Original Narrative

On August 20, 2024, at approximately 2142 hours, Officer Gulsby and I responded to the RUPD Sally port, 55 Paul Robeson Boulevard, New Brunswick, NJ, after Officer Calimano requested additional officers to respond to that area. Upon arrival, we provided scene security and observed Lt. Wiess speaking with Michael Schultz (unaffiliated) outside of a black Chevy Silverado bearing NJ registration V13UPW, which was parked inside the Sally port behind patrol vehicle #20.

While recounting tonight's events, Schultz stated that as he traveled on a service road heading towards the entrance to Rt. 18 South, Officer Calimano merged between Schultz's vehicle and another in front of him. He further explained that this caused him to abruptly brake to avoid a collision, resulting in him becoming agitated. He added that he followed Officer Calimano, at what he described as high rates of speed, in an attempt to speak with him. He stated that he then proceeded to enter the RUPD Sally port behind Officer Calimano. Schultz informed us that once he saw Officer Calimano's demeanor, he realized that his actions were inappropriate and made a mistake. It should be noted that Schultz stated multiple times that he knew his decisions were unwarranted, stating that he had overstepped his bounds and wanted to be on his way.

The above incident was observed by a bystander who was operating white SUV with a temporary NJ registration. Due to the vehicle leaving the area officers were tasked with retrieving the registration number in the event that additional information needed to be gathered from the occupants. See Sgt. Synosky's supplemental report for additional information.

While on scene, I could detect the odor of an alcoholic beverage on Schultz's breath and observed that his eyes were glassy and bloodshot. While speaking with Schultz, his speech was slurred and slowed, and he had to repeat numerous words after pronouncing them incorrectly or unclearly. Due to these observations and the actions taken by Shultz, it was determined that a DWI investigation would need to be conducted.

In response to our questioning, Schultz stated that at 1915 hours he was in the Elks Lodge in New Brunswick for a union meeting, where he had consumed two beers. Shultz explained that he left at approximately 2110 hours and drove to Destination Dogs in New Brunswick. Schultz stated that he did not consume any alcohol while at this location. It should be noted that during questioning, Schultz's speech continued to be slurred and slowed, and I continued to detect the odor of an alcoholic beverage on his breath. Schultz was asked if he would be willing to perform Standard Field Sobriety Tests, to which he declined.

Shultz was also informed that the RUPD Sally port was prohibited for non-police vehicles and was shown signage on the exterior of the Sally port that clearly stated this information. During further conversation, Shultz again stated that he had made a mistake in following Officer Calimano and wanted to be on his way. Schultz stated that the entire incident was a result of road rage and apologized for his actions.

At this time, Sgt. Synosky stayed with Schultz while Lt. Weiss informed us of the observations he had made prior to our arrival. See Lt. Weiss's supplemental for further information. It was determined, based upon observations and investigation, that Schultz would be placed under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated and Defiant trespassing at 2236 hours. While placing Schultz under arrest, he pleaded with officers to drive him home instead of arresting him.

Schultz was placed in handcuffs, which were checked for proper fit and double-locked. A search incident to arrest was performed, yielding negative results. He was then escorted to the processing area by Officer Gulsby and Sgt. Synosky.

I then conducted a search for intoxicants of Schultz's vehicle, which yielded the following:

- Four small glass cartridges with white mouthpieces containing a Amber-colored substance.
- One Puftin vape pen with a similar cartridge attached
- One plastic Smart Water bottle, which contained a small amount of liquid that emanated the odor of an alcoholic beverage, which I recognized to be consistent with that of vodka.

Officer Stoya and Officer Walsh remained with Schultz's vehicle while it was towed by Guaranteed Motors. All corresponding paperwork was complete, a copy of which is attached to this report. In accordance with John's Law, a 12-hour hold was placed on Schultz's vehicle.

Upon my arrival to the RUPD processing area, Schultz's was already searched, yielding negative results for contraband and handcuffed to the bench inside the processing area. I then read the Standard Statement form to Schultz and asked if he understood, to which he responded, "Yes."

The twenty-minute observation period was then explained to Schultz, and he was instructed that during this time he could not belch or regurgitate any of the contents of his stomach. Prior to beginning the 20-minute observation, Schultz's mouth was checked and was clear of foreign objects. The first 20-minute observation had to be restarted as I witnessed Schultz belch. A second 20-minute observation period was started, which Schultz was able to complete without issue. At the conclusion of the 20-minute observation, all electronic equipment was removed from the processing area.

