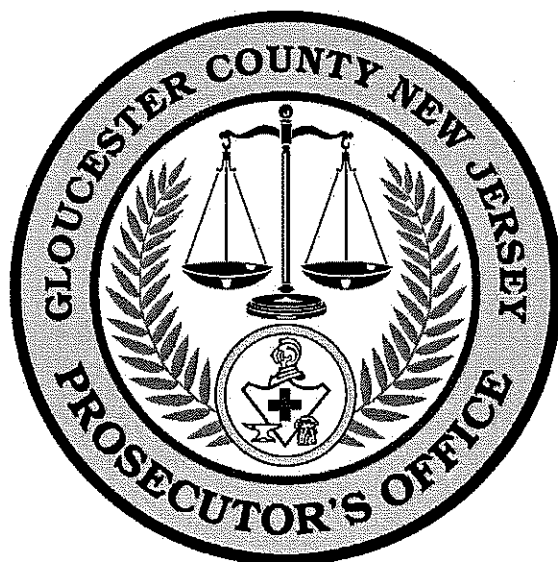

ARSON AND EXPLOSION **INVESTIGATIONS UNIT**

The Arson and Explosion Investigations Unit is primarily utilized to assist in the investigation of all arson fires, suspicious fires, explosions, and the possession and manufacturing of explosives in conjunction with the Gloucester County Fire Marshal's Office.

STAFFING:

All unit staff are assigned on a part-time basis. Also, an Insurance Fraud Agent is available to assist with investigations where there is a suspicion of insurance fraud.

ORGANIZATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The purpose of the Arson and Explosion Investigation Unit is to work in conjunction with local, county, state and federal law enforcement agencies and fire agencies in order to successfully investigate and prosecute arson cases. The Arson and Explosion Investigation Unit responds to and investigates a variety of cases, including but not limited to the following:

- All fires or explosions that directly or indirectly result in death or serious bodily injury;
- All incendiary fires occurring in residential or commercial buildings, whether occupied or not, at the time of the fire;
- All incendiary fires, regardless of whether the focus of the fire is a "structure" as defined by N.J.S.A. 2C:18-1, which appears to be part of a pattern of serial fire setting;
- A fire or explosion in which a public official, law enforcement officer or a member of the fire service is a potential suspect;
- All incendiary fires involving property, equipment or structures owned or occupied by the government of the county or any municipality within the county;

- Catastrophic fires or explosions, regardless of whether the cause and origin are readily apparent;
- All cases involving bombings or attempted or facsimile bombs (i.e.: post-bomb investigation); and
- A fire or explosion in which a suspect is already in police custody, at the direction or request of a local police department.

In addition to the above, detectives from the Arson and Explosion Unit respond to assist the Gloucester County Fire Marshal's Office or local municipal Fire Marshal's Office should assistance be requested to investigate the origin and cause of fires.

Members of the Arson and Explosion Unit continue to respond and render safe incidents within Gloucester and Camden Counties as outlined in the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Camden County Bomb Squad. The costs for the training and equipment are continued to be funded by the New Jersey Render Safe Task Force and the New Jersey Department of Homeland Security.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2020:

During 2020, the Arson and Explosion Investigation Unit responded to 2 fire-related investigations. These 2 incidents were determined to be arson/incendiary fires. In addition, unit members responded to several bomb related investigations.

CRIME SCENE INVESTIGATION UNIT

The mission of the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office Crime Scene Unit is to engage in the profession of scientific identification and investigation. It is our duty to serve the interest of justice at all times.

ORGANIZATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The CSI Unit responds to a wide variety of calls ranging from burglaries to homicides. The unit provides support services to all investigative sections within the office, as well as to all municipalities in Gloucester County. Those services include the following:

Crime Scene Examination and Evidence Collection

The CSI Unit documents the scene by means of still photography, video photography, and sketches. After the evidence is collected, the unit may process the evidence in-house or forward evidence to various laboratories for further testing.

Training

Three members of the unit are trained in Shooting Reconstruction. Three members of the unit are trained in Blood Spatter Interpretation. One member of the unit is trained in Entomology.

Evidence Storage

The CSI Unit is responsible for the tracking and storage of seized domestic violence weapons and criminal evidence. The unit transports evidence to various labs including: the New Jersey State Police Office of Forensic Sciences Laboratory, Hamilton, New Jersey; the New Jersey State Medical Examiner's Lab in Newark;

Cellmark DNA Lab in Maryland; and The Office of Chief Medical Examiner, New York City.

Fingerprint Classification, Comparison and Expert Testimony

All members of the CSI Unit are trained fingerprint examiners. Unit members must be able to testify in court as experts and their efforts have to stand up to challenges by defense, which may be using experts of its own. Many cases included the development of latent fingerprint identifications. Those identifications were instrumental in the arrests of suspects in addition to clearing many cases throughout Gloucester County.

Trial Preparation

Trial preparation is done through witness testimony and the presentation of physical evidence, photographs, charts, diagrams, maps and models when required. The CSI Unit is the primary source for all of these presentation aids.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2020:

Homicides claimed the lives of six victims in Gloucester County during 2020. As a testament to the investigative efforts employed by the members of the CSI Unit working in conjunction with the Major Crimes Unit, all of the homicide investigations resulted in arrests. This work included the following:

- Over the course of several days, the CSI Unit organized a search of a wooded area where the partial remains of a homicide victim were found, excavating and recovering over 100 bones of the victim.
- Over the course of three days, the CSI Unit methodically reconstructed the shooting scene involving two victims, providing key evidence in the case.
- The CSI Unit analyzed the blood stains on the living room walls, carpet, and ceiling where the victim had been bludgeoned to death with a baseball bat.

The CSI Unit also provided assistance at the scenes of various shootings. This work included the following:

- The CSI Unit processed the scene where two people were shot in the parking lot of a local club. The scene spanned several hundred feet in each direction and contained approximately 75 pieces of evidence, including 15 shell casings.
- The CSI Unit processed a shooting scene, locating 19 shell casings and multiple projectiles.

In addition to homicides and shootings, the CSI Unit investigated or processed multiple cases throughout the year.

Furthermore, members of the CSI Unit share their expertise and training with their law enforcement peers. The CSI Unit also hosts an annual 'Crime Scene Processing' workshop, which consists of 32 hours of hands-on training in fingerprint development, alternate light source, photography, presumptive blood tests, and blood print development and crime scene processing. Another outlet is their continued support of the Gloucester County Police Academy by coordinating advanced training seminars and instructing recruit classes. The CSI Unit coordinated a four-day Crime Scene Investigations course designed for new detectives and a Basic Crime Scene Photography course for law enforcement officers. The CSI Unit is also frequently called upon to provide crime scene investigation demonstrations and lectures for local high schools, junior police academies, and civic organizations.

FUGITIVE INVESTIGATIONS UNIT

The mission of the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office Fugitive Investigations Unit is to apprehend wanted persons and fugitives from justice. The FIU works in conjunction with the New Jersey State Police, the United States Marshal's Service NY/NJ Regional Fugitive Task Force, Federal Bureau of Investigation, and other federal, state, county and local agencies.

ORGANIZATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The sergeant and detective search, track and apprehend both in-state and out-of-state defendants who have been issued Superior Court of New Jersey Bench Warrants for failure to appear at any stage of prosecution, warrants from direct presentment of indictments, and warrants for failure to comply with court ordered conditions. They also arrest and process fugitives wanted by out-of-state agencies after verifying the extradition status and appropriate legal documentation. They coordinate and conduct emergent arrest operations for wanted defendants who have committed violent crimes in Gloucester County and are actively evading law enforcement, as well as proactive operations focused on arresting habitual offenders in high crime areas with outstanding warrants. They also assist the GCPO investigative units with locating and arresting wanted subjects related to their investigations. They work cooperatively with local, state, and federal law enforcement partners to facilitate these operations. Moreover, both have numerous responsibilities on tactical teams, as instructors, and for the Uniform Crime Reporting.

The Assistant Prosecutor assigned to the unit provides the necessary legal assistance with extradition hearings, waiver hearings and Governor's Warrant applications. The Assistant Prosecutor also reviews and approves communication data warrants, search warrants, and body warrants before they are presented to a Superior Court Judge.

The FIU support staff processes correspondence, maintains an in-house Gloucester County Fugitive Information database, update NCIC entries for wanted persons, and implements Governor's Warrant Applications, Interstate Compact Agreements (juvenile offenders), Interstate Agreements on Detainers (IAD). In 2020, FIU support staff processed 365 new warrants, 10 Governor's Warrants Applications, 4 IADs, and 75 Extradition Waivers. Additionally, FIU coordinated with the Gloucester County Sheriff's Department with extraditing 28 offenders from other states. The extraditions, Governor's Warrants and IADs have significantly decreased because of the COVID-19 Pandemic.

The GCPO remains an active member of the United States Marshal's Service New York/New Jersey Regional Fugitive Task Force, receiving grant funding as well as additional resources when needed. This task force is responsible for identifying and locating violent fugitives. These federal task force also review all current fugitive files in order to verify feasibility of prosecution.

In 2019, the GCPO established a part-time Fugitive Task Force with the Woodbury Police Department and the Franklin Township Police Department. The goal of this task force was to standardize fugitive investigations and provide tactical training by certified officers. The implementation of this task force has been very successful in tracking down and arresting violent criminals.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2020:

In 2020, the FIU made 65 arrests, including numerous high profile arrests for dangerous and violent offenders. Because of actions by the FIU, a total of 1,750 Superior Court bench warrants also were resolved.

FIU members were instrumental in locating and apprehending several violent offenders who were responsible for numerous serious offenses in Gloucester County in 2020. Below are some investigative highlights in which detectives had to use various investigative methods to track and locate the fugitives:

- Jose Saez was tracked and located in a homeless shelter in Camden after he beat his victim to death with a baseball bat. He was arrested as he was attempting to get on a bus headed to Pennsylvania.

- Daniel Hall fled to north jersey after his role in a double homicide and robbery. When located, he slammed the door in the face of the detective but was then arrested after the door was forcibly opened.
- Nykel Prout fled to Philadelphia after two victims were stabbed. He was arrested for aggravated assault and related charges after detectives found him hidden in a closet underneath clothes in an apartment.
- Stefaun Corley was involved in a fatal shooting and fled to Chester, Pennsylvania. He was arrested after he was located in a hotel where he was staying under a friend's name and was uncooperative.
- Aaron Beasley assaulted a subject with a fire extinguisher, pulled a handgun and attempted to fire it at the victim. He was similarly tracked to a hotel in Camden County, where he was arrested and the handgun used in the crime was recovered.
- Kadejha Cummings drove while intoxicated and caused a serious accident while his 5-year old nephew was unrestrained in the car seat in 2013. After she was arrested and released, she immediately fled the state. The case received significant amount of local and regional media attention, and she was placed on the GCPO Top Ten Most Wanted List. She was recently tracked and apprehended at a casino in Atlantic City.

In addition to the above, FIU members assigned to the US Marshalls NY/NJ Regional Fugitive Task Force, Camden Field Office, participated in several arrest operations targeting homicide suspects and other violent offenders. They also assisted municipal police departments during proactive enforcement operations and participated in mobile deployment operations. They were routinely called upon by these departments to lead emergent arrest operations and were responsible for the arrests of individuals responsible for robberies, aggravated assaults, sexual assaults, weapons possession, and numerous burglaries. Many of the arrestees were violent criminals, habitual offenders, or gang members.

GANGS, GUNS AND NARCOTICS TASK FORCE

Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office Gangs, Guns and Narcotics Task Force works in partnership with the federal Homeland Security Investigations, and we are designated as a High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area Task Force. Our task force works cooperatively with municipal police departments, neighboring county prosecutor's offices, state law enforcement agencies, and federal agencies to enhance our collective abilities to combat drug trafficking and gang issues in Gloucester County.

Since the designation as a HIDTA Task Force, the number of municipal police officers and their total time assigned to the task force has proven to be invaluable. As a result of municipal police participation, the number of drug related investigations and arrests have increased. Officers who have previously served with our unit have returned to their departments with the training and experiences learned during their time with the task force, which has made an impact in drug enforcement in their jurisdictions.

ORGANIZATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office has implemented a task force to address drug traffickers traveling to and from Gloucester County. We have a number of major thoroughfares throughout Gloucester County identified as primary routes that traffickers travel to bring drugs into Gloucester County from neighboring metropolitan areas and even internationally as far as Mexico. Drug consumers also utilize those same routes to purchase their narcotics and ultimately to return to the Gloucester County area. With support from our partners within the Liberty Mid-Atlantic HIDTA region, we initiate and develop cases focusing on stopping drug trafficking organizations and improving the quality of life in our communities. Through HIDTA support, we have

key access to additional personnel, equipment, and intelligence. By enhancing our abilities through these partnerships, we provide a dynamic, proactive approach that leads to successful investigations and prosecutions.

The task force also provides investigative assistance and support to municipal police departments to reduce the volume of "open air" drug sales and related violent crimes. This is accomplished by deploying personnel to support wiretap investigations and street level operations. We frequently provide undercover officers for buy/bust and reverse purchases and support the subsequent arrests. We often implement investigative methods such as targeted street encounters, cultivation of key sources, and probable cause purchases. These methods are utilized to obtain search warrants, which are executed by the Gloucester County Entry Team or SWAT. Additionally, each task force member has been assigned as a liaison to each Gloucester County municipality in order to promote good working relationships, information sharing, and officer safety.

Intelligence gathering and information sharing is vital to successfully identifying and targeting drug traffickers, illegal firearms dealers, and violent gang members. The reformation of the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office Intelligence Unit has established a system in which information sharing is maximized and is a foundation for our intelligence-led policing initiative. The Intelligence Unit is comprised of Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office staff and a team of hand-picked intelligence liaisons. The liaisons are all sworn law enforcement personnel that represent each of Gloucester County's municipalities, the Gloucester County Sheriff's Department, and the Gloucester County Department of Correctional Services. The Infoshare Intelligence Database and other computer programs represent the technological means by which information is gathered, analyzed, collated, cataloged, and disseminated as finished intelligence product to law enforcement users in the field. The backbone of our intelligence-led threat assessments is the formation of clear lines of communication and cooperative relationships with the law enforcement agencies with whom we work.

