I have added county superintendents because I have several email rejections. I would like to create a unified front within Southern Ocean County, in asking Governor Murphy to allow each local district to make the mask decision based on local data.

I do understand the concern, but also feel like we are running into a wall. I'm sure you all have received emails and have seen plans on social media to hold "unmask rallies". To be clear we are going to abide by the EO until the Governor makes changes.

I would like to get this to the press and governors office tomorrow. Tomorrow is when the EO is in action. We will also have a resolution during our next board meeting but that isn't until much later in the month. I am on board with a joint resolution too.

We will bold the words indicating that we will comply, but use the letter as a way to push the issue back into the governor's hands instead of debating masks at our board meetings.

Good evening-

As I am sure you have all read,
we should expect Governor
Murphy to issue a mask mandate
for the coming school year at an
event tomorrow.

We owe it to our students, staff,
and community to offer the safest
environment possible. That said,
I don't think the state should be
making sweeping requirements
about our schools which are
driven by populations centers
that are much more dense than
our own.

I would like to propose a unified
front, to present Governor
Murphy with a joint statement
that expresses our desire to
control our own districts. We as
a group of Southern Ocean
County schools have the ability
to best gauge the needs of our
students, staff, and community.
We need to let our own local
data drive the decision, not

politics or locations heavily skewed by large populations.

I have attached two documents as examples. One is a letter the Barnegat Township School District wrote to Governor Murphy in May. The second is a decision matrix we used to determine if the schools within our district should be open, or transition to virtual. This document was well received by the community and represents a data/fact driven approach to the decision based on the specific details within our own town. This document could be easily revised to drive PPE decisions rather than virtual/in-person learning.

I will be asking our Superintendent (Dr. Latwis) to reach out to the Superintendents of your respective districts to gauge interest. I firmly believe as a unified front with a smart approach we may be able to gain some traction with the Governor and make him confident that we can run our own schools.

Please let me know if you are interested in participating. We can create a solid message, plan of action, and communication plan to present to the governor TOGETHER.
