Dear Mr. Anderson,

After I publicized emails that I obtained through an OPRA request, which embarrassed Chari Chanley, Ms. Chanley seized control over the OPRA process. This action, in effect, has permitted Ms. Chanley to exercise undue influence over a State protected process. Previously, our tenured business administrator, Michael Gorski, was the OPRA officer and all OPRA requests were submitted for attorney review. Now, Ms. Chanley's confidential secretary, Reeshemah Zielinski, is the new OPRA officer and the district is paying her an additional stipend for this work in effort to reduce billable hours to the attorney (see attached video clip). In other words, Ms. Chanley believes that the services of her secretary are a reasonable substitute for the services of a licensed attorney.

My most recent OPRA request included a request for "Total tuition reimbursement Monroe Township Board of Education made to Chari Chanley related to pursuit of her doctoral degree". This request was denied and the custodian wrote:

Your request requires further clarification as it fails to identify a specific government record. OPRA is "not intended as a research tool litigants may use to force government officials to identify and siphon useful information. Rather, OPRA simply operates to make identifiable government records 'readily accessible for inspection, copying, or examination.' N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1." *MAG Entm't, LLC v. Div. of Alcohol Beverage Control*, 375 N.J. Super. 534 (App. Div. 2005); see also *Bent v. Stafford Police Dep't*, 381 N.J. Super. 30 (App. Div. 2005) (holding that the information sought did not amount to an identifiable government record." Your request seeks the District calculate certain information rather than identify a specific government record. As a result, the request is denied until further clarification is provided."

Mr. Anderson, I feel my request was straightforward and I wonder if this represents Ms. Chanley's illegitimate attempt to deprive me of information to which I am legally entitled because it would be embarrassing to Ms. Chanley who has been "pursuing a doctorate" since 2008. Ms. Zielenski has an excellent reputation and I consider her to be an innocent person who is acting under the direction of an unethical acting superintendent. Nonetheless, I revised the request as follows:

"Records of payments made by the Monroe Township Board of Education to either Rowan University or Chari Chanley that relate to Chari Chanley's pursuit of a doctoral degree from Rowan University from 2008-2022."

I hope this request is specific enough to meet the required criteria.

Again, it is concerning to me that Ms. Chanley's office now has control over the OPRA process, given her questionable ethics. I wonder if there is anything the county or state can do to return this OPRA responsibility back to our tenured business administrator. Please click on the link from the opramachine email.

Ordinarily, I would dismiss the spellings on Ms. Chanley's certifications as clerical errors. However, when these misspellings are viewed in the context of massive evidence that shows fraudulence in both her 2003 and 2021 resumes, five yearbooks, as well as the numerous fraudulent statements she made at the Feb 2022 board meeting (see below), then I think it's very much worthwhile to confirm that her certifications are authentic. At the Feb 2022, I confronted Ms. Chanley about the yearbook misrepresentations and, in response, she did not deny the misrepresentation but publicly attacked Rowan University, accusing them of "libel" and a "lack of ethics" for not awarding her with a doctorate. She also said Rowan did "not approve" her dissertation topic. This raises the question as to whether Rowan charged Ms. Chanley with academic dishonesty or some type of wrongdoing--why else would she defame Rowan? Given that Rowan has collected over \$34K in Monroe taxpayer monies in tuition reimbursements and the Board refuses to investigate this matter, I was hoping the DOE could investigate it.

