Arrived on site at approximately 1600 hours. Met with both the manager (Evan) and the head chef at this time in order to discuss this complaint. The chef had already been made aware of this incident via the complainant. Reviewed hand washing procedures and the necessity of avoiding bare hand contact with ready to eat foods. Employees do utilize gloves when necessary. Because only 1 incident has been reported, it is difficult to determine what may have cause the illness. However, the meat used for the chop steak is the same meat that is used for hamburgers which the restaurant reportedly serves "dozens" of each day. This would indicate that most likely the illness came from another source possibly cross contamination or a virus from a food handling employee. All hand sinks including the bar hand wash sink were stocked with soap, paper towels, and had hot water. All refrigeration appears to be in good working order with adequate temperatures. Both the bar and kitchen appear to be kept clean and in good working order. Any additional complaints will be thoroughly investigated as well. However, no further action is required at this time
