Good morning Councilman Colaci,

The police department is continuing to address concerns in reference to tractor trailers parking on Kennedy Drive. We continue to enforce the no overnight parking ordinance and have issued numerous summonses and towed multiple vehicles. We are also working with Code Enforcement to have the garbage/debris that has accumulated on both sides of Kennedy Drive cleaned up. We have also issued summonses and towed tractor trailers from the shoulder of Bordentown Avenue in the area of Winding Woods where we have received additional parking complaints. Sergeant Braile is still researching the overnight truck parking ordinance and will have recommendations to amend our current ordinance with enhanced penalties soon.

The Patrol Division is continuing with our high visibility patrol initiative in the early morning hours in an effort to deter criminal activity in response to the uptick in occupied home burglaries and car thefts throughout the state. We have had several residents contact us in the early morning hours to report suspicious activity and we encourage our residents to continue to do so. We would also like to remind all of our residents to lock their vehicles. The majority of our vehicle burglaries are committed as crimes of opportunity on unlocked doors.

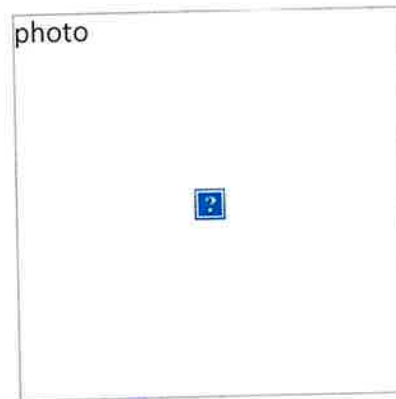

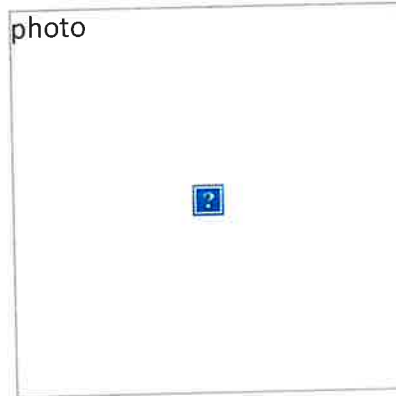

Not sure if you were made aware yet but prior to last nights council meeting, we have received a communication from a concerned resident, Mrs. Perhacs, expressing significant apprehension about the prevailing crime rates in our community and the perceived influx of individuals contributing to these issues. A particular point of concern is the Winding Woods apartment complex, which Mrs. Perhacs describes as being associated with gang activity and drug-related problems. She holds the property management accountable for these conditions and urges the town to take decisive action to enhance public safety.

In response to Mrs. Perhacs' concerns,
I'd like work with you and your team to prepare a comprehensive report possibly addressing the following points including anything else the team thinks of.

Good afternoon Councilmen,

During our last meeting, we discussed residents' concerns regarding truck parking on Kennedy Drive. Specifically, residents of Gillette Towers expressed issues with trucks and trailers parked near the entrance and exit, obstructing their view.

On February 6th, the Traffic Safety Bureau responded to Kennedy Drive, impounding 15 vehicles and issuing 60 summonses for parking violations. They will continue monitoring the area and enforcing regulations to mitigate this issue. Additionally, Sergeant Braile is reviewing the current parking ordinance and associated fines, as they are likely outdated and may need revisions to strengthen deterrence against illegal parking.

We are also investigating the following concerns:

- **Illegal Truck Parking on Bordentown Avenue** – The Traffic Bureau is addressing reports of illegal truck parking on the shoulder of Bordentown Avenue near Winding Woods. Several summonses have been issued.
- **Speeding and Traffic Violations on Deerfield Road** – We are responding to complaints about speeding and stop sign violations in the Deerfield Road area and surrounding streets.
- **Equipment Storage in Bailey Park** – The contractor, Waters and Bugbee, is storing equipment in Bailey Park as part of PSE&G's ongoing gas line replacement project in the Morgan section. Sergeant Braile is reaching out for an update on the project timeline.
- **High-Visibility Patrol Initiative** – Our efforts continue to deter the ongoing statewide issue of occupied home burglaries targeting high-end luxury vehicles.
- **Swearing-In Ceremony** – We will host a swearing-in ceremony on **Wednesday, February 12th, at 6:00 PM** for two newly promoted supervisors and four new hires.
- **Traffic Enforcement Efforts** – Officers have been reminded to maintain traffic enforcement efforts aimed at reducing accidents, injuries, and fatalities. The goal is not just to issue summonses but to prevent dangerous driving behaviors that lead to crashes.

