Governor Phil Murphy announced the launch of the [New Jersey COVID-19 Information Hub](#), a new, visitor-friendly website available at covid19.nj.gov.

The New Jersey COVID-19 Information Hub provides New Jerseyans with the most up-to-date information about COVID-19 and the State's response, including information about services such as food assistance and small business assistance.

The New Jersey COVID-19 Information Hub includes a COVID-19 Symptom Checker, so New Jerseyans can receive tailored advice depending on their

symptoms, including information about testing. It will also increase the State's ability to analyze the spread of COVID-19.

The New Jersey COVID-19 Information Hub is accessible via mobile phone and for those with disabilities. All the content is easily searchable via Google and other search engines so the information can be found widely and consistently.

Stay at Home Order & Closure of Businesses

Governor Murphy signed an executive order implementing a "stay at home" order throughout New Jersey. Under this order, all residents are to stay at home or at their place of residence unless they are leaving for the following reasons:

- Obtaining goods or services from essential retail businesses;
- Obtaining takeout or food beverages from restaurants;
- Seeking medical attention, essential social services, or assistance from law enforcement;
- Visiting family or close friends, caretakers, or romantic partners;
- Reporting to or performing their job;
- Walking, running, or engaging in outdoor activities with immediate family, caretakers, household members, or romantic partners;
- Leaving for an educational, religious, or political reason;
- Leaving because of a reasonable fear for health or safety; or
- Leaving at the direction of law enforcement or other government agency.

Governor Murphy's executive order further directs the closure of all non-essential retail businesses to the public, with the exceptions of:

- Grocery stores, farmer's markets and farms that sell directly to customers, and other food stores, including retailers that offer a varied assortment of foods comparable to what exists at a grocery store;
- Pharmacies and medical marijuana dispensaries;
- Medical supply stores;
- Gas stations;
- Convenience stores;
- Ancillary stores within healthcare facilities;
- Hardware and home improvement stores;
- Banks and other financial institutions;
- Laundromats and dry-cleaning services;
- Stores that principally sell supplies for children under five years;

Pet stores;

- Liquor stores;
- Car dealerships, but only for auto maintenance and repair, and auto mechanics;
- Printing and office supply shops;
- Mail and delivery stores.

Red Cross Blood Shortage



The American Red Cross is working to continue delivering its mission, including the collection of lifesaving blood, but they have had a staggering number of scheduled Red Cross blood drives cancelled as more workplaces, college campuses and other venues send people home and encourage social distancing. Disruptions to blood donations can lead to shortages and cause delays in essential medical care.

Latest Updates

Public Health

As of today, we had 935 new positive COVID-19 cases, bringing our total to 2,844. A total county breakdown can be found at the [COVID-19 dashboard](#).

Governor Phil Murphy announced the opening of a COVID-19 Community-Based Testing Site at Bergen Community College in Paramus. The drive-thru testing center will be open seven days per week, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. In order to be eligible for testing, individuals must be current New Jersey residents and experiencing symptoms of respiratory illness. Priority will be given to symptomatic individuals experiencing cough, fever (99.6F or above) and shortness of breath.

The Murphy Administration required hospitals and Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) to [waive patient fees](#) for testing and related diagnostic services for those who lack health insurance.

Consumer Information

The US Department of Education announced that all borrowers with federally held student loans will automatically [have their interest rates set to 0%](#) for a period of at least 60 days. In addition, each of these borrowers will have the option to suspend their payments for at least two months to allow them greater flexibility during the national emergency.

The Governor imposed a moratorium on removing individuals from their homes pursuant to an eviction or foreclosure proceeding. Evictions and foreclosure filings can still take place (but cannot be executed until the moratorium is lifted), so residents are advised to still pay what they can. If you foresee any problems with paying, contact our office so that we can forward you to the appropriate resources.

All public utilities and regulated entities shall immediately cease any in-home or business visits unless there is an immediate risk to health and safety.

The IRS [extended the 2020 federal tax filing deadline](#) to July 15.

The Department of Banking and Insurance launched a [COVID-19 website](#), including a [health insurance FAQ page](#) with information on health insurance.

Business Information

The U.S. Small Business Administration opened up access to the SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loan program to New Jersey businesses hit hard by the COVID-19 pandemic. Click [here](#) for more details regarding the SBA loan program.