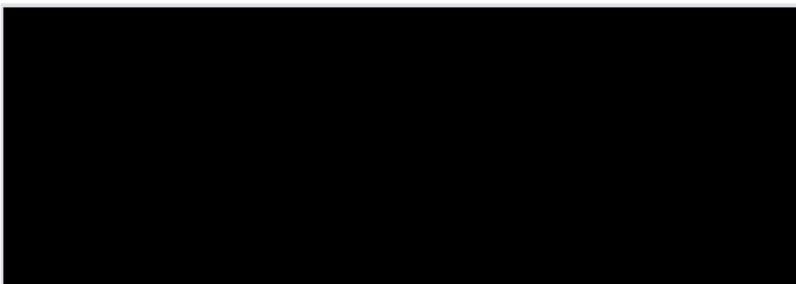
In February, I notified Rowan officials that Ms. Chanley defamed them at the board meeting and asked them why Ms. Chanley would accuse THEM of being unethical. Rowan thanked me for alerting them to this issue but refused to answer my questions, citing the Federal Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). However, given that Rowan is a *public* university and Ms. Chanley's doctoral studies are *publicly* funded, I thought the DOE would have the authority to intervene and investigate this matter to protect the taxpayers of Monroe Township given the BOE's refusal to do so.

The Monroe Township Board of Education is itself is compromised--there have been least 8 ethics complaints against various board members, filed by 5 different complainants, and 2 of these ethics complaints have been referred to the Office of Administrative law and the rest are pending. There is also a lawsuit pending against the Board seeking to invalidate the extension of Ms. Chanley's contract (see attached)

In light of these factors, everything in Ms. Chanley's resume should be checked--her certifications, degrees, etc. This level of dishonesty is unacceptable at any level--be it at the teacher level, the principal level, or the superintendent level.

To the State Board of Examiners,

I am a taxpayer and parent of three children in the Monroe Township School District and I am writing to express concerns about fraudulent resumes and possibly fraudulent certifications submitted by Acting Superintendent, Chari Chanley.

Attached are copies of her 2003 and 2021 resume and all her certifications obtained from the Monroe Township School District that have been publicly posted on the opramachine website:

1) Ms. Chanley's provisional Principal/Supervisor certificate was valid from February 2004-July 2004 but her standard Principal/Supervisor certificate was valid beginning December 2004 and has no expiration date. **Her 2021 resume proves that she was working as Assistant Principal of Applegarth School WITHOUT either a provisional OR standard certificate from August 2004-November 2004. Is this illegal? If it is illegal, what, if any, consequences would the DOE impose for this illegal act?**

2) On the resume she submitted to the Monroe Township School District in 2003 in her application for the position of Assistant Principal of Applegarth Middle School, she claimed she possessed "New Jersey Principal/Supervisor/School Administrator Certificates of Eligibility." However, as of May 2003, the ONLY Certification she possessed was a Certificate of Eligibility for "School Administrator." **The two other certifications she has, Provisional Principal/Supervisor and**

Standard Principal/Supervisor, were issued in February and December 2004, respectively. Chari Chanley began working as an Assistant Principal in the district in August 2003. **Why did Ms. Chanley represent that she possessed more qualifications than she actually had, and what are the consequences for this misrepresentation on her resume?**

3) Ms. Chanley's name is misspelled "Charii R. Chanley" instead of "Chari R. Chanley" on all these certifications. It's highly unusual to have name misspellings appear on such important documents. It should be noted that Ms. Chanley spells her name on resumes and other correspondence with staff and the community as "Chari Chanley," i.e. with one "i." This is also evident in documents submitted to the State, like her 2022 School Ethics Commission Personal Disclosure Statement (attached). **To what can we attribute this discrepancy? Is there another person, who spells her name Charii R. Chanley, to whom these certifications actually belong? Are these records consistent with those on file with the State Board of Examiners? How could this error re-occur three separate times, with the issuance of three separate documents, over a two-year period?**

4) Given these misrepresentations and inaccuracies, what information did Chari Chanley attest to when she signed "The Oath of Allegiance/Verification of Accuracy" statement when seeking employment and certification in New Jersey? What are the consequences for perjury in this context?

5) Could the State face legal consequences for approving the contract of someone with fraudulent certifications or who has a history of working as principal without the proper certification?

