On 10/26/19 at approximately 1924 hours, Ptl. Elwood #425 and I responded to the Toms River Elks Lodge, located at 600 Washington St, in reference to a disorderly in progress. While enroute, TRPD Communications advised that the caller was assaulted by an intoxicated male. Ptl. Elwood was first to arrive on scene and made contact with the above listed suspect, David Barr, to speak with him regarding the matter. Upon my arrival, I came into contact with the above listed victim, Kevin Miller, who was accompanied by involved person, . Miller then stated the following:

Miller was inside the Toms River Elks Lodge and came outside to smoke a cigarette. When he came outside, he advised that (a complete stranger to him) asked him where her ride was. Noticing that she was intoxicated, Miller advised that he would order an Uber to get her home safely. Miller then ordered the Uber and advised that it was coming to pick her up. During this time, David Barr came outside and began accusing of cheating on him and pushed her to the ground (see #19-60295 for further detail). He then charged at Miller and grabbed his shirt by the collar which caused Miller to somehow sustain a laceration to his left thumb. Miller advised that he does not know how he got the laceration to his thumb but knows it was the result of Barr assaulting him. At this time, Miller contacted the police department for assistance.

Miller advised that he does not need an ambulance or any medical attention for his thumb. Miller requested documentation of the altercation with Barr and advised that he may pursue complaints against him.

When speaking with Barr regarding the matter, he was unable maintain his train of thought and could not explain what had happened. However, he denied pushing anyone or being in any altercation. Barr was visibly intoxicated and unable to be reasoned with.

As a result, Ptl. Elwood transported Barr home to his residence safely and advised him that based on him being determined the aggressor in the altercation, Miller may pursue complaints against him for simple assault.

I subsequently provided Miller with a report information card and advised him of complaint procedures with Toms River Municipal Court.
