Enclosed please find the documents requested in your OPRA request. As I previously stated in my letter on December 7, 2017 there were no Police Use of Deadly Force reports generated during this time frame. There were no Public Synopsis reports required other than the information supplied in the Annual Summary report and we do not have any dispatchers, call takers, or K9 officers.

We follow the Attorney General's Guidelines for our annual firearm training and I have included a copy of our 2017 annual firearms report. All officers complete annual training in use of force, domestic violence and vehicle pursuits but there are no training certificates generated and there are no additional reports that are maintained that reflect this training.

I have included the Alco-test recertification cards for those officers who were scheduled for recertification for the year 2017. I have additionally included the Police Academy training certificates for officers who attended the police academy during the year 2017. These would be the only training certificates that were available from the items in your request.
