On 10/26/2024 at 1527 hours I, Ptl. Summerton, was dispatched to 233 N Charlotteville Drive for a report of a 45-year-old female in an active seizure. Upon arrival, Berkeley Township First Aid #557 was already on the scene attending to the victim, [REDACTED]

I immediately noticed that [REDACTED] was verbally unresponsive, in a sitting position on her floor, and only being kept upright by her wall. In addition, her head hung down on her chest as if it were extremely heavy. In an attempt to clear [REDACTED] airway, the First Aid squad lifted her onto her bed shortly after, [REDACTED] projectile vomited on the floor and herself. It should be noted that First Aid also checked [REDACTED] eyes which were pinpointed.

While on scene, no drugs were found, however, an empty methadone bottle was recovered. In addition, [REDACTED] father Mr. Dean Voss, admitted that she has struggled with opioids in the past. Mr. Dean explained that at 1430 hours [REDACTED] came to him looking for help with Naloxone, however, Mr. Dean, not knowing what it was, accidentally broke it. About thirty minutes after this exchange, Mr. Dean went into [REDACTED] room and noticed that she was acting in a strange lethargic manner which caused him to call 911.

First Aid and Medics transported Ms. Voss to Community Medical Center for further treatment. Due to [REDACTED] history of opioids, signs of impairment, and the methadone bottle found, Mr. Dean was given a Naloxone kit to keep at the residence. In addition, Overdose mapping was completed for this incident.

Nothing further to report.
