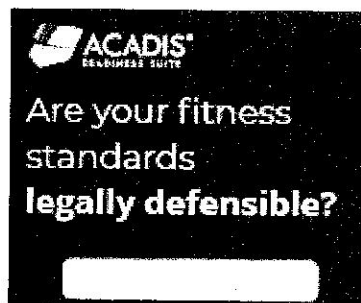
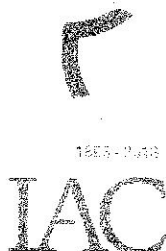

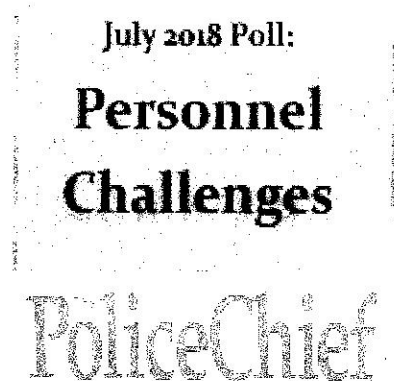

Chief this explains what transpired, and why you cant provide those two items #3, #4 of what she is asking for the posts, and deleted posts. Im still waiting from a call back from MCPO computer crimes to see if they have anything to help us, but as of this writing we are not able to recover those items.

Prior to July 18th 2018 our agencies facebook page was not archived. During the week of July 9th, officers from our agency deleted a photo taken several years ago depicting three of our officers teaching in a classroom from the Oceanport Police Department Facebook page after a person commented on the photo, and he was blocked. By deleting the photo it subsequently then deleted all comments that had been attached to that photo. Our officers have attempted to retrieve the photo and comments unsuccessfully. It appears that the items can not be recovered once deleted since our social media page did not have retention/archive safeguards in place.

Immediately upon learning of the incident you instructed the blocked user to be reinstated. In addition you have instructed the Oceanport Police Department Facebook page be temporarily taken down until new policies, training and safeguards (social media records retention software, or through a 3rd party contractor) are put into place, that this type of incident will not happen again.

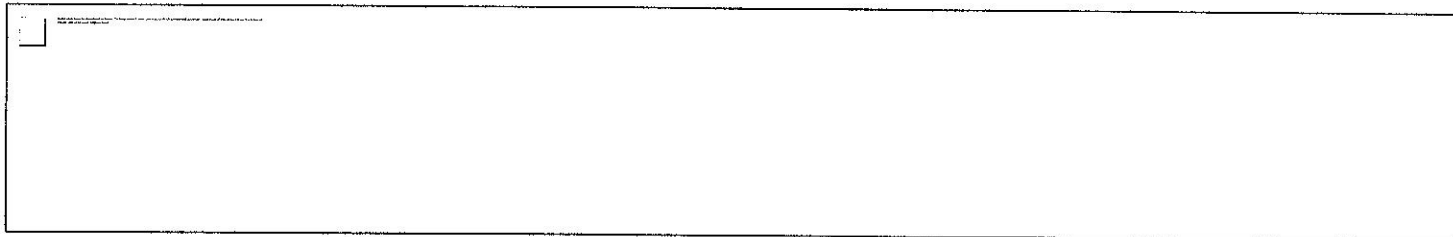

Maryland County Police Department Weighs New Gear, Weapons In Gunman Confrontations After Newspaper Shooting.

The [Washington Post](#) (7/20) reports the Anne Arundel County Police Department in Maryland “may change the gear and weapons that are used when confronting gunmen” after the recent attack on the Capital Gazette. Police Chief Timothy J. Altomare “says based on what he has heard from officers, he has begun making changes, including asking the training academy to research rifles with shorter barrels to allow smoother maneuvering in crowded spaces.”

Police Charge Felon For Receiving Gun Via FedEx.

The [Rochester, NY](#) (7/20) website reported that police “charged a convicted felon with third degree criminal possession of a weapon after a gun was shipped to him by FedEx and he tried to buy ammunition for it at Walmart.” The man, Anthony Alberti “told police he thought he was picking up a nail gun, and didn’t realize it was a handgun until he opened the package.”

Report Unveils Britain’s Use Of Children As Intelligence Sources.