Good afternoon Councilman Colaci,

On Tuesday, March 11th at 8:56 AM, Sayreville Police received an urgent call about a fire at the Gallery Motel. When officers arrived, they encountered thick smoke pouring from one of the rooms. As they attempted to gain entry, they discovered the door was being deliberately obstructed. Undeterred, officers forced their way in and discovered a female victim trapped inside the bathroom. Thanks to their swift and courageous actions, she was rescued without life threatening injuries.

Sayreville Fire Department and J.F.K. EMS quickly responded, extinguishing the fire and providing critical care to the victim, who was later transported to Saint Barnabas Hospital for treatment. One of our officers also sustained injuries during the rescue and was taken to Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital. Thankfully, that officer has since been released and is recovering.

Following a thorough investigation by Detectives of the Sayreville Police Department, the female involved has been charged with arson, assault, criminal mischief, obstruction, and causing widespread injury and damage. She has since been released from the hospital and is now in the custody of the Middlesex County Adult Corrections Center.

This incident serves as a stark reminder of the dangers our officers face every day and the importance of public vigilance. We urge our community to stay alert, report suspicious activity, and support those who put their lives on the line to keep us safe.

On Monday March 17, the Sayreville Police Department, in collaboration with the Middlesex County Special Operations Response Team, executed a search warrant on a residence in Sayreville, leading to the arrest of two individuals connected to a series of burglaries in the area.

Defendant 1, Samir Matthews, 19, of Sayreville, faces multiple charges including:

- 2 counts of Burglary
- 2 counts of Theft
- 1 count of Possession of Handgun
- 2 counts of Possession of Prohibited Weapons involving ammunition and handcuffs
- 1 count of Certain Persons Not to Possess a Firearm

Further charges are expected as the investigation continues.

Defendant 2, Keyshawon Zephirin, 21, also a resident of Sayreville, has been charged with:

- 1 count of Receiving Stolen Property

During the search of Matthews' residence, law enforcement officials recovered a stolen handgun, additional prohibited weapons, and evidence linking the defendants to prior burglaries in Sayreville.

Both defendants have been turned over to the custody of the Middlesex County Adult Corrections Center.

The Sayreville Police Department encourages the community to remain vigilant and report any suspicious activities to ensure the safety and security of our neighborhoods.

Finally, we are about to launch our Cordico Wellness app. Cordico is the leader in first responder wellness and part of Lexipol, the expert in policy, training and wellness support, committed to improving the quality of life for all first responders. The Cordico wellness app is used by first responder agencies across the country to provide 24/7 confidential access to easy-to-use wellness resources and support, including anonymous self-assessments, instructional videos and one-touch access to local mental health providers, peer support team members and chaplains. On-demand tools target more than 60 behavioral health topics, such as critical incidents, depression, trauma and suicide risk. The Cordico wellness solution also includes access to a library of online accredited wellness courses. We were able to partner with Cordico using grant funds we were awarded from the Department of Justice's Law Enforcement Mental Health and Wellness Act. Access to the app is available to all officers, retired officers and their families. Our partnership with Cordico is another important component of our overall wellness program. The Sayreville Police Department is dedicated to creating a resilient workforce and providing the best resources to aid our team through any life challenges they and/or their families are facing. Officer wellness efforts must be ongoing throughout an officer's entire career. Our goal is to provide wellness trainings, programs, resources, and options to our employees, along with options tailored for their families and support systems.
