Complaint Investigation Narratives

Narrative Date 10/12/17

Narrative Author Stine, Karl

Arrived on site at approximately 1500 hours. Met with the Manager at this time in order to discuss the complaint. No odors were witnessed while inside of the facility. On Sunday 10/8/17 an issue occurred in the men's restroom in which a pipe that feeds a urinal either burst or otherwise somehow began to leak heavily. The floor of the restroom and the floor immediately outside of the restrooms flooded with water. This was not the result of a sewage leak or backflow but rather originated from the public water supply. Although the floors of the bathrooms are tile, immediately outside of them the flooring is carpeted. Once the issue inside of the bathroom was fixed and all of the water was removed, efforts to dry out the carpet began. At no time was the kitchen, its equipment, or food supply affected as the bathrooms are located near the arcade machines and not the cafeteria/kitchen area. No food had to be discarded and no damage inside of the kitchen or eating areas was observed. Servpro was brought in to inspect for water damage and possible mold concerns but no significant issues were found. No further public health concerns exist at this time.
