Your request for access to public records pursuant to the Open Public Records Act, N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1.1, et seq., was received by the Custodian of Records of the Borough of Lavallette via email on Wednesday, May 27, 2020. Due to the COVID 19 Pandemic the NJ Governor has extended the seven (7) business day response deadline to twenty-one (21) business days which would be Thursday, June 25, 2020.

Your request was for:

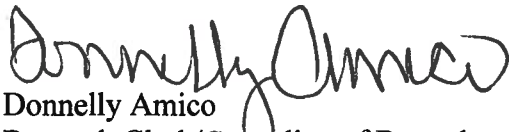
1. A list of all lawsuits and cases in which any officer of the police department was involved between 2012 and 2019. For each lawsuit/case, please provide the date (month and year) of the alleged incident at issue, whether the alleged incident was excessive force, settlement amount (if any), and final compensation amount ruled (if any).
2. Please provide copies of the complaint in any lawsuits and cases described in above.

After diligent inquiry, the Custodian of Records of the Authority makes the following response to these requests.

Due to this records request time frame of years, potentially having a voluminous amount of records, as well as our insurance company also needing to check their data bases and provide us some of these records, if necessary, the Borough of Lavallette Custodian of Records is requesting an extension of time to Friday, July 3, 2020.

If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within the days required by law, you have a right to challenge the decision by the Borough of Lavallette to deny access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC) by completing the Denial of Access Complaint Form. You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511, by

mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625, by e-mail at [grc@dca.state.nj.us](mailto:grc@dca.state.nj.us), or at their web site at [www.state.nj.us/grc](http://www.state.nj.us/grc). The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.
