Mike,

As submitted this request can be denied for the following reasons:

A proper request under OPRA must identify with reasonable clarity those documents that are desired. *Bent v. Stafford Police Department*, 381 N.J. Super. 30, 37 (App. Div. 2005). To determine whether requests for e-mails meet this requirement, the Government Records Council established specific criteria that must be met by the requestor in order for that individual's request to identify specific government communications. The GRC determined that to be valid, the request must contain:

- (1) the content and/or subject;
- (2) the specific date or range of dates during which the email(s) were transmitted; and
- (3) the identity of the sender and/or the recipient thereof.

This request falls on two of the three requirements and therefore should be denied. If the requester resubmits with the appropriate criteria, we will have to gain Jackie's assistance in identifying the specific emails requested. I believe Jackie is the only one with the access to search emails in this fashion.
