Thank you for your interest in South Carolina history. Our agency collections the permanently valuable government records for South Carolina 1671 to ca. 2000.

Attached are copies of the documents that our staff found pertaining to the Walter Raleigh McCall family and the Benjamin Hunt and Ella Patterson families. We unfortunately we were not able to locate any documents for Walter Raleigh McCall after his World War II draft registration card from 1942 and could not find any documents that explain the relationship between Mr. McCall and Mr. Hunt. Attached also is a list of researchers who can help you search other repositories in South Carolina.

Mr. Tuttle,

Thank you for your willingness to help with information. The questions surround two African American families from Conway, SC, the Hunts and the McCalls. First, we are seeking an explanation of the genealogical relationship of Walter Raleigh McCall (1923-1978), born in Conway, SC, to his "cousin," Benjamin Hunt. Hunt evidently came to New Jersey during the 1920s, and McCall came to New Jersey in 1948, after completing a bachelor's degree at Morehouse College in Atlanta. We are also seeking further evidence of McCall's whereabouts during the years from the end of the end of his wartime service in the Army to the spring of 1948. By the summer of 1948 he was already in New Jersey.

We are also seeking evidence of the family structure of the Hunt household. He may have had more than one wife in succession, and perhaps children by more than one wife. One wife was Ella Hunt; we'd like to know whether she, perhaps, was related to the McCalls. The Hunts' eldest son was Jesthroe Hunt (1920-2005), who was born in Conway.

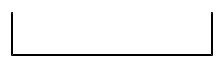

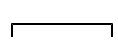

Cast of characters associated with Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr

- **Walter McCall:** McCall was one of King's closest friends. Before meeting King at Morehouse, McCall was in the Military. They met at as classmates at Morehouse College in 1945 and both chose to go to Crozer once they graduated. McCall was the barber for the Dorm and King got his haircut but forgot his money. This caused McCall and King to have a wrestling match outside of the Dorm, where King bested the older and bigger McCall. McCall and King would become great friends for years to come.
- **Herbert Holmes:** Herbert Holmes was hired by the King Center to provide interviews as a part of the oral history project for the remembrance of Dr. King.
- **Benjamin Hunt:** Hunt was cousins with Walter McCall. He allowed for King and McCall to stay at his home (753 Walnut St. Camden, NJ) on and off for two years while they went to Crozer theological Seminary in Upland, PA.
- **Lily Hunt:** Mrs. Hunt is the daughter in law of Benjamin Hunt. She was married to his Son, Jesthroe Hunt, and would frequently see Dr. King at the home in Camden during a two and a half year period.
- **Rev. Lloyd Burrus:** Burrus also went to Crozer with King. Burrus was the Reverend of the Zion Baptist Church in Camden beginning in October of 1949. Burrus helped Dr. King get into contact with Dr. Wiggins. Burrus also allowed King to preach at his church in Camden.
- **Thelma Lawrey:** Thelma is the Daughter of Benjamin Hunt and a living witness that also verifies that Dr. King lived at 753 Walnut. Thelma lived at 753 Walnut Street during the time that King and McCall stayed at the home. She said that King and McCall were inseparable and were always together.
- **Mordecai Johnson:** Johnson was the President of Howard University and the person said to be responsible for convincing King that Gandhi's nonviolent methods

could also work for black and brown people in America. Johnson is also said to be one of the most prolific orators of the 19th century.

