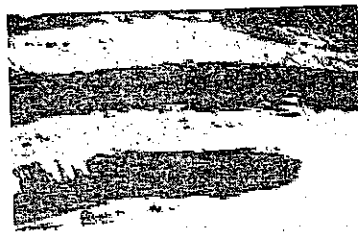

In the recent suit against Auto Scrap, Grewal
charged the company with failure to comply

The other five Environmental Justice actions
that Grewal filed on behalf of the State of New
Jersey were against Nanes Metal Finishing
Company in Newark; Sainte Marie Dry Clean-
ers in Trenton; Schofield Cleaners in Trenton;
260-268 Chestnut Street in Camden (a site of
alleged illegal dumping); and Gas Mart in East
Orange.

On the day that the six environmental cases,
including the one against Auto Scrap were
filed, Grewal also issued a 33-page "Environ-
mental Crimes Handbook" to law enforcement
officers throughout New Jersey. The handbook
details how law enforcement officers should
enforce laws related to air pollution, asbestos,
lead, fish and wildlife, hazardous chemicals,
land use, radioactive materials, waste-related
crimes, and water-related crimes.

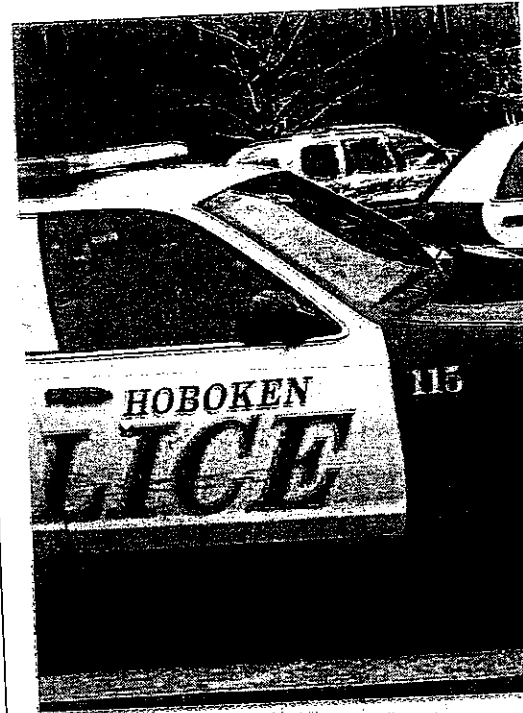
None of those arrested were Hoboken residents.

Two arrested in alleged early morning fight

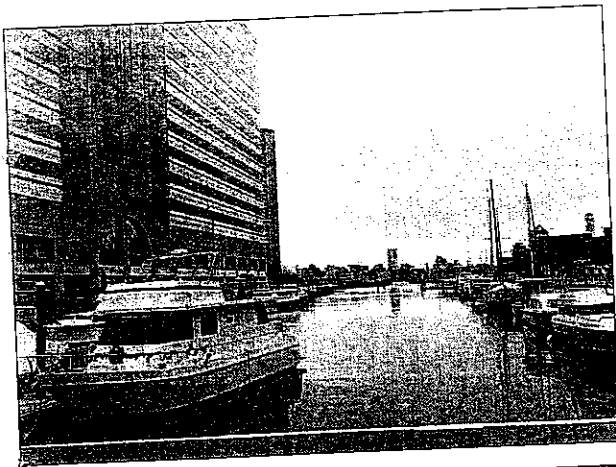

Sports Authority blasted for appealing Keegan Landfill

Stack, Sacco, Cunningham sponsored resolution for immediate closure and capping

The New Jersey State Senate Environment and Energy Committee recently released a resolution urging the New Jersey Sports and Exhibition Authority (NJSEA) and the state Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) to take immediate action to close and cap Keegan Landfill.

The resolution, SCR180, was sponsored by state legislators in Hudson County, Senator Nicholas J. Sacco (LD32), Senator Brian P. Stack (LD33), and co-sponsored by Senator Sandra B. Cunningham (LD31).

Since March of 2018, the Kearny-based landfill, which is owned and operated by the NJSEA, has been regularly emitting hydrogen sulfide at levels that a Hudson County Superior Court judge said were a "clear and immediate danger" to anyone in the nearby area. The

levels of hydrogen sulfide emitted by the landfill routinely exceeded 30 parts per billion, a threshold set by the DEP.

Keegan is the only landfill still operating in the Meadowlands District. At one time, dumping was occurring at more than 50 locations in the ecologically-sensitive wetlands, not including sites where illegal dumping has historically occurred.

Residents of Kearny and its surrounding communities have been filing complaints about Keegan Landfill's noxious odors since at least December 2018. The NJSEA installed a gas collection system to mitigate the odors, but it was not sufficient. Complaints continued to be filed with the DEP, officials opposing the landfill said.

Last month, the town of Kearny sued the DEP and the NJSEA, which owns and operates the landfill, and a judge ruled that the landfill had to be closed.

'Toxic nightmare'

The verdict, reached on Sept. 30, marked a major victory for opponents of the landfill, but the NJSEA filed an appeal to reopen the site

able units instead of the 10 percent the city currently requires.

