



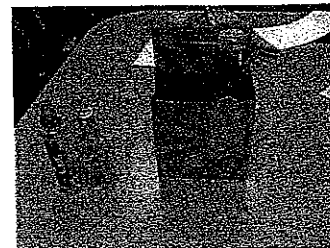

While on patrol on 08/24/2014 I was dispatched to the area of Third Avenue and Main Street to assist with a minor motor vehicle accident. Dispatch had received information that the driver of one of the vehicles may be intoxicated. Upon arrival at scene I spoke with S/O Brewer and he relayed the following information to me. He stated that the accused was operating a 2001 silver Volvo bearing NJ registration Z20 ELP. This vehicle was being operated by Amy Ortiz. The accused was travelling northbound on Third Avenue and northbound traffic was stopped at the intersection of Third Avenue and Main Street. The accused rear ended a vehicle in front of her that was stopped in traffic, a 2014 Volkswagen bearing NJ registration C34 EGV. The accident was minor in nature.

After speaking with S/O Brewer, I then observed the accused to be seated in her vehicle that was still in the middle of the roadway. She was slumped over the steering wheel and was crying. I instructed her to roll down her window so I could speak to her and also asked her to turn off the ignition. The accused rolled down the window, turned off the vehicle and then attempted to place the car into park (already in park). After she removed the keys from the ignition, she then attempted to place the car into drive. At this time the window was down and I could immediately detect a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her breath as well as the interior of the vehicle. I asked her how many alcoholic beverages she had to drink and she replied "none". I told her that this was a lie as I could smell it and at this time I asked her to step out of the vehicle. It should be noted that on the passenger side seat I observed a brown lunch bag that contained a 4 pack of small wine bottles and two empty "airplane" bottles of rum and a flavored vodka. These items were eventually seized and placed into evidence.

Upon her exiting the vehicle she opened the driver's side door and took a step out of the vehicle. At this time, she lost her balance and began to fall down so I stepped in front of her to stabilize her. I escorted her to the sidewalk and she was exhibiting signs of intoxication. Her eyes were bloodshot and watery, and her speech was slurred. I couldn't tell what she was trying to say because she was just mumbling. I secured the accused on the sidewalk and asked her if she knew the alphabet. She stated that yes she did. I asked her to recite it from the letter "E" to "Q" without singing and she was unable to complete this test. The accused was very unstable and was losing her balance just trying to stand so at this point I determined for her safety that no further psychophysicals would be administered and she was placed under arrest for DWI. She was handcuffed and placed into the rear of my patrol vehicle.

Enroute to HQ a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage filled the patrol vehicle and the accused was asking me repeatedly if she could just go home.

While at HQ the accused was placed into cell 1 at 1116 hrs. She was mirandized and read the standardized statement and gave consent for samples of her breath to be taken. She was then removed from the cell at 1120 hrs and my 20 minute observation began. (time kept on clock in hallway). During the 20 minute observation period, she did not belch, vomit, or place anything into her mouth. After the 20 minute observation was complete, the accused was placed on the Alcotest MKIII-C. My radio, cell phone and MVR recorder were secured in the detective bureau office before entering the Alcotest room. I prepared the Alcotest for the accused and as I was speaking to the accused I received an error message on the Alcotest that read "Ready to blow expired". The Alcotest then purged and a new test was prepared. I inserted a new mouthpiece and read her the required instructions for a proper test. The minimum volume was not achieved. The Alcotest was then purged again and a new test and mouthpiece was prepared. A proper sample was then received. The Alcotest was purged again for the 4th test and a new mouthpiece was inserted. The instructions were once again read to the accused and the minimum volume was not achieved. A 5th test was then conducted after the Alcotest was purged and a new mouthpiece was used. A second sample was then obtained. I then re-mirandized the accused and completed the MPD DWI Questions and related reports. Accused was then placed back into Cell 1. Once she was in the cell, she began to panic and was saying that she needed help and felt that she was going to kill herself. M.F.A.S. was dispatched to HQ and she was transported to JSMC for crisis evaluation. All court dates are set