The task force employs a multi-faceted approach to prevention. Our initiative focuses on diverting individuals who have a drug dependency and offer them with assistance and guidance for recovery. Our investigative group will refer those individuals with substance abuse problems to our various Operation Helping Hand programs supported by various Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office staff members, municipal prosecutors, and police departments. These OHH programs provide avenues for those individuals with addictions before and after charging, with referrals to partner treatment providers and advocates. This initiative brings education, awareness and the environment to remove stigma from the disease of substance use disorder at zero cost to the community. The first year of implementation began with

one municipality as a pilot program. It was so successful that within the first six months, the program was reviewed and then began implementation across Gloucester County. Moreover, we have an assistant prosecutor assigned that exclusively handles drug recovery court for charged crimes. Working within the legal framework, the assistant prosecutor embraces the mission and diligently works to find and place those in need of recovery into services and programs.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2020:

Since the initiation of the HIDTA Task Force, we have successfully investigated a range of drug and weapon cases within Gloucester County and surrounding counties - both as the lead agency and assisting agency.

- Throughout the spring of 2020, the task force conducted a wiretap investigation that resulted multiple arrests including for leader of narcotics trafficking and seizure of both a kilogram of cocaine and a kilogram of heroin. This dismantled a drug trafficking organization being supplied from Mexico.
- While working a multi-agency investigation, the task force made 3 federal arrests and seized 6 kilograms of heroin/fentanyl, 53 grams of MDMA, 348 grams of tramadol, and 42 weapons.
- While working with the DEA, the task force made 2 arrests for money laundering and attempted delivery of 1 kilogram of fentanyl.
- While working with the Deptford Township Police Department, the task force made 3 arrests and seized quantities of marijuana, over 1,300 various pills, a defaced Smith & Wesson .38 Special, and a stolen H&K 9 mm handgun.
- Additional investigations resulted in a total of 6 arrests and seizures of 5 ounces of marijuana, over 2 grams of cocaine and crack cocaine, 2 grams of heroin, ½ gram of MDMA, various pills, and 7 weapons.

GRAND JURY UNIT

The Grand Jury Unit of the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office is dedicated to the efficient and thorough review of all allegations of indictable crimes, as well as all pre-indictment events mandated by Criminal Justice Reform. Our decisions in the Grand Jury Unit largely determine the course each particular case will take in the criminal justice system. Our goal is the prompt, fair, impartial, professional handling of every matter that we review.

ORGANIZATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Over 3,000 cases were opened in the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office in 2020. These cases are reviewed and then proceed through the criminal justice system. Some more minor offenses are remanded back to the municipal courts for a quicker resolution, and appropriate offenses are transferred to Family Court. The remaining cases are presented to the grand jury. Assistant Prosecutors, Paralegal Specialists, and Detectives work together to ensure that the cases presented to grand jury are well prepared. Our staff works with the local police departments to develop probable cause and consider proofs which would be necessary to prove a case beyond a reasonable doubt. Also, we have continued to refine our screening systems so that matters can be reviewed more efficiently and made adjustments to sending out pre-indictment discovery. We continually review our procedures to ensure that we meet the deadlines of Criminal Justice Reform and the mandates of the Victims' Bill of Rights.

Each grand jury is empaneled for sixteen weeks and meets once per week. There is only one grand jury empaneled for each session. The Court empanels new grand juries in February, July and November. Assistant Prosecutors advise the grand jury of the relevant statutes, proposed indictments, and a synopsis of the State's proofs through witness testimony. We have continued the process whereby in addition to a mailed

subpoena, we email subpoenaed officers and confirm those officers' appearance with follow up phone calls and text messages.

This year the Grand Jury Unit dealt with the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, as did the entire world. Due to the pandemic, we were unable to present grand jury matters from March 2020 until October 2020. In October 2020, we were able to conduct in-person, socially distanced grand jury presentations until December. We then converted to virtual grand jury presentations, where the grand jurors were virtual while the Assistant Prosecutor and witness were present together. An additional Assistant Prosecutor observed the process virtually to ensure the soundness of the presentations.

HIGH-TECH CRIMES UNIT

The High-Tech Crimes Unit is comprised of both law enforcement and legal personnel. The members of this Unit conduct proactive and reactive investigations in which computers, digital equipment, cellular telephones or other advanced technology are used to facilitate a criminal act or are the objects of the attack. They also conduct forensic examinations of seized computers, and other pieces of digital media, for evidence of criminal activity.

The HTCU participates on various state and federal task forces and plays an important contributing role. Members of this Unit also provide investigative and technical assistance to local law enforcement agencies throughout Gloucester and surrounding counties. Training is provided to the municipal police officers throughout the county on topics such as computer crime investigations and the seizure and preservation of electronic evidence. Internet Safety Presentations are provided to civic, business, and educational organizations regarding computers and family safety on the Internet.

ORGANIZATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The HTCU conducted computer crimes investigations, such as child pornography (possession, distribution, and manufacturing), luring and enticing of children, invasion of privacy, computer theft, and cyber harassment. The HTCU also played crucial roles in a variety of other crimes in which computers or mobile devices were used, such as homicide, assault, robbery, and various frauds.

The HTCU continues to support local police departments with technology related investigations. To assist detectives with the growing number of digital media related crimes, the HTCU provides training at the Gloucester County Police Academy several times throughout the year and continues to host a week-long school titled High Technology Crimes Investigations. The trainings included various topics such as

investigations involving computers, cellular telephones, tablets, video surveillance recovery, cellular phone mapping and the extraction of data from other digital devices.

During 2020, the HTCUC conducted over 10 Cyberbullying and Sexting Presentations at various schools and civic organizations. The programs educate parents, children, teachers, administrators and law enforcement professionals on various internet/computer safety issues and programs. Due to COVID-19, the presentations shifted to a virtual presentation, rather than in-person. Over 500 people attended the virtual presentations.

Throughout the year, Unit personnel received advanced level training in various fields of computer and digital media forensic examinations. As a result of these trainings, the Unit obtained several pieces of hardware/software and certifications that assist in the examination of computers, cellular telephones, or other pieces of digital media.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2020:

In 2020, the HTCUC conducted investigations into child exploitation cases, many developed from the 39 cyber-tip referrals from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. The HTCUC also self-initiated 2 cases from peer-to-peer networks where exploitation materials were being shared and 3 cases from engaging in undercover chats with suspects attempting to lure children. The HTCUC actively participated in statewide operations conducted by the New Jersey Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force and large-scale operations conducted by the FBI Cyber Task Force. In an effort to strengthen the Prosecutor's Office commitment to the investigation of the growing number of crimes being committed against children during the COVID-19 pandemic, the HTCUC added other municipal police departments to the ICAC Task Force.

