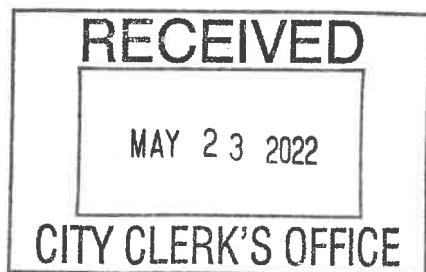

PROCLAMATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY
TO ALL CITIZENS AND PERSONS WITHIN THE CITY OF
LONG BRANCH AND TO ALL DEPARTMENTS, DIVISIONS AND
BUREAUS OF THE MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT OF THE CITY OF
LONG BRANCH:

WHEREAS, pursuant to the powers vested in me by **N.J.S.A. App. A:9-40.5** and by ordinances adopted by the City of Long Branch, and other relevant authority, I have the authority to declare a **STATE OF LOCAL DISASTER EMERGENCY** within the City of Long Branch; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid laws authorize the promulgation of such orders, rules, regulations, and emergency management operations as are necessary to meet the various problems which have or may be presented by such an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH the aforesaid laws, given current exigent circumstances, I do hereby declare, in order to continue to protect the residents of the City of Long Branch, the following:

1. That a **STATE OF LOCAL DISASTER EMERGENCY** exists within the City of Long Branch
2. As part of the **STATE OF LOCAL DISASTER EMERGENCY**, a limited curfew is imposed for the City of Long Branch beginning at 9:00 p.m. on Saturday, May 21, 2022 and shall expire on Sunday, May 21, 2022 at 5:00 a.m. unless further extended.
 - a. During the hours of curfew, all persons are prohibited from using, standing, sitting, travelling or being present on any public street or in any public place, including for the purpose of travel, with the following exemptions:
 1. All law enforcement, firefighters, paramedics or other medical personnel, as well as any other emergency response personnel authorized by the State of New Jersey, and credentialed members of the media.
 2. Individuals traveling directly to and from work; attending religious services; commercial trucking and delivery services; obtaining food; caring for a family member, friend, or animal; patronizing or operating private businesses; seeking medical care or fleeing dangerous circumstances; and travel for any of the above services.
 - b. For purposes of this order, "travel" includes, without limitation, travel on foot, bicycle, skateboard, scooter, motorcycle, automobile, or public transit, or any other mode of transporting a person from one location to another.
 - c. For purposes of this order, "public place" means any place, whether on privately or publicly owned property, accessible to the general public,

- including but not limited to public streets and roads, alleys, highways, driveways, sidewalks, parks, vacant lots, and unsupervised property.
- d. For purposes of this order, "exempt care" means necessary medical services for an individual's self or family member.

**CITY OF LONG BRANCH
DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY**

TO ALL CITIZENS BUSINESSES, DEPARTMENTS, DIVISIONS AND OFFICES WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF LONG BRANCH STATE OF NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, PURSUANT TO THE POWERS VESTED IN ME BY CHAPTER 251 OF THE LAWS OF 1942, AS AMENDED AND SUPPLEMENTED, NJSA APP A:9-30 ET SEQ; NJSA 40:48-1(6) AND ORDINANCE PURSUANT THERETO; NJSA 2C:33-1 ET SEQ; AND ALL SECTIONS AND SUBSECTIONS, I HAVE DECLARED THAT A CITY-WIDE DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY EXISTS WITHIN THE CITY OF LONG BRANCH,

WHEREAS, THE AFORESAID LAWS AUTHORIZE THE PROMULGATION OF SUCH ORDERS, RULES AND REGULATIONS AS ARE NECESSARY TO MEET THE VARIOUS PROBLEMS WHICH HAVE OR MAY BE PRESENTED BY SUCH EMERGENCY, AND,

WHEREAS, BY REASON OF THE SERIOUS CONDITIONS WHICH PRESENTLY EXIST OR ARE EXPECTED TO OCCUR WITHIN THE CITY OF LONG BRANCH WHICH MAY AFFECT THE HEALTH, SAFETY AND OR WELFARE OF THE PEOPLE, AND

WHEREAS, IT HAS BEEN DETERMINED CERTAIN PREACUATIONARY MEASURES AND PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS WILL NEED TO BE IMPLEMENTED, AND THAT CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS MAY NEED TO BE ENACTED, AND

