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All emergency services (police, fire and ambulance) remain on duty. Call 9-1-1 in the event of an emergency and (856) 428-5400 for non-emergency issues. If you go to police headquarters for a non-emergency, use the phone outside the door and an officer will respond and speak with you. All requests for fingerprints for a volunteer organization are suspended until further notice. The Construction Office and Fire Official's Office will be monitoring requests. All Planning Board and Zoning Board meetings have been postponed through April.

In addition, the following restrictions are in effect:

- All parks, playgrounds, and basketball courts at all Township facilities are closed.
- The Egg Hunt, scheduled for April 4, is canceled.

All Senior Services and activities are canceled or closed until further notice. Both Eastern Regional High School and the Voorhees Schools have been closed. Information on the status of each school will appear on their respective websites.

The Voorhees Municipal Court is canceled through March.

There are no changes to trash, bulk trash and recycling collection.

It is our intention to conduct Voorhees Township Committee Meetings as scheduled with appropriate safety precautions. The Town Hall will be open during the course of the meeting should the public desire to attend. This is in accordance with direction provided by the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs and the Local Public Meetings Act.

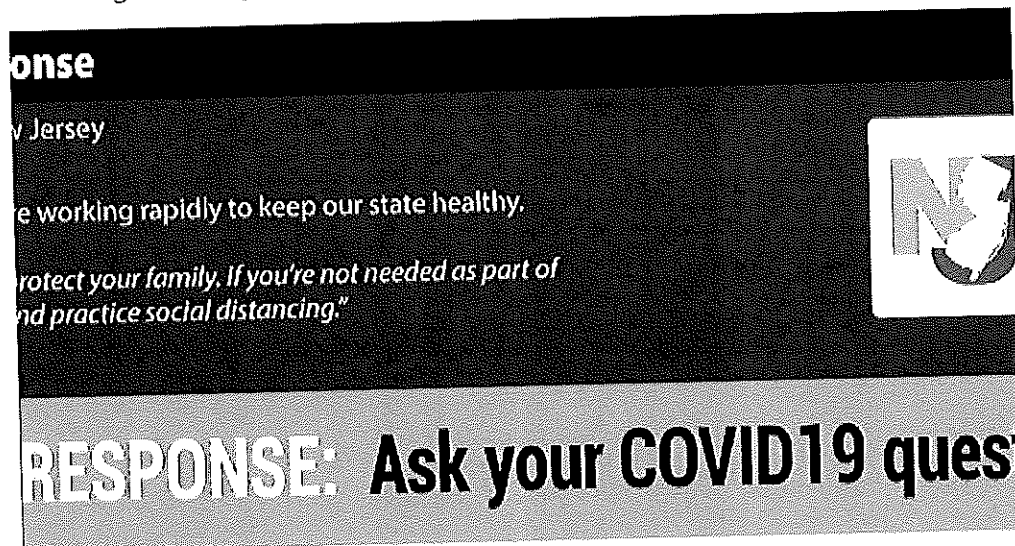


I just finished another conference call with Camden Co. Mayors and reps of County, State and Federal Gov't. Camden Co. has 41 positive cases of the coronavirus. 8 of those remain hospitalized and 5 are in ICU. The testing site at Camden Co. College is ready but still has no testing kits. Congress is still working on a federal financial stimulus package to provide mortgage relief, small business relief, student loan relief, an increase of unemployment benefits and direct cash payments to residents. They expect to have a final package in the next 24 hours. While the deadline for filing federal taxes has been extended to July 15, no decision yet re the NJ income tax filing date. We anticipate such an extension is coming.