In the attached file "The Case Against Chari Chanley", I have already proven other examples of Ms. Chanley's fraudulence—her yearbook misrepresentations as well as the false statements she made at the February 2022 board meeting when she claimed to be meeting with her "dissertation chairperson" "every Monday" when evidence later revealed she disenrolled from her doctoral program. My research also revealed that Ms. Chanley has collected nearly \$40K in tuition reimbursements for her enrollment in the doctoral programs of three different universities, failing to achieve a doctorate from all of them. Ms. Chanley has advanced her career on the appearance that she is just about to achieve a doctorate when there is no evidence she is actually doing the work necessary to achieve one. Monroe taxpayers are still contractually required to fund her doctoral studies.

I am wondering if her certifications are yet another example of Ms Chanley's 20 year pattern of fraudulent behavior.

At this point, it is not merely a question as to whether Chari Chanley should become permanent superintendent of Monroe Township Public Schools—it's a question as to whether the State should revoke ALL of her certifications. In my view, someone who displays this level of dishonesty is unfit to have any supervisory role over teachers and other administrators, whether it be in the capacity of Principal or Chief School Administrator.

Good Morning Monroe Township Board of Education Members!

I know that some of you have been extremely busy with your shenanigans, but I hope you all pause to read this email. I believe in complete transparency so I would like you to know all of the people that are on this email. I

am sending this email to all of the members of the BOE, and I am copying the NJ State Commissioner of Education, Mr. Kyle Anderson, and the Middlesex County Prosecutor's Office. I am blind copying a whole bunch of other individuals including but not limited to: journalists, attorneys, and individuals in law enforcement, potential whistleblowers and a few other individuals. Please make sure that you carefully go through all of the attachments because the picture becomes a lot clearer.

First of all, I would like to apologize to Miss Arminio, Miss Rattner, and Miss Fabiano for prejudging them too harshly. Thank you ladies for proving me wrong. It actually brings a smile to my face when individuals who face adversity, stand by their convictions and who have their moral compass pointed in the right direction are extremely rare finds and should be valued and not attacked. Knowing Mrs. Skurbe and her cronies like I do, I know that this could not have been an easy task for the last few months. Due to the insecurities that authoritarian leaders (like Skurbe) have, any opinion that goes counter to their opinion is the wrong opinion. I know that the pressures to coalesce with the majority opinion (even when the choice is morally and ethically wrong) must have been great and I applaud you for voting with your conscience.

I think we need to first establish what the Board of Education is and isn't for municipalities. Think of the Board of Education as an educational charitable trust. This means that the Board of Education members need to safeguard the taxpayer funds to ensure that these funds are used in the best possible manner for the public. BOE members have a fiduciary responsibility to protect these funds. (Wouldn't it be great if we had someone with risk management experience on the BOE to limit the amount of Board of Education exposure to risk? Oh wait...) **It doesn't mean that you can use the taxpayer funds to reward your friends and punish your enemies.** The Board of Education is an entity of itself, and the insurance companies that the Board of Education uses only insures BOE members when they are performing legitimate BOE business. **These insurance companies do not insure BOE member when they are abusing their positions.** To ensure that the Board of Education as an entity is protected, the entity has an attorney. The BOE attorney is just that, he or she is the attorney for the entity and not the attorney for individual members of the Board of Education. **I wonder why the Monroe Township BOE attorney allowed the BOE to become this corrupted...**

As a quick FYI to the all of the individuals who are copied and blind copied on this email. The budget for the Monroe Township School District is \$140 million dollars. I believe it accounts for roughly 55% of the total tax bill that the each property owner pays in Monroe. Every single tax payer is affected by the performance of the school system. Property values are directly proportional to school performance in New Jersey, so if the school district is mismanaged, we are all affected.

Most of you have no idea who I am, so I want to give you a little background of who I am. I am the son of 1st generation immigrants from India who arrived in 1970. My dad came here with \$8.00 in his pocket. My parents started a manufacturing business in 1984, and they became financially successful. It wasn't easy, and for the first couple of years, my family were the only the employees. Below are the most valuable things that I learned from my parents were the following:

- 1) Education is the most valuable gift that you can give a child, because education is the great societal equalizer.
- 2) It is every individual's responsibility to give back to society, so the more fortunate that you are, the greater the responsibility you have to give back.

