Incident Report



Today is Friday, April 18, 2025. I, Police Officer Marvin DeJesus #76, am currently assigned to the Emergency Response Unit working the 2001-0401 tour of duty operating radio car #107 and assigned as the Northwest District under the direct supervision of Sgt. Daniel Grossi S17.

At approximately 2146 hours while driving Northbound on Washington Street between 3rd and 4th Streets, I observed a black Honda bearing New Jersey registration (B92-SFN) traveling Northbound in front of me. Upon approaching the intersection of Washington Street and 4th Street the traffic light located at that intersection turned red when the operator of the Honda decided to accelerate through the intersection. At this time I activated my emergency overhead lights to conduct a motor vehicle stop in the area of 417 Washington Street. Police Officer Alexander Miller utilizing marked radio car #114 arrived on scene as back up.

Upon approaching the operator of the vehicle, I stated my credentials and asked the operator, now identified as Luis E. Martinez-Sanchez, for his Driver's License, vehicle registration and proof of valid insurance for the vehicle. Sanchez handed me a New Jersey Driver's License and began looking through a small bag on his person. He then handed me a second New Jersey Driver's License and stated that it was his insurance. I asked Sanchez again if the document he just handed to me was his insurance and he replied "yes". At this time I began to smell an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the vehicle. I then asked Sanchez where he was coming from and if he had anything to drink tonight to which he stated he did not have anything to drink and he was at "Fat Taco" eating dinner. At this time I informed Officer Miller that I was able to smell an odor of an alcoholic beverage at this time and asked him to switch positions with me to confirm whether there was an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the vehicle. After speaking with Sanchez, P.O. Miller confirmed that he also smelled the odor of an alcoholic beverage. At this time we advised Sanchez to exit the vehicle. We informed Sanchez about our suspicion that he may be under the influence of alcohol and that P.O. Miller was going to conduct a Standard Field Sobriety Test to confirm or dispel our suspicion. Please see P.O. Miller's Supplemental Reports regarding his findings.

P.O. Miller determined that Sanchez was unable to operate a motor vehicle and Sanchez was placed under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated (39:4-50). Sanchez was placed into marked radio car #107 and transported to Police Headquarters for processing. A search for intoxicants within the vehicle was conducted and no intoxicants were found at this time. Sanchez was issued three summons (0905-KA-023498, 39:4-50), (0905-KA-023499, 39:4-81) and (0905-KA-023500, 39:4-97). He was released to his brother, Juan Martinez, who signed a Potential Liability Form and took possession of Sanchez.

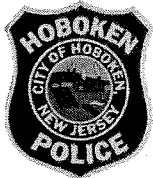

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Incident Report



Today is Sunday, April 20, 2025. I, P.O. Zackary J. Guido #84, am working the 0001 to 0801 hours tour of duty, assigned to Squad #6 in the Hoboken Police Department's Emergency Response Unit. I am currently under the direct supervision of Sgt. Grossi and Sgt. Roman and under the command of Lt. Butler. I am utilizing Radio Car # 119 along with P.O. Bhisey in the South District.

At approximately 0504 hours, I observed a vehicle parked on the eastern side of Hudson Street directly adjacent to Hoboken Police Headquarters located at 106 Hudson Street. I observed this vehicle to not have a rear license plate on the vehicle. Because of this, in addition to having noticed that the vehicle I was presently observing was parked in a legal parking spot and turned on I proceeded to shine my spotlight on the vehicle to see if it was occupied since I could not see into the vehicle because the tints on the vehicle were dark. Upon doing this, I observed the driver of the vehicle roll down the rear passenger side window of the vehicle and state that the vehicle had an in-transit plate. After having said this to me, the driver of the vehicle proceeded to close the rear passenger side window of the vehicle and drive away. Due to this fact, I wished to further investigate this matter since I did not observe a license plate on the vehicle and/or any identifiable information to confirm if vehicle was registered or suspended or if the vehicle did in fact have an in-transit license plate as claimed by the driver.

I proceeded to conduct a motor vehicle stop in front of Hoboken Police Headquarters and made contact with the driver of this vehicle, later identified as Richard Vaquero. I also observed a passenger seated in the front passenger side seat, later identified as David Jones. During the motor vehicle stop, I proceeded to ask Richard for his Driver's License, Proof of Insurance, and the Registration for the vehicle. Upon gathering the necessary documentation for the vehicle and Richard's pedigree information, Richard did in fact hand me a New York In-Transit License plate in addition to the aforementioned documents I requested from him.

At this time, I observed Richard to have bloodshot eyes which also appeared to be glassy. Furthermore, I also observed Richard's pupils to be enlarged. Despite this, I did not smell any odor of alcohol emanating from Richard's breath and/or from within the 2025 Acura, that Richard was driving. Because of this, I gathered Richard's documents and proceeded to make my way to my patrol vehicle to verify if the vehicle was registered, if suspended and able to be driven on the public roadway. At this time, Sgt. Grossi, P.O. C. Rivera, and P.O. Soto arrived on scene to assist me during this motor vehicle stop.

