Hiya all,

The topic of ESYOR came up at our last meeting and I mentioned the system they have available to the public, called "MyESYOR" but I was not accurate in describing the system.

The free service creates a virtual feedstock for you with those data, which you can use with ESYOR articles. You can read them as long as they stay there, but you cannot print them out or save them as PDF.

The catch is that once you get something "on the shelf" it must stay there two weeks (I had said 30 days at the meeting, but I was remembering incorrectly).

So, if you are strategic about it, in a month you can have two different items in each of three shelf slots, for a maximum of six items free. Every month.

ESYOR also advertises a paid, but publicly available service called "PAM" which I have not advertised for. The service does allow you to download, and keep*, up to 10 PDF articles per month for a cost of \$15 US. If you pay monthly (\$15 US/article, or a yearly cost of \$180 (\$1.50/article).

I thought everyone would like to know about MyESYOR. These affiliated with universities can find backup* :)

For a listing of New Jersey's municipalities, you can consult John Parr Snyder 1969 work, "The Story of New Jersey's Civil Boundaries" and its supplement (1988) although changes have occurred since the issuance of the latter publication.

For the bounds of a specific municipality, consult the erecting legislation for that municipality, which contains an exact description of the metes and bounds for its landmass.

Keep in mind, however, that adjoining municipalities can agree to make changes in their bounds without recording such changes with the Secretary of State. These changes are often recorded with the county clerk.
