Additional Remarks

11/9/18 Inspection

Reviewed:

- Hoses at 3 bay sink are not directed to any sink for detergent and sanitizer. Hoses to be directed to labeled sinks. Hoses may have been moved out of the way to permit rinsing of whole produce.
- Illegal dumping to ground of belongings at exterior closest to recycling (Bottles and cans) container. Debris is collected for proper disposal.

Alliance is exterminator, last on site November 7, 2018. No activity observed during this inspection.

4.6(n)	Observed a bakery worker rinsing food contact utensils. No washing. Manager spent time with the worker to re-train to properly wash with detergent prior to rinsing COS
4.7(a)	Bakery worker found doing no sanitizing of food contact equipment. COS Manager spent time to explain and have worker sanitize utensils after washing and rinsing (re-training). Manager will ensure all equipments properly washed, rinsed and sanitized prior to air drying. Recommend the placement of a clock with a second hand to ensure the sanitizing time is sufficient because worker simply dipped utensils in sanitize, not leave them in the sanitizer for 7 or 30 seconds, dependent on which sanitizer was being used.
21. HOT HOLDING: PHFs Hot Held at 135°F or above in appropriate equipment.	
3.5(f)1	- Hot food: fried chicken found at 110 degrees f. Then observed an Appy worker add more fried chicken on top of chicken out of temperature control. COS Never add new food to an old tray. Remove old and serve new. All food is removed for re-heating. - Additional foods that should be held hot: Meatloaf 125 degrees f, Saur Kraut 115 degrees F, Swedish meatballs 125 Degrees F are removed for reheating or disposal and per manager direction. COS It is important for management to determine if cold food is improperly put out for food service or is the hot holding equipment not holding food temperatures at 135 degrees f or above.

4.5(a)	Refrigerator at front end Cashier 14 is 52 degrees F. COS Unit is plugged back in and illuminated and temp dropped.
46. Plumbing system properly installed; safe and in good repair; no potential backflow or backsiphonage conditions.	
5.2(a)	Women's Bathroom closest to seafood is slow to drain. Top of drain is cleaned out and sink drains properly.
51. Premises maintained free of litter, unnecessary articles, cleaning and maintenance equipment properly stored; and garbage and refuse properly maintained.	
6.5(j)	Pot Wash unit in warehouse room next to 3 compartment sink is inoperable. Too expensive to repair and tagged for disassembly and removal.


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
