Dear Anonymous,

The Township of Wall Police Department's ("Police Department") Records Custodian received your Open Public Records Act ("OPRA") request dated December 5, 2017 on the same date. As such, the seven (7) business day deadline to respond to your request is December 14, 2017. The Police Department is responding to your request within seven (7) business days after receipt of your request as required by New Jersey law. N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5.

For ease of reference, the Police Department notes that your OPRA request seeks the following:

- 1. A copy of policies and/or procedures regulating the Wall Township Police Department's public Facebook page.*
- 2. List(s) of names of people who are/were hidden, blocked, banned from the Wall Township Police Department's public Facebook page.*
- 3. List(s) of any deleted, hidden, blocked, banned comments that were on the Wall Township Police Department's public Facebook page for the time period of 7-1-2016 to 12-5-2017.*
- 4. List(s) of the authors' names of any deleted, hidden, blocked, banned comments that were on the Wall Township Police Department's public Facebook page for the time period of 7-1-2016 to 12-4-2017.*

As a threshold matter, please be advised that Item Nos. 2, 3, and 4 of your OPRA Request are invalid, as each of these requests seeks information and data rather than specific government records. See Bent v. Stafford Police Department, 381 N.J. Super. 30, 37 (App. Div. 2005) (noting that OPRA allows requests for specific records, not requests for general information, data or statistics). See also Murphy v. N.J. Dept. of Corrections, GRC Complaint No. 2015-340 (finding that a request for "any records" constituted an invalid, blanket request for a class of various documents rather than identifiable government records). The request may not be a broad generic description of documents that requires the custodian to search the agency's files and "analyze, compile and collate" the requested information. Id. See also MAG Entm't, LLC v. Div. of Alcoholic Beverage Control, 375 N.J. Super. 534, 549 (App. Div. 2005) (holding that "[u]nder OPRA, agencies are required to disclose only 'identifiable government records not otherwise exempt . . . OPRA does not countenance open-ended searches of an agency's files'").

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Here, Item Nos. 2, 3, and 4 of your OPRA Request would improperly require the Records Custodian to conduct an open-ended search of the Police Department's records to identify the requested information, and to then collate the information into a list. Please note that a Records Custodian has no duty to create a government record. *See Eden v. Little Egg Harbor Township (Ocean), GRC Complaint No. 2014-369 (June 2015) (stating that "OPRA does not require custodians to research and compile information to create a record that may be responsive to an OPRA request [and custodians have] no legal duty to create a record").*

New Jersey courts have upheld a government records custodian's denial of access in response to an overly broad and generalized OPRA request. *See e.g., Spectraserv, Inc. v. Middlesex Cnty. Utilities Auth., 416 N.J. Super. 565, 576 (App. Div. 2010). Consequently, a proper request under OPRA "must identify with reasonable clarity those documents that are desired, and a party cannot satisfy this requirement by simply requesting all of an agency's documents. OPRA does not authorize unbridled searches of an agency's property. Bent v. Twp. of Stafford Police Dept., 381 N.J. Super. 30, 37 (App. Div. 2005). Notably, it is well settled that OPRA does not authorize unbridled searches of an agency's property. See Abdur-Raheem v. N.J. Div. of Criminal Justice, GRC Complaint No. 2014-171 (June 30, 2015). Further, New Jersey courts have consistently held that a request for "data, information, and statistics" is overly broad and lacks the requisite level of specificity required by OPRA. See MAG Entm't, LLC, 375 N.J. Super. at 548; see also Debockler v. Twp. of East Windsor (Mercer), GRC Complaint No. 2011-29 (2012).*

Notwithstanding the invalid nature of your request, the Police Department has conducted a good faith search for potentially responsive records to each itemized portion of your request. With respect to Item Nos. 1 and 2, enclosed please find all records readily identified as responsive. Please be advised that information has been redacted from the Police Department's Electronic Social Media / Networking Standard Operating Procedure to remove information related to social media surveillance techniques used by the Police Department during criminal investigations. *N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1.1 removes any records that contain "security measures and surveillance techniques which, if disclosed, would create a risk to the safety of persons, property, electronic data or software" from the definition of "government record."* Here, the redacted portion of the Standard Operating Procedure contains directives that outline surveillance techniques used by the Police Department when conducting criminal investigations. As such, the dissemination of the unredacted portion of the SOP would reveal surveillance techniques which, if disclosed, would create a risk to the safety of police officers when conducting electronic surveillance.