We moved to Monroe Township, NJ in 2015. Since we moved to Monroe, my wife and I have donated as generously as possible wherever we can. In the last year, we have donated approximately \$50,000 to \$75,000 to Monroe charities. We sponsor 10 need based \$1,000 scholarships for graduating seniors. We give generously to Friends of the Senior Center (Food Pantry in Monroe), Deacon's Cupboard (Food Pantry in Jamesburg), the Monroe Educational Foundation, Soups for Rossmoor Seniors, Make-A-Wish and other charities. We give to anyone who needs a helping need not for any other reason, but because it is the right thing to do.

We try to give anonymously as much as possible, but the reason that I am explaining things in detail is that I need to establish my character to our wider audience. Prosecutors, investigators and journalists all need as much back story as possible to uncover the truth, and I have nothing to hide. (By the way, Skurbe I am sure that you can reach out to any of these organizations for my character reference, and to establish that I am in fact telling the truth. I hope everyone OPRA's all of my emails to the district and to the schools because it will be the fastest way to verify that I am telling the truth.

This is where the email gets really interesting.

I had heard that Monroe BOE meetings were getting combative and you had to be careful of certain individuals. I immediately thought that this had to be same made up nonsense. The first and only time that I ever spoke at a BOE meeting was the day that Dr. Dori Alvich announced her retirement, July, 2021. I spoke harshly to the BOE at the meeting as I have a right to do as a resident of Monroe Township, New Jersey.

Funny thing happened the next day. Chrissy Skurbe (using her online fake persona Suzy Ann) slandered me online, and she slandered my business. Until that moment, I was rarely on social media except for Twitter. My wife was the only who used FaceBook. After my wife saw the attacks by Skurbe and her friends, she immediately became frightened and no longer felt safe in her home. (Cyber bullying at its finest by Skurbe and the gang.) Everyone on this email chain knows the pain of seeing a loved one hurt or frightened, and now imagine knowing that this pain was being caused by an elected official using tax payer funds. (Highly illegal behavior by the way!) One thing that I realized almost immediately was that this not normal behavior, and that my wife and I probably just joined a large list of people targeted by Chrissy Skurbe. Sadly this turned out to be true. Monroe Township turned into a really bad movie and the villains had taken over.

By the way, one of the attachments shows an email that I sent the BOE a few months before I spoke at the July, 2021 BOE meetings about my frustrations with how the BOE was behaving in public. Skurbe knew who I was and she stated in public that my charitable giving was actually a way to bribe a BOE member. How insane is that behavior? I immediately contacted a friend from a college who is a former US Prosecutor. She told me that New Jersey has one of the toughest cyber laws in the country. I contacted a few other friends and family members who happen to be attorneys, and they advised me that targeted retaliatory harassment from elected officials against a class of individuals is a very winnable class action lawsuit. (This is why I blind copied the attorneys). I posted this on Facebook, and the first thing that happened was that Skurbe's Facebook group went from being a public group to becoming a private group. This confirmed a few things about Skurbe and company. She is nothing more than an authoritarian bully, and she and her bunch were morally and ethically corrupted.

Fast forward to January, 2022 of this year, when Skurbe became BOE president. Skurbe and Chanley moved to consolidate power. They also began their campaign of vengeance and retribution. Skurbe and Chanley seized funds from the Monroe Township High School Athletic Booster Club because they personally disliked the President of the Booster Club. Word spread throughout the district that you did not want to cross Skurbe and

crew because not only did they have the majority of the BOE, but the Superintendent was in her pocket. The Monroe Township Educational system has lost an unusually large number of teachers, staff, and administrators in the 7 months since Skurbe became president. The damage that she and her cohorts have caused may be irreparable.

While Skurbe and Chanley were screwing over school district, I was able to join a group of individuals who realized that our school system was in trouble. We started connecting dots and we started to gain momentum. Whistleblowers in the district started to send emails and messages about irregularities and policy changes that were being implemented, so that Skurbe and crew could do whatever they wanted to at the expense of taxpayer dollars.

