Chief,

I wanted to touch base about a situation at the Bank of America and McDonalds on Rt. 34 in Aberdeen.

Karen Ventura reached out to me on behalf of Mayor Tagliarini requesting any registered colony caretakers, which I did send over to them, because they received a complaint about someone feeding feral cats in the BOA and McDonalds parking lots.

I spoke with Ellen Dwyer earlier who I knew was actively trapping in the area who confirmed for me that she, along with a gentleman named Albert Malave, do in fact feed the colony there.

Both Albert and Ellen are technically signed in under our program, but it's worth noting (and figuring out moving forward) that they are not actually colony caretakers for a colony on their own property, but instead caring for colonies on private property.

I asked Ellen how long she has been on the property actively feeding and she said she has been there for 11 years. I asked if either of them had ever received explicit permission to trap and/or feed, and she said over the years sometimes employees would come out and thank her but that was the extent. She said there are 12-15 feral cats she has TNR'd on her own over the years, with one remaining that needs TNR. Ellen believes this is all stemming from the neighbor behind BOA, John Fereesi, who is attempting to file a lawsuit over turkey vultures in the area. Ellen was adamant that they keep the area clean and do not ever leave food out.

Karen Ventura (on behalf of Mayor Tagliarini) seemed incredibly understanding. I did ask that she let me reach out to you, as well as Ellen, to gather more information.

Colony Caretaker Rules and Regulations

I understand that as part of my participation with the Aberdeen TNR Program, I agree that:

1. I am responsible for keeping the feeding stations for my colony neat and clean, providing fresh food and water for my colony every day, keeping accurate data on all cats in my colony including newcomers and kittens and reporting this data to the MCSPCA on a monthly basis.
2. I will allow MCSPCA personnel to trap feral cats for sterilization and to check that proper care is given to the colony. I will only trap feral cats if I am given prior approval by the MCSPCA Coordinator in charge of TNR programs.
3. If I am given approval to trap feral cats, I will not use the trap(s) to knowingly capture any cat with a home; to capture a healthy animal to be euthanized; for any unlawful purpose; or to capture any cat for research/testing purposes whatsoever.
4. All feral cats in the MCSPCA Trap/Neuter/Return program will receive a spay or neuter, rabies and distemper vaccinations, ear tip and microchip. Any other medical treatment will be done on a case by case need by the veterinarian.
5. In some cases it may be necessary to euthanize cats and/or kittens whose physical conditions may prevent them from having a quality life and that this decision will be made by the MCSPCA veterinarians. I further agree that I will not hold the MCSPCA or veterinarian(s) liable or responsible for the decision of their actions.
