144 Drum Point Road
Brick, New Jersey 08723

4. DESCRIBE THE ACCIDENT OR OCCURRENCE:

On or about, July 15, 2015, Plaintiff FERN LUMPKIN, an African American, called the Brick Township Police Department to report a noise complaint regarding her downstairs neighbor who habitually made noise late at night and into the early morning hours interfering with the sleep of Fern Lumpkin and her young daughter Freedom Lumpkin. Officer Smith arrived at the scene and spoke to Lumpkin and stated that he would not issue her downstairs neighbor a summons. Fern Lumpkin verbally expressed her exasperation with the refusal of the officers to assist her and/or issue a summons or complaint to the downstairs neighbor. Lumpkin was then placed under arrest for disorderly conduct by Officer Smith in front of her daughter, FREEDOM LUMPKIN. Officers Smith and Rotundo used excessive force in placing her wrists behind her back and placed her into handcuffs in the presence of the crying Freedom Lumpkin who was very emotionally distraught at being separated from her mother and observing the actions of the police officers. The handcuffs were double locked and Lumpkin was searched before being placed in Officer Smith's patrol vehicle. Freedom was terrified after seeing her mother handcuffed by the police and she was left terrified inside the residence. Freedom was not left in the custody of any family or friends and was terrorized as she watched while her mother was dragged

away from her and falsely imprisoned. It was not until one and one half hours later that the officers called an acquaintance of Ms. Lumpkin and told her that if she did not come they would call DYFS.

5. NATURE OF CLAIM:

Violation of civil rights pursuant to the U.S. Constitution and the N.J. Constitution including but not limited to false arrest, malicious prosecution, conspiracy to violate civil rights, violation of due process and equal protection constitutional rights
Intentional infliction of emotional distress
Negligent infliction of emotional distress
Negligence

6. Plaintiff claims that the following are responsible for causing the damages:

Brick Township Police Officer Scott Smith
Brick Township Police Officer John Rotondo

7. DEMAND: Compensatory damages including damages for mental distress, punitive damages, attorney's fees and costs on behalf of Fern Lumpkin and Freedom Lumpkin.

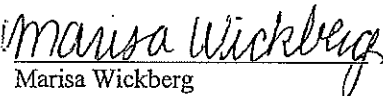

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Plaintiff, FERN LUMPKIN, individually and as guardian on behalf of her daughter FREEDOM LUMPKIN, both residing at 311 Kentwood Boulevard in the Township of Brick, Ocean County in the State of New Jersey, by way of this Complaint against Defendants herein says:

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

1. Jurisdiction of this Court is evoked pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1331 in as much as this matter involves causes of action arising under 42 U.S.C. §§ 1983, 1985, 1986 and the Fourth,

Fifth and Fourteenth Amendments to the United States Constitution.

2. The jurisdiction of the claims based on New Jersey law which are set forth in this Complaint is invoked pursuant to the pendant jurisdiction of this Court.

PARTIES TO THE ACTION

3. Plaintiff, FERN LUMPKIN, an African American female, is a resident of the Township of Brick, New Jersey. She is the mother and sole caretaker of FREEDOM LUMPKIN who was three years old at the time of the incident in this complaint and resided with FERN LUMPKIN at 311 Kentwood Boulevard in the Township of Brick, Ocean County in the State of New Jersey.

4. At all times relevant to this Complaint, Defendants include Brick Township Police Officer SCOTT SMITH, Brick Township Police Officer JOHN ROTONDO and Brick Township Police Officers JOHN Doe A to F, located at 401 Chambers Bridge Rd, Brick, New Jersey, 08723.

5. At all times relevant to this Complaint, Defendants Brick Township Police Officer SCOTT SMITH, Brick Township Police Officer JOHN ROTONDO and Brick Township Police Officers JOHN

Doe A to F, acted under color of law, to wit, under color of statutes, ordinances, regulations, policies, customs and usages of the State of New Jersey, Borough of Brick and the Borough of Brick Police Department.

6. At all times relevant to this Complaint, Defendants Brick Township Police Officer SCOTT SMITH, Brick Township Police Officer JOHN ROTONDO and Brick Township Police Officers JOHN Doe A to F, are sued individually and in their official capacities.

