Dear Mr. Lord:

The Borough of Allenhurst and the official Records Custodian received your Open Public Records Act (OPRA) request on December 2, 2019. As such, the seven (7) business day deadline to respond to your request is December 11, 2019. This response to your request is being provided to you on the third business day after the custodian's receipt of said request.

Your OPRA request sought copies of email logs for the municipality's police chief from December 1, 2018 to December 7, 2018, including sender, recipient, date and subject. In response to the foregoing request, please see the attached.

If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within the seven (7) business days required by law, you have a right to challenge the decision by the Borough of Allenhurst to deny access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC) by completing the Denial of Access Complaint Form. You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511, by mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625, by e-mail at grc@dca.state.nj.us, or at their web site at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.