The 15 percent set aside would be required of developments that have more than 10 units.

The introductory ordinance also mandates that any residential or mixed-use development which receives Urban Transit Hub Tax Credit financing, any subsidy or financing from the State of New Jersey, or any governmental entity or political subdivision of the state, would be required to set aside an additional five percent for a total of 20 percent of the total units in the development.

The ordinance also states that no developments by conditional redevelopers that have already executed an Interim Cost and Conditional Designate Agreement would be required to provide the additional affordable housing units and would instead be held to the current 10 percent set aside requirement.

This means that developments such as the

groundbreaking.

The \$49 million mixed-use development will have 97 luxury one- and two- bedroom apartments, lots of amenities, a rooftop deck, and ground floor retail. The ten-story high rise is the tallest building in the Bergenline Avenue area business district, the only residential project of its size there. The developer will construct 80 underground parking spaces and 25 spaces off-site.

"NRIA will deliver several multi-family projects on the Gold Coast," NRIA's Glenn LaMantina said. "The Station is our second project, with many more planned in the years ahead. It

will be the tallest and most luxurious building in West New York, and will be the most accessible to public transportation. The Station will give West New York a product comparable to other Gold Coast towns, like what you'd find across the river but more attractively priced."

Public transit is the key

The development will be at the former site of a Duane Reade pharmacy near the Union City border, across the street from the Bergenline Light Rail station.

Public officials who spoke at the event were optimistic about its being so close to a light rail station. The state Department of Transportation and New Jersey Transit in the "Transit Village Initiative" call for pedestrian-friendly growth

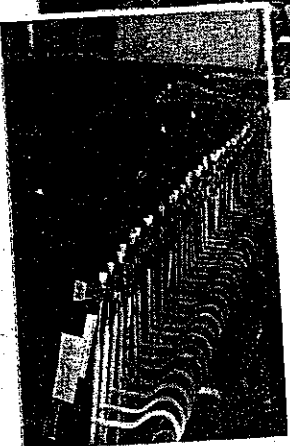
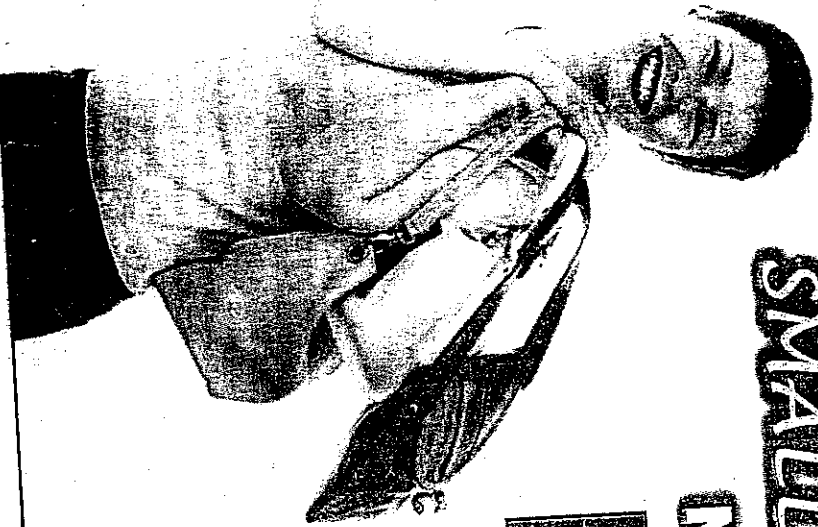

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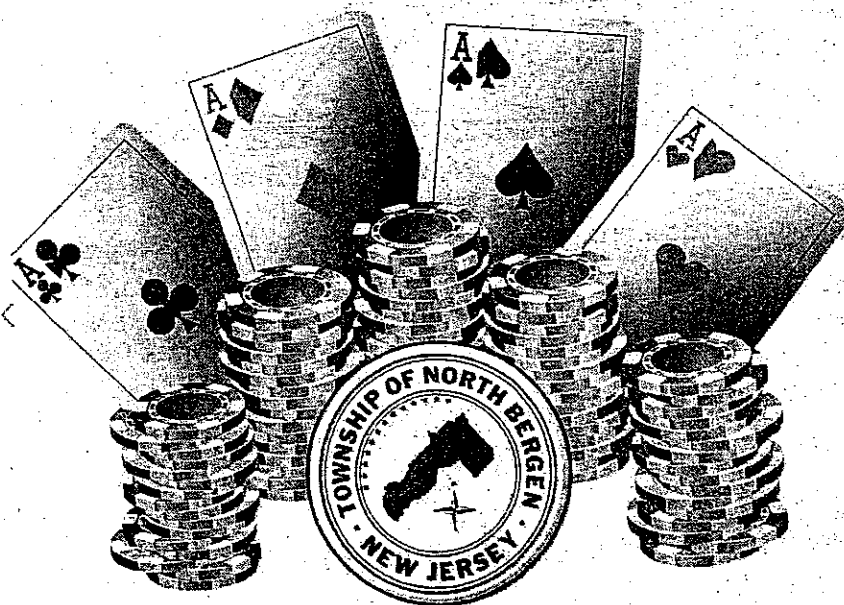