- Pearl E. Smith: Smith was the second African American woman to become a Philadelphia Police Officer. She was sworn in in May of 1950 and was with King the night of the Maple Shade incident.
- Doris Wilson: Wilson, a Philadelphia social worker, was also with King the night of the Maple Shade incident.
- Dr. Ulysses S. Wiggins: Wiggins was the President of the Camden NAACP from 1941 till his death in 1966. Wiggins was one of the greatest civil rights activists in the NJ, even before he became President of the NAACP. He was responsible for getting thousands of black people jobs they would not otherwise have at industries in Camden that before Wiggins intervention, either refused to hire black people or would only employ them in the unskilled positions. Wiggins was also partially responsible for helping to desegregate the Camden School System along with the areas in which black people could reside. Wiggins personally helped King and the group navigate the situation in Maple Shade and also filed a lawsuit against the restaurant owner for refusing to serve King and the three others.
- Robert Burk Johnson: Johnson was the lawyer for King and the other three, he was the first African American to serve as editor of the Penn Law Review, to be elected to the Camden School Board and also the first African American NJ Supreme Court Justice. Johnson also served as counsel for the Camden branch of the NAACP. McCall is quoted as saying that Johnson was a good friend of his.
- Ernest Nichols: Nichols was a former German Soldier who fought in World War 1. He immigrated to America and later bought Mary's Cafe. Nichols is the one who refused King service and threatened him and the group with a gun.
- Percy Charlton: Charlton was the Magistrate for Maple Shade. He is the one who officially charged Nichols and also found him guilty of brandishing a weapon.
- Thomas McGann: McGann was the attorney for Nichols after Nichols refused King service. McGann later became a Judge in Burlington County and has written many times about the incident that took place in Maple Shade to King.
- Eileen Stilwell: Stilwell was a reporter for the Courier Post who wrote the story in 1981 entitled "City Man Housed Activist".
- George Anastasia: Anastasia wrote an article entitled "For lack of a Beer--King rocked America's bias" in 1976 about the incident in Maple Shade. In that article a spokesperson for the SCLC said that King "often recounted the incident as one example of what stirred his interest in the civil rights movement."

Timeline of 1945-1961

- September of 1945: King starts his schooling at Morehouse college after graduating from High School at the age of 15.
- 1945, date unknown: McCall gives King a haircut but King forgot his money. This caused a wrestling match between the two where King bested McCall, causing McCall to gain respect for the younger and smaller King and they soon became best friends. For years to come they were known as "Mac and Mike".
- May of 1948, Morehouse College: King and McCall graduate from college and both decide to go to Crozer Theological Seminary, in Upland, PA. King's Father bestows upon his son a Brand new Cadillac to drive himself and McCall to Crozer.
- June of 1948, Haverford College: King and fellow Morehouse Graduate, June Butts work with Dr. Ira Dea Reid learning interview techniques. They later travelled around the south and interviewed black preachers during the summer months.
- September of 1948, Crozer and 753 Walnut: King starts his first semester as a student at Crozer. One semester later he is joined by McCall. Most biographers thought McCall stayed in Atlanta and followed King after needing to save enough money for tuition, which is half true. Instead, McCall was staying at 753 Walnut Street and working in Camden, NJ as a substitute teacher to save money.
- 1948, Camden School District, date yet unknown: Walter McCall interview with Herbert Homes: McCall states that "I worked for three months in the public school system in Camden, NJ" This shows that McCall was staying in Camden in 1948 and that he was not in the Atlanta area as has been previously written in the history books. Thelma "Hunt", Daughter of Benjamin Hunt, says that McCall worked as a substitute teacher in the Camden Schools.
- 1948, 753 Walnut Street in Camden, Quotes by Benjamin Hunt, Lily Hunt and Thelma Lawrey: All report King and McCall as staying at 753 Walnut off and on for about 2 years.
- On February 23rd of 1949, Rev. King was a speaker at the fourth meeting of the Saturday Night Frolic Club's Teen Talk. The meeting was held at the [West Branch YMCA](#), 7th & Edgmont ave.
- On February 27th, 1949 9 a.m. Rev. King was again at the [West Branch YMCA](#) where he was a part of a radio program on WPWA called "Sunday Meditations" 7th & Edgmont ave.
- On February 27th, 1949 at 7:45 p.m. Rev. King was the speaker at a special Fellowship service that was held at [Prospect Hill Baptist Church](#). The announcement reads "to attend which all residents of community regardless of race, creed or color are invited". 703 Lincoln Avenue Prospect Park, PA 19076
- On March 9th, 1949 Rev. King was at the [Calvary Baptist Church](#) where he was the speaker as a part of "Missionary Group No. 3". 1612 West Second Street

Chester, PA.