All door-to-door sales activity by third-party suppliers or other sales persons selling energy or energy related products (for example: residential solar, community solar, or energy efficiency offerings) are to be suspended immediately

Broadband internet providers may continue to connect new customers or repair existing service for homes with school age children, those who need internet access to meet job requirements, or other priority customers, as defined by each company, provided that such visits should only be done as a last resort after utilizing hotspots, self-install kits, and like measures to minimize in-home visits.

Public Services

The US Department of Education announced that it will [waive standardized test requirements](#) for states affected by the virus. States must apply for the exemption.

Governor Murphy announced the [mandatory closure of all state, county and municipal libraries](#). The order also includes all libraries and computer labs at private and public colleges and universities.

NJ TRANSIT is now running special weekday service. The North Jersey Coast

Legislative Action

On Saturday, the following bills from the Legislature addressing the COVID-19 pandemic were signed into law:

[A-3095/S-1982](#) – Provides county clerks with additional week to mail ballots for 2020 primary election; requires ballot position draw to occur one day early if statutory date falls on holiday

[A-3840/S-2281](#) – Requires school districts to provide school meals or meal vouchers to students eligible for free and reduced price school meals during school closures due to COVID-19 epidemic

[A-3843/S-2283](#) – Requires health insurance and Medicaid coverage for testing of coronavirus disease 2019 and for telemedicine and telehealth during coronavirus disease 2019 state of emergency

[A-3849/S-2302](#) – Modifies deadline by which public agency is required to respond to request for government record during period of emergency

[A-3850/S-2294](#) – Allows public bodies to conduct meetings, and provide notice, by electronic means during periods of emergency

[A-3851/S-2295](#) – Permits extension of deadlines for adoption of county and municipal budgets under certain circumstances

[A-3854/S-2286](#) – Authorizes all licensed health care facilities and laboratories to collect specimens to test for coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19); allows waiver of staffing ratio requirements

[A-3855/S-2287](#) – Requires food access information be displayed on websites of 2-1-1 system and executive branch departments during public health

emergencies to the extent practicable

[A-3861/S-2290](#) – Permits corporations to hold shareholders' meetings in part or solely by means of remote communication during state of emergency

[A-3865/S-2291](#) – Limits return of items purchased from retail food stores under certain circumstances

[AJR-158/SJR-77](#) – Urges FCC to take temporary measures to secure broadband access for those affected by COVID-19

Hi Vito - In response to your email from May 7th, i sent the below to the Governor's office this morning. I have been advised that they will respond to these publicly no later than Friday. #6 on my list is your concern. Thank you, Vin

I am a follower and believer in medicine, science, research and data. I hope the Governor and State of NJ will look to open up the following areas this week.

If they have some data or research to suggest otherwise, I hope they will release that.

1) Appointment only car dealers

- This is allowed in New York with proper social distancing and cleaning precautions. NY dealers are now doing digital ads targeting NJ customers. My research indicates that 800 cars alone were sold in NY from NJ residents this past Friday. Time to allow this in NJ.

2) Elective Surgeries

- I have spoken to residents in incredible pain. Physicians should decide what procedures should take place and the physicians I have spoken to are pushing for elective surgeries. As hospitalization rates continue to go down, lets let physicians decision what surgeries are necessary and what aren't. NJ should allow this.

3) Clarity on dental offices

- Dental offices are considered essential but it is important to provide clarity as far as what is allowed and what isn't. Guidelines and do's and don'ts should be publicized as soon as possible.

4) Tennis Clubs & Beach clubs

- They are trying to plan for summer. How can public tennis clubs at parks be open but not private ones? We need to allow both to begin planning for Memorial Day weekend, as long as all social distance guidelines take place. Guidelines and timelines should be publicized as soon as possible.

5) Expanding construction

- If this can be done responsibly and with social distancing, it should be allowed.

6) Even the playing field

- You can go to a Walmart and buy a TV but can't go to a local electronic store buy one. The state needs to even the playing field by allowing non-essential retail to do curbside. Our mom and pops are going to get killed while corporations are coming out big. The state should put our clear and responsible social distancing guidelines for this.

7) Allowing pharmacies to test responsibly.

- 48 other states currently allow this. While we speak of expanding testing, we need to allow independent pharmacies to test. They already do flu shots and so much more.