In Voorhees, our Police, Fire, EMTs and DPW continue to be fully staffed and working a normal schedule. Because more people are home, we have seen an increase in trash. Our parks and playgrounds remain closed. Our Town Hall remains closed to the public but we are providing our services with a reduced staff. 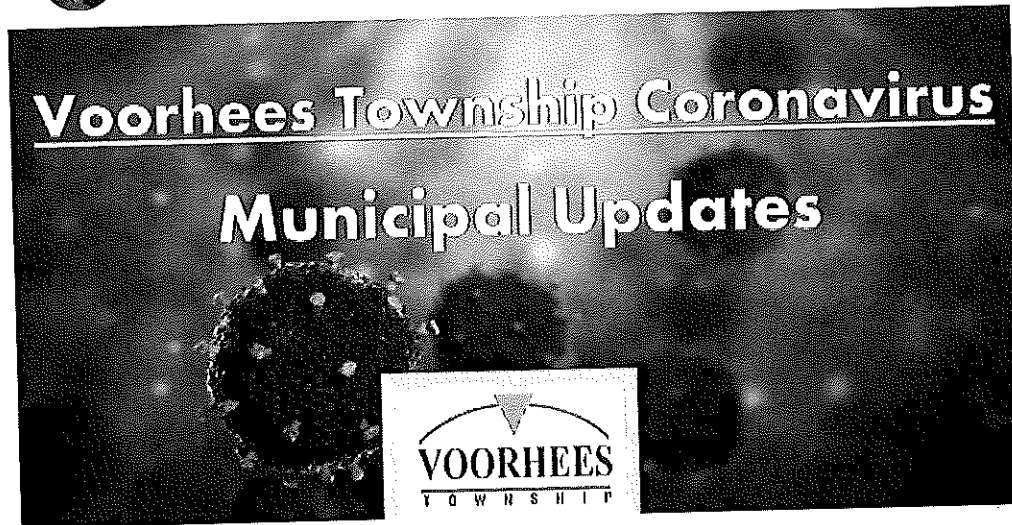

Just got off another conf call with Camden Co Mayors, County, State and Federal reps. This is simply a very brief synopsis. Much more info to come from state and federal sources. The proposed \$2 Trillion federal stimulus package is expected to go to a final vote tomorrow morning. It should include a \$1200 payment to individuals who make less than \$75K plus \$500 per child. (\$2400 to married couples who make less than a combined \$150K/year.) Hoping checks will be sent out within 7 days of passage. Unemployment ins to be extended from 3 to 4 months and all to get an additional \$600/month. Waiting period to be waived. Billions to be allotted for childcare of essential workers, SBA loans, state/local govts and health care. Federal student loans to be suspended for 60 days with no additional interest.

11 new cases today in Camden Co for a total of 80. Testing sites in Camden Co will not have kits until 2nd week of April.

Voorhees Town Hall still closed to public for at least next 2 weeks. Services with reduced staff. Go to Voorheesnj.com for contact info and other updated info. Full squad of police, fire, EMTS and DPW doing great job. Parks and playgrounds still closed.