The [New York Times](#) (7/20, Yeginsu) reports that “British intelligence and police units are using children in undercover operations in a drive to expose terrorists, criminal gangs and drug dealers amid a nationwide rise in violent crime,” according to a July 12 report released by the House of Lords secondary scrutiny committee. The committee revealed the practice “after reviewing the government’s new draft of legislation that seeks to extend the period for which youths under the age of 18 are authorized to work as a ‘covert human intelligence source.’” The Times says the proposed measure “comes as violent crime in

England and Wales has jumped, with murders up by 12 percent over the same period last year, according to figures published by the Office of National Statistics."

New London, Connecticut Police Lead Graffiti Removal Project.

The [New London, Connecticut](#) (7/20, Scofield) reports New London, Connecticut Police will collaborate with the New London Community Campus Coalition and the Teens in Action Youth Council to remove graffiti in Fulton Park. Captain Brian M. Wright said, "Graffiti is a serious problem and has real consequences in a community. ... Oftentimes, graffiti in a neighborhood gives the impression that 'nobody cares', which may further instigate criminal activity in affected neighborhoods."

Non-Fatal Drug Overdose Spiked In Philadelphia Over The Weekend.

The [Philadelphia](#) (7/22, Whelan) reports Philadelphia Health Commissioner Tom Farley said overdoses or adverse drug reactions "spiked between Friday and Saturday night to levels not seen in months, driving about 100 people to seek help in hospital emergency rooms," with seven people dying. Non-fatal apparent overdoses "were unusually high around the city, officials said. It was unclear whether victims were overdosing on heroin, fentanyl or some other opiate or having a bad reaction to some other substance cut into their drug, Farley said."

Arizona Drug Investigation Nets 25 Arrests.

The [Flagstaff, AZ](#) (7/20) reported, "The Flagstaff Police Department's Northern Arizona Metro Narcotics Task Force, with help from the FBI, has arrested 25 people in a ten-month investigation. The investigation called 'Operation Landslide,' focused on local and regional meth and heroin dealers." The [Phoenix, AZ](#) (7/21) also reports.

New Hampshire Man Sentenced To More Than Four Years For Meth Trafficking.

The [New Hampshire](#) (7/20) reported Peter Dauphin, "a Laconia man selling a powerful form of methamphetamine out of his Gilford auto repair shop was sentenced Friday to serve more than four years in federal prison on trafficking charges." The police departments "of Gilford and Laconia, working with the FBI New Hampshire Safe Streets Gang Task Force, investigated this case." The [Portland, ME](#) (7/21) and the [Manchester, NH](#) (7/22) reported similarly.

Suspected "Faux Badge Bandit" Wanted In California Bank Robberies Found Dead.