Thank you for your email dated September 11, 2019. Kindly advise if Neptune is willing to buy the property and waive the financing contingencies in the Contract. If so, we are willing to sell the property to Neptune. If not, please advise immediately, so we can put the property back on the market.

As we both are aware, the Green Acre "powers that be" were aware of the remediation plan at all steps in the process and tacitly approved it. One must come to the conclusion at this point-in-time that either (1) the state

never intended to approve the project, (2) changed their mind about approving the project or (3) wishes to prolong the approval. We do not conjecture as to their reasons, but I'm sure that you, being in government for many years, can surmise what they may be. As such, we believe that there has been a failure of good faith and fair dealing by Green Acres. We believe Neptune's motives have been upright.

The matter of additional surface testing at the site is still on the table. They are looking at the need to take 7 or 8 surface samples every 30' along the northerly perimeter of the remediated area. They stated the samples provided were taken nearly 60' away from the remediated area. This additional testing is required to determine compliance. NJDEP and Green Acres will not sign off on the funds until this additional testing is completed. As I stated in an earlier email, Township is willing to pay the cost of the additional testing as necessary. I would just need a proposal for that work. Vito,

Very pleased to meet you. By way of background, I am a real estate and municipal attorney, who in my day-to-day profession as a lawyer, encountered numerous municipalities with abandoned property problems.

Specifically, most towns' code enforcement is very effective at eliminating property code violations through the municipal court, and most towns' local ordinances now fully address and register absentee landlords and vacant properties. However, there are a handful of eye-sore properties remaining in every town that are both vacant and for which no owner or responsible party can be located to appear in municipal court or register under ordinances in the first place.

For these properties, the only remaining remedy is the Abandoned Property Rehabilitation Act (the "Act"), whereunder the municipality is authorized to take court-based enforcement actions, but only to the extent the municipality is willing to fund rehabilitations of these problem properties itself, or designate a third-party Qualified Rehabilitation Entity (QRE) to undertake the enforcement action and fund the rehabilitations in return for a lien on the rehabilitated property.

That's where Vin has introduced you to me. Given my experiences in this arena as a lawyer, I have formed a QRE, Ascend Neighborhood Renewal, LLC, with two of my colleagues in the construction industry – namely, Justin DeLeo and Anthony Castro of Top Shelf Electric Corporation in Iselin, NJ. In short, enforcing the Act requires both legal and construction expertise to bring enforcement actions as a QRE, and I have assembled that team from my experiences and network.

In this process, we do not request any contribution from the municipality beyond allowing us access to your code enforcement official's time and attention to draft and file court paperwork, inspect the subject properties on regular intervals, and act as our expert witness to execute enforcement actions in court under the Act. Our QRE is ultimately compensated through the enforcement actions themselves by court-authorized liens placed upon the abandoned property, plus statutory fees charged back to the absentee owner(s) on the lien.

As you can likely infer from the foregoing summary, there are a lot more details to the Act and QRE process, unique market considerations for every property, as well as ancillary benefits to your Tax Collector in that a property being deemed "abandoned" under the Act simultaneously cancels all waiting periods on tax sale certificates under the Tax Sale Law – another way to potentially churn your town's "eyesore market" without spending any money as a municipality.

If this is something you believe can help Neptune Township, I would welcome the opportunity to more fully discuss the Act and QRE process with you at your convenience. Please let know what works best for you.

NJDOT Commitment to Communities Initiative provides grant assistance as application period for FY19 Municipal Aid program now open

**Bikeway, Safe Routes to School and Transit Village grant
applications
also being accepted**

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) Commissioner Diane Gutierrez-Scaccetti today announced applications are now being accepted for several of NJDOT’s Fiscal Year 2019 State Aid programs, with increased assistance and information sharing as part of the Department’s Commitment to Communities Initiative. The initiative is designed to ensure local governments succeed in delivering transportation projects that improve the quality of life for those traveling in and through New Jersey.

The most significant grant program taking applications is the \$151 million

Municipal Aid program. In addition, grant applications are being accepted for **Bikeways, Safe Routes To School, and Transit Villages**. Each of those three program has \$1 million available in funding. Municipalities may submit grant applications for any of these four programs beginning on July 24 through October 8, 2018.

