The East Brunswick Police Department received your Open Public Records Act (OPRA) request on December 5, 2023. The official Records Custodian, of the East Brunswick Police Department, received your OPRA request on December 6, 2023. As such, the seven (7) business day deadline to respond to your request is December 15, 2023. This response to your request is being provided to you on the 7th business day after the custodian's receipt of said request.

Your OPRA request sought access to the following:

This includes the dispatcher, officers, records, IA.

Response: Your request lacks the appropriate information needed to search for the requested records. More specifically, your request fails to provide any of the following information: phone numbers called, date range, call times.

Without this information, we will be unable to query our phone system event recorder to locate responsive records. Additionally, only select phone lines/devices are recorded.

If possible, please provide specific phone numbers called, date ranges, and call times or we will be unable to fulfill your request.

Also, keep in mind that recordings of phone calls are retained for the required period of time delineated in the New Jersey Records Retention schedule.

If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within the seven (7) business days required by law, you have a right to challenge the decision by the East Brunswick Police Department to deny access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC) by completing the Denial of Access Complaint Form. You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511, by mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625, by e-mail at xxx@xxx.xxxxx.xx.xx, or at their web site at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.