I met and spoke with parents, teachers, and staff who were worried that Skurbe and Chanley would retaliate towards their children or it would affect their livelihoods because of past disagreements or because they were seen as disloyal. I would like to give a great big thank you to Mr. Pete Piro, the former Director of Security of the Monroe Township School System. It is because of Mr. Piro that I am able to write this email. Mr. Piro is a decorated, retired police officer from Monroe Township. He spent 25 years in the police force, and 11 years working security for the school system. Mr. Piro has worked for many different superintendents and administrations, but he could only last 6 months working with Skurbe and Chanley. Attached is his resignation letter, and Mr. Piro has confirmed that he is willing to be questioned and to give sworn testimony. **Mr. Piro's resignation letter is Must Read material!**

The beauty of being a teacher, a journalist, a prosecutor or just having an inquisitive mind is that you look for trends. If something happens once, we can brush it off as an accident. If it happens a second time, you notice the trend, and if it happens a third time then it's a problem. Notice Skurbe and co.'s pattern for harassment and retaliation.

Below is another whistleblower complaint. Boy it seems like these are popping up on a daily basis. It seems like it confirms Skurbe's pattern of vindictive behavior, but since it is anonymous, we cannot corroborate the full details, but we can look at what was written about Chanley. I'm not sure that everyone realizes that due to decreased newspaper and magazine readership have decreased to the point where you can buy space in magazines and newspapers. Any guesses on why I would do the research for something like this??? FYI, I know higher ups on Wall Street too, and the one thing that people on Wall Street don't want is publicity. Mrs. Chanley's record does not bode well, and I fear retribution. However, I could not stay silent on this matter. We need to have a superintendent and Board of Education with integrity.

Perhaps you can post the info below on Facebook, or perhaps you or someone else at the Board meeting might want to bring the following to the Board's attention and demand action.

Mrs. Chanley's resume includes verifiably false information, discussed below. To repeat: verifiably false. As in: patently untrue. This information is not simply intentionally misleading; it is outright and provably counterfactual. She was not a "Summa cum laude" graduate in either of the programs indicated on her resume, even if she had the grade point averages noted.

Note: Mrs. Chanley may not have intentionally lied. However, twice Mrs. Chanley indicates she received the distinction "Summa cum laude" (under "Education Specialist, Educational Leadership" at Florida Atlantic University, and under "Master of Arts, Teaching" at Monmouth University. **This claim is verifiably false, even if the stated grade point averages are correct.**

- The distinctions "Summa cum laude," "Magna cum laude," and "Cum laude" are generally only used in undergraduate programs, not graduate programs.

- In some universities, for undergraduates to achieve these distinctions, all that is required is a particular GPA. In others, a faculty endorsement is also needed. Thus, GPA is not the only factor.
- Mrs. Chanley indication that she received such a distinction demonstrates that when she crafted her resume, she was neither aware of the distinctions' application to undergraduates only nor of the requirements that often exist beyond GPA.
- Here's a little more information. Most, if not all, accredited graduate programs do not use these distinctions for graduate programs for a variety of reasons.
 - In a graduate program, maintaining a high GPA is expected to be a given. In fact, most (legitimate) graduate programs have different grading standards to maintain matriculation. (For example, according to Florida Atlantic University's website, for the program Mrs. Chanley completed, a minimum passing grade was considered to be a C. Earning a C- was considered failing.)
 - Thus, general GPAs in graduate programs almost always far exceed those of undergraduate programs. Students who cannot achieve grades of A and B generally do not last. In fact, it is not uncommon for all of the graduates from within any particular graduate program to have an A average. While attrition is expected in graduate programs, there is no expectation of a "bell curve" among the GPAs of those who complete their degrees; in fact, it's quite the opposite.
 - Therefore, awarding distinctions such as "Summa cum laude," etc., simply does not exist in graduate programs. The distinctions would be rendered meaningless, because everyone, or close to everyone, would have a distinction.
 - Rather, often universities will convey prestige or honor to select graduate level students by awarding specific, named awards to individual graduates for specific achievements in research or contributions to their fields (for instance, some universities or programs convey named awards for outstanding dissertations, others for excellence in research or discovery, etc.).
- Please feel free to consult the websites or give a call to the registrars at Florida Atlantic University and/or Monmouth University. This information is easily checked.