The Transportation Trust Fund (TTF) reauthorization in 2016 increased funding for Local Aid programs to counties and municipalities from \$190 million per year to \$430 million. The steep increase is because the majority of New Jersey's roadway mileage—about 90 percent—is under local government jurisdiction and is in as much need of repair as the state roadway network.

Commissioner Scaccetti recently announced NJDOT's Commitment to Communities initiative that creates new programs and combines existing Departmental efforts to assist local governments spend the significantly increased level of aid that the reauthorized Trust Fund law affords them. The Commitment to Communities initiative provides one-stop shopping for local government managers by providing hands-on resources for the application process, raising awareness of grant cycles and proactively communicating pertinent information.

"As Commissioner of Transportation, I am committed to maintaining and improving New Jersey's local transportation infrastructure by providing financial assistance, technical expertise and training in the application process for local transportation initiatives as part of NJDOT's Commitment to Communities Initiative," Commissioner Scaccetti said. "These programs allow our counties and municipalities to be well positioned to design and construct important local projects without the need to impact property taxes. The success of local governments in building projects and spending the additional funding will improve the quality of life not only for local residents, but for the entire state."

The following is a brief description of each grant program:

- **Municipal Aid** - This \$151 million program has been a significant resource in funding local transportation projects. All municipalities are eligible. The Department continues to encourage municipalities to consider using the Municipal Aid Program to fund projects that support walking and biking in their communities especially now that additional funds are available. NJDOT has set a goal to award up to 10 percent of the Municipal Aid Program funds to projects such as pedestrian safety improvements, bikeways and streetscapes.
- **Bikeways** - This \$1 million program is intended to fund bicycle projects which create new Bike Path Mileage. It is available to all counties and municipalities. The Department continues to work toward the goal of achieving 1,000 miles of dedicated bikeways in New Jersey. Special consideration will be given to bikeways that are physically separated from motorized vehicular traffic by an open space or barrier, but on-road bike

lanes and other bike routes and facilities are also eligible for funding.

- **Safe Streets to Transit** - The intent of this \$1 million program is to encourage counties and municipalities to construct safe and accessible pedestrian linkages to transit facilities, in order to promote increased usage of transit by all segments of the population.
- **Transit Village** – This \$1 million program will award grants or traditional and non-traditional transportation projects that enhance walking, biking and/or transit ridership within a half mile of the transit facility. Only New Jersey municipalities that have been designated as Transit Villages by the Commissioner of Transportation and the inter-agency Transit Village Task Force are eligible to apply. Municipalities are encouraged to submit applications for these Local Aid programs. Each of these four programs are evaluated independently, affording local governments the opportunity to receive funding from more than one grant program. Governor Murphy and Superintendent Callahan Announce Clarifications to List of Essential Businesses Permitted to Operate

Governor Phil Murphy and Superintendent of the State Police Colonel Patrick Callahan today announced an Administrative Order clarifying which businesses are permitted to operate and ways in which certain businesses may operate in accordance with Executive Order 107. The Administrative Order states the following:

- 1) Pet grooming businesses, pet daycare, and pet boarding businesses and 2) stores that principally sell items necessary for religious observation or worship shall be considered essential retail businesses.
- Car dealerships may permit customers that have ordered and/or purchased a vehicle online or by phone to test drive the vehicle at the time of pick-up or prior to delivery, provided the dealership adopts social distancing policies, the individual is given access to the vehicle alone, and the dealership appropriately cleans and sanitizes the vehicle after such test drive if the customer does not purchase the vehicle.
- Licensees, owners, operators, employees, or independent contractors of personal care services facilities are not permitted to provide personal care services in their own homes, the homes of others, or in any facility or business setting unless the individual personal care service provider is providing the service to their household members, immediate family or other individuals with whom the personal care service provider has a close personal relationship, such as those for whom the personal care service provider is a caretaker or romantic partner. A prior business relationship alone does not qualify as a close personal relationship.

“As long as my stay-at-home order remains in effect, we’ll continue to provide New Jerseyans and our business community at-large with as much clarity as possible for any and all restrictions we’ve put in place,” **said Governor Murphy**. “I thank everyone for doing their part to stay at home and maintain social distancing, which is the single most important thing we can do to beat this virus.”

