Good Day Mr. Farrell,

I thank you for your responses to my past few emails and the time you have taken to entertain my concerns. I wanted to wait until I received the results of my open public records request (OPRA) before responding to your last email. I also CC'd a few of the BOE members on this email as well.

For those of you who are attached to this email, with whom I do not know personally, I offer you this introduction. I am a 6 year resident of Oceanport with children in the 1st and 2nd grade. I work for a municipal police department for the past 20 years (still active) and I have been teaching in county colleges for the past 10 years. The courses I teach are related to crime, crime prevention, crime mapping, community policing and police role in their communities. I will not be one to grab the microphone at the BOE meetings and I am not all that vocal on Facebook.

First and foremost, as I have said in the past, I have the utmost respect for you as our superintendent, our BOE members and our local police agencies and all the work that has contributed to this process and its results to date. Outside of the physical infrastructure, our schools could not be better.

At the end of the day, I respectfully, very strongly disagree with your belief on the security and safety of the proposed site area, Commvault. You stated in your published BOE FAQ that this is a "safe area, with no patterned history of crime, similar to the rest of the borough". Not only do I disagree with that statement, I offer an argument that this location is in fact the least safe area in the Borough of Oceanport. Nowhere else in town neighbors a property, where police have responded continually for drug offenses, prostitution, thefts, unlawful weapons possession, wanted persons, shots fired and attempted homicide. Needless to say, yes these are patterned crimes that have occurred and will continue to occur in this vicinity. The crimes committed at the La Quinta Inn property go beyond crimes relating to simple disorderly persons offenses, they are crimes of magnitude, with real victims and real consequences.

Under OPRA, West Long Branch Police, records department, have provided me 93 individual documents representing 93 incidents in which the police were involved in at La Quinta Inn over the past 20 months. Yes, the police responded there 93 times in the past 20 months. Below I have simply listed some of the examples of the criminal activity:

shots fired, attempted homicide, prostitution, missing persons, report referencing the DEA conducting a no knock warrant, restraining order violations, suspicious persons/activity, domestic violence offenses, thefts, assaults, harassment, possession of drugs, underage drinking, unresponsive individuals (drugs-heroin), unresponsive individual (alcohol), unresponsive individuals (unknown), fraud, resisting arrest, suicidal individuals, criminal mischief, hindering apprehension, weapons offenses.....

As I mentioned in a previous email, my wife and I moved to Oceanport 6 years ago because of the existing school system that was in place and the neighborhoods surrounding them. I can't say that if we were moving to Oceanport today our thoughts would be the same with the proposed school project. We love it here and want to continue to love every aspect of what Oceanport represents. If you were to think of this proposed site in regards to building residential houses there; ultimately, you wouldn't. Regardless of any zoning issues, the property values would be significantly less than similar homes in town, simply because of the neighboring property is a transient \$60-\$80/night hotel. That same care and concern should be applied towards our children and their proposed school. Our school is our children's home away from home. I ask you this, would you want your home located behind La Quinta Inn. I know I wouldn't.