At this time, Piscataway Patrolman Yulick arrived on scene and entered processing to breath tests. The subsequent breath samples provided by Schultz resulted in a BAC of .10. A copy of this Alcotest and the Alcotest Calculator results are attached to this report. Reference Piscataway Police report number 24020504 for further information regarding the operation and administration of the Alcotest.

Schultz was able to contact Hasahya Hirya (unaffiliated), to take custody of him from RUPD Headquarters. Upon his arrival, I explained the Potential Liability Warning form to Hirya, which he acknowledged understanding, and signed. A copy of Hirya's license was taken, and both the copy of his license and the signed Potential Liability Warning form are attached to this report.

Schultz was provided with a complaint summons and seven traffic summonses, which are to be heard on September 9, 2024, at New Brunswick Municipal Court at 0845 hours. A copy of the complaint summons and the traffic summonses are attached to this report.

On August 20, 2024 at approximately 2140 hours, I responded to the garage of our police headquarters to assist Officer Calimano who was requesting assistance for an unknown matter. Once entering the garage, I observed Officer Calimano engaged in a verbal confrontation with a male standing next to a Chevrolet pickup truck later identified as Michael Schultz. I separated Schultz from Officer Calimano to interview him with regard to what prompted this confrontation. Additionally, an unknown female could be heard yelling into the garage from a vehicle on Neilson Street. While speaking with Schultz, I detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his mouth and noticed his speech was slurred. Schultz's description of what had occurred was unorganized and hard to follow.

I then spoke with Officer Calimano as Schultz began to speak with Lt. Weiss for a formal interview. While speaking with Officer Calimano, Rutgers Communications advised that a female was on the phone who may have witnessed what had occurred.

I spoke with the female identified as "Ella" on the patrol supervisor phone who wished to remain anonymous. She advised that she witnessed Schultz tailgating and following Officer Calimano on Tabernacle Way in a reckless manner and at first thought they were acquainted with each other due to this being so out of the ordinary. She further advised that she heard the trucks tires spin out turning onto Neilson Street while following Officer Calimano. She advised that it was her who was yelling into the garage from Neilson Street because she did not want anyone to get hurt once she observed the altercation. She then advised that she was concerned on why an Officer had followed her vehicle once she left the area and "ran her plate." I informed her of basic police tactics and information gathering which she then understood why this occurred.

On Tuesday, August 20, 2024 at approximately 2139 hours, I was operating marked patrol vehicle #20 and traveling west on Tabernacle Way after exiting Route 18 in New Brunswick.

As I approached the stop sign on Tabernacle Way at its intersection with Neilson Street, in my rearview mirror I observed a black Chevrolet Silverado traveling at a high rate of speed towards the rear of my patrol car. I could hear the vehicle's engine and noticed the Chevy bridging the gap between our vehicles quickly which got my attention. I then came to a stop at the stop sign while signalling a left turn onto Neilson Street. Observing that the intersection was safe, I executed my turn while simultaneously maintaining observation of the vehicle behind me as I found the operation of the vehicle out of the ordinary. As I accelerated onto Neilson Street I observed the Chevy behind me accelerate aggressively causing the tires to lose traction on the roadway, the revs of the engine were obviously audible, and the vehicle failed to observe the stop sign. The vehicle accelerated rapidly and began tailgating my patrol car and traveled south on Neilson Street towards Rutgers Police Headquarters. The Chevy followed my patrol car into the Sally Port of Headquarters which is reserved for police vehicles and relevant law enforcement related business.

As I entered the Sally Port and continued to observe the vehicle follow me aggressively, I quickly stopped and exited my patrol vehicle to address the driver, later identified as Michael Schultz (not affiliated). My initial concern was that Schultz was attempting to make an urgent report to police, it was immediately evident that was not his intent when following my patrol vehicle into the controlled area of Headquarters. He was irate and shouting as I then radioed for officers to assist. He identified himself as City of New Brunswick Firefighter as he then continued to shout with regard to having issues with the operation of my vehicle on the roadways utilized while traveling to Rutgers Police Headquarters. In an attempt to better understand what his exact issue was, I asked where this occurred. He was unable to specify where he observed the issue, what the speed limit of that roadway may have been, or any other detail surrounding the incident, despite being a City of New Brunswick Firefighter and resident of the city for several years.

Schultz then continued that he observed me traveling at high rate of speed. When asked how fast he believed I was traveling and what the speed limit of the roadway was, he responded with the speed limit being "a lot more than what [the officer] were doing," contradicting his initial issue.

