According to NJDOT, the Columbia Ave. exit ramp will be closed and barricaded during work on the exit ramp.

Mairin Bellack, NJDOT's deputy director of communications, said that NJDOT will be co-operating with local police to mitigate traffic while the detour is in place.

"NJDOT has been monitoring traffic patterns in the vicinity of the project and has made adjustments to traffic signal timings," Bellack said. "In addition, local police are posted at key intersections during the morning and evening commute. This week there will be an additional officer posted at Columbia Avenue and the 30th Street ramp."

Bellack said there will also be digital monitors in place to mark the detour route for motorists.

IEW also closed an eastbound lane on 495 to pour a new concrete deck. Traffic in that direction will be reduced to two lanes.

Lifespan of a bridge

According to NJDOT, maintenance will extend the bridge's life for about 75 years, and eliminate the need for emergency repairs. A total of \$90.3 million is being spent to reconstruct the bridge deck, repair structural steel, conduct substructure repairs, improve drainage, and repaint the bridge.

Fulop makes peace with HCDO

In what appears to be a move to repair the damage caused by his part in the plot to overthrow County Executive Tom DeGise last year, Jersey City Mayor Steven Fulop has

endorsed the slate of candidates backed by the Hudson County Democratic Organization (HCDO).

Almost exactly a year ago, the reelection of DeGise was challenged when the mayors of Jersey City, Union City, West New York, and Hoboken said they would not back him in the 2019 primary.

Union City Mayor Brian Stack and Hoboken Mayor Ravi Bhalla appear to have fallen back into line behind DeGise, leaving Mayor Fulop and West New York Mayor Felix Roque to do so, or not.

Fulop's move may be a bit self-serving; he may well be eyeing the U.S. Senate seat currently occupied by Cory Booker (if Booker is elected president in 2020) and will need the HCDO support to accomplish it.

Supporters of DeGise held a reelection-petition-signing party in Bayonne on Feb. 26 which included support for 31st District Assembly members Nicholas Chiaravalloti and Angela McKnight as well as Hudson County Sheriff Frank X. Schillari. It was hosted by Bayonne Mayor Jimmy Davis.

Oddly enough, Fulop held his own birthday fundraiser in Bayonne in February as well, one of a number of events designed to increase his mayoral reelection war chest for his run in 2021.

In what appears to be a peace offering to Stack for his return to the Democratic mainstream, the HCDO has endorsed Freeholder Tilo Rivas for Hudson County surrogate.

Rivas was rumored to be seeking to challenge Rep. Albio Sires in last year's Democratic primary, but apparently withdrew this name at the last moment.

The HCDO's official announcement was released at the end of February. Apparently the slate has the support of nearly all the Hudson County mayors and power brokers.

The HCDO is endorsing McKnight and Chiaravalloti for the 31st District, Assemblywoman Angelica Jimenez and Assemblyman Pedro Mejia for the 32nd District and Assemblyman Raj Mukherji and Assemblywoman Annette Chaparro for the 33rd District.

On a county level, the HCDO has endorsed Tom DeGise for county executive and Schillari for Hudson County sheriff.

Is Booker really the one?

Raising hopes that New Jersey might see its first president since Woodrow Wilson, Democrats are coming out in droves to support Sen. Cory Booker's bid to become the Democratic candidate.

Among the most prominent name is Gov. Phil Murphy, who may actually be sincere in his bid to see Booker become president.

Other Democrats, however, may simply want to see him vacate his senate seat and would be willing to see him become president to achieve that.

Booker was once seen as the savior of Newark when he ran for mayor to oppose Mayor Sharpe James, and became a U.S. Senator after the death of Frank Lautenberg. His departure from Newark did not leave a lot of people in tears, though Ras Baraka, who replaced him as mayor, has endorsed Booker for president as well.

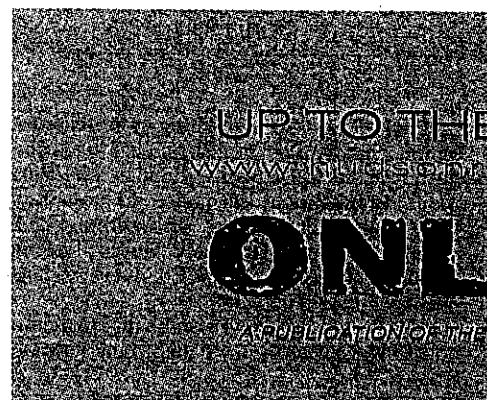

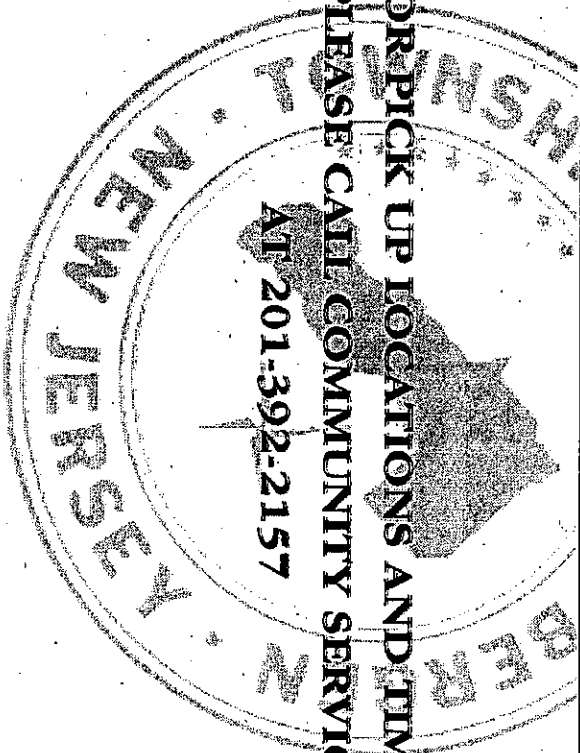

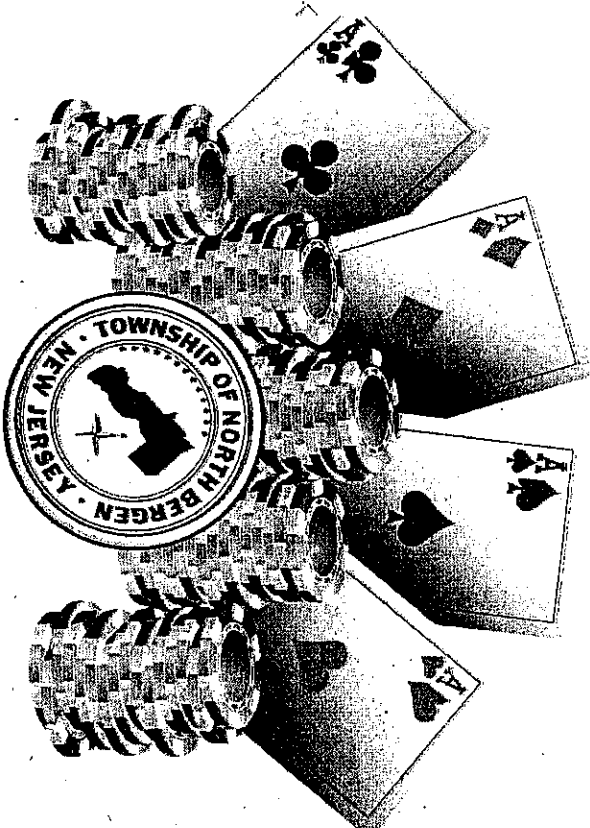
