On Thursday, 8/9/18 at 2214 hours, Sgt. Scali #334, Ptl. DiFabio #385 and I were dispatched to a reported CPR In Progress at 357 Kettle Creek Road, Apartment [REDACTED] listed Reporting Person, advised Toms River Communications a 30 year old female was not breathing at the residence.

Upon arrival, I located the female, later identified as [REDACTED] laying in the upstairs bathroom, unconscious with agonal breathing. Silverton EMS responded shortly after and administered two doses of Narcan during rescue breathing, which later alleviated the apparent heroin overdose. [REDACTED] regained consciousness and was able to provide me with her last name, as no witnesses (listed above) to the overdose knew her besides her first name. The witnesses were asked how they came into contact with [REDACTED] on this date. I was advised they were in Seaside Heights for the day and had met her on the boardwalk. [REDACTED] later returned to the apartment in Mariners Cove with the parties. Approximately one half hour after returning to the apartment, [REDACTED] was found laying in the bathroom unresponsive, which is when [REDACTED] contacted 911.

[REDACTED] would not disclose if she had in fact utilized heroin, nor if she snorted or injected it. A search of [REDACTED] purse and the surrounding area of the overdose was negative for any drug paraphernalia. [REDACTED] was then transported to Community Medical Center for further treatment by Silverton EMS.

A Spillman Database and Division of Motor Vehicle search of [REDACTED] was conducted and returned an active NCIC Missing Person hit out of Montgomery Township Police Department for absconding from a halfway home, The Crawford House, while under a court order. [REDACTED] was removed from NCIC Missing Persons and Montgomery PD was notified of the circumstances. Nothing further.