BACKGROUND AND NATURE OF ACTION

7. Defendants, Brick Township Police Officer SCOTT SMITH, Brick Township Police Officer JOHN ROTONDO and Brick Township Police Officers JOHN Doe A to F, are employees of a public entity of the State of New Jersey and subject to suit under the Tort Claims Act, N.J.S.A. 59:1, et seq. A Notice of Intent pursuant to N.J.S.A. 59:8-1 was filed by the Law Office of Maria D. Noto, P.C.

8. On or about, July 15, 2015, Plaintiff FERN LUMPKIN, an African American female, called the Brick Township Police Department to report a noise complaint regarding another tenant in the building, who habitually made noise late at night and into the early morning hours. The other tenant's conduct habitually

interfered with the sleep of FERN LUMPKIN and her young daughter FREEDOM LUMPKIN.

9. Defendants, Brick Township Police Officers SMITH and ROTONDO arrived at the scene and spoke to FERN LUMPKIN, who advised the officers of the continuing noise problem cause by the other tenant, but the officers refused to issue a summons to the offender or to do anything to stop the offender from continuing her practice of making noise late at night and interfering with the sleep of FERN and FREEDOM LUMPKIN.

10. FERN LUMPKIN verbally expressed her exasperation with the refusal of the officers to assist her and/or issue a summons or complaint to the offending tenant.

11. Defendants, Brick Township Police Officers SMITH and ROTONDO then advised FERN LUMPKIN that, instead of doing anything to stop the cause of the noise complaint, the offending tenant, that they were going to, instead, arrest FERN LUMPKIN.

12. Brick Township Police Officers SMITH and ROTUNDO, illegally and without probable cause arrested FERN LUMPKIN and used excessive force while placing her wrists behind her back and placing her into handcuffs in the presence of the crying FREEDOM LUMPKIN who was very emotionally distraught at being

separated from her mother and observing the actions of the police officers. FERN LUMPKIN expressed concern and fear about her three year old child being left alone at the vestibule of her home with the door wide open, but Brick Township Police Officers SMITH and ROTUNDO ignored her concerns for her child.

13. Further, FERN LUMPKIN fell to the ground and begged the defendants, Brick Township Police Officers not to leave her child alone whereupon the defendants, Brick Township Police Officers dragged FERN to a police vehicle and left her inside with the windows closed and no ventilation for several minutes while they appeared to be doing paperwork, all the while ignoring the physical and emotional well-being of little FREEDOM LUMPKIN.

14. The handcuffs were double locked and FERN LUMPKIN was searched before being placed in Officer SMITH's patrol vehicle.

15. FREEDOM LUMPKIN, who was three years old at the time, was terrified after seeing her mother dragged and handcuffed by the police and being herself abandoned at the vestibule of the residence with the door left wide open.

16. In violation of the New Jersey Attorney General Guidelines FREEDOM LUMPKIN was left abandoned in extreme fear as she watched while her mother was dragged away from her and falsely imprisoned.
17. Plaintiff FERN LUMPKIN was falsely charged with Disorderly Conduct, N.J.S.A. 2C:33-2A(1), and Resisting Arrest, N.J.S.A. 2C:29-2A(1), thereby subjecting her to malicious prosecution in violation of federal and state law. Those charges were dismissed in Brick Township Municipal Court when Ms. Lumpkin pleaded guilty to a township ordinance. Thus, the criminal charges were resolved favorably in favor of Plaintiff, thus constituting malicious prosecution as to the criminal charges.
18. It was not until approximately one hour after FERN LUMPKIN was taken away from her daughter that the officers called an acquaintance of FERN LUMPKIN and told her that if she did not go to FERN LUMPKIN's home and take care of FREEDOM LUMPKIN, they would call the Division of Child Protection and Permanency ("DCPP").

CAUSES OF ACTION

FIRST COUNT

19. FERN LUMPKIN repeats each and re-alleges every allegation contained in the proceeding paragraphs as if set forth at length herein.

20. On or about, July 15, 2015, Defendants, Brick Township Police Officers, as discussed above, used excessive force in arresting FERN LUMPKIN without probable cause and illegally and improperly caused false criminal complaints to be issued against FERN LUMPKIN, which had no basis in fact or law and were issued maliciously and with the motivation to falsely arrest, detain and imprison FERN LUMPKIN.

