, Rev. King was a speaker at the fourth meeting of the Saturday Night Frolic Club's Teen Talk. The meeting was held at the [West Branch YMCA](#), 7th & Edgmont ave.
- On February 27th, 1949 9 a.m. Rev. King was again at the [West Branch YMCA](#) where he was a part of a radio program on WPWA called "Sunday Meditations" 7th & Edgmont ave.
- On February 27th, 1949 at 7:45 p.m. Rev. King was the speaker at a special Fellowship service that was held at [Prospect Hill Baptist Church](#). The announcement reads "to attend which addresses of community regardless of race, creed or color are invited". 703 Lincoln Avenue Prospect Park, PA 19076
- On March 9th, 1949 Rev. King was at the [Cavary Baptist Church](#) where he was the speaker as a part of "Missenary Group No. 3". 1612 West Second Street Chester, PA.
- On April 13th, 1949 Rev. King is at the [West Branch YMCA](#) giving a sermon on "My God. My God, Why Hast Thou Forsaken Me?" 7th & Edgmont ave.
- On April 15th, 1949 Rev. King was a part of the devotional service at [Murphy Ave Church](#). 700 Yarnall St. Chester, PA 19013

- October of 1949, Zon Baptist Church in Camden:, date yet unknown, Courier Post article: King's Crozer classmate, Rev. Lloyd Burrus, becomes pastor at Zon Baptist Church.
- On October 29th, 1949 10:30 a.m. Rev. King was a speaker at a youth rally which located at the [Grace Methodist Church](#) 1213 Central Ave. Chester, PA 19013
- On November 13th, 1949 at 11 a.m. Rev. King gave a sermon at Young People's Day at the [Soam Methodist Church](#), on 12th and Up and Streets.
- Jan 15th, 1950 2:45 pm Rev. King delivered a sermon to the young people at [Fifth Presbyterian Church](#) at 3rd and Tighman St. Chester, PA 19013
- On March 5th, 1950 at 8 p.m. Rev. King was a speaker at the [Fifth Presbyterian Church](#) for Men's day. 3rd and Tighman St. Chester, PA 19013
- On March 8th, 1950 Rev. King was a speaker at [Cavalry Baptist](#) Second and Baker
- On May 2nd, 1950, Pearl E. Smith's sworn in as the second African American woman to join the Philadelphia Police Force.
- On May 3rd, 1950 Rev. King spoke in Newark Delaware at the local NAACP Chapter meeting. Exact location still unknown.
- Spring of 1950, date yet unknown: Dr. King hears Mordecai Johnson, who is said to be one of the most prolific orators of the 20th century, speaking in Philadelphia at a fellowship house meeting, after the speech Dr. King went out and bought every book on Gandhi and his techniques of nonviolence that he could find. In these teachings he would learn about such things as "sit ins", an idea that he would soon employ in his own life, and other forms of nonviolent resistance.
- May of 1950, Crozer: King and McCa complete their second year of seminary school. It was mentioned in the Philadelphia Tribune article that King and McCa were staying in the area after school for the summer to work on a project with Dr. Ira Dea Reed at Haverford College.
- June 11th, 1950 at Mary's Cafe on a Sunday night in Maple Shade: King, McCa, Pearl E. Smith and Doris Wilson walk into Mary's Cafe around 11:30 pm. Pearl, Doris and King all took a seat while McCa went up to the bar and asked for 1, or 2 quarts of beer and 4 glasses. The Bartender, Ernest Nichols, rudely responded, "NO BEER". King began to question Nichols as to whether he wasn't serving them based on the color, so Nichols responded by saying this segregation to sell packaged goods on a Sunday after 10 pm, and a quart of beer was considered packaged goods. So McCa, armed with this new bit of information, walks back up to the bar and says that he wants 4 beers or 4 Ginger Ales, Nichols asks them to leave and they decided to perform a sit in. Nichols loses it and begins to yell at King and his group. A couple of white college students from Penn tried to calm down Nichols and have them served, but Nichols goes back to his apartment and grabs a gun. He returns to the bar where King and his group were still seated. He points the 45 in McCa's face and orders them out but they still refused to leave. Nichols takes one step out the front door and fires the gun off a couple of times into the air and screams "I Kill for Less". At this point, with the rifles being threatened, the four leave the bar and go to the Maple Shade police station.
- June 11th 11:45 pm: Maple Shade Police Station: King and the group go to the police station to file charges. Pearl Smith's quoted as saying "we attempted to pay charges". My belief is the police refused to pay charges, causing Dr. King to reach out for some help. Benjamin Hunt's quoted as saying that "it was King's idea to call a doctor who was very active in civil rights", and that doctor was Dr. Ulysses S. Wilson. Hunt also said that they got locked up that night, which could have been the reason why Wilson left his home in the middle of the night. Wilson was one of the people responsible for helping to make sure that the newly drafted NJ Constitution, which was implemented in 1947, included a section making refusal of service based upon color illegal.
- June 12th, 1950 12:45 am: Maple Shade Police Station: President of the Camden NAACP comes to help King and the group pay charges. King is said to have been introduced to Wilson by Lloyd Burrus, a fellow classmate of King and McCa at Crozer and the pastor at Zon Baptist Church in Camden, which was on blocks from Dr. Wilson's house, and as a space that King preached at several times. A complaint was filed for the refusal of service, some one hour and 15 minutes after the incident occurred. The interesting part of the actual complaint was the charge was originally written "Refusal to serve acoholic beverage in public place", but the word "alcoholic" was later crossed out, mostly by the magistrate judge. This is interesting because the very complaint itself was attempting to discriminate King and his group by saying they were trying to buy acoholic on a Sunday after 10. Another interesting part of the complaint was the address that King listed as his home, which was 753 Walnut St. Camden, NJ. Which we now know was his part-time residence where he attended Crozer. We also know that classes had ended at Crozer for over a month at this point in June, so it's safe to assume that he was staying at the address he listed on the sworn police complaint at that time.
- June 12th, 1950 later in the morning, Maple Shade Municipal Court: The restaurant owner, Ernest Nichols, appears before Judge Percy Charleston with his attorney Thomas McGann. McGann asks for a continuance and the hearing is postponed to Thursday night, June 15th.
- June 15th, 1950 Thursday night, Maple Shade municipal courthouse: A formal complaint is made against Nichols for brandishing a weapon, using obscene language and refusal of service. Ernest Nichols is held on \$500 bail by Judge Charleston for the refusal charge and found guilty on the brandishing a weapon and obscene language charges and paid a \$50 fine. The refusal charge is sent to the Grand Jury for further proceedings. King and McCa are represented by Robert Burk Johnson who is assisted by Ulysses S. Wilson. Three white witnesses testify on behalf of King and his group, saying they tried to calm down Nichols and have them served. This shows that the white people were being served at the same time he refused to serve King and the group, otherwise, why would they ask King's group be served?
- June 16th, 1950, Caysmont DE: King is arrested for speeding in Caysmont Delaware on his way to his brother's wedding. His brother's wedding was on the next day, so King was rushing back to make sure he was there, especially considering he was the best man.
- June 17th, 1950: Philadelphia Tribune article about the Maple Shade situation. King is listed as Michael King. Other articles from the same time period about King have his name listed as Martin Luther King Jr., or M.L. King Jr, but this clearly states his name as Michael, why? The article also states they were being helped by Dr. Wilson, who they were introduced to through Lloyd Burrus.