○ Despite Mrs. Chanley's indication on her resume that she received the distinction of "Summa cum laude" from both universities, and despite her commendable (if true) GPAs at both, neither Florida Atlantic University nor Monmouth University award the distinction of "summa cum laude" for graduate level degrees, only undergraduate degrees.

• The Board of Education must request and require proof of Mrs. Chanley's claim to have received the "Summa cum laude" distinction from both universities. Accordingly, the Board must take commensurate action once Mrs. Chanley's misrepresentation of her credentials is proven.

- Generally, degrees awarded with distinction are noted on official transcripts. Did the board ever require official transcripts? If so, were they read? If not, they must make this request now.

- Generally, commencement ceremony programs also indicate graduates who have received distinctions. (Again, have a look. Recent commencement programs from Monmouth University, for example, are online. A quick look shows the symbols used to designate degrees awarded with distinction are noted as pertaining to undergraduate degrees only.)
- What does it suggest about our Board of Education that this blatant untruth was overlooked?
 - * Did they read her resume?
 - * Did they have any knowledge as to the way degrees with distinction work? (Surely most graduate level educated people should know this basic fact...)
 - * Was receipt of the resume a pure sham to make it look like there was a valid vetting process?

 - If her stated GPAs are indeed truthful (and I am not suggesting they aren't) then why did she feel the need to add an honor she did not earn and, in fact, could not have earned? Why could she not have allowed the GPAs to speak for themselves? (And why did she not include her GPAs in the other programs she completed?)
 - **If Mrs. Chanley indeed lied, then about what else might she lie? And if she was simply mistaken, then it appears she "does not know what she does not know." In that case, what reckless actions might she take based on presumptions of knowledge that is, in fact, incorrect?**

* It is the latter potential that seems most dangerous. When so many other previous superintendents have rejected a potential plan as a potential money pit, and, more significantly, plainly unsafe, Mrs. Chanley again proves not to know what she does not know. Her arrogance is baffling, and the inclusion of the term "Summa cum laude" on her resume is much more than a minor error.

Good Morning Monroe Township Board of Education Members!

I know that some of you have been extremely busy with your shenanigans, but I hope you all pause to read this email. 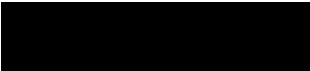

A quick look shows the symbols used to designate degrees awarded with distinction are noted as pertaining to undergraduate degrees only.)
 - What does it suggest about our Board of Education that this blatant untruth was overlooked?
 - * Did they read her resume?
 - * Did they have any knowledge as to the way degrees with distinction work? (Surely most graduate level educated people should know this basic fact...)
 - * Was receipt of the resume a pure sham to make it look like there was a valid vetting process?
- Mrs. Chanley clearly decided for herself that she was a “Summa cum laude” graduate. This distinction was not conveyed to her officially or unofficially by either institution from which she claims she earned it.
 - Did Mrs. Chanley knowingly lie, or did she simply use their GPA standards for undergraduate distinctions and mistakenly apply them to herself?
 - If indeed it was a mistake, on the surface level it would be easy to blow it off and say it was an honest human error. However, such a casual interpretation would belie the intent.
 - Clearly, no one at either university conveyed this distinction to Mrs. Chanley.
 - Mrs. Chanley took it upon herself to add that distinction to her resume without anything official from either university.
 - Even if she had the GPA, didn’t she know it was not official?
 - Didn’t she know these distinctions are not used in graduate programs?
 - If she didn’t know these distinctions did not apply to graduate students, didn’t she know that often a student’s GPA is not the only criteria on which the distinctions are awarded?
 - Most importantly, why did Mrs. Chanley believe she had the authority to “award” herself a distinction?
 - If Mrs. Chanley believes she has the right to make her own rules, then what "rules" will she create as superintendent, and how will they affect our district?
 - If her stated GPAs are indeed truthful (and I am not suggesting they aren't) then why did she feel the need to add an honor she did not earn and, in fact, could not have earned? Why could she not have allowed the GPAs to speak for themselves? (And why did she not include her GPAs in the other programs she completed?)