- On April 13th, 1949 Rev. King is at the [West Branch YMCA](#) giving a sermon on “My God. My God, Why Hast Thou Forsaken Me?” 7th & Edgmont ave.
- On April 15th, 1949 Rev. King was a part of the devotional service at [Murphy AME Church](#). 700 Yarnall St. Chester, PA 19013
- October of 1949, Zion Baptist Church in Camden:, date yet unknown, Courier Post article: King's Crozer classmate, Rev. LLOYD Burrus, becomes pastor at Zion Baptist Church.
- On October 29th, 1949 10:30 a.m. Rev. King was a speaker at a youth rally which located at the [Grace Methodist Church](#) 1213 Central Ave. Chester, PA 19013
- On November 13th, 1949 at 11 a.m. Rev. King gave a sermon at Young People's Day at the [Siloam Methodist Church](#), on 12th and Upland Streets.
- Jan 15th, 1950 2:45 pm Rev. King delivered a sermon the the young people at [Fifth Presbyterian Church](#) at 3rd and Tilghman St. Chester, PA 19013
- On March 5th, 1950 at 8 p.m. Rev. King was a speaker at the [Fifth Presbyterian Church](#) for Men's day. 3rd and Tilghman St. Chester, PA 19013
- On March 8th, 1950 Rev, King was a speaker at [Calvary Baptist](#) Second and Baker
- On May 2nd, 1950, Pearl E. Smith is sworn in as the second African American woman to join the Philadelphia Police Force.
- On May 3rd, 1950 Rev. King spoke in Newark Delaware at the local NAACP Chapter meeting. Exact location still unknown.
- Spring of 1950, date yet unknown: Dr. King hears Mordecai Johnson, who is said to be one of the most prolific orators of the 20th century, speak in Philadelphia at a fellowship house meeting, after the speech Dr. King went out and bought every book on Gandhi and his techniques of nonviolence that he could find. In these teachings he would learn about such things as “sit ins”, an idea that he would soon employ in his own life, and other forms of nonviolent resistance.
- May of 1950, Crozer: King and McCall complete their second year of seminary school. It was mentioned in the Philadelphia Tribune article that King and McCall were staying in the area after school for the summer to work on a project with Dr. Ira Dea Reid at Haverford College.
- June 11th, 1950 at Mary's Cafe on a Sunday night in Maple Shade: King, McCall, Pearl E. Smith and Doris Wilson walk into Mary's Cafe around 11:30 pm. Pearl, Doris and King all took a seat while McCall went up to the bar and asked for 1, or 2 quarts of beer and 4 glasses. The Bartender, Ernest Nichols, rudely responded, “NO BEER”. King began to question Nichols as to whether he wasn't serving them based on their color, so Nichols responded by saying it's illegal to sell packaged goods on a Sunday after 10 pm, and a quart of beer was considered packaged

goods. So McCall, armed with this new bit of information, walks back up to the bar and says that he wants 4 beers or 4 Ginger Ales, Nichols asks them to leave and they decided to perform a sit in. Nichols loses it and begins to yell at King and his group. A couple of white college students from Penn tried to calm down Nichols and have them served, but Nichols goes back to his apartment and grabs a gun. He returns to the bar where King and his group were still seated. He points the 45 in McCall's face and orders them out but they still refused to leave. Nichols takes one step out the front door and fires the gun off a couple of times into the air and screams "I'll Kill for Less". At this point, with their lives being threatened, the four leave the bar and go to the Maple Shade police station.

- June 11th 11:45 pm: Maple Shade Police Station: King and the group go to the police station to file charges. Pearl Smith is quoted as saying "we attempted to prefer charges". My belief is the police refused to prefer charges, causing Dr. King to reach out for some help. Benjamin Hunt is quoted as saying that "It was King's idea to call a doctor who was very active in civil rights", and that doctor was Dr. Ulysses S. Wiggins. Hunt also said that they got locked up that night, which could have been the reason why Wiggins left his home in the middle of the night. Wiggins was one of the people responsible for helping to make sure that the newly drafted NJ Constitution, which was implemented in 1947, included a section making refusal of service based upon color illegal.
- June 12th, 1950 12:45 am: Maple Shade Police Station: President of the Camden NAACP comes to help King and the group prefer charges. King is said to have been introduced to Wiggins by Lloyd Burrus, a fellow Classmate of King and McCall at Crozer and the pastor at Zion Baptist Church in Camden, which was only blocks from Dr. Wiggins house, and also a place that King preached at several times. A complaint is filed for the refusal of service, some one hour and 15 minutes after the incident occurred. The interesting part of the actual complaint was the charge was originally written "Refusal to serve alcoholic beverage in public place", but the word "alcoholic" was later crossed out, most likely by the magistrate judge. This is interesting because the very complaint itself was attempting to incriminate King and his group by saying they were trying to buy alcohol on a Sunday after 10. Another interesting part of the complaint was the address that King listed as his home, which was 753 Walnut St. Camden, NJ. Which we now know was his part time residence while he attended Crozer. We also know that classes had ended at Crozer for over a month at this point in June, so it's safe to assume that he was staying at the address he listed on the sworn police complaint at that time.
- June 12th, 1950 later in the morning, Maple Shade Municipal Court: The restaurant owner, Ernest Nichols, appears before Judge Percy Charlton with his attorney Thomas McGann. McGann asks for a continuation and the hearing is postponed till Thursday night, June 15th.
- June 15th, 1950 Thursday night, Maple Shade municipal courthouse: A formal complaint is made against Nichols for brandishing a weapon, using obscene language and refusal of service. Ernest Nichols is held on \$500 bail by Judge Charlton on for the refusal charge and found guilty on the brandishing a weapon and obscene language charges and paid a \$50 fine. The refusal charge is sent to the Grand Jury for further proceedings. King and McCall are represented by Robert

