Evesham Township received your Open Public Records Act (OPRA) request on **January 19, 2019**. The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.

Upon arrival I spoke to Lost Prevention employee/caller, Kevin Schaeffer, who stated clerk, Nicole Arellano, found a brown Coach Wallet at a cash register. Schaeffer reported he located the NJ Photo Drivers License and made an announcement over the PA for the owner, Rebecca Cristoforo, who apparently already left the store.

Upon speaking to Schaeffer I responded to headquarters and contacted Cristoforo, who did not realize she was missing her wallet. Sunday March 13, 2011

On the above date I was dispatched to Walmart, located at 150 Ert. 70, for a past tense shoplifting. Upon arrival of patrol I met with loss prevention officer, Kevin Schaeffer. He reported that he observed two white juvenile males, later identified as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] remove an unknown number of packages of condoms from the store shelf and hide them on their persons. Schaeffer followed the two from the store and observed them get into a Mercedes Benz with NJ registration, [REDACTED] which was being operated by a white female. The vehicle then exited the store parking lot onto N. Locust Avenue.

I reviewed the video with Schaeffer and observed one of the males, who was wearing a gray sweat jacket, take something from a shelf and place it in his jacket pocket. The video also depicted another male, who was wearing a blue and red jacket, as well as a black hat, take an item from a shelf and place it in his jacket pocket. Schaeffer stated that he had been following the two around the store and knew that the items taken were condoms. Schaeffer provided me with printouts of still photographs, depicting the two subject, which I have included with this report.

I checked the provided vehicle registration through AEGIS and found the vehicle to belong to Matthew Titus, Sr. of [REDACTED]. I proceeded to that address and observed that the vehicle was on location. I made contact with Mr. Titus and advised him of the complaint. He called his son in from the other room and confronted him about the matter. [REDACTED] stated that he was trying to show off for his friend and left the store with two boxes of condoms. He further stated that [REDACTED] initially put a package in his pocket but after being too nervous to leave the store, gave [REDACTED] the box, which he then returned to [REDACTED] after the two got outside. They then left the scene in the described vehicle, which was being operated by [REDACTED] older sister, Leah. I spoke with Leah and she claimed to have no knowledge of the boy's activities while they were in the store. [REDACTED] turned over to me a 3-pack of Lifestyles brand condoms, later found to

be valued at \$1.88. He then provided me with [REDACTED] contact information and stated that he would be in possession of the other package of condoms.

I then proceeded to [REDACTED] residence at [REDACTED] where I met with him and his mother, Gina Bryce. Prior to my arrival [REDACTED] had called [REDACTED] in order to get his address for me and made him aware that I was en route to his home. Bryce stated to me that before I arrived her son had told her what happened and [REDACTED] confirmed that he did not leave the store with merchandise but received the package of condoms from [REDACTED] once the two were outside. [REDACTED] turned over to me a 3-pack of Trojan ENZ condoms, later found to be valued at \$1.84.

I then went back to Walmart and turned the items over to LPO Schaeffer, who stated that the store will not be cooperating with the prosecution of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] due to their status as juveniles, as well as the low dollar amount of the theft.

This case is closed pending any future action by the victim.

At 5:02 PM, I was dispatched to 150 Rt 70 E (Walmart) for a suspicious person complaint. When I arrived, I met with Kevin Schaffer (Loss Prevention Officer), who stated that an unknown male in a white unknown truck (red 2008 Trailer ([REDACTED])) told five juvenile males that he would pay them to get into his vehicle.

I then met with witnesses Adrian Lomonico and Tracy Speakman, who were selling items for charity in front of the store. Lomonico advised me that the suspect had made contact with him first and stated that he would pay him cash to help remove items from a local residence. When Lomonico advised the suspect that he could not leave the store, the suspect pulled up to a group of five juvenile males, [REDACTED]

These juveniles advised me that the suspect stated that he would pay them to cut grass and that they could put their bicycles in the back of the trailer. One of the juveniles called the suspect a rapist and they all began to scatter. The suspect then allegedly drove up to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] a second time to offer them work before driving away. According to Speakman, it appeared as though the suspect was only driving toward the juveniles a second time in order to get their attention. The juveniles then regrouped and rode their bicycles northbound on N Locust Ave, where they observed the suspect vehicle at an unknown location in the area of Atlanta Dr. All of the juveniles returned to Walmart to report the incident.

Each juvenile advised me that they contacted their parents to inform them of the incident. Two of those parents, Liz Horner and Lisa Giacobbetti, had arrived on location and I spoke with them further about following up the matter. The suspect was described as a dark skinned male around forty or fifty years of age with a thin build and missing a front tooth. The trailer is registered to Sylvia Wasso, but no female was observed inside of the vehicle. I obtained a 411.com listing for Wasso's residence; however, the number appears to be for a fax machine. I then requested that central dispatch (P8) have the Cherry Hill Police respond out to Wasso's residence and have her contact me. The make and model of the white truck that the trailer was

attached to is unknown and no registration was obtained.

No threats have been made and Schaffer was in the process of reviewing the digital footage from Walmart's exterior security cameras. The incident had occurred directly in front of Walmart's front entrance where there was a large number of customers in the area. This case will remain active pending further investigation.

On 3-13-11, at 2:30 PM, I made phone contact with Thomas Mitchell, who is the owner of the trailer seen at Walmart the previous day. Thomas advised me that his father, Lee Mitchell, was in possession of his truck and trailer to move items out of a family member's former residence on N Locust Ave (unknown number). Thomas then gave me his fathers's information and the three of us spoke via three way calling.

Lee had stated that when he arrived at the residence on N Locust Ave, he realized that there was more to move than he originally thought. Lee then decided to drive to Walmart to locate a few people to assist him as temporary day laborers. He first made contact with Adrian Lomonico, who turned him down. Lee then saw the five juveniles, who he thought were around fifteen years of age. After asking the boys to help him, they called him a rapist and then began to yell. To avoid further conflict, Lee drove off and the juveniles chased after him until he got back to the residence. This is where the trailer registration was obtained by the juveniles. Prior to ending my conversation with Lee, I advised him that he should reframe from making contact with unknown juveniles in the future because of the possible implications that could be made against him.

Based on my investigation, there is no indication that Lee attempted to lure the boys into his vehicle for unlawful purposes. Lee first made contact with Lomonico, who is an adult and then contact the juveniles directly in front of Walmart's entrance with dozens of customers walking by. Tracy Speakman (witness) had also advised me that it appeared as though the driver of the suspect vehicle was only trying to get the juvenile's attention. I then placed calls to the parents of all five juveniles. Contact was made with Lisa Pleskonko,

I contacted [REDACTED]'s mother, Lana, by phone and advised her of the situation. She stated that she did not know Schaeffer and requested that I bring her son home. I transported [REDACTED] to his residence and released him into the custody of his mother. Ptl. Libetti transported Schaeffer to his home at [REDACTED] Rd. [REDACTED] was not charged with a violation of curfew. There were no other problems on location.