“We understand the challenges businesses face in these unprecedented times and the need to keep the economy operating,” **said Colonel Patrick Callahan, Superintendent of the New Jersey State Police**. “These clarifications address the way certain businesses are permitted to operate, while adhering to the stay-at-home order and social distancing guidelines.”

The Order will take effect immediately.

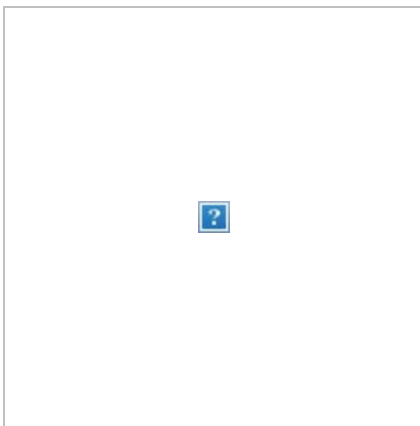

A couple of weeks ago you and I discussed some of the issues with short term rental housing. I mentioned that NYC and the state had gone after VRBO/HomeAway, AirBnB and other rental sites. Here is some of the details

The law that NYC tried to pass required AirBnB, the company, to provide the actual listing rental info on a monthly basis for all rental units so the City could properly manage the process. It was originally rejected by a judge but according to the article above, the data will probably be shared so that market can be better regulated.

What NYC tried to do was to limit people using their apartments and homes as de facto hotels. This was creating a housing shortage and gave some entrepreneurial people an opportunity to rent their rent stabilized units to tourists.

This has been happening in AP and Ocean Grove. We have seen a decrease in the availability of full time rentals in Ocean Grove and it makes the area unaffordable for residents. Rental housing is practically non existent and speculators are buying many properties to rent out for income. This does affect the quality of life for many residents as these homes sit vacant in the winter. If this continues, our businesses who rely on serving guests and residents, will close.

AP passed an ordinance to limit such rentals to homeowners who had a room or a additional unit. This was challenged but was affirmed by a NJ court.

Ocean Grove currently has more than 107 of such rentals, and home prices have skyrocketed. While some full time residents are renting out rooms in their homes, the majority of the rentals are short term; between 2 and 7 days and have all but eliminated rental housing stock. They are, in essence, de facto hotels that compete with our Bed and Breakfasts.

We have strict ordinances for Bed and Breakfasts but not for AirBnB. (I am seeking to change that with new ordinances). Almost all Ocean Grove B&Bs are required to be located within the first 2 beach blocks. They all must have mercantile licenses, are inspected each year at the beginning of the season, must provide on request, a list of all guests, and have someone on staff, day and night. The B&Bs all pay both property tax and income tax. We almost never get resident complaints about the B&Bs.

We have tried to duplicate the process with the AirBnBs but they are not the same. There is no or little on premise oversight. While the AirBnB owners do pay property tax, unlike the

B&Bs, they do not pay income tax making it a very unfair playing field.

The B&Bs are a significant element of historic Ocean Grove's character and charm but a number have gone out of business in recent years as the competition from AirBnB has increased.

Recently Neptune acquired a system that tells our Code department where the AirBnBs and other short term rentals are but not when they are rented or when there is a changeover. We do go after the owners to get a mercantile license and they have to have inspection on every 4 th guest changeover but that is difficult to manage when we don't know who is coming in and for how long. And the owners don't tell us. Further, we don't have enough inspectors for the number of AirBnBs.

More troubling is that the AirBnB's do not have the owners nearby. Some live in other states. Thus when neighboring residents have problems with unruly and noisy guests, they call the police department creating a higher cost to the Township.

Furthermore, because most guests leave a day or two before garbage pickup, the garbage tends to get out of the pails and onto the streets.

The other problem is parking. It was hard enough to find a parking spot before AirBnB, now it's almost impossible. A 3 bedroom home can have as many as 10 people and 3 cars. This has further deteriorated the quality of life for residents. And residents are complaining!

Now some of these things, we can remediate with ordinances, though there is much resistance from the short term rental market. We could do as Asbury as done, restrict short term rentals to no less than 7 days and the owners must reside full time in Ocean Grove or within some reasonable distance (10 miles)

But the reality is that these short term rentals are driving up our costs, and negatively impacting the quality of life for our full time residents.

