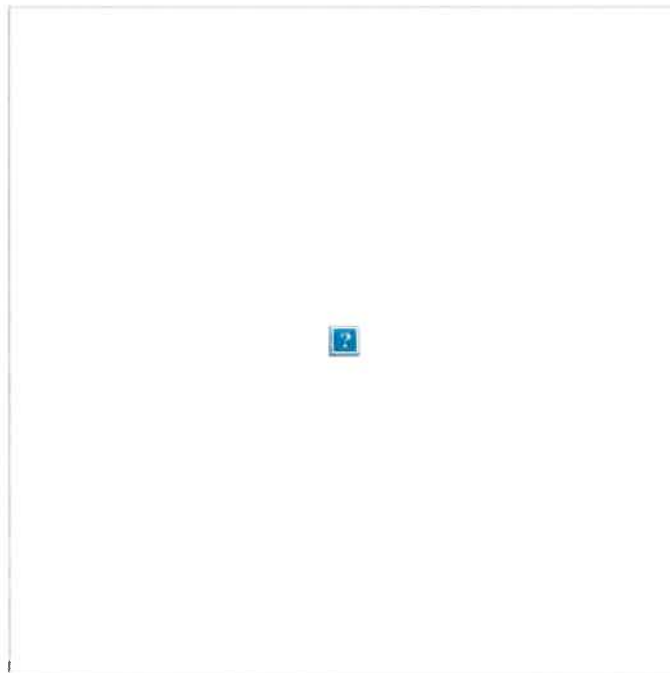
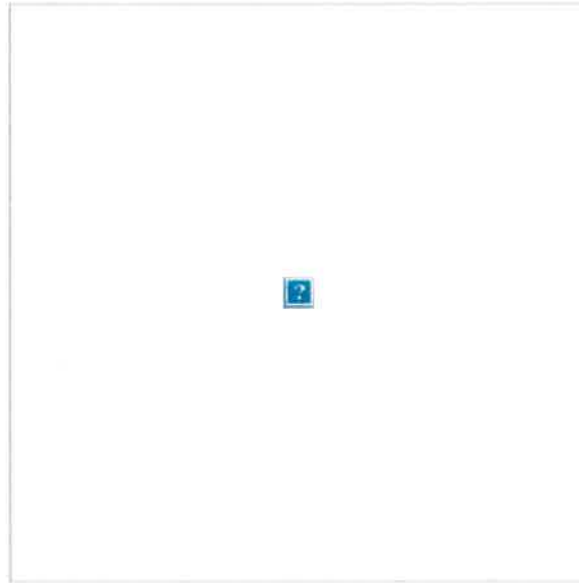

Description

New Jersey's Water Bank program will receive almost \$1 billion from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law over the next five years. These engagement sessions will focus on how the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection expects to use the first \$168 million. DEP's Intended Use Plans outline the funding of aspects such as project priorities and funding packages. During the engagement sessions, interested parties will be updated on the draft direction of the IUPs and will be able to provide input on priorities, affordability criteria, funding packages, project types that qualify for principal forgiveness and disadvantaged community determination criteria. The meetings also will include discussion on separate monies allocated for principal forgiveness, as well as funding to address lead, PFAS, climate change and sea-level rise.

NJ Infrastructure Bank

The New Jersey Water Bank - NJWB is a partnership between the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) and the [New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust \(Trust\)](#) to provide low cost financing for the design, construction, and implementation of projects that help protect and improve water quality and help ensure safe and adequate drinking water.

The NJWB finances projects by utilizing two funding sources. The Trust issues revenue bonds which are used in combination with zero percent interest funds to provide very low interest loans for water infrastructure improvements. The NJDEP administers a combination of Federal State Revolving Fund (SRF) capitalization grants, as well as the State's matching funds, loan repayments, State appropriations and interest earned on such funds.

