Complaint Investigation Narratives

Arrived on site at approximately 1030 hours. Met with Eric whom was the manager on duty at this time. This establishment is currently operating with a valid satisfactory rating issued by this Department. A quick inspection of the deli and surrounding area was performed. No evidence or indication of an insect or rodent issue could be found. The Deli, kitchen, and produce area appeared to be clean and well kept. Also, no evidence could be found that would validate the claims made by the complainant as no bucket or any such employee actions were witnessed while on site. When questioned, management denied these claims indicating that any employee performing these actions would simply be terminated rather than being told not to do so.
