Dear Mr. Duff:

Stockton University's Open Public Records Act (OPRA) Custodian received your OPRA Request on March 5, 2020. As such, the seven (7) business day deadline to respond to your request was March 16, 2020.

By letter dated March 13, 2020, the OPRA Custodian extended the response time by nine (9) business days, until March 27, 2020, because of the volume of documents under review, and the impact of the University's emergent and ongoing operations in response to the COVID-19 global pandemic. In accordance with New Jersey Executive Order No.103, University employees, including the OPRA staff, began operating remotely on March 18, 2020.

By letters dated March 25, 2020, April 3, 2020, April 27, 2020, and May 18, 2020 the University sought extensions until June 8, 2020, because remote operations continued to impact the scope and timing of the University's ability to respond due to the ongoing State of Emergency implemented in New Jersey related to the COVID-19 global pandemic.

Your OPRA Request sought access to the following:

This is a request for public records made under OPRA and the common law right of access. I am not required to fill out an official form. Please acknowledge receipt of this message.

OPRA allows custodians extensions of time pursuant to N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5. i. Specifically, OPRA states that, "the requestor shall be advised by the custodian when the record can

be made available. If the record is not made available by that time, access shall be deemed denied." Please note that on March 20, 2020, New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy signed into law P.L. 2020, c. 10, which amends OPRA to suspend the 7-day response deadline when "a state of emergency, public health emergency, or state of local disaster emergency" has been declared. N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(i)(2).

On May 6, 2020, New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy issued Executive Order 138, which extends the Public Health Emergency declared on March 9, 2020 under Executive Order 103 and extended on April 7 under Executive Order 119. All previously entered Executive Orders remain "in full force and effect" under Executive Order 138. University employees, including the OPRA staff, continue to operate remotely in accordance with the Executive Orders.

Regretfully, the scope and timing of the University's OPRA responses continue to be impacted by remote operations. Your request requires an extension of time of an additional 10 (ten) business days until June 22, 2020. We are mindful of and appreciate your patience during this time.

If your request for access to a government record has been denied, you have a right to challenge the decision to deny access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council ("GRC") by completing the Denial of Access Complaint Form. You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511; by mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625; by e-mail at grc@dca.state.nj.us; or, at its web site located at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also answer other questions about OPRA. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.