While in my marked radio car, Sgt. Grossi spoke with Richard. He eventually asked Richard to step out of the vehicle. According to Sgt. Grossi, he later stated to me that he proceeded to ask Richard to exit the vehicle since Richard was extremely argumentative with him in addition to Richard stating that he was coming from Fat Taco and Pig and the Parrot, which are both popular bars that serve alcoholic beverages in Hoboken. Additionally, Sgt. Grossi later stated to me that he smelled a faint odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from within Richard's vehicle. Due to Sgt. Grossi's extensive training and experience relating to Driving While Intoxicated incidents, he advised me to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests (SFST) to determine if Richard was able to safely operate a motor vehicle and not impaired.

Before performing the SFST, I proceeded to ask Richard if he had any medical conditions that would prevent him from performing the tests I was going to administer in order to determine if he was able to safely operate a motor vehicle. In addition to this, I also asked Richard if he wears glasses and/or contact

lenses, to which Richard stated that he did not.

Prior to having Richard perform SFST, I explained and demonstrated each test to him in the manner in which each test was to be performed. In addition to this, I also asked him if he understood my instructions regarding how to properly perform each of the tests. Although Richard proceeded to become progressively more annoyed and irritable as I was performing each test, he did state that he did understand how to perform each test after having explained the instructions to him.

All tests were administered on the outside of 5 Marineview Plaza and 106 Hudson Street, which were both artificially lit with flashlights and street lamps. The surface was flat and free of debris. During the administration of each test, Richard was wearing a high-top footwear that was similar to a boot. The aforementioned footwear appeared to be properly fitted and suitable for testing.

Prior to beginning the first test, I observed Richard's eyes to be equal in size with equal tracking. I did not observe resting nystagmus in either of Richard's eyes. After concluding the assessment, I proceeded to administer the first series of tests for SFST.

The first test I administered was the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (HGN) test. At the completion of the HGN test, I observed Richard to have a lack of smooth pursuit in both his left and right eyes. Although slight, I also observed a distinct and sustained Nystagmus at maximum deviation in both Richard's right and left eyes. I did not observe onset Nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in either Richard's right or left eyes. I did not observe vertical nystagmus in either of Richard's eyes. At the completion of this test, I observed a total of 4/6 indicators during the HGN test.

The next test I administered was the Walk and Turn Test. Richard stated to me that he wished to perform the test in front of Hoboken Police Headquarters on one of the parking spots lines since it was a straight line. Because of this, I allowed Richard to perform this test at this location. As previously stated, Richard proceeded to become increasingly argumentative with me and the other officers on scene while performing each test. With that being stated, prior to me explaining the instructions for this test, Richard proceeded to begin performing the test without having been explained the instructions and/or how to properly perform the test. Because of this, I advised Richard to stop and wait until I explain the proper way to perform the test. Moreover, while explaining to Richard on how to enter into the starting position he proceeded to place his feet improperly. Specifically by placing his left foot in front of his right foot touching heel-to-toe. Because of this, I corrected Richard and advised him once more on how to properly perform the test. Once I explained the test to Richard, I advised him that he may begin performing the test. On Richard's first step, he did not touch his feet heel-to-toe. I also observed Richard to have taken 10 steps as opposed to 9 steps as instructed. Upon Richard's completion of the test I observed a total of 2/8 indicators for the Walk and Turn Test.

The final test I administered was the One Leg Stand. After having the instructions explained to Richard, he stated that he understood them. I set a timer for 30 seconds and stated to Richard that he may begin performing the test in the manner in which I explained. While performing the test, Richard proceeded to lift his leg off of the ground at a far greater height than six inches. Moreover, Richard did not keep his foot

parallel to the ground as I instructed him to do. Richard also proceeded to count in a manner different from the way in which I instructed him to do so. Additionally, at one point during the test, Richard proceeded to lift his arms from his side and keep them away from his body and began to slightly sway. While performing this test, Richard also proceeded to place his foot on the ground. At the completion of the One Leg Stand, I observed a total 1/4 indicators during the One Leg Stand test.

Based on my observations, the totality of the present circumstances, and Richard's performance of the SFST, I determined that Richard was impaired and he was placed under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated in violation of 39:4-50. Richard was searched incident to arrest and walked over to Police Headquarters by P.O. Rivera and I.

After being placed under arrest, Richard's vehicle was searched for intoxicants in accordance with State v. Irelan. Upon searching Richard's vehicle, Sgt. Grossi later stated to me that he observed a sealed bottle of Don Juilo and 1800 Tequila. Besides the aforementioned findings, the search for intoxicants yielded a negative result. Richard's vehicle was subsequently towed by John's Main to 1445 Union Tpke, North Bergen, NJ, 07047, in accordance with John's law.

Grossi also later stated to me that Richard did admit that he had a drink of an alcoholic beverage earlier in the evening.

After having blown a 0.00 on the Alcotest machine, Sgt. Grossi and I proceeded to ask Richard if he wished to submit to a Drug Recognition Expert (DRE), since he blew a 0.00 after having completed Alco-Testing. Ultimately, Richard refused to submit to a DRE after having been afforded the opportunity to so.

After having completed the necessary paperwork for this arrest, Richard was released into the custody of David Jones, after he signed the DWI Potential Liability Warning Form.