21. The conduct of Defendants Brick Township Police Officer SCOTT SMITH, Brick Township Police Officer JOHN ROTONDO and Brick Township Police Officers JOHN Doe A to F's, acting individually and in conspiracy with each other and others, resulted in FERN LUMPKIN being falsely, maliciously and unlawfully arrested and detained, the deprivation of FERN LUMPKIN's right to be free from unreasonable and unlawful seizure of her person, to the equal protection of law and to due process of law in violation of the 4th, 5th, and 14th Amendments of the United States Constitution, 42 U.S.C. § 1983, § 1985, § 1986, the New Jersey State Constitution, Article I, Section 5 - denial of rights; and Article I, Section 7 and the New Jersey Civil Rights Act (N.J.S.A. 10:6-2).

22. As a direct and proximate result of the Defendants, Brick Township Police Officers' willful, wanton, intentional, false, malicious, reckless, and/or grossly negligent actions described above, FERN LUMPKIN suffered severe emotional distress and anxiety and will continue to suffer severe emotional distress, anxiety, mental anguish and psychological damages.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff, FERN LUMPKIN, demands judgment against Defendants Brick Township Police Officer SCOTT SMITH, Brick Township Police Officer JOHN ROTONDO and Brick Township Police Officers JOHN Doe A to F for compensatory damages including severe emotional distress, mental anguish, punitive damages, attorney's fees, costs of suit, and such other relief as the Court deems just and appropriate.

SECOND COUNT

23. FERN LUMPKIN repeats and re-alleges each and every allegation contained in the proceeding paragraphs as if set forth at length herein.

24. Defendants, Brick Township Police Officers JOHN ROTONDO and SCOTT SMITH conspired with one another to deprived FERN LUMPKIN of her rights as guaranteed by the Fourth, Fifth, and Fourteenth Amendments to the United States Constitution, and having the power to prevent through its agents and assigns the

violation of said rights, refused to do so in violation of 42 U.S.C. §§ 1985 and 1986.

25. Specifically, Defendants, Brick Township Police Officers JOHN ROTONDO and SCOTT SMITH conspired with each other and others, to bring false charges against FERN LUMPKIN in order to cover up the fact that they had subjected her to excessive force and had falsely arrested and detained her.
26. The said conspiracy and acts in furtherance thereof were in direct violation of 42 U.S.C. Section 1983 and 1985, depriving FERN LUMPKIN of her civil rights secured to her by the Constitution of the United States under the provisions of the Fourth, Fifth, and Fourteenth Amendments.
27. As a result of the foregoing deprivations, FERN LUMPKIN has been permanently injured, damaged or otherwise harmed unlawfully, suffered severe emotional distress and anxiety and will continue to suffer severe emotional distress, anxiety, mental anguish, psychological damages, and pecuniary damages.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff, FERN LUMPKIN, demands judgment against Defendants, Brick Township Police Officer SCOTT SMITH, Brick Township Police Officer JOHN ROTONDO and Brick Township Police Officers JOHN Doe A to F, for compensatory damages including severe emotional distress and mental anguish, punitive damages, attorney's fees, costs of suit and such other relief as

the Court deems just and appropriate.

THIRD COUNT

28. FERN LUMPKIN repeats and re-alleges each and every allegation contained in the proceeding paragraphs as if set forth at length herein.

29. Defendants, Brick Township Police Officer SCOTT SMITH, Brick Township Police Officer JOHN ROTONDO and Brick Township Police Officers JOHN Doe A to F were negligent in causing FREEDOM LUMPKIN's injuries.

30. Each of the Defendant Brick Township Police Officers owed a duty to FREEDOM LUMPKIN and breached it by leaving FREEDOM LUMPKIN without the supervision of a family member or a friend, for approximately one hour and also while she witnessed her mother being brutalized and falsely arrested and taken away by the Defendants. The Defendants' breach actually and proximately caused FREEDOM LUMPKIN's injuries.