- Since issuing its first loan in 1987, Water Bank issued more than \$7.6 billion in low-interest long term loans and has an additional \$1.48 billion in short-term construction loans outstanding;
- New Jersey's ratepayers have saved an estimated \$2.76 billion in financing

costs through zero interest rate loans and Principal Forgiveness loans (or grant like funding); and

- Average NJWB borrower saves \$0.5M in interest expense per \$1M borrowed.
- In addition, the NJWB has 209 funded projects under its Short-Term Loan Program totaling approximately \$1.488 billion which will be converted upon construction completion to Long-Term loans.
- Total loan spending has generated over 140,000 direct construction jobs and countless related jobs throughout the State.
- Total 1,416 loans were provided, and 1,666 projects were constructed (71.61% - Clean Water projects and 28.39% Drinking Water projects)

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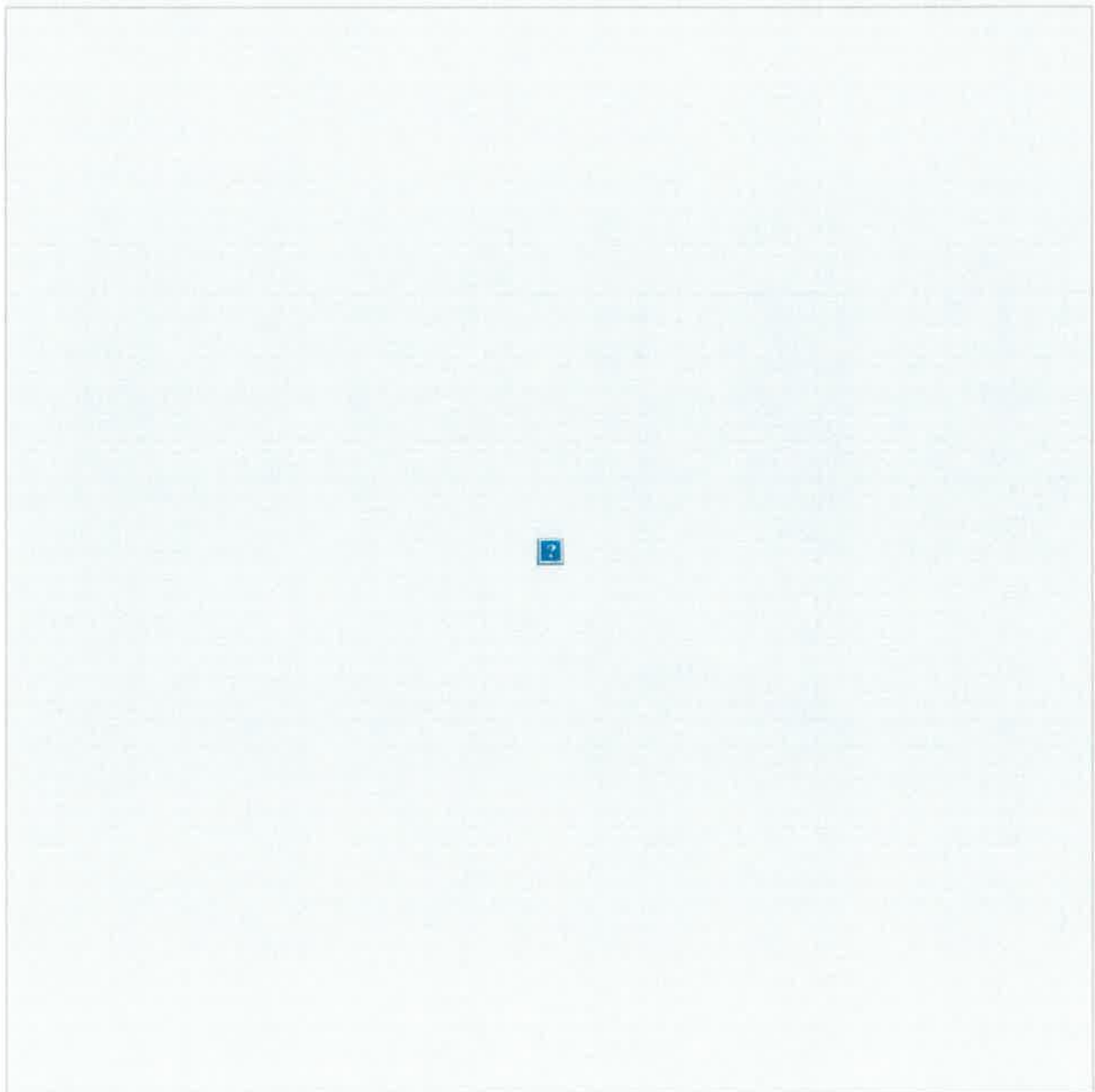

It covers December 1, 2020 to December 31, 2021 and is broken down by UPS as requested. If you need the raw data let me know. The raw data recorded the UPS input in five second interval, and is in my excel spreadsheet. I averaged the input values for each month to get a close approximation of the total UPS demand in kWh.