Throughout the year, the HTCUC assisted the Major Crimes Unit and the Crime Scene Investigation Unit with several homicide investigations. The HTCUC was requested to examine several pieces of digital media ranging from laptop computers to cellular phones. The results, which ranged from the recovery of deleted text messages from the cellular phones, GPS location data, videos and/or images, to Internet searches related to the investigation. The HTCUC also assisted in several homicide and shooting investigations that involved the identification and recovery of surveillance videos from multiple systems. The HTCUC responded to and canvassed crime scene areas and recovered several surveillance videos which aided in these investigations. The HTCUC also assisted local police departments in 48 cases. Overall, the HTCUC forensically examined 185 computers/mobile devices and performed 16 video surveillance extractions.

INSURANCE FRAUD UNIT

The Insurance Fraud Unit of the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office was established in July 1999. It is partially funded by the County Prosecutor's Office Reimbursement Program, awarded to the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office by the Office of the Insurance Fraud Prosecutor. The goal of the IFU is to identify, investigate and prosecute violations of New Jersey's criminal statutes pertaining to insurance fraud.

ORGANIZATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The IFU operates as both a reactive and proactive investigative entity. The unit investigator meets frequently with the unit prosecutor to review current investigations. The unit investigator also acts as a liaison with other criminal detectives as needed. Despite the restrictions of the pandemic, the IFU continued to aggressively conduct its investigations and prosecutions, with a number of complaints filed and indictments returned.

The IFU keeps in close contact with the Office of the Insurance Fraud Prosecutor, National Insurance Crime Bureau, and the Department of Banking and Insurance. These contacts have resulted in a steady number of referrals of potential incidents of insurance fraud, and each referral is thoroughly investigated by the unit investigator. In addition, the IFU conducts outreach with various Special Investigation Units of insurance companies that write policies in the southern New Jersey area. This allows the unit to obtain criminal cases in a timely manner and encourages the flow of information on various new criminal trends.

The IFU also investigates arsons that occur in the county. Many arsons are motivated by desire for payment through an insurance policy. However, that is not always the case. If an arson is determined to not contain an aspect of insurance fraud, the investigation would be closed under the insurance fraud grant, and would instead be investigated by detectives from other units.

The IFU attends various training seminars offered to local law enforcement officials, county agencies, and SIU personnel of insurance carriers. These programs are successful in training investigators to spot fraudulent insurance identification cards, assisting them in searching for and identifying the necessary evidence to prove the required elements of the insurance fraud statutes, and to stay up to date with new criminal practices. It also provides invaluable networking opportunities.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2020:

By cultivating and maintaining the above contacts, the IFU received numerous insurance fraud referrals throughout 2020. The IFU also proactively developed various insurance fraud cases. Diligently investigating, the IFU charged and prosecuted the following individuals who committed insurance-related offenses:

- Anaizah Bowman fraudulently filed a claim from a motor vehicle accident that occurred while her policy had lapsed.
- Shajuan Clark fraudulently filed a homeowner's insurance claim that a burst water pipe caused the damage rather than the area flooding that was not covered under the policy.
- John Valentine committed rate evasion by claiming on his auto insurance policies that he resided in Pennsylvania when he, in fact, resided in Gloucester County.
- Beau Togno falsely claimed that he had not been in any accidents or that his vehicle was not damaged in his renewal application for a lapsed auto insurance policy. Togno had just been in an accident hours before, and he quickly filed a claim two days after the policy was reinstated.
- Kristen Lee misrepresented material facts in support of a claim that her rental vehicle was stolen. However, Lee knew that her boyfriend had been driving the vehicle when he was involved in a shooting incident that resulted in damage to the vehicle.

JUVENILE UNIT

The Juvenile Unit is responsible for prosecuting juveniles for acts of delinquency, which range from petty disorderly persons offenses to first degree offenses. The unit's goal is to handle cases expeditiously, while upholding the statutes' goals for juvenile rehabilitation. The unit serves as a resource for law enforcement officers and frequently provides legal guidance on juvenile issues to municipal officers. Furthermore, the unit also participates in a number of committees and programs that address juvenile rehabilitation and restorative justice, as well presents to schools and organizations.

ORGANIZATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Juvenile Unit Assistant Prosecutor screens all incoming juvenile complaints. The Assistant Prosecutor appears for all mandatory detention hearings, plea hearings, trial, disposition hearings, restitution hearings, and violation of probation hearings. The Assistant Prosecutor also files legal briefs and argues all accompanying motions, including motions for waiver to adult court when appropriate. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the Assistant Prosecutor appeared virtually for these court appearances. The Assistant Prosecutor and support staff work closely together to gather and provide discovery, while keeping victims abreast on their cases.

The Assistant Prosecutor provides legal advice to police officers in all municipalities in Gloucester County on a regular basis. The Juvenile Unit, along with the Gloucester County Juvenile Detectives Association, also plans and organizes the quarterly Juvenile Officer/Detective information-sharing meetings and coordinates an annual training conference for law enforcement and education personnel.

The Assistant Prosecutor is involved with all aspects of juvenile delinquency. The Assistant Prosecutor works closely with the police officers to encourage use of the stationhouse adjustment program to decrease the signing of juvenile complaints. The program allows youth to receive services before juvenile delinquency incidents began to escalate, allows the juvenile to keep their record clean, avoid the stigma of becoming a delinquent, and furthers an improved relationship between law enforcement and the

community. In all juvenile matters, the Assistant Prosecutor recommends programs or residential placements for juveniles who are in need of services from the community and the Juvenile Justice Commission. The Assistant Prosecutor continues to work with the Youth Services Commission and Unified Case Management Office to implement programs that will provide the juvenile and their family services, from narcotics dependency to mental health issues. The Assistant Prosecutor attends and participates in all meetings for the Juvenile Detention Alternatives to Incarceration program, which has been a major component with respect to diverting juveniles facing new charges into alternative placement programs so that the juvenile can receive the support and care necessary for their needs. Moreover, the Assistant Prosecutor speaks at various programs at school and organizations when requested.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2020:

In 2020, a total of 122 cases (involving 263 charges) were resolved. A total of 87 juveniles were adjudicated delinquent, including 2 juvenile trials which resulted in adjudication of delinquency of one or more charges. Also, there were 3 juvenile waiver decisions.

The Assistant Prosecutor now screens all juvenile complaints before they are filed with Family Court. Because of this change, there has been a sizeable increase of stationhouse adjustments. Moreover, the efficiency of the complaints has increased because the Assistant Prosecutor can dismiss or amend complaints to more accurate legal charges before they are docketed with Family Court. Notably, this change allows a dismissal to take place without it ever being on the juveniles' criminal history.

In December 2020, the Juvenile Unit created a new countywide Juvenile Directive, in compliance with and as required by the Attorney General's Office. This directive set new standards for charging and was implemented in January 2021.

The Juvenile Unit works hand in hand with the JDAI program. One of the program goals is to conduct a continuous, critical examination of the juvenile detention system in order to ensure that its efficiency and effectiveness are maximized. The Juvenile Unit assisted in creating the Detention Alternative Continuum, which set four alternative levels (Shelter Placement, House Arrest, Home Detention and the Juvenile Home Electronic Detention) to ensure the proper placement and review of the juvenile during pendency of the charges.