31. As a result of Defendants, Brick Township Police Officers' reckless, willful, wanton, intentional, and/or negligent acts, FREEDOM LUMPKIN suffered severe emotional distress and anxiety and will continue to suffer severe emotional distress, anxiety, mental anguish and psychological damages.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff, FERN LUMPKIN, on behalf of FREEDOM LUMPKIN, demands judgment against Defendants, Brick Township Police Officer SCOTT SMITH, Brick Township Police Officer JOHN ROTONDO and Brick Township Police Officers JOHN Doe A to F, compensatory damages including severe emotional distress and mental anguish, punitive damages, attorney's fees, costs of suit and such other relief as the Court deems just and appropriate.

FOURTH COUNT

32. FERN LUMPKIN repeats each and re-alleges every allegation contained in the proceeding paragraphs as if set forth at length herein.

33. Defendants, Brick Township Police Officer SCOTT SMITH, Brick Township Police Officer JOHN ROTONDO and Brick Township Police Officers JOHN Doe A to F, unlawfully and intentionally arrested FERN LUMPKIN after she had called the Brick Police Department to report a noise complaint and caused intentional infliction of emotional distress to FERN LUMPKIN by arresting FERN LUMPKIN and leaving FREEDOM LUMPKIN without the supervision of a family or friend for approximately one hour after witnessing the Defendants arrest her mother, FERN LUMPKIN.

34. Defendants, Brick Township Police Officers acted wantonly,

purposefully, maliciously, and with the intent to cause emotional distress to FERN LUMPKIN. Defendants, Brick Township Police Officers' actions were extreme and outrageous. Intentionally abandoning FERN LUMPKIN's three year-old child at the open front-door of her home, despite FERN LUMPKIN's pleas, is conduct so extreme that it goes outside the bounds of decency and is regarded as atrocious and utterly intolerable in society.

35. As a result of Defendants' wanton, intentional, and malicious conduct, FERN LUMPKIN suffered severe emotional distress and anxiety and will continue to suffer severe emotional distress, anxiety, mental anguish and psychological damages.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff, FERN LUMPKIN, demands judgment against Defendants, Brick Township Police Officer SCOTT SMITH, Brick Township Police Officer JOHN ROTONDO and Brick Township Police Officers JOHN Doe A to F, for compensatory damages including severe emotional distress and mental anguish, punitive damages, attorney's fees, costs of suit and such other relief as the Court deems just and appropriate.

FIFTH COUNT

36. FERN LUMPKIN repeats and re-alleges each and every

allegation contained in the proceeding paragraphs as if set forth at length herein.

37. Defendants, Brick Township Police Officer SCOTT SMITH, Brick Township Police Officer JOHN ROTONDO and Brick Township Police Officers JOHN Doe A to F, unlawfully and intentionally arrested FERN LUMPKIN after she had called the Brick Police Department on a noise complaint and caused intentional infliction of emotional distress to FREEDOM LUMPKIN by arresting her mother, FERN LUMPKIN and leaving FREEDOM LUMPKIN without the supervision of a family member or friend for approximately one hour after witnessing Defendants arrest her mother, FERN LUMPKIN.

38. Defendants' performed their actions wantonly, purposefully, maliciously, and with the intent to cause emotional distress to FREEDOM LUMPKIN. Additionally, Defendants' actions were extreme and outrageous. Leaving a three year-old child at the open front-door of her home, in the middle of the night, without any adult supervision while witnessing her mother being taken away by officers is so extreme that it goes outside the bounds of decency and is regarded as atrocious and utterly intolerable in society.

39. As a result of Defendants' wanton, malicious, and intentional conduct, FREEDOM LUMPKIN suffered severe emotional

distress and anxiety and will continue to suffer severe emotional distress, anxiety, mental anguish and psychological damages.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff, FERN LUMPKIN, on behalf of her daughter, FREEDOM LUMPKIN, demands judgment against Defendants, Brick Township Police Officer SCOTT SMITH, Brick Township Police Officer JOHN ROTONDO and Brick Township Police Officers JOHN Doe A to F, for compensatory damages including severe emotional distress and mental anguish, punitive damages, attorney's fees, costs of suit and such other relief as the Court deems just and appropriate.

JURY DEMAND

Plaintiff hereby demands a trial by jury as to all issues.

Maria D. Noto, Esq. is hereby designated as trial counsel for the Plaintiff.