WHEREAS, MANAGING THIS EVENT REQUIRES DEPLOYMENT OF PERSONNEL AND OTHER RESOURCES TO ENSURE THE HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE CITIZENS OF MONMOUTH COUNTY, AND

AND FURTHER, THAT CERTAIN MEASURES MUST BE TAKEN TO INSURE ORDER AND TO PROTECT THE PERSONS AND PROPERTY AFFECTED BY SAID CONDITIONS AND INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS THAT SHOULD BE TAKEN BY ALL RESIDENTS;

1. The following areas are designated disaster areas;

City of Long Branch (All Areas)

2. All vehicles abandoned on the streets, highways and public roadways, or which are unable to proceed due to conditions of the emergency will be towed away at the expense of the owner.
3. The City of Long Branch has instituted a curfew from dusk to dawn.
4. The movement of all vehicular traffic throughout the city in the area of the shoreline and mandatory evacuation zones is prohibited until the termination of the emergency.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT, THIS EMERGENCY DECLARATION INCLUSIVE OR IN PART WILL BE IN EFFECT UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE, AND THAT OTHER RESTRICTIONS OR INSTRUCTIONS MAY BE ADDED AS DEEMED APPROPRIATE TO ENSURE PUBLIC SAFETY.

NOW THEREFORE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE AFORESAID LAWS, I DO HEREBY PROMULGATE AND DECLARE THAT THE ABOVE CITED APPLICABLE REGULATIONS SHALL BE IN ADDITION TO ALL OTHER LAWS OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY, THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH AND CITY OF LONG BRANCH.



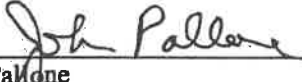

**ORDER OF THE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR REGARDING BOARDWALK AND
PROMENADE ACCESS**

**TO ALL CITIZENS AND PERSONS WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF CITY OF LONG BRANCH, NEW JERSEY,
AND TO ALL DEPARTMENTS, DIVISIONS AND BUREAUS OF MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT OF LONG
BRANCH, NEW JERSEY**

WHEREAS, pursuant to the powers vested in me by N.J.S.A. App.A:9-30 et seq and, Section 32-3 of the Code of the City of Long Branch, On March 17, 2020 I declared a local disaster emergency exists within the City of Long Branch; and,

WHEREAS, Governor Murphy issued Executive Orders No.108 delegating to the City the discretion to impose additional restrictions on the use of local beaches and boardwalks in response to Covid-19 beyond the applicable provision of the Governor's Executive Order No. 107; and,

WHEREAS, the aforesaid laws and Executive Orders authorize the promulgation of such orders, rules and regulations as are necessary to meet the various problems which have or may be presented by such emergency, and

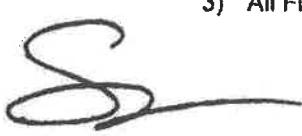
WHEREAS, by reason of the conditions which presently exist in certain areas of the City of Long Branch which may affect the health, safety and welfare of the people of the City of Long Branch, to wit,

A COVID-19 Coronavirus Emergency beginning at 12:01 PM on March 17, 2020; all resources available to the municipal government will be available to combat the spread of the virus; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that a health emergency exists in the City of Long Branch and it has been further determined that certain measures must be taken in order to ensure that the City of Long Branch will be unhampered in their efforts to maintain health, safety, law and order, and protect the persons and property of all residents affected by this condition, and

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the aforesaid laws and Executive Orders 107 and 108, I do hereby **ORDER** as follows:

- 1) The Boardwalk, Promenade and adjacent Bicycle Paths, roadways and service roads are hereby closed to all persons, and,
- 2) All City of Long Branch Parks shall remain open for passive recreation, such as walking, jogging or running, only; and,
- 3) All Fields and Courts for sports activities are closed to all persons

WHEREAS, by reason of the conditions which presently exist in certain areas of the City of Long Branch which may affect the health, safety and welfare of the people of the City of Long Branch, to wit:

A COVID-19 Coronavirus Emergency beginning at 12:01 PM on March 17, 2020; all resources available to the municipal government will be available to combat the spread of the virus; and