At this time Sgt. Synosky and Lt. Weiss arrived on-scene and began to speak with Schultz.

Officers Gulsby and Azarow arrived on-scene to take over primary investigative responsibility for this incident. Please see Officer Azarow's initial narrative for details regarding the ensuing investigation.

It should be noted that in my initial interaction with Schultz, I observed his eyes to be bloodshot.

Schultz was issued numerous traffic summons for: failing to stop, following too closely, reckless driving, and careless driving.

My body-worn camera was active during this incident.

On the above date and time, I was completing administrative duties within the Rutgers University Public Safety Building while adorned in full Class C duty attire. As I completed said responsibilities, Officer Jared Calimano utilized his two-way radio to request priority assistance at the building's designated "SALLY PORT" parking area. The referenced location is utilized to store/house agency approved modes of transportation and provide exclusive facility access for credentialed employees. To alert pedestrians and the motoring public of these guidelines, two large, descriptive "NO TRESPASSING" warning signs were affixed to both sides of the lone, gated entryway. In order to further emphasize this legal restriction, an additional "DO NOT ENTER" placard was fastened to an adjacent section of the concrete exterior.

Upon arrival on scene, I witnessed a large black Chevy Silverado (NJ-V13UPW) stopped askew in a lane of travel which bordered RUPD Director/Chief Kenneth Cop's assigned parking space. When first observed, the vehicle's front door was ajar, and its engine and/or general lighting equipment appeared to be active. As I closed distance between myself and the suspicious vehicle, I observed Sergeant David Synosky speaking with a white male subject, later identified as Michael Schultz (non-affiliate), who was loudly expressing his distaste for motor vehicle actions taken by an unnamed officer. Simultaneously, Officer Jared Calimano was conversing from a distance with an unnamed female, who was occupying the driver seat of a white SUV which was stopped near the intersection of Neilson Street and Paul Robeson Boulevard. Although the exact context of the female's dialogue was not immediately clear, her direct reference to Schultz and accompanying tone clearly suggested that she possessed some knowledge of the events which preceded my response. As a result of this discovery, the female was asked to meet with officers but instead slowly moved her vehicle from view.

Officer Stoya and Officer Walsh arrived on site a short time later and were directed to attempt further contact with the potential witness. As they followed my instruction, Sergeant Synosky indicated that Schultz wished to speak with me regarding the matter at hand. After providing Schultz with a formal introduction and associated pleasantries, he voluntarily accompanied me to a more secluded portion of the SALLY PORT, where I began efforts to obtain pertinent information.

During the conversation that ensued, Schultz, who self-identified as a New Brunswick city firefighter, reported that he followed Officer Calimano from a Route 18 access Road near Highland Park to his current location for the purpose of discussing a traffic-related concern. More specifically, Schultz indicated that he disagreed with how Officer Calimano navigated a roadway merge zone and was distressed that such an action exposed his new vehicle to potential damage. While speaking with Schultz at this cursory stage of my inquiry, he displayed slow, slurred speech and experienced difficulty providing a clear description of the highlighted traffic disagreement. In fact, he was unable to accurately identify roads, engaged in long pauses between statements, and provided contradictory accounts of Officer Calimano's rate of speed, or lack thereof. Given Schultz's employment with the New Brunswick Fire Department, I found his inability to describe a course of travel or identify applicable roadways to be unusual and noteworthy. In addition, he exhibited a flushed face, overtly nervous demeanor, and bloodshot, glassy eyes.

Despite my initial suspicions regarding his condition and concerning behavior, I assured Schultz of this agency's commitment to accountability and explained the process associated with filing a formal complaint. In response to this notification, Schultz advised that he did not wish to pursue a grievance and only aspired to engage Officer Calimano in normal conversation. He further added that "If it's more than that, I really don't care."

Once complete with this initial interaction, I met and spoke with Officer Calimano who expressed disbelief with Schultz's actions and the initial explanation that he provided concerning his displayed outrage. Officer Calimano

related that he followed all applicable traffic guidelines when operating in and around the area identified by Schultz and was unaware that any individual driving nearby had been negatively impacted by his benign driving behavior. Officer Calimano indicated that a third unidentified vehicle experienced difficulty navigating the connecting roadways highlighted by Schultz, and he was forced to utilize his air horn to alert that party of their poor operation and disregard of traffic rules. When asked, Officer Calimano communicated that he had not become aware that Schultz was tracking his movement until he approached a stop sign located at the intersection of Tabernacle Way and Neilson Street. It was at that juncture where Officer Calimano observed Schultz operating at a dangerously close distance to his vehicle, before "aggressively spinning his tires," ignoring the posted stop sign, and proceeding to follow him.