With respect to Item Nos. 3 and 4, the Police Department did not readily identify any records as responsive. Although the Police Department admits that comments may be deleted from its pages, such comments are deleted automatically through Facebook to remove any comments that contained terms banned by the Police Department. The Department does not maintain a record of the posts deleted or the authors of such posts. Please be further advised that the list of banned terms is being provided to you in response to Item No. 1 of your request.

PURPOSE The purpose of this standard operating procedure is to provide guidance to the employees of the Wall Township Police Department concerning their personal web pages, websites, and other electronic social networking sites. A further purpose is to regulate this department's procedures concerning its social media/networking site(s).

POLICY While employees have a right to maintain personal web pages and websites, their status as members of the Wall Township Police Department requires that the content of those web pages and websites are not in violation of existing agency rules, regulations, policies, procedures, policies or create a potential conflict of interest. The Chief of Police reserves the right to restrict an employee's involvement in electronic social networking sites for the good of the agency.

It is further the policy of the Wall Township Police Department to utilize electronic social media to advise the public on matters of concern, foster community outreach efforts, investigate crimes, and to provide a mechanism for citizen feedback while safeguarding the Wall Township Police Department's professionalism.

PROCEDURES

I. GENERAL

A. Definitions:

1. Avatar – A computer user's representation of himself/herself, or an alter ego.

2. Blog – A series of electronic entries, diary or commentary, written by one or more persons in an on-line journal that may permit visitors to post responses, reactions or comments. The term is an abbreviated version of 'web-log'.
3. Comments – Responses to a blog post, news article, social media entry or other social networking post.
4. Commenting – The act of creating and posting a response to a blog post, news article, social media entry or other social networking post. Commenting can also entail the act of posting an original composition to an unrelated post or article.
5. Forum – An online discussion site.
6. Identity – An online identity, Internet identity or Internet persona that a social networking user establishes. This can be a real name, an alias, a pseudonym or a creative description.
7. Mobile social networking – Social networking using a mobile phone or other cellular based device.
8. Wall Township police personnel – Includes all sworn and non-sworn personnel.
9. Page – The specific portion of a social media website where content is displayed, and managed by an individual or individuals with administrator rights.
10. Post – The content a person shares on a social media site or blog; an entry to any type of computerized bulletin board; the act of publishing content on a social media site.
11. Posting – The act of creating, uploading, editing or adding to any social media outlet. This includes text, photographs, audio, video or any other multimedia file.
12. Profile – Information that a user provides about himself or herself on a social networking site.
13. Social networks – Online platforms where users can create profiles, share information, and socialize with others using a range of technologies.
14. Social media – A category of Internet-based resources that integrate user-generated content that allow people to communicate, share information, share photos, share videos, share audio and exchange text and other multimedia files with others via some form of online or cellular network platform. This includes, but is not limited to, social networking sites (Facebook®, MySpace®), micro-blogging sites (Twitter®), photo and video

sharing sites (Flickr®, Snapchat®, Instagram®, YouTube®), wikis (Wikipedia®), blogs, and news sites (Digg®, Reddit®).

15. Speech – Expression or communication of thoughts or opinions in spoken words, in writing, by expressive conduct, symbolism, photographs, videotape, or related forms of communication.
16. Web 2.0 – The second generation of the World Wide Web focused on shareable, user-generated content, rather than static web pages. Some use this term interchangeably with social media.
17. Wiki – Web page(s) that can be edited collaboratively. Post: an item inserted to a blog or an entry to any type of computerized bulletin board or forum.

- B. There are no reasonable expectations of privacy while engaging in social media activities. All social media is subject to public view and comment, criminal defense and prosecutorial review, and review by this agency.
- C. Conduct both on and off duty is subject to the rules and regulations of this agency. Any electronic social networking activity that brings discredit to the Wall Township Police Department and/or of an employee's status as an employee of this agency is prohibited.
- D. Employees shall not express personal opinion as official agency policy or position.
- E. Employees shall not display or post any image or comment involving a reference concerning any form of bias, hatred, or derogatory comments about any protected class of persons.
- F.

, employees shall not assume the identity of another or an identity that could be assumed to be a factual (e.g., alias, penname, avatar, etc.) while posting any comments.