Burk Johnson who is assisted by Ulysses S. Wiggins. Three white witnesses testify on behalf of King and his group, saying they tried to calm down Nichols and have them served. This shows that the white people were being served at the same time he refused to serve King and the group, otherwise, why would they ask King's group be served?

- June 16th, 1950, Claymont DE: King is arrested for speeding in Claymont Delaware on his way to his Brother's wedding. His brother's wedding was on the next day, so King was rushing back to make sure he was there, especially considering he was the best man.
- June 17th, 1950: Philadelphia Tribune article about the Maple Shade situation. King is listed as Michael King. Other articles from the same time period about King have his name listed as Martin Luther King Jr., or M.L. King Jr, but this clearly states his name as Michael, why? The article also states they were being helped by Dr. Wiggins, who they were introduced to through LLOYD Burrus.
- June 20th, 1950: Philadelphia Tribune article about the maple shade incident where King is listed again as, Michael.
- Unknown date: Camden NAACP filed a lawsuit against the restaurant owner for discrimination. I believe this was done to gain some leverage because McCall faced being indicted too for trying to buy what could be considered packaged goods on a Sunday after 10pm.
- July 1st, 1950: Baltimore Afro American article about the incident. King is mysteriously left out of the article. Dr. Ulysses Wiggins is quoted at saying "Our organization expects to launch a drive soon against public places which refuse accommodations solely on the basis of race and color". Wiggins would later go on to lead a drive in the Southern NJ area to help desegregate places of public accommodation. Proving that this event was not just significant to King as a person, but also to southern NJ as a catalyst.
- August 28th, 1950, Burlington County Detectives office, Mount Holly NJ: Pearl Smith gives an interview to Burlington County Chief Detective, Clifford D. Cain, and in doing so she incriminates McCall by saying he was trying to buy "one, or two quarts of beer, and four glasses", and admitting it was a Sunday after 10 pm. She also tells the story of what happened inside Mary's cafe that night. Pearl, who was listed in all of the articles found about her as Mrs. Pearl Smith, was a police woman at the time, and should have known that her statement incriminated McCall. Interestingly, Detective Cain was under an investigation of his own for looking the other way on a Casino that operated out of Maple Shade for many years until it was busted right around the same time of this incident. The Casino was just down the street from Mary's Cafe.
- Date unknown, place unknown: A short while after Pearl gives the statement, the case is dropped by King and McCall, and they all walk away. McCall says the case was thrown out when three white witnesses refused to testify, King says that it was two white witnesses. McGann says that it was King and McCall that refused to show up. McCall also said in that King and himself couldn't act as their own plaintiff and defense at the grand jury, which shows that they were also facing being

charged at the grand jury. Was it that the white students who originally testified on their behalf did not show up, as King and McCall said, or was it King and McCall who decided to not risk being indicted at the grand jury and walked away? It being 1950, and them being African American's, it was probably best not to take that chance.