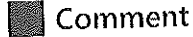

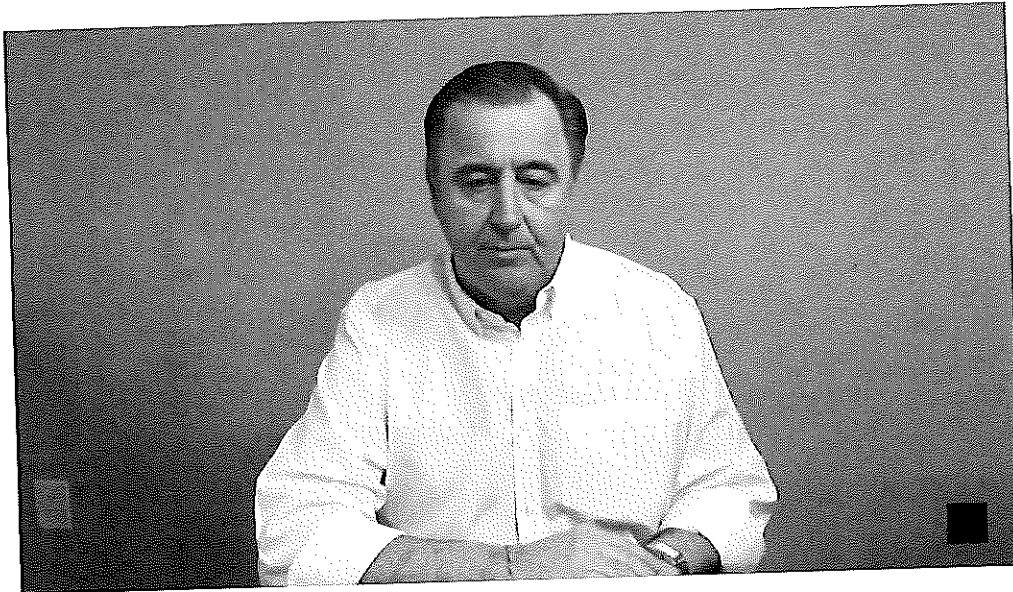

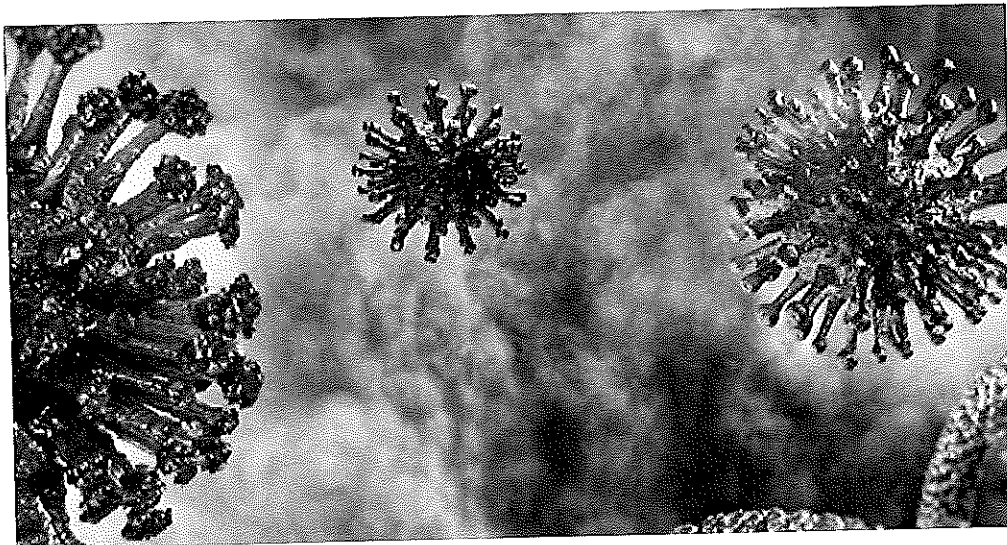

Today marks the beginning of National Police Week, a time set aside for our nation to honor all Law Enforcement Officers who have given their lives in the line of duty. These heroes should be honored every day.

Gov. Murphy announced today an additional 1453 COVID-19 cases in NJ, bringing our state total to 139,945. Tragically, there have been 59 additional deaths from the virus, bringing the state total to 9310 precious lives lost.

The state also clarified the prohibition against "wave parades" to celebrate such occasions as birthdays and graduations. Such parades are permitted as long as they do not generate an assembly of people and as long as the parade participants so not exit their cars.

In Voorhees, we continue to have a full squad of police, fire and DPW workers. All are doing a fine job. In fact, since the order to stay at home, our town has seen a 25% increase in trash collected and a 31% increase in vegetation collected. While Town Hall continues to be closed to the public, there is a reduced staff providing municipal services in all departments. Our Voorhees Residents Task Force continues to help hundreds of residents on a weekly basis. For any questions or concerns, visit voorheesnj.com.

This morning I was on a conference call with Camden Co. Mayors and reps from the county, state and federal governments. A federal bill will be introduced tomorrow calling for an \$875 billion stimulus package that will include, among other things, state and local aid as well as additional money for unemployment benefits. The bill must pass through the House, Senate and then be signed by the President.

The County will be holding a fresh food giveaway later this month for all residents. They will also be sponsoring public health information sessions throughout the county. For info., visit camdencounty.com.

Gov. Murphy announced some good news today--all NJ beaches will be open starting Friday, May 22. There will be capacity restrictions and social distancing requirements that will be determined and controlled by each individual shore town. No special events are permitted. Amusement rides, playgrounds, arcades and picnic areas will continue to be closed.

Unfortunately, Gov. Murphy also shared that there are an additional 1,216 COVID-19 cases in NJ, bringing our state total to 142,704. (113 new cases in Camden Co. for a total of 5,364.) Sadly, there have been 244 more deaths, bringing the state total to 9,946 precious lives lost. (8 additional deaths in Camden Co. for a total of 249.)

