**CONTRACT AWARD - CONTRACT NO. 18-7SW
FURNISHING MAINTENANCE, PARTS AND REPAIRS
FOR LEACHATE PUMPING STATIONS, CONTROLS AND PUMPS
AND FLOW METER CALIBRATION
AT THE MIDDLESEX COUNTY LANDFILL**

LONGO ELECTRICAL-MECHANICAL, INC.

WHEREAS, the Middlesex County Utilities Authority ("Authority") publicly advertised for bids for a contract entitled "Furnishing Maintenance, Parts and Repairs for Leachate Pumping Stations, Controls and Pumps and Flow Meter Calibration at the Middlesex County Landfill/ Contract No. 18-7SW," hereinafter referred to as the ("Contract"); and

WHEREAS, on June 22, 2018, the Authority received and publicly opened the two bids submitted for the Contract as follows;

Longo Electrical-Mechanical, Inc.

Pumping Services, Inc.

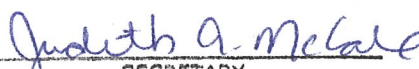
WHEREAS, the said bids have been reviewed by the Authority's Counsel and staff who have advised that the said bid of Longo Electrical-Mechanical, Inc. in the amount of \$111,000.00 as set forth in Exhibit C-1 attached hereto satisfies, in all material respects, the requirements of the Specifications and Bid Documents and is the lowest numeric and responsive bid; and

WHEREAS, an issue was raised during the review of the bid as to whether Longo Electrical-Mechanical, Inc. could also be deemed a "responsible" bidder under the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et. seq., and in response thereto, a responsibility hearing was held before the Commissioners on August 23, 2018, with notice to the bidder; and

WHEREAS, at the hearing, evidence was presented and testimony provided to the Commissioners by and on behalf of Joseph M. Longo, President of Longo Electrical-Mechanical, Inc. and it was determined by the Commissioners, after hearing such testimony and reviewing such evidence, that the company can be deemed a "responsible" bidder and therefore, be awarded the contract as the lowest numeric bidder for Contract No. 18-7SW; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-5.4 et seq., the Chief Financial Officer shall certify, in writing, the availability of sufficient funds for such supply and delivery services based on the unit prices and other prices as set forth in Exhibit C-1 up to the maximum quantities, not to exceed \$111,000.00 for the first year as set forth in the attached excerpt from Exhibit A for the bid items, for which funding shall be certified as ordered and drawn against the amount allotted in the Solid Waste Division Operating Budget; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the Middlesex County Utilities Authority as follows:

1. For all future reference the title of this Resolution shall be "Contract Award – Contract No. 18-7SW/ Furnishing Maintenance, Parts and Repairs for Leachate Pumping Stations, Controls and Pumps and Flow Meter Calibration at the Middlesex County Landfill - Longo Electrical-Mechanical, Inc." and all subsequent documents concerning the matters addressed herein shall reference this title.
2. The Commissioners hereby find Longo Electrical-Mechanical, Inc. to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder for the Contract.
3. The Commissioners hereby award the Contract to Longo Electrical-Mechanical, Inc. for the unit prices and other prices contained in its Bid and for a total bid price not to exceed \$111,000.00 for the first year, commencing from the Notice to Proceed date.
4. Funding for services under this Contract shall be certified as outlined by the Chief Financial Officer and shall be drawn against the Solid Waste Division Operating Budget.
5. The Executive Director is hereby authorized and directed to notify of Longo Electrical-Mechanical, Inc. of the acceptance of its bid, and the Chairman or Vice Chairman and Secretary are authorized to execute any and all contracts with said bidder as required by the Contract.
6. The Bid Security of the unsuccessful bidder shall be returned to said unsuccessful bidder upon receipt, by the Authority, of executed Contracts by the successful bidder together with a Performance and Payment Bond and required Certificates of Insurance.
7. This Resolution shall take effect immediately following Freeholder review period, in accordance with law.