II. DEPARTMENTAL USE OF SOCIAL MEDIA

A. Sanctioned Presence

1. Determine strategy
 - a. Where possible, each social media page shall include an introductory statement that clearly specifies the purpose and scope of the agency's presence on the website.
 - b. Where possible, the page(s) should link to the Wall Township Police Department's official website.
2. Procedures

- a. All Wall Township Police Department social media sites or pages shall be approved by the Chief of Police or his/her designee and shall be administered by the Chief's designee.
- b. Where possible, social media pages shall clearly indicate they are maintained by the Wall Township Police Department and shall have Wall Township Police Department contact information prominently displayed.
- c. Social media content shall adhere to applicable laws, regulations, and policies, including all information technology and records management policies.
- d. Where possible, social media pages should state that the opinions expressed by visitors to the page(s) do not reflect the opinions of the Wall Township Police Department.
- e. Pages shall clearly indicate that posted comments will be monitored and that the Wall Township Police Department reserves the right to remove obscenities, off-topic comments, personal attacks, and any posts that may identify juvenile offenders, endanger victims, or jeopardize an active investigation.

3. Sanctioned Use

- a. Wall Township Police Department personnel representing the Wall Township Police Department via social media outlets shall:
 - 1) Except where officially sanctioned by the Chief of Police (department managed sites), identify themselves as a member of the Wall Township Police Department and shall adhere to all existing federal, state, and local laws policies, standards of conduct, and procedures of the City of Wall Township and the Wall Township Police Department, laws regarding public information on arrests, investigations, and personnel data, and shall observe conventionally accepted protocols and proper decorum.
 - 2) Under no circumstances, make statements about the guilt or innocence of any suspect or arrestee, or comments concerning pending prosecutions.
 - 3) Not post, transmit, or otherwise disseminate confidential information, including photographs or videos, related to Wall Township Police Department training, activities, or work-related assignments, including crime or crash scenes, without the permission of the Chief of Police or his/her designee.
 - 4) Not conduct political activities or private business.

5) Not endorse any product or service without the prior written permission of the Chief of Police or his/her designee.

- b. The Chief of Police shall designate personnel to manage the department's social media. The designee is authorized to access such media from personally owned devices.
- c. Employees shall observe and abide by all copyright, trademark, and service mark restrictions in posting materials to electronic media.

III. PERSONAL USE

A. Barring state law or binding employment contracts to the contrary, Wall Township Police Department personnel shall abide by the following when using social media while off duty and using privately owned electronics.

- 1. Wall Township Police Department personnel are free to express themselves as private citizens on social media sites to the degree that their speech does not impair any working relationships within the Wall Township Police Department for which loyalty and confidentiality are important, impede the performance of duties, impair discipline and harmony among coworkers or negatively affect the public perception of the Wall Township Police Department.
- 2. As public employees, Wall Township Police Department personnel are cautioned that speech, dealing in matters of public concern, on or off-duty, made pursuant to their official duties, that is, that owes its existence to the employee's professional duties and responsibilities, is not protected speech under the First Amendment and may form the basis for discipline if deemed detrimental to the Wall Township Police Department. Wall Township Police Department personnel should assume that their speech and related activity on social media sites could adversely reflect upon their office and the Wall Township Police Department.
- 3. Employees are prohibited from using Wall Township Police Department computers, cell phones, personal data assistants, mobile data computers/terminals or any other devices for any unauthorized purpose, including participation in personal social media or social networking.
- 4. This prohibition shall include the use of departmental computers for bidding, buying and / or selling of personal items on such sites as eBay or similar activities that shall instead be conducted on an employee's personal computer.
- 5. Employees are prohibited from updating / posting to any personal social media or social networking platform from a department-owned device while on duty, (except while on an approved break or meal period, but not using a department-owned device) unless written permission is granted for investigative or public information purposes.