In Voorhees, our police, fire, EMS and DPW continue to work full time at full capacity. Town Hall continues to be closed to the public, but all departments are open with a reduced staff to serve our residents. The grace period to pay 2nd quarter property taxes has been extended to June 1. For more Township information, visit voorheesnj.com.

Stay home if you can. Wear a mask if you must go out. Respect social distancing guidelines. Check in with your neighbors, especially if they are alone or elderly. Wave to each other. We will get through this together. We're six feet apart, but closer than ever.

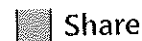

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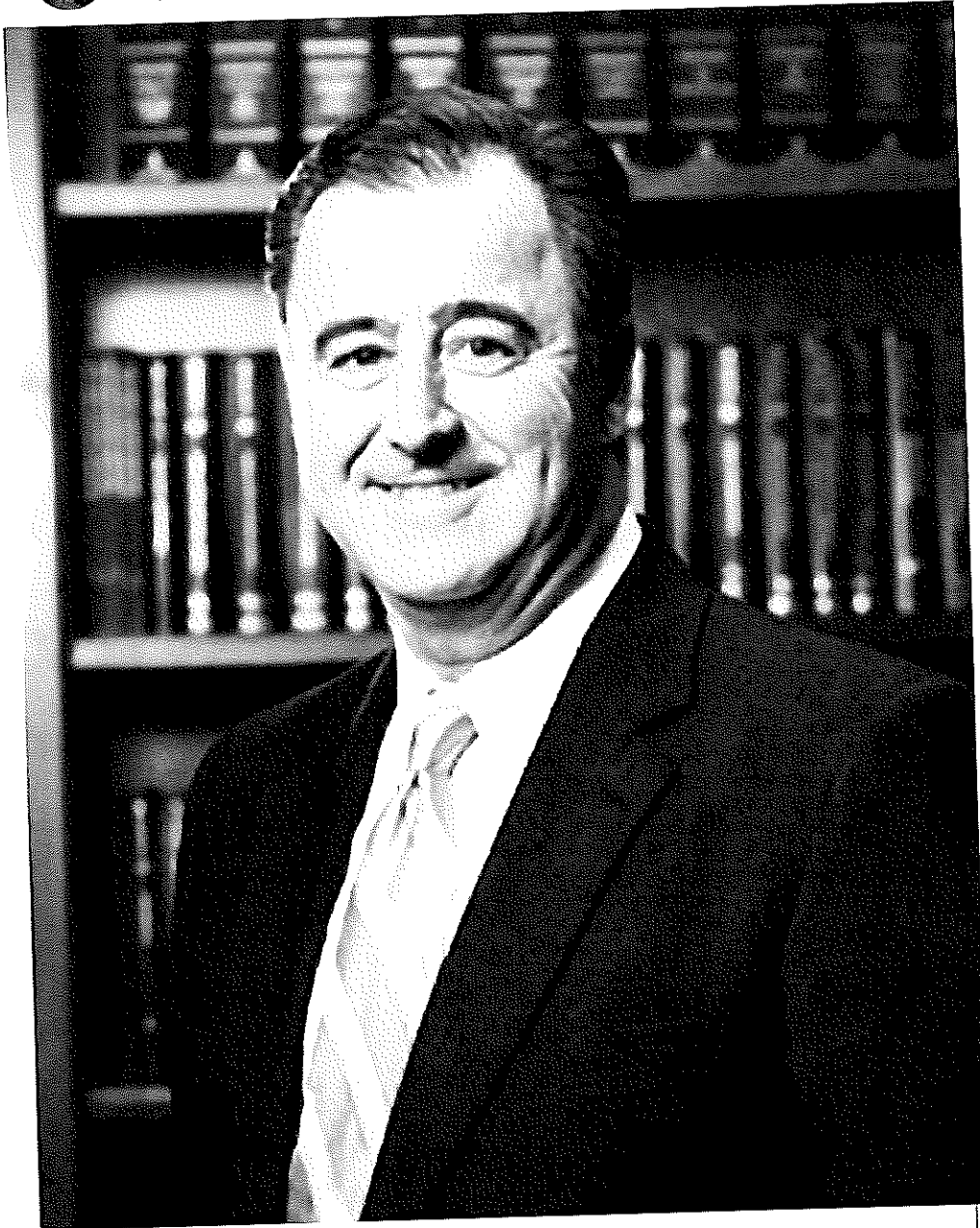

Mayor's Column

While our focus has understandably been on facing the unique challenge of the coronavirus, we should be mindful that we are in the midst of an important United States Census.