After obtaining all relevant details from the involved officer and initial responding supervisor, I transferred primary reporting responsibilities to Officer Tyler Gulsby and Officer Justin Azarow, before commencing with a continued, joint investigation.

As I engaged Schultz in further communication from a close distance and downwind position, I detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath. When discussing the matter at further length and advising Schultz of the heightened caution his actions created for Officer Calimano and responding co-workers, Schultz acknowledged that he "overstepped his bounds" and relayed a desire "to go home." Throughout our supplementary conversations with Schultz he would continue to reverse course/retract his initial account, apologize profusely, and acknowledge his role as the aggressor and party at fault. Schultz further indicated that his actions were born from anger and concern for his vehicle, while proceeding to further proffer the following declarations of guilt:

"I realized my mistake, immediately."

"I understand what I did wrong."

"I was out of bounds."

"I was really mad and angry."

"I wrongly followed him."

"I'm sorry that I ruined things."

Most notably, he would later describe the totality of his actions as "ROAD RAGE." He was further alerted to the criminal implications of his unauthorized SALLY PORT entry and directly shown the clearly visible signs which warned against such an action. Schultz did not offer a rebuke of this contention, and instead accepted responsibility for the trespass/law violation. In addition to these affirmations, Schultz also indicated that he *may have* misinterpreted Officer Calimano's operation as improper and later assigned *possible blame* to a third unidentified vehicle for his need to "stop short" and alter course.

In subsequent dialogue concerning the events which occurred prior to police involvement, Schultz related that he attended a "union meeting" at a local Elks Lodge and traveled to the Destination Dogs Restaurant/Bar upon its conclusion. Schultz related that he consumed "two beers" while at the listed establishments, before operating his vehicle to his current destination. Schultz also experienced increasing difficulty with clear expression of dialogue and could be heard uttering slurred speech and even repeating a mispronounced word on one occasion.

Officer Gulsby and Officer Azarow next asked Schultz if he would submit to Standardized Field Sobriety Testing, which was declined. When alerted to this decision, I made certain to emphasize the voluntary nature of this testing while ensuring that he understood its value as a method to dispel officer suspicion and/or probable cause to believe impairment exists. Schultz did not wish to change his decision and that right was honored. When asked to describe his level of intoxication on a scale of 1 through 10, he responded with "1 or 2" as his answer. Despite this assertion, Schultz indicated that he did not drink often and that the two beers he ingested on this night constituted his limit.

During further information sharing with Sergeant Synosky, I was alerted that he spoke with the witness who was referenced earlier and briefly interacted with Officer Calimano. The female reported to Sergeant Synosky that she observed Schultz operating his vehicle in an exceedingly fast, reckless manner and dangerously "tailgating" Officer

Calimano as he operated on Route 18, Tabernacle Way, and Neilson Street. The female contacted Rutgers University Police Department and Sergeant Synosky via the non-emergency line and declined to identify herself.

As a result of the collective, thorough investigation conducted by myself and supporting officers, we developed probable cause to believe that Schultz operated his vehicle while intoxicated and trespassed within our SALLY PORT area. He was subsequently placed under arrest by Officer Azarow and processed accordingly. The dangerous vehicle actions and further improper behavior exhibited by Schultz inside the Rutgers University Police Department will be further evaluated for potential added criminal charges.

Given the false claims of negligence lodged by Schultz, I made precautionary command notification to Acting Captain John Bell and the Professional Standards Division.

It should be noted that a portion of the information included in my writing was not authored in chronological order, but rather organized in a manner that will provide the reader with an accurate depiction of the events which triggered police intervention and our ensuing investigation.

Please refer to the report narratives completed by Officer Azarow, Officer Calimano, and Sergeant Synosky for additional information.

The police officer shall read the following:

8. Any response from you that is ambiguous or conditional, in any respect, to my request that you provide breath samples, will be treated as a refusal to submit to breath testing. Even if you agree to take the test, but then do not follow my instructions, do not properly perform the test, or do not provide sufficient breath samples, I will charge you with refusal to submit to breath testing.
9. I repeat, the law requires you to submit samples of your breath for testing. Will you submit the samples of your breath?
