On 10/24/2014 while on patrol. I observed a four door white sedan matching the description of an attempted child luring (14-13808) that occurred in this jurisdiction. I observed the vehicle initially travelling east on Pine Avenue. As the vehicle passed me I noticed he was not wearing his seat belt. I was travelling west on Pine Avenue at the time. I continued west on Pine Avenue and then proceeded east on Cedar Avenue and then passed the same vehicle again as he was travelling west on Cedar Avenue. I then turned and travelled west on Euclid Avenue. I radioed for dispatch for a DMV lookup of the license plate D78 ESB. I was advised that the vehicle was registered to Michael Mylod from Farmingdale, NJ. When I reached the intersection of Euclid and Warren Avenue, I stopped my patrol vehicle. I then observed the subject to be travelling north on Warren Avenue, still not wearing his seatbelt. As he passed me, he parked abruptly approximately 50 yards north of the intersection I was stopped at, about 2 feet from the curb. I then proceeded north on Warren Avenue and pulled my patrol vehicle to the side of the road. Ptl. Hamill was on patrol with me at this time. I then observed the subject to get out of the driver's side, walk to the passenger side rear of the vehicle and retrieve what appeared to be a floral arrangement. He then placed that in the front seat of the car and removed some trash, specifically a clear plastic Dunkin Donuts cup and a small black plastic bag. I then observed him to walk into Curtis park and throw away the plastic cup in the trash receptacle and the black bag in the recycling container. The subject at this time walked back to his car and got into the driver's seat. I then approached the vehicle and identified myself as a Manasquan Police officer and requested credentials. He was fumbling around his belongings and appeared frustrated and wanted to know why he was being stopped. I explained to him that he was not wearing a seatbelt and that his actions were suspicious in nature. He immediately became confrontational and stated I was harassing him and wanted to call his lawyer. I told him that I could detect an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his vehicle and wanted to perform psychophysical evaluations. The accused was reluctant at first and then complied. He denied having any alcoholic beverages. I escorted him to the sidewalk which was flat, level and free of any debris. The accused was wearing shoes and they were untied. I told him to tie his shoes, which he did, and he appeared as though he was going to fall over. At this time I asked him if he had any medical ailments which would prevent him from performing the tests and he stated that he had a [REDACTED]. I then demonstrated the walk and turn test and asked subject if he was able to perform the test. He stated that he was. He lost his balance during the instructions, had his arms out to the side for balance, didn't touch heel toe, started before the instructions were finished and turned incorrectly. I then performed a HGN test. (See MPD supplemental HGN report). I then instructed the accused to recite his alphabet from "E" to "Q" without singing. Subject started at "E" and finished the alphabet to "Z" and sang it as well. At this point, due to the odor of alcohol and the unsuccessful completions of the psychophysical evaluations he was placed under arrest and put into car 3 for transport to HQ. I then went to the recycling container I observed him place the black garbage bag in and retrieved the bag. It should be noted that this was the only item in the recycling container. Contained within the black garbage bag was an empty 25 ounce can of Budweiser Ice beer. I seized this item and placed it into evidence. While I was walking back to the patrol car with the evidence I was approached by an unknown female in the park who stated that she saw him throw away the beer as well. Ptl. Morton arrived on scene and advised me that he would be attempting to contact the victim to see if she could identify the vehicle. I transported the accused to HQ and Ptl. Hamill drove his vehicle to HQ where it was parked in the lot. Once at HQ, accused was placed into cell 2. I read the accused the DWI standard statement and he consented to taking samples of his breath. I contacted DSG Kleinknecht and he advised that a photo line up would have to be conducted for a positive identification to be made of the subject. Ptl. Morton then arrived with the victim of the attempted luring and she positively identified the suspect vehicle, specifically by stating she remembered the fabric on the seats. At this time I contacted DSG Kleinknecht via text message that the vehicle was positively identified.

AUP

The accused was removed from the cell at 1702 HRS and placed on a chair in the hallway outside of the processing room. He was observed by Ptl. Morton and time was kept on the clock in HQ. During this observation, the accused didn't belch, vomit or place anything into his mouth. He was mirandized by Ptl. Morton and he completed the DWI questionnaire. After the 20 minute observation was complete, Ptl. Morton placed the accused on the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C. Ptl. Morton secured his cell phone, radio and MVR recorder in the patrol room before administering the tests. The accused gave two good breaths. Ptl. Morton read the instructions to the accused before each breath and used a new mouthpiece each time. The accused B.A.C. was .00%. He was placed back into cell 2 and given his cell phone to call for a ride. He was released to his friend, the liability waiver signed, and court dates are set for 11/12/2014 at 900HRS.

It should be noted that the vehicle was secured and towed to Monmouth Auto Body. I spoke to Lt. Bauer in regards to this and the vehicle is not to be released until authorization from the Detective bureau is given, as the subject is a suspect in the luring investigation.