6. Wall Township Police Department personnel shall not post any information concerning their employment with the Wall Township Police Department that would be deemed inappropriate, offensive, or in violation of any rule, regulation or SOP of the Wall Township Police Department, nor shall they post information pertaining to any other member of the Wall Township Police Department without that employee's permission. As such, Wall Township Police Department personnel shall not:
 - a. Post personal photographs, or provide similar means of personal recognition that would cause them to be identified as a police employee of the Wall Township Police Department that would be deemed inappropriate, offensive, or in violation of any rule, regulation or SOP of the Wall Township Police Department. Some exceptions to this shall be the announcements of appointment, promotions, honors, graduations, retirements, or other such professional recognitions.
 - b. Post false or improper personal or professional information (e.g., college degree when one was not earned, training certification when one was not earned, etc.)
 - c. Unless granted explicit permission, employees of the Wall Township Police Department are prohibited from posting any of the following on any social networking platform, either on their own sites, the sites of others known to them, the sites of others unknown to them, news media pages, or other information exchange forums:
 - 1) Any text, photograph, audio, video, or any other multimedia file related to any investigation (criminal, quasi-criminal, or administrative), both current and past, of the Wall Township Police Department.
 - 2) Any text, photograph, audio, video, or any other multimedia file related to any past or current action of the Wall Township Police Department, either in homage or critique.
 - 3) Logos, badges, seals, uniforms, vehicles, equipment or any item or symbol that is affiliated with the Wall Township Police in an inappropriate or offensive manner or in a way that is in violation of any rule, regulation or SOP of the Wall Township Police Department.
 - 4) Any item, symbol, wording, number, likeness or material that is identifiable to the Wall Township Police Department in an inappropriate or offensive manner or in a way that is

in violation of any rule, regulation or SOP of the Wall Township Police Department.

- 5) Any text, photograph, audio, video, or any other multimedia file that is related to any occurrence within the Wall Township Police in an inappropriate or offensive manner or in a way that is in violation of any rule, regulation or SOP of the Wall Township Police Department.
 - 6) Weaponry, owned by this department and/or owned personally or privately, shall not be displayed or referenced to, in any multimedia format, on social media or social networking sites if such displays or depictions promote or glorify violence.
 - 7) Any text, photograph, audio, video or any other multimedia file included on a social media or social networking site that infers, implies, states, opines or otherwise expresses the officer's views on the public shall not be detrimental to the department's mission, nor shall it in any way undermine the public's trust or confidence in this department.
7. When using social media, Wall Township Police Department personnel should be mindful that their postings become part of the worldwide electronic domain. Therefore, adherence to the Wall Township Police Department's code of conduct and rules and regulations is required in the personal use of social media. In particular, Wall Township Police Department personnel are prohibited from the following:
- a. Postings containing obscene or sexually explicit language, images, or acts and statements or other forms of speech that ridicule, malign, disparage, or otherwise express bias against any race, ethnicity, religion or religious belief, sexual orientation, sexual identity, or any protected class of individuals.
 - b. Postings involving themselves or other Wall Township Police Department personnel reflecting behavior that would reasonably be considered reckless or irresponsible.
8. Engaging in prohibited postings noted herein may provide grounds for undermining or impeaching an officer's testimony in criminal, civil, and administrative proceedings. Personnel thus sanctioned are subject to discipline up to and including termination of office.
9. Wall Township Police Department personnel may not divulge information gained by reason of their authority, make any statements, speeches, appearances, and endorsements, or publish materials that could reasonably be considered to represent the views or positions of the Wall Township Police Department without the expressed written authorization from the Chief of Police.

10. Personnel should expect that any information created, transmitted, downloaded, exchanged, or discussed in a public online forum may be accessed by the Wall Township Police Department at any time without prior notice.
- B. Employees have the potential to be called as a witness in court proceedings related to their employment as a member of this agency. Credibility and character are subject to challenge and potential impeachment based upon the nature of postings on personal webpages, websites and other electronic social networking sites from any time, past or present and the person(s) or organization(s) with whom the employee networks.
 - C. Employees shall not network with judges, attorneys, court personnel, or other members of the judiciary or defense attorneys as it may result in adverse consequences to the operation of the police department or the Monmouth County Prosecutor's Office when prosecuting or attempting to prosecute criminal and civil matters. Examples of such consequences include, but are not limited to:
 1. Having to change prosecution venues if a conflict of interest is alleged;
 2. Rendering testimony of investigative personnel inadmissible or impeachable due to alleged conflicts of interest due electronic personal relationships;
 3. An increase in successful appeals due to perceived conflicts of interest.

IV. REPORTING VIOLATIONS

- A. Any employee becoming aware of or having knowledge of a posting or of any website or webpage in violation of this SOP shall notify his or her supervisor immediately for follow-up action.

V. APPROVAL PROCESS

- A. Any employee seeking approval to use any item, object, or material described in subsection III.A.6 on a personal webpage or website shall submit a written request through the chain of command to the Chief of Police.
 1. Describe the proposed reference to the agency and purpose.
 2. Provide a list of media to be used on the web page.
 3. Provide a printed layout of the material that is the subject of the request.
- B. The Chief of Police will approve or deny the request based upon the merits of the request and its compliance with existing agency SOPs or policies.
