Dear Person Responsible for Conducting Remediation:

The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is writing to remind you that as the person remediating Public Works Water Treatment Pla, you have certain obligations under the Site Remediation Reform Act (SRRA), enacted on May 7, 2009. In accordance with SRRA, DEP has issued temporary licenses to qualified environmental consultants, known as licensed site remediation professionals (LSRP), who will ensure that contaminated sites are remediated in accordance with the Technical Requirements for Site Remediation, N.J.A.C. 7:26E and related DEP guidance. Your obligations regarding use of an LSRP for remediation and other major obligations that SRRA imposes are included in the attached document.

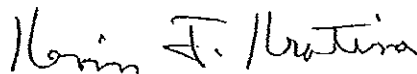
Once you retain an LSRP, the DEP will assist you and the LSRP in completing the remediation in accordance with the DEP rules and guidance.

The DEP strongly encourages you to hire an LSRP as soon as possible. Please be advised that due to the number of cases currently in the Site Remediation Program, and the fact that existing staff are being reassigned to implement the new LSRP program, submittals already received by DEP or received between now and May 7, 2012 may not be reviewed and approved before May 7, 2012. With few, specific exceptions, as of May 7, 2012, the DEP will no longer conduct any traditional case oversight activities or issue No Further Action (NFA) letters. Instead, you will be required to hire an LSRP to conduct the remediation and issue a Response Action Outcome (RAO) upon completion. Also, note that as of May 7, 2012, traditional oversight costs will be replaced by annual fees, the first of which is due in June 2012.

List of obligations regarding use of LSRP and other major obligations from SRRA

- Responsible parties have an explicit affirmative obligation to remediate all discharges of hazardous substances.
- If you have not continuously conducted the remediation at your site since discovery of the discharge or other event that triggered the remediation requirement, you are currently out of compliance with SRRA and related regulations and are required to immediately comply by hiring an LSRP now.
- If you have been continuously conducting remediation but you do not complete the cleanup by May 7, 2012 you are required to hire an LSRP to conduct any remaining remediation that continues after May 7, 2012.
- You must comply with the regulatory and mandatory time frames established in the Technical Requirements for Site Remediation (N.J.A.C. 7:26E) and the Administrative Requirements for the Remediation of Contaminated Sites (N.J.A.C. 7:26C), respectively. The requirement to comply with these timeframes applies to all responsible parties, regardless of when you hire an LSRP.
- If your remedial action workplan submitted after November 4, 2009 calls for engineering or institutional controls, you must apply for a Remedial Action permit. For cases with such controls already in place, you will need to apply for a Remedial Action permit at the time of the next biennial certification.