MAJOR CRIMES UNIT

The Major Crimes Unit of the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office is in place to answer the call of public safety to all citizens in our community. Every employee assigned to the Unit is a valued member of a team committed to professional excellence and the respect and protection of an individual's rights and liberties. We act with integrity to foster the trust of those we serve, the citizens of Gloucester County, and all those who pass through our jurisdiction. Our goal is to ensure a safer environment for our citizens and conduct thorough investigation when a serious violation of the law occurs.

ORGANIZATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The MCU Lieutenant or Sergeant screens the cases and, when appropriate, will assign cases to one or more detectives. A number of cases are referred to other agencies, and unit members subsequently track or assist until completion. Case status briefings are held routinely between the Sergeant and the detectives, as well as when needed with the Chief and the County Prosecutor. Detectives also consult on a regular basis with members of the legal staff. All major crimes investigated by the unit are prepared for court in cooperation with the Assistant Prosecutor assigned to the case. On complex cases, unit members often assist the assistant prosecutor during the trial.

The MCU investigates all types of serious crimes that occur in Gloucester County, with the exception of narcotics and cases involving special victims. Detectives respond to most deaths that are reported to the local police that are classified as *homicide, suicide, unattended, accidental, drug related, and automobile*. With a few exceptions, cases investigated by the MCU detectives are done so in cooperation with local detectives. Many of the investigations conducted by the MCU involve *fraud, robbery, internet crimes, aggravated assault, arson, and theft*. Other crimes are evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

Of note, the MCU is responsible for elder abuse investigations. In Gloucester County, we have a long-standing elder abuse working group with key county partners. We receive a number of referrals through our partners. We also have been active in

community presentations and education, as well recently starting a number of initiatives related to preventing abuse.

The MCU is additionally responsible for bias crimes investigations. All reported bias incidents are carefully tracked and reviewed for potential criminal charges. We also work closely with the bias crimes liaisons in all of the municipal police departments, and frequently provide both investigative and legal guidance related to bias crimes. We attend the statewide bias crimes officers meetings, as well as engage in community outreach.

Unit members continue to build on their expertise in the areas of interviewing victims, witnesses, and suspects. They also receive training in many aspects of the job in various settings throughout the country. Unit members are also instructors at the Gloucester County Police Academy and coordinate some of the training at the Academy.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2020:

Homicides claimed the lives of 6 victims in Gloucester County during 2020:

- In February 2020, the skeleton remains were located of missing person Miguel Martinez in a wooded area in Deptford Township. Michael Zapple was subsequently arrested and charged in connection with the homicide.
- In August 2020, two victims were discovered shot to death in their home. Altaifjoe Hassan, Abdelgadi Hassah, Daniel Hall, and Devon Conover were arrested and charged in connection with this double homicide.
- In September 2020, the victim was discovered bludgeoned to death in her residence. Jose Saez was arrested and charged with the homicide.
- In October 2020, the victim was discovered deceased in her residence by blunt force trauma to the chest. Her husband, Stanley Wilson, confessed and was charged with the homicide.
- In November 2020, the victim was shot during a dispute outside of his home. Stefaun Corley was arrested and charged with the homicide.

In addition to the active homicide and attempted homicide investigations, MCU detectives vigorously investigate Gloucester County's unsolved homicides dating as far back as the 1970s. All the detectives in MCU strive to solve these difficult homicide cases, and they met with the Prosecutor on a monthly basis to discuss their progress.

Although, MCU does not conduct narcotics investigations, many of our investigations have a nexus with controlled dangerous substances, including drug-related deaths, home invasions, and homicides. Recently, the MCU has taken a more active role in investigating strict liability drug deaths.

Statistics

There were 182 MCU investigations opened in 2020 along with 5 walk-in notifications only. A breakdown of those cases is as follows:

Additionally, MCU members also have other instructional duties including firearms, Taser, Resiliency, and Police Academy.

MOTOR VEHICLE CRASH INVESTIGATION UNIT

The Crash Investigation Unit of the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office completed its twenty-third year of operation in 2020. The CIU is responsible for investigating, jointly with municipal police departments or the New Jersey State Police, all fatal and serious bodily injury motor vehicle crashes in Gloucester County. It is also responsible for investigating police motor vehicle pursuits that end in injury or death to civilians. The CIU prosecutes all indictable criminal charges arising out of these investigations. Additionally, the CIU is responsible for various comprehensive traffic safety programs.

ORGANIZATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The CIU is required to be notified by municipal police departments of all fatal and serious bodily injury motor vehicle crashes in Gloucester County. As needed, the CIU then assists with investigations, particularly where extensive follow-up is required. These investigations rely on securing witness statements and documentation and collection of physical evidence at the scene. Additionally, the CIU sergeant assigned to the squad is a traffic crash reconstructionist.

All cases that result in criminal charges being filed are forwarded to the Chief of the Grand Jury Unit. The Chief works closely with an Assistant Prosecutor to screen the cases and, when appropriate, present cases to the Grand Jury.

The CIU sergeant also performs the duties of traffic safety coordinator and is the program director of the county's DWI Sobriety Checkpoint Program, the Gloucester County Highway Safety Taskforce, and the Comprehensive Traffic Safety Program. The investigator also coordinates training programs for municipal police departments.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2020:

In 2020, the CIU was involved in 33 fatal motor vehicle crash investigations, which resulted in 4 cases being charged and subsequently indicted by the Grand Jury for

vehicular homicide. Also, the CIU was involved in 30 assault by auto cases, which have resulted in a range of charges (aggravated assault using a motor vehicle, assault by auto, leaving the scene of a crash with serious bodily injury, suspended driver causing serious bodily injury as a result of motor vehicle crash, and endangering an injured victim).

The CIU, in conjunction with the Highway Safety Taskforce, has continued to strive to lower motor vehicle fatalities. We led a regional Driving While Intoxicated enforcement effort in the "Over the Limit, Under Arrest" holiday saturation patrols. Funds were distributed to 8 municipal police departments in Gloucester County. As a result, 2 DWI arrests were made as well as over 400 motor vehicle summonses issued. Also, after receiving a grant, we continued to conduct sobriety checkpoints and saturation patrols throughout the year but at a greatly reduced number because of COVID-19 concerns. As a result, 1 DWI arrest and 5 additional arrests for narcotics and open alcohol violations were made as well as 47 motor vehicle summonses issued.

Given the success of the regional DWI enforcement program, the CIU and Highway Safety Taskforce were also awarded grants to lead a regional effort in Click it or Ticket and Distracted Driving. Unfortunately, these mobilizations were not conducted due to COVID-19. These mobilizations are anticipated to resume in 2021. Additionally, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Highway Safety Taskforce did not hold its annual Highway Safety Video Contest. It is anticipated that the contest will resume in the coming years.

PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS UNIT

The Professional Standards Unit of the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office reports directly to the Prosecutor and Chief of Detectives in the county. The Unit is responsible with administering the investigative and disciplinary processes for members of the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office. This includes investigations of misconduct complaints received against members of the office, Chiefs of Police within Gloucester County and the criminal review of all investigations involving sworn members of law enforcement in Gloucester County.

ORGANIZATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Members of the Professional Standards Unit are tasked with completing administrative and criminal investigations involving the review and investigation of complaints alleging police misconduct, to include allegations of excessive use of force and disparate treatment. Members conduct reviews of administrative investigations and internal affairs functions of local police agencies within the county to ensure compliance with the New Jersey Attorney General's Internal Affairs Policy and Procedures. The unit also conducts investigations as directed by the Gloucester County Prosecutor to include sensitive investigations involving members of law enforcement and elected officials. Members of the Professional Standards Unit also administer random drug testing for sworn officers and monitor the Early Warning System for all sworn law enforcement officers within the county.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2020:

The Professional Standards Unit completed a total of 36 investigations in 2020. During 2020 the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office arrested one police officer as a result of a criminal investigation referred by a local agency. A total of 292 complaints

were received by Gloucester County police agencies in 2020. Most of the complaints (175) were for Other Rule Violations alleged to have been committed by officers followed by Officer Demeanor and complaints of Excessive Use of Force. As part of the Attorney General's updated Internal Affairs Policy and Procedures, members of the Professional Standards Unit trained over 60 officers within Gloucester County on the updated Internal Affairs Policies in 2020. Lastly, members of the Professional Standards Unit assisted Acting Prosecutor Christine Hoffman with presenting the Attorney General's Excellence in Police Initiative. This included the updated Attorney General's Use of Force Policy, to include reporting policies, to members of the public in various public forums. The presentations were aimed at informing the public on the new reporting policies, use of force informational portals for public viewing, becoming transparent on police reform and assisting in creating a dialogue among police agencies and the public. Most importantly, the presentations were directed at informing the public of the three components of the new Excellence in Policing Initiative: policy, training and monitoring.



SPECIAL VICTIMS UNIT

The mission of the Special Victims Unit is to strengthen the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office response to the investigation, prosecution and intervention of reported allegations of domestic violence, adult sexual assault, child sexual abuse, physical abuse, human trafficking, child exploitation and child maltreatment by offering a friendly environment where they can disclose their abuse to experienced and trained law enforcement officers. The SVU utilizes a coordinated multidisciplinary team approach to sexual assault and crimes against children, with the hope and premise that we reduce trauma, ensure safety, and promote healing of victims and their family members.

ORGANIZATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

In January 2019, the SVU was created and has since grown. The SVU is responsible for the investigation and prosecution of sexual assaults against both children and adults, physical abuse of children, missing children, and human trafficking. The SVU works closely with the Forensic Nurse Examiner / Sexual Assault Response Team, which has been in existence for over two decades and provides critical response to sexual assault victims. The SVU also maintains the Gloucester County Child Abduction Response Team, which is a team of resources allocated if a child goes missing in Gloucester County. The SVU oversees the report of all children missing under the age of 13 and under the

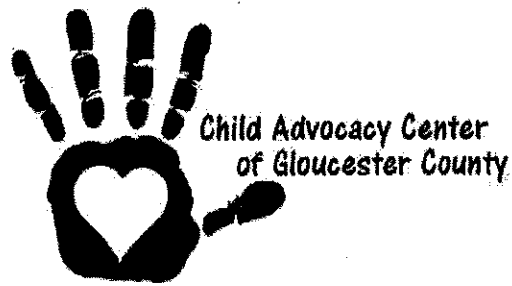


age of 18 if certain circumstances are present. Additionally, the SVU oversees the Child Advocacy Center of Gloucester County located at 45-47 Cooper Street, Woodbury, New Jersey.

Utilizing the Multi-Disciplinary Team approach to investigations, the SVU has strong relationships with our partner agencies. The MDT is comprised of law enforcement, assistant prosecutors, victim advocates and medical personnel each committed to serve the most vulnerable victims of Gloucester County. The needs of the victim and offering support services is the priority of the SVU. These partner agencies include the local municipalities in Gloucester County, state and federal agencies, the Division of Child Protection and Permanency, Services Empowering Rape Victims, the CARES Institute and the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children to combat crimes involving special victims.

The SVU is governed by the Gloucester County Crimes Against Children Policy, the Gloucester County Sexual Assault Notification Policy, the Gloucester County Forensic Interviewing Policy and New Jersey Attorney General Directive 2018-5. The SVU is in full compliance with Attorney General Directive 2018-5 on Implementing Procedures and Protocols for Sexual Assault Response and Referrals. With the creation of this directive, the SVU drafted a Sexual Assault Notification Policy and Sexual Assault Notification Form for Gloucester County Law Enforcement, which directs them to contact us and submit a form with the report of every allegation of sexual assault. Once the form is received, it is logged into the Infoshare database as a "notification" and then placed in a binder, which is categorized by month so that we may submit the statistics required to the Attorney General's Office in six months. With the creation of the unit, we have implemented case tracking not only for the sexual assault notifications but also for all referrals received by the DCP&P.

All SVU detectives are required to be trained by the New Jersey Finding Words Program which teaches the Child First Interview Protocol sponsored by the Zero Abuse Project. During this training they learn how to forensically interview children who have experienced abuse or witnessed interpersonal violence. Detectives are taught how to corroborate the statements of the children to support the successful prosecution of these cases. The interviews are video and audio recorded and have proven to be invaluable



tools in the successful prosecutions of child abusers. The SVU detectives are required to participate in peer review bi-annually, which allows the review and analysis of forensic interviews conducted by the SVU detectives. This review assists in their advancement and improvement in the field of forensic interviews. Additionally, SVU Lieutenant Stacie Lick has been an instructor with the Child First Finding Words training for the past 16 years.

Multi-Disciplinary Team Program

The Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office has a Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) to aid in the investigation and prosecution process of child abuse/ child sexual assault cases. The purpose is to reduce the trauma to the child victim caused by the criminal justice process. The MDT is a group of dedicated professionals who share the common goal to provide the best approach to effectively prevent, detect and prosecute crimes against children. The efforts focus on reducing the effects of the trauma and provide therapy for the children and their families, to promote the healing process, and prevent re-victimization through the legal, child protective and health and human services.

The SVU and MDT are co-located to benefit the children and families where allegations of child physical and sexual abuse exist so the multiple professions involved can meet in one location to coordinate the child's legal and treatment needs through community resources. Community resources include specialized medical evaluations at the CARES Institute, mental health treatment and support, DCP&P, victim services through the Victim Witness Unit, and Victims of Crime Compensation Office (VCCO).

The MDT meets bi-monthly to for case discussions and to determine the best plan of action for a child's protection and safety, a child's physical and emotional well-being, and the criminal investigation and prosecution. Cases are reviewed within approximately two to four weeks of the child being interviewed by law enforcement or the case referral being received by a MDT agency. This includes an initial case conference, as well as periodic case reviews. Any member of the MDT can request additional case review meetings as needed or access to case information or statistics at any time.



The Multi-Disciplinary Team has provided an opportunity for professionals and agencies involved in investigation of child abuse cases to collaborate early on in the process. Coordination of the investigatory process has reduced the number of children and family interviews. This interdisciplinary process has also improved communication between agencies with the result of placing more children, more quickly, in appropriate services. The MDT, SANE/SART programs, as well as the prosecutions supported by victim centered multi-disciplinary collaboration has resulted in better case outcomes.

