Dear Mr. Jones:

On July 30, 2025, the Town of Boonton (hereinafter "the Town") received your request for government records pursuant to the Open Public Records Act ("OPRA"). The Town has advised you of the need of an extension based on the expansiveness of your request, and most recently advised that it anticipated producing records by September 2, 2025. On September 2, 2025 responsive records were produced, along with notification that the Town needed further extension until September 15, 2025. Thereafter, on September 15, 2025, the Town advised need for further extension with an expectation to produce responsive records no later than September 19, 2025. You requested:

Legal invoices with accompanying sender's email (the actual email(s) from the vendor/attorney's office to the receiving individual at the Town of Boonton, and then their respective included attachment(s), which would presumably be the invoices) for all legal services rendered and reimbursed by the Town of Boonton from January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024. Including but not limited to Town Counsel, Labor Counsel, Special Counsel, Civil Counsel, Bond Counsel, and any other attorney work performed for, and paid by, the Town of Boonton or its Insurer(s).

Responsive documents are herein attached. To the extent any documents are redacted, such redactions were made pursuant to N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1.1 (attorney client privilege) and N.J.S.A. 47:1A-10 (personnel).

Your OPRA request is now deemed answered and closed. If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within the statutory timeframe required by law, you have a right to challenge the denial of access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC) by completing the Denial of Access Complaint Form. You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511, by mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625, by e-mail at grc@dca.state.nj.us, or at their web site at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.
