Nature of Incident: Jaywalking / Hindering / Possession of Prescription Legend Drugs

Location of Incident: Hooper Ave & S Shore Dr

Arrested - Richard Churchill Jr.

Evidence - 41 prescription Amphetamine 20mg pills as well as 35 prescription clonazepam 1mg pills

On 04/11/2026 at approximately 01:11, I (Ptl. Mlotkiewicz) was driving south on Hooper Ave passing S Shore Dr when I observed in the male in the right lane of travel. I swerved and applied my brakes to avoid striking the male with my patrol vehicle. I then activated my emergency lights and conducted a pedestrian stop on the male for jaywalking. I approached the male and advised him the reason for the contact this evening. I asked the male for his name and date of birth. He advised me that his name was Vincent Demarco and that his date of birth was . Ptl. Landmesser arrived on scene to assist.

After utilizing my MDC in my patrol vehicle I learned that Vincent Demarco is the alias commonly used for a Richard Churchill. In Richard Churchill's name record in Spillman, it states that Richard commonly uses the name Vincent Demarco as an alias to avoid apprehension for active warrants. I also observed the previous arrest photos of Richard Churchill and they matched the male that I was currently with in this incident. I advised TRPD Communications to check if Richard Churchill has any active warrants.

TRPD Communications advised me that Richard did have an active NCIC warrant out of this jurisdiction (Warrant number 1507W2026000516). Please see supplement report in case 26-16179 for further details surrounding the warrant. I then asked Richard to confirm his identity. Richard stated multiple times that his name was Vincent Demarco. After telling Richard that I could confirm his identity by checking his tattoos that we have records of, he then advised that his name was Rory Churchill and that his middle name was Richard. I once again advised him that Rory was another known alias for Richard Churchill. Eventually, Richard admitted to his real name which was Richard Churchill Jr.

Richard was advised to place his hands behind his back and he was handcuffed utilizing the double locking mechanism. Richard was carrying multiple bags in his possession at the time of the arrest. The bags were quickly checked for weapons and this search yielded negative results. A search of Richard's person was also negative for weapons or contraband. The decision was made to bring the multiple bags back to District One to search them further. After searching the bags at District One, there were two prescription medications that were not located in a proper prescription container. There were 41 prescription Amphetamine 20mg pills as well as 35 clonazepam 1mg pills located in a prescription bottle for Gabapentin which belonged to Richard Churchill. Ptl. Landmesser assisted in identifying these drugs using drugs.com. These pills are being logged in to evidence as well as a lab request form to further test the drugs. The pills were logged in to evidence locker #6.

Richard was charged with Jaywalking (39:3-34) two counts of possession

of prescription legend drugs (2C:35-10A1), and hindering (2C:29-3). Richard was left in possession of TRPD Jail Guards while awaiting commitment to Ocean County Jail. There is no further information at this time.
