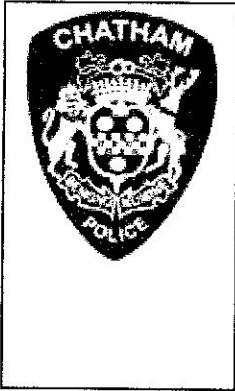

Moreover, they seem determined to catch officers off guard and to publish any ignorance related to the CUMMA guidelines on their websites/blogs; at times baiting officers into what they consider to be unlawful arrests for the use of medical marijuana, surely resulting in litigation. 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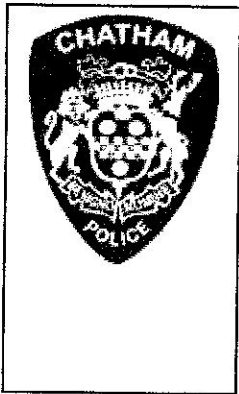

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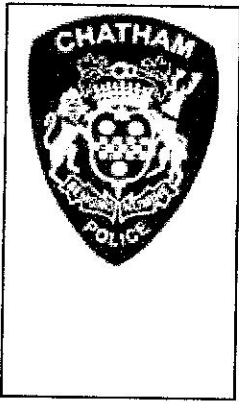

Subject: Storm update

Mayor and Council –

Now that our 4th Northeaster' this month is over, I'm proud to report that your team did an excellent job handling the event. Listed below are some of the challenges we faced:

- The snow event lasted until early Thursday morning. The rate in which the snow fell varied but it there were times when it was at least two inches per hour. The bulk of the snowfall was from 8:00 pm on Wednesday evening until 3:00 am on Thursday morning. On Wednesday morning, we began by brining all the streets; followed by late afternoon/early evening salting; and finishing with continual plowing throughout the night. Keeping primary roads open was challenge that was met head on. By 7 am, almost all roads were down to black top; schools where prepared and ready to be opened; and Borough Hall was opened on time. (However, from experience, I do not recommend trying to sleep on a cot at the Borough Hall Building.) This morning, sidewalks that are the Borough's responsibility were addressed. In addition, Public Works took care of many trees that came down during the storm and are continuing to respond to residents' inquiries regarding same.
- Communication: I believe the Borough was ahead of the curve on this event. Garbage and recycling were addressed early through multi-media (Council President, Jeanne and Buzz). The police posted on Facebook and enforced "no on-street parking during the storm" (Chief and his team). Buzz continued to send out updates throughout the entire event. Thank you all for your assistance in this matter.
- Fire /First Aid: Both had their houses staffed the entire or majority of the night. First Aid had one call - Fire had five. First Aid rolls out when Fire gets called out. All Fire calls were in response to downed wires; all of which were cable/telephone wires. Thanks to Councilman Solan, ("Steve the Verizon Guy" while on the clock) who addressed many of the down wires throughout the Borough.

All in all, this was certainly a team event and as a result "all went well".