Forensic Nurse Examiner / Sexual Assault Response Team

In Gloucester County, this program has been in place since 1997. The Gloucester County program began with a small group of committed nurses at Underwood-Memorial Hospital and a \$10,000 training grant through the local United Way. The program has grown significantly as the result of funding through the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) grant administered by the Division of Criminal Justice.

Forensic nurse examiners are registered nurses trained to provide comprehensive care to sexual assault victims at the hospital's emergency department. The forensic nurse provides a comprehensive medical-forensic exam including collection of potential evidence, detailed exam, photographs of injuries and treatment. A forensic nurse is on call twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week to respond to the victim at the emergency department in order to alleviate any delay in the victim receiving care.

When requested, the Forensic Nurse responds to the hospital to provide a medical forensic examination and care consistent with the Sexual Assault Response Team policy and the Attorney General's Sexual Assault Response Standard. An emergency response includes activation of staff of the designated rape advocate agency, SERV, to assist the victim with counsel and support. The law enforcement agency, if not the first responder, is activated with the consent of the victim to respond to the hospital. The approach is victim centered and recognizes the victim's right to come forward for medical, psychological and law enforcement assistance.

Child Abduction Response Team



The SVU is responsible for the activation, training and oversight of the Gloucester County Child Abduction Response Team. The SVU Lieutenant is the CART Coordinator, while the SVU Sergeant is the Co-Coordinator. The CART is comprised of approximately 120 resources to include local, county, state and federal partners. A list of the resources is maintained and updated yearly to be utilized during activations.

The SVU is required to be notified of any child that is missing under the age of 13, the report of a missing child under the age of 18 with special needs, the abduction of a minor child, the abduction of a minor child with endangerment circumstances and/or any other circumstance of a missing child that requires an immediate response. The SVU is responsible for assuring all investigative measures have been taken related to missing children in Gloucester County. If the CART is activated, it is the SVU's responsibility for assuring an organized, unified response with the purpose of recovering the child safely.

The Child Advocacy Center of Gloucester County

In October 2017, the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office established the Child Advocacy Center of Gloucester County located at 45-47 Cooper Street, Woodbury, New Jersey through grant funding received from the Department of Children and Families. It is located within walking distance from the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office and has free parking on site. The building is centrally located in the City of Woodbury, and is accessible to public transportation and major arteries, in order to benefit the children and families it serves.

The primary focus of the CAC is to investigate allegations of child abuse, both physical and sexual, to include the forensic interviews of child victims and the interviews of non-offending parents. The CAC is also utilized to meet with families to discuss available services, to orient them to the criminal justice process, and to prepare the family and victim for courtroom testimony. The CAC may also be utilized for any special victim to include adult sexual assault or domestic violence. Suspects are not permitted at the CAC because the focus and purpose of the CAC is to provide a comfortable environment for the child victim.





HIGHLIGHTS OF 2020:

In 2020, the SVU received and reviewed 312 referrals of sexual assault/physical abuse/human trafficking and missing children. From these referrals, we safely located 47 missing children and successfully handled 212 sexual assault investigations, 42 physical abuse investigations, 10 endangering the welfare of a child investigations, and 1 human trafficking investigations. We also made 42 arrests for first- or second-degree crimes.

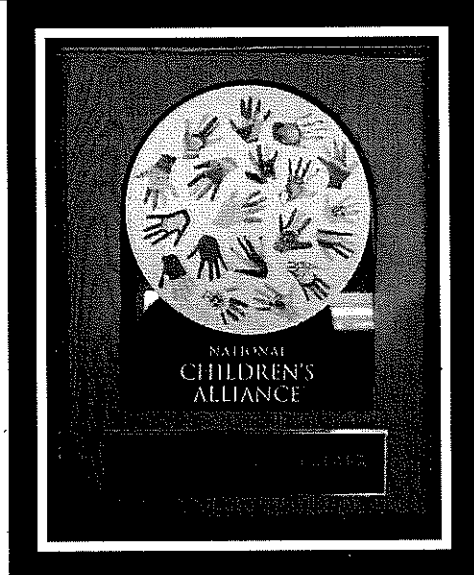
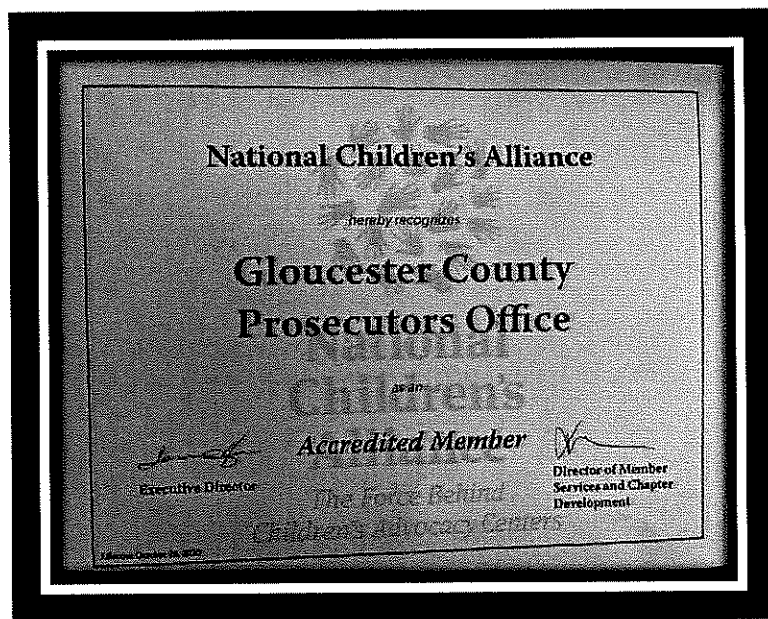
During the COVID-19 pandemic, members of the SVU were responsible for initiating and implementing Tele-Forensic Interviewing. A tele-forensic child interview is a neutral, structured, fact-finding interview intended to elicit disclosure of abuse or neglect or details about incidents that a child may have experienced or witnessed that



may be helpful in response to a child abuse or neglect allegation. The tele-forensic interview is conducted via a video conferencing platform and may be done in circumstances where the ability to conduct in-person interviews is not reasonable or as otherwise needed. The Tele-Forensic Interview Model was supported by the New Jersey Finding Words Program and our policy was the model policy for every Prosecutor's Office in the state of New Jersey. Additionally, our policy and training program received support and recognition on the national level to include the Gunderson National Child Protection Training Center.

The SVU applied to the National Criminal Justice Training Center under the United States Department of Justice to have the CART accredited. We began the process by providing them with our 100-page manual for our CART response. Our manual was requested to be used as a model example on their website for law enforcement agencies across the country. We intend to complete the process in 2021 with an onsite review.

After a two-year process, the CAC became accredited through the National Children's Alliance where we meet the standards required to ensure that all children who visit the CAC receive consistent, evidence-based interventions that help them heal. In order to achieve accreditation status, the CAC had to provide proofs that we met the 21 standards necessary for best practice.