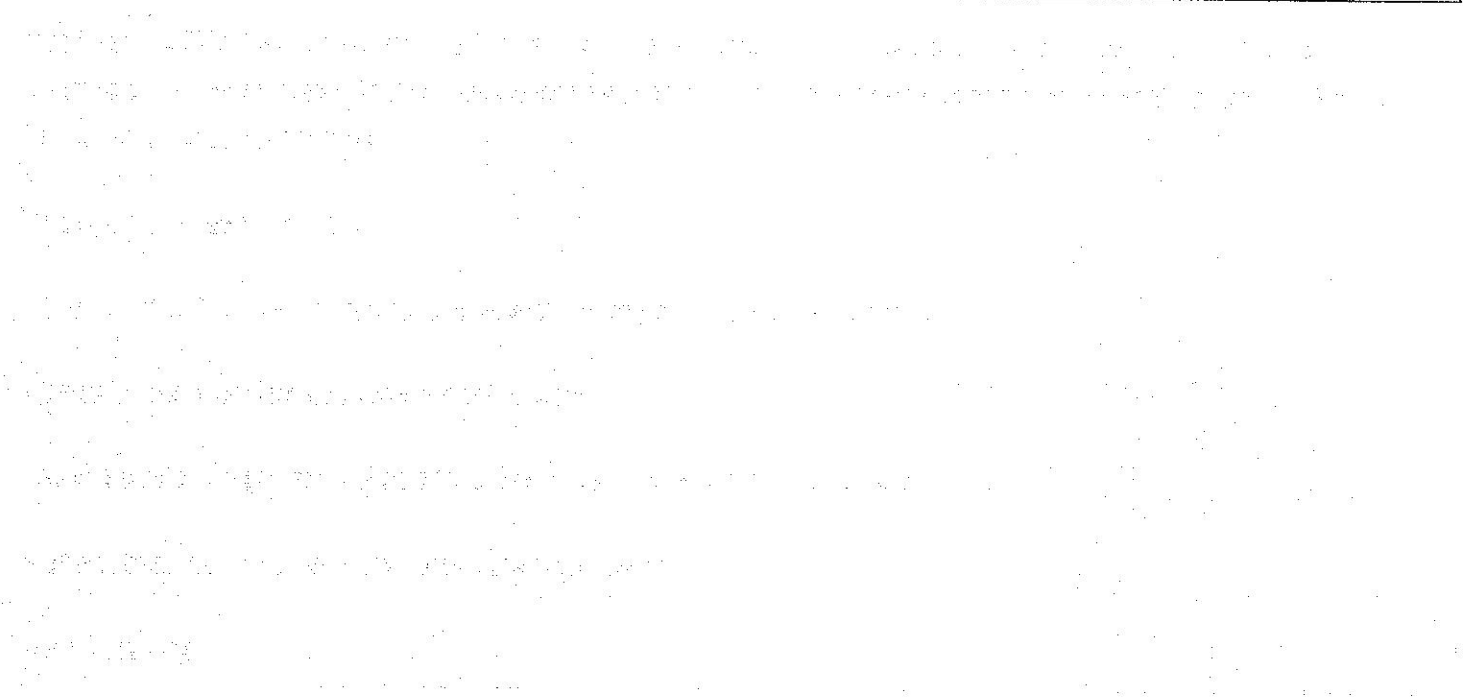
The [Fresno, CA](#) (7/20) reported Keith David Goodwin, "a Fresno man suspected of being the 'Faux Badge Bandit,' wanted in a series of bank robberies in the Bay Area and Southern California, was found dead of a self-inflicted gunshot wound in Goleta on Friday, law enforcement officials have reported." The FBI "had been searching for the bank robber since May 2018 and had linked him to at least nine heists or attempted heists in California, according to Danville police chief Alan Shields and KEYT." The robber "was given the 'Faux Badge' monicker after witnesses to several robberies said he wore a seven-point law enforcement badge on his hip along with a shoulder holster." The [San Francisco, CA](#) (7/20), [San Jose, CA](#) (7/21), [Fresno, CA](#) (7/21), and the [San Diego, CA](#) (7/21) reported with similar coverage.

Australian Border Force Says Chinese Syndicate Was Shipping Tobacco Inside Children's Toys.

The [Sydney, Australia](#) (7/21) reported Australian Border Force officials have disrupted "an alleged Chinese syndicate smuggling tobacco and cigarettes into Australia hidden in children's toys." A Sydney delivery driver faces up to ten years' imprisonment for reportedly intercepting shipments of tobacco sent "to fake addresses in Panania, Picnic Point and Revesby." ABF Investigations Commander Graeme Grosse said 350,000 illicit cigarettes and 1,200 kg of tobacco have been seized. Australasian Association of Convenience Stores CEO Jeff Rogut said the illegal "trade is booming — and cigarettes have become the most valuable commodity for crime gangs." The [Sydney, Australia](#) (7/21) also reported.

German Police Arrest Suspect In Bus Knife Attack.

The [New York Times](#) (7/20, Moulson) reports German authorities overpowered and arrested a man armed with a kitchen knife who “attacked passengers Friday on a crowded city bus in northern Germany.” Ten people were wounded, “three of them seriously.” Authorities have not yet determined the suspect’s motive for the attack, “but said they had no indication that he was politically radicalized or had any terrorist background.” Authorities did, however, recover “a flammable substance in a backpack aboard the bus, but no explosives.” [The Guardian](#) (7/20, Staff) reports the suspect “is originally from Iran but is now a German citizen and has lived in the northern city for years, the Luebecker Nachrichten newspaper said.”

[The Virginian-Pilot](#) Norfolk, VA (7/22) reports, “A family member of one of the victims of the infamous Colonial Parkway Murders announced Saturday that authorities have the DNA of the potential suspect in three of the four crime scenes.” There were eight victims “who were murdered in a series of four double homicides in and around Williamsburg from 1986-1989.” Investigations “on the murders are being handled by the FBI and Virginia State Police.”

UPS Driver Honors Fallen Police Officer In Bartlett.

In continuing coverage, the [Chicago Tribune](#) (7/20, Kunkel) reported that UPS driver Sean Brockway stood by his truck on the roadside as a funeral procession drove by for Captain Paul Phillips in Bartlett, Tennessee. The woman who posted the image of Brockway on Facebook said, “People like this UPS driver and all the thousands of people who have liked, shared, or commented on my post ease my worry,” adding, “With all the bad that is being shared these days there really is so much good!”