Every 10 years since 1790, the United States has undertaken the monumental task of counting the population. An accurate Census count is very important as the data obtained is used to determine the number of seats each state has in the House of Representatives and to draw congressional and state legislative



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for more than 100 programs, including school lunches, highway construction and education.

The goal of the 2020 Census is a complete and accurate count of everyone living in the United States and its five territories. You should count yourself at the place where you were living and sleeping most of the time as of April 1, 2020 (Census Day). The 2020 Census will provide a snapshot of our nation—who we are, where we live and so much more.

As of May 14, only 59.1% of the population of the U.S. has responded to the Census survey. In New Jersey, the response rate is 61%. Camden County's response rate is 63.1% and Voorhees Township's response rate is 67.4%. As such, 32.6% of our residents have not yet responded.

It is not too late to complete your 2020 Census. The quickest way to respond is online at my2020census.gov with your Census ID, which easily links your response with your address. However, you can respond without a Census ID and still be linked with your address. You can also complete your Census survey by phone with customer service representatives available every day from 7a.m. to 2a.m. Customer service representatives are available in English at 844-330-2020 and in Spanish at 844-468-2020. A dozen other languages are available and can be found at my2020census.gov at the language support page.

The 2020 Census asks a few simple questions about you and everyone who was living with you on April 1, 2020. Please know that it is against the law for the Census Bureau to publicly release your responses in any way that could identify you or your household. By law, your Census responses cannot be used against you and can be used only to produce statistics.

Be on the lookout for scams. The Census Bureau will never ask you for your full Social Security number, your bank account or credit card numbers, anything on behalf of a political party or for money or donations.

If you have not yet completed your Census form, please do so as soon as possible. If you have questions, visit my2020census.gov or call the Census Bureau at 884-330 -2020.

This morning, the Camden Co. Mayors had a conference call with reps of the county, state and federal governments. Camden Co. has received \$88 million from the CARES Act to be distributed throughout the county and is awaiting specific direction as to the manner in which it can be distributed. The Mayors emphasized this money is needed ASAP.

Last Friday, the House of Representatives passed a \$3 Trillion incentive program known as the CARES Act. Among other needs, it calls for \$200 Billion for essential workers and \$500 Billion for state governments to be distributed to their respective counties and municipalities. The bill must now go through the Senate and, if passed by them, must then be signed by the President.

Today, Gov. Murphy announced NJ has seen 1,304 additional cases of COVID-19, bringing our state's total to 151,472. (107 new cases in Camden Co. for a total of 6,007.) Sadly, NJ has seen another 98 precious lives lost for a total of 10,843. (19 additional lives lost in Camden Co. for a total of 294.) Our flags remain at half mast in their honor.

While our focus has understandably been on the coronavirus, please participate in the ongoing U.S. Census. To date, NJ has a 61% response rate and Voorhees has a 67% response rate. Visit my2020census.gov to participate and be counted.

Stay home if you are able. If you must go out, wear a mask and respect social distancing guidelines. Check on your neighbors. Wave to each other. Get take-out from local restaurants or buy gift cards. We're six feet apart, but closer than ever.

Camden Co. received \$88 million through the federal CARES Act and is taking steps to make sure the money is spent in accordance with guidelines. Next year, the fed'l gov't will audit the manner in which each county spent the money and any deviations from the guidelines will result in the money having to be paid back. Much of the money will go to helping small businesses and all Mayors encouraged this money to be made available asap.

VBM ballots will soon be sent to all registered Democrats and Republicans. Registered voters who are unaffiliated will receive VBM applications. No sample ballots will be sent but voters will receive postcards with info. Additionally, each town will have at least one polling place with machines reserved for those with disabilities. Anyone else who wishes to vote at a polling place will vote provisionally. The deadline to register to vote is June 16. The deadline for unaffiliated voters to apply for VBM is June 30. VBM ballots must be postmarked by July 7. For additional info, visit camdencounty.com.
