Dear Council Member,

As President of the Toms River Board of Education I am asking for your position on the upcoming referendum. By now I'm sure you are very familiar with the referendum to be voted on January 22nd. We have hosted 19-advertised school initiative meetings and 3-advertised regional Q&A meetings to stress the importance of the necessary repairs slated to our aging buildings. With our school system's loss of community building grant money, loss of tax rateables from Superstorm Sandy, and now, the State taking away almost \$80 million over the next six years from our school funding, we need help.

The Toms River Regional School District is currently running on one of the most streamlined budgets in the state. According to the State of New Jersey we are functioning at \$31 million BELOW adequacy. As you are aware, our administrative costs are 2nd lowest in the state and our cost per pupil is 3rd lowest in the state.

Our first and foremost concern are our children and teachers. They deserve to have a healthier and more secure environment to learn and to teach in. After reviewing the Power Point demonstrations that we provided at all 22 referendum information meetings, you can see this is a true concern. Every dollar of this referendum is dedicated to the imperative building repairs as documented on the TR Schools website at <http://www.trschools.com/community/referendum>.

Secondly, we must remember that in the past people moved to Toms River for our exceptional school district. Without a thriving school district we lose our property values. Currently we have people leaving Toms River for a variety of reasons, and as leaders in this town, we have an obligation to give them a reason to stay. The core of our district is intact, however our building infrastructure is crumbling. It is our duty to our taxpayers to keep their home investment safe.

Our Superintendent, Business Administrator, Board Vice President and myself are going to be on Bob Levy's Topic A with Jeremy Grunin this Sunday from 8:30-9:30 AM on 92.7 WOBN. We will also be on a Facebook Live with Karen Wall from the Toms River Patch this Thursday (with an expected reach of 29,000 viewers), as well as various other media sites to bring awareness of the referendum and the urgency.

We have been asked where the council stands on this issue. Today I am respectfully asking for your public assistance in bringing awareness to this referendum in the best interest of Toms River. I am asking each of you for an acknowledgement of this letter as well as your feelings on preserving our district and saving our schools thus our property values in our great town. Thursday, when asked if we have the full support of the town Council, we would like to be prepared with an accurate response from each of you.

I appreciate your time and hope you have a good understanding of what is at stake here. Please feel free to contact me with any questions.