- On Nov 12th, 1950 at 3:30 p.m. Rev. King delivered a sermon to the [Fifth Presbyterian Church](#) at 3rd and Tilghman St. Chester, PA 19013
- Between September and December of 1950, Crozer Campus: King begins to court the girlfriend of one of his professors, Kenneth Lee Smith, and wound up winning her heart. Her name was Betty Moatz, she was the daughter of the cook on campus and she also just happened to be white. King fell in love and asked for her to marry him. His friends and mentors stressed that he could not possibly return to the south with a white wife, Moatz, also thought the same, and they had to call it off. This angered King, said Moatz, but he went through with it in the end and they broke it off.
- January 6th, 1951: Courier Post clipping showing Walter McCall gave a sermon at Zion Baptist Church in Camden, NJ
- January 13th, 1951 2:20 pm: Courier Post clipping showing Dr. King gave a sermon at Zion Baptist Church in Camden, NJ.
- On Feb 25th, 1951 at 11 a.m. Rev. King was a speaker at the [Fifth Presbyterian Church](#) at 3rd and Tilghman St. Chester, PA 19013
- On March 11th, 1951 at 3 p.m. Rev. King gave a sermon to the [Calvary Baptist Church](#) on 1612 West Second Street Chester, PA. 19013
- On April 14th, 1951 at 8 p.m. Rev. King was a speaker at [St. Daniels Methodist Church](#) at 315 Edwards St. Chester, PA 19013
- September 15th 1952: Courier Post clipping showing Dr. King and Walter McCall were guests for the weekend at Zion Baptist Church in Camden, NJ. This is the last documented time of King in Camden.
- August 5th, 1954 letter to King, McCall writes to King in a letter: "Pearl has gone to California. I gave her fifty dollars with the idea of helping to support the child, but that support only gave Pearl a ray of hope to win me over to marry her although I have told her again and again that I am not going to do that. She has already worried the very day light out of me by long distance phone calls and a host of letters. So, instead of continuing that support, I have cut it off already. Never do I expect to help in any fashion. Man, Pearl will harass me to death if I give her the least o' consideration. Hate to take that attitude, but I think I am wise in so doing." Could McCall be talking about Pearl Smith?
- October 28th, 1961: Philadelphia Tribune Article with Dr. King speaking about what happened in Maple Shade. King said it was a very painful experience because

they decided to “sit in”. This proves that this was the first recorded time in which King would perform a sit in.

- 1960's, unknown date: Thomas McGann reports hearing a report by Fulton Lewis Jr that said Dr. King's interest in civil rights began while he was staying with friends in Camden and he was refused service at a restaurant in the suburbs of the city. This caused McGann to call Robert Burk Johnson to ask him to look into his files and see if he had the case they had together over a decade earlier. Johnson called McGann back and confirmed that it was Dr. King who was involved in the incident.
- 1970 interview with Walter McCall: McCall very clearly states that the first civil rights struggle Dr. King was in was in Maple Shade in the year 1950. He also states that he worked in the Camden, NJ school system for three months in 1948.
- 1976 article by George Anastasia: It is reported that the spokesperson for the SCLC said that Dr. King would frequently mention the situation in Maple Shade as what inspired him to become involved in civil rights.
- Jan 16th, 1981 article in the Courier Post by Eileen Stilwell: Interview of Benjamin Hunt, cousin of Walter McCall, speaking about King and McCall living on and off at 753 Walnut St. in Camden, NJ. Reporter talks about seeing Dr. King in the pictures on the wall. Hunt states that he believed that what happened in Maple Shade started to change him into the leader he became.

Attached please find Stockton's revised proposal for the MLK Jr. in Camden Historical Study. We're tried to respond to as many comments and suggestions as possible. Principal among these are:

-

Proposed Changes in Staffing:

- Paul W. Schopp and John O'Hara have agreed to serve as Co-Leaders for this project, each taking the lead role for different phases.
- We have also reduced the number of consulting historians by one, and reallocated these funds to Paul Schopp's line to allow him to move forward more quickly on local research.
- That being said, given current teaching and work responsibilities, the timeline herein proposed would be as expeditiously as we could move (we could complete three phases of the project within 120 days and, should more distant research be required, would conduct this in May or June).
- We have reduced the number of graduate assistants from two to one, to be fully funded by Stockton University.

Research Plan and Reporting:

- In the research plan, we've tried to provide greater clarity about the simultaneous nature of the phases proposed, as well as who would be assigned to complete the work described.
- We've also incorporated some of the specific source suggestions from your December correspondence.
- We are proposing to meet virtually with HPO on a monthly basis to review progress.
- We have made some adjustments to the time dedicated to specific research steps as

requested; we would prefer not to eliminate any altogether, however. We appreciate that HPO staff have researched several sources in the past, and welcome your input about their value, but need to establish our own baseline for understanding this project, as well as review with fresh eyes some of these sources in order to undertake a complete analysis.

I have not reattached Appendix A, as that had no significant changes (beyond the removal of Sharon Musher), but please let me know if that would be helpful.

I'm in Puerto Rico on holiday at the moment, but will be back in the office next Tuesday. We are very much looking forward to your feedback, and think this is a project well worth undertaking!