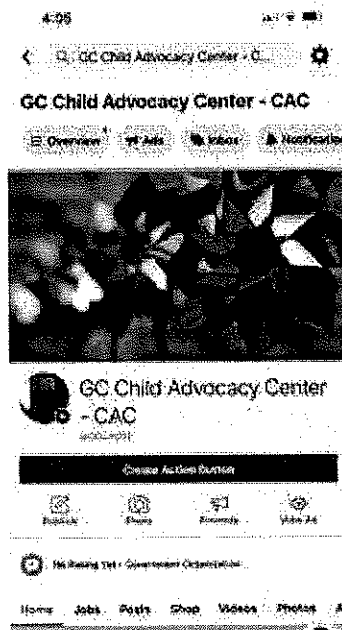


The SVU maintained involvement in the New Jersey Attorney General's Office Clergy Abuse Task Force, which includes receiving and investigating referrals related to clergy abuse and reporting same to the task force at quarterly meetings. The SVU received, documented and investigated 51 cases of clergy abuse that allegedly occurred in Gloucester County. All of the victims in the cases were contacted. All reports,



corroborating documents gathered in the investigation and audio/video taped statements were provided to the New Jersey Attorney General's Office Clergy Abuse Task Force for presentation to the grand jury.

The Child Advocacy Center of Gloucester County created and maintains a Facebook page to provide educational resources and announcements to the community. We have approximately 500 followers and are working to build our following and enhance our social media presence.



TRIAL SECTION

The mission of the Trial Section is to zealously seek the expeditious and just disposition of criminal indictments in a fair and professional manner. The attorneys also provide key legal guidance and instruction.

STAFFING:

- 6 Assistant Prosecutors

ORGANIZATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Chief of Trial and Senior Assistant Prosecutor personally handle priority matters, as well as closely supervise the litigation conducted by the Trial Team Assistant Prosecutors. These Assistant Prosecutors are assigned in "teams" before each of the three Criminal Judges.

The Trial Team Assistant Prosecutors are responsible for a caseload assigned to them by the Trial Section Chief. That caseload consists of indicted matters from the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office Major Crimes Unit and from the Gloucester County's 21 municipal police departments. Municipal court appeals from these municipalities are likewise prosecuted by the trial team. Upon assignment, the Assistant Prosecutors review, evaluate, investigate and prosecute the cases on their list. They litigate and argue a wide variety of criminal matters, consistent with the office's model of horizontal prosecution.

The Trial Team Assistant Prosecutors are responsible for all motion practice associated with the files assigned to them. Courtroom proceedings handled by the Assistant Prosecutors routinely include arraignment/status conferences, motions, trials, sentencing, restitution hearings, extradition hearings and post-conviction relief motions. The general court schedule involves status conferences conducted on Mondays; trials Tuesday through Thursday; and all other hearings (sentences, motions) on Fridays. On a rotating basis, each Criminal Judge was handling all

Criminal Justice Reform duties on a monthly basis. Upon the COVID-19 pandemic beginning in March, the court switched to virtual proceedings held on multiple dates, with each of the three Criminal Judges handling proceedings on different days. From March through the end of 2020, there were no jury trials in the county.

In addition to their courtroom responsibilities, the Trial Team Assistant Prosecutors are also designated to be community liaisons to specified municipal police departments. These designations provide for a point of contact between the local police and a specific assistant prosecutor familiar with that municipality. These designated assistant prosecutors review search warrant applications and provide investigative advice on a daily basis.

Finally, the Trial Team Assistant Prosecutors are certified instructors at the Gloucester County Police Academy. They teach various legal topics on a year-round basis to the recruits. These same assistant prosecutors routinely provide continuing legal education to sworn law enforcement personnel through updates, seminars and speaking engagements.

A legal secretary is assigned to each member of the Trial Team for preparation of correspondence, pleadings and memoranda. In addition to clerical staff assigned to each team, a paralegal and a designated victim/witness advocate are assigned to each case. The paralegals are an integral part of the team and provide invaluable support by way of assisting the attorneys in locating witnesses and obtaining discovery and other information that is necessary for the proper prosecution of motions and trials. The assigned victim/witness advocate provides ongoing services and support for victims of indicted crimes handled by the Trial Team.

VICTIM/WITNESS UNIT

The mission of the Gloucester County Office of the Victim/Witness Advocacy is to assure that crime victims are treated with dignity and compassion by the criminal justice system. The unit has professionals specifically trained in helping individuals cope with the aftermath of crime victimization, making their participation in the criminal justice system less difficult and less burdensome. These advocates explain the criminal justice system and provide literature to crime victims to help them understand it. The unit is dedicated to ensuring that victims are afforded the protections of the New Jersey Crime Victim's Bill of Rights, N.J.S.A. 52:4B-36.

ORGANIZATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Victim/Witness Unit notifies victims of specific court-related events relevant to their cases. These notifications begin with the earliest proceedings, such as first appearances and detention hearings which occur just shortly after arrest. These notifications are then made at every stage of the prosecution and continue until the very end of the sentence, including parole hearings and parole/release status from New Jersey State Prison and County Jail. All notifications are provided through letters and are often followed up with telephone calls. Furthermore, advocates are always available to accompany victims to court in both adult and juvenile prosecutions. Advocates also attend Family Court and Municipal Courts on a regular basis for domestic violence matters.

The Victim/Witness Unit provides direct assistance to victims in various forms, including temporary housing and food vouchers as well as transportation to court. The advocates also refer victims to available assistance and counseling staff. When needed, they assist in the filing of victim claims for compensation and act as liaison to the Victims of Crime Compensation Office (VCCO). Also, they coordinate with the investigative and legal staff for any return of property and restitution.

The Victim/Witness Unit continues to develop specialized knowledge in specific areas of victimization, including juvenile delinquency, child abuse and neglect, sexual assault, homicide survivors and domestic violence. The staff works closely with the Assistant Prosecutors to facilitate a victim-centered team approach to the prosecution process.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2020:

In addition to our basic function of providing support and advocacy for over 3,000 victims as well as countless witnesses in the criminal justice system throughout 2020, we carried out the following activities:

- We sent out over 30,000 letters generated by the Promis/Gavel system to notify victims of events scheduled in the criminal justice system.
- We provided help to our victims applying for assistance from the VCCO, with 75 claims approved and paid for lost wages, medical and funeral expenses, counseling, and emergency relocation costs due to crime in State Fiscal Year 2020.
- We renovated a large private room for victims and witnesses, providing comfortable furniture for them to wait for court or interviews and state of the art equipment for them to stream and watch court proceedings.
- Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, our advocates had limited opportunities to participate in community activities but attended whenever possible, such as countywide events like the NAACP Juneteenth event and Candlelight Vigil for Overdose Deaths.
- We participated in online trainings and conferences on a monthly basis. Those trainings and conferences included Diversity and Inclusion, Online community forums and panel discussions, Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault, Sex Trafficking, Micro Aggressions, Resiliency in the Workplace and Reimagining Policing. These trainings and conferences allowed several advocates to complete the necessary hours for their Certification in Victim Advocacy for the CAC/Prosecutor's Office Accreditations.

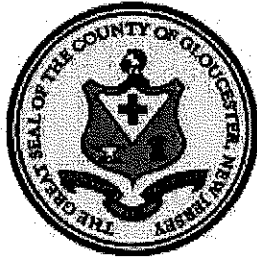
