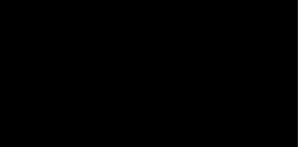


"Franklinite: did the work, doesn't get the credit."

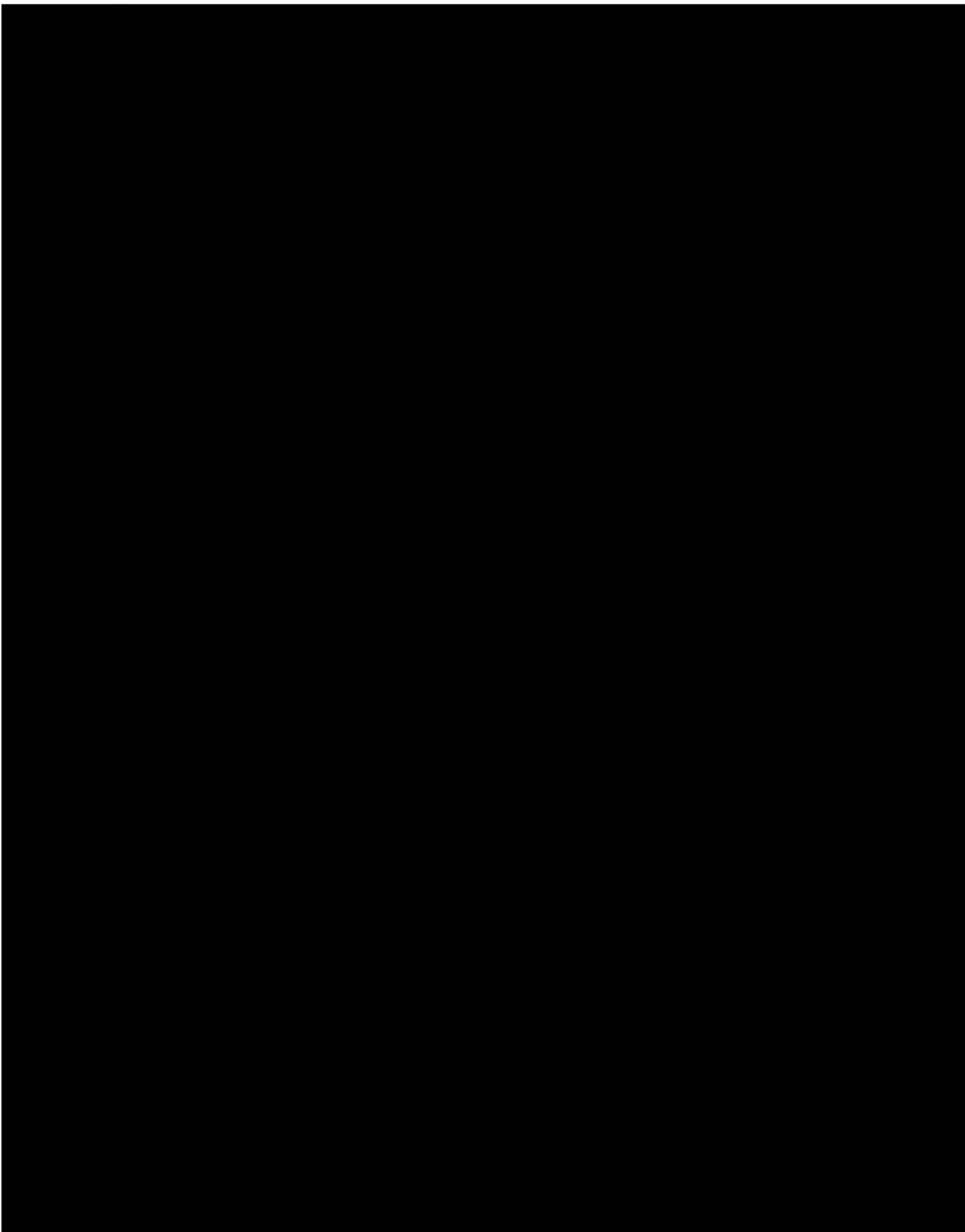