▪ If Mrs. Chanley indeed lied, then about what else might she lie? And if she was simply mistaken, then it appears she "does not know what she does not know." In that case, what reckless actions might she take based on presumptions of knowledge that is, in fact, incorrect?

* It is the latter potential that seems most dangerous. When so many other previous superintendents have rejected a potential plan as a potential money pit, and, more significantly, plainly unsafe, Mrs. Chanley again proves not to know what she does not know. Her arrogance is baffling, and the inclusion of the term "Summa cum laude" on her resume is much more than a minor error.

We are aware of an e-mail from an anonymous parent that was sent to the Board of Education in Monroe Township and to the State Department of Education alleging harassment on the part of our Superintendent, Mrs. Chari Chanley and our Board of Education President, Mrs. Chrissy Skurbe.

Specific to allegations pertaining to Mrs. Chanley, Mrs. Dinsmore and I would like to attest to the fact that we requested a meeting with the state PTA and our officers and scheduled that meeting for Friday, December 2nd at 2 p.m. at Applegarth School. We had been navigating a difficult relationship between our existing PTA officers and some vocal parents since the end of the 2021-2022 school year. At the meeting, we were hoping to encourage our officers to allow the vocal parent group to chair an activity during the school year so they felt more included. This meeting included Lisa Falco and Sharon Roseboro from the state PTA, Mrs. Dinsmore, Mrs. Graziano, Melissa Storey (PTA President), Christine Lester (3rd VP), Jenan Grant (Secretary) and Aimee Benner (2nd VP).

Coincidentally, Mrs. Chanley reached out via telephone a day or two before the December 2nd meeting was to occur, urging us to encourage greater diversity in our PTA, as the vocal parents were contacting her with concerns about a lack of inclusivity. Mrs. Chanley encouraged us to speak up for such inclusivity when she found out about the December 2nd meeting and cautioned that the vocal parents were concerned about racism on the PTA.

As principals, we are unaware of any acts of harassment or bullying on Mrs. Chanley's part, and though she was copied on numerous e-mails from a vocal parent

group and our PTA officers prior to the meeting, we have no knowledge of any direct interactions between Mrs. Chanley and our PTA executive board members.

During the course of that meeting, Mrs. Storey announced her intention to resign (she was not forced out) and we later found out that Mrs. Goyal, Mrs. Lester, and Mrs. Grant would be tendering resignations as well. Three of the officers will remain in their positions. Mrs. Dinsmore reached out to the state PTA on our behalf, and we were told new elections would be held at a scheduled January 10th meeting.

I have not received any acknowledgement to my earlier email, but nevertheless feel it is necessary to follow up with additional information.

I have included Ms. Graziano on this email because she was left off previously but is aware of the situation that has transpired with the Oaktree-Applegarth PTA.

Ms. Dinsmore and Ms. Graziano were made aware of the harassment and hostility that our parents were being subjected too, well before the four PTA officers were forced to step down. As concerned parents, we would like to know if it was discussed with the administration and board or just disregarded. Was an investigation completed?

When our four PTA officers resigned on Friday, their resignation letters were sent to Ms. Dinsmore and Ms. Graziano. It is unclear if these letters have been shared with the board or administration. As concerned parents, we need reassurance that the serious allegations of harassment and hostility, including Ms. Skurbe's verbal assault on a parent in front of her child on school grounds will be investigated. Furthermore, we need to understand what assurances are in place to make sure parents and any child who have been subjected to these events feel safe on school grounds.

Let this be a wake-up call to take action to protect our parents and children. If the school district is not going to investigate, then we believe that the State Department of Education must get involved.
