1. Contract with Flock Safety-The complete contract is included
2. List of locations where they have installed cameras- This will not be provided. According to NJSA 47:1A-1.1, this information is exempt due to security measures and surveillance techniques which, if disclosed, would create a risk to the safety of persons or property. Disclosure of locations would eviscerate the effectiveness of the system, allow for avoidance and thereby poses a safety risk. We can disclose the total number of cameras to be twelve(12).

If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within the seven (7) business days required by law, you have a right to challenge the decision by the Borough of South Plainfield to deny access. At your option, you may either institute proceedings in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC) by completing the Denial of Access Complaint Form. You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511, by mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625, by e-mail at grc@dca.state.nj.us, or at their web site at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.