We do need more regulation from the state to make it so these short term hotels work on an equal footing with motels and BnBs and does not eliminate our reasonable priced rental housing.

Please let me know your thoughts and how we can maintain our beautiful resort town with its historic Bed and Breakfasts.

This process resulted in [548 awards to 543 municipalities, totaling \\$161.25 million](#). The 2016 Transportation Trust Fund renewal has made it possible to continue to award \$161.25 million annually – more than double the \$78.75 million that was available before the TTF renewal. In addition, the extra funds have allowed the Department to increase the number of municipalities receiving grants from about 370 a year prior to the TTF renewal to 543 municipalities this year.

When my husband and I purchased our townhome Sunsets was a mom & pop seasonal restaurant and Headliner was a Jersey shore bar. In the past few years Sunset has sold and is now an obnoxious bar/night club. Following hurricane Sandy, Headliner upgraded their outdoor space by adding a swimming pool, extravagant sound system and oversized bars.

For YEARS since these changes have taken place at Sunsets & Headliner, the residents of Seaview Island have been complaining of the late night noise spilling into the early morning hours, very loud DJ's, Salsa parties and music. We have made hundreds of phone complaints to the NTPD with zero resolution. As a matter of fact, there has been no summons or fines issued to either establishments! We have made resident complaints to your court system and was heard by your Judge in 2019 when Headliner was given a warning. As a homeowners association we sat in Mr. Gadaleta's office with our complaints and again NOTHING has been done! Recently my husband Jim DeGilio reached out to you via email and telephone. You assured him there was going to be a special meeting in October and new restrictions would be applied to both Sunsets & Headliner, yet this has not happened.

This past Saturday night I called the NTPD at 10pm with a noise complaint and then again after midnight. During my second phone call the dispatcher told me he had 3 other noise complaint phone calls on hold and the police were addressing these complaints.

Here we are YEARS have passed, HUNDREDS of complaints have been logged and ZERO has been done to resolve this excruciating problem!

Since you refuse to do your job, the residents of Seaview Island, Compass Pointe Homeowners Association are now choosing to take our complaint to the State Senator and members of the assembly in Monmouth County's district 11, Senator Vin Gopal, Assemblywoman Joann Downey & Assemblyman Eric Houghtaling, and of course Governor Phil Murphy.

We have gone way too long with out sleep and the ability to sit in our backyards and enjoy a beautiful summer night or open our windows on a breezy spring night!!! We question who's "pocket" Sunsets & Headliner are lining, whether through hefty donations or election support. We will be fighting as long and as loud as needed!!!

Attorney General Grewal Announces Measures to Increase Number of Special Law Enforcement Officers (SLEOs) Available to Shore Resorts This Summer

TRENTON – As Shore resorts seek to augment their police forces with special officers for the busy summer season, Attorney General Gurbir S. Grewal today issued guidance to law enforcement on a new expedited process that will allow special law enforcement officers who work in New Jersey's schools to be re-designated to perform general law enforcement duties as seasonal law enforcement officers in other municipalities.

The guidance is designed to help municipalities address law enforcement staffing issues caused by COVID-19, especially in those municipalities that see an influx of visitors during the summer months. This action is the latest step taken by Attorney General Grewal and the Police Training Commission (PTC), which establishes statewide standards for police officers, to ease the burden on local law enforcement agencies during the pandemic.

"We knew law enforcement resources would be stretched to the limit by this pandemic, not only because of officers being ill or quarantined, but because of the many new responsibilities imposed by this unprecedented emergency," said Attorney General Grewal. "Nonetheless, police across New Jersey have worked together, as they always do, to meet the challenges, and we are doing all that we can do at the state level to support their heroic efforts. I'm confident that the measures we have announced to address manpower issues – along with the recent re-opening of the police academies – will give our Shore communities the officers they need to ensure a safe and family-friendly summer season."

State law allows municipalities to hire "special law enforcement officers" (SLEO), who can perform certain functions for a police department but lack the full authorities of a typical law enforcement officer. The law establishes three categories: SLEO I officers, who handle routine traffic details, spectator control, and similar duties; SLEO II officers, who have full arrest authority but generally work on a part-time or seasonal basis; and SLEO III officers, who provide security at schools.

Generally speaking, law enforcement agencies must obtain approval from the PTC to transfer an officer from one category of SLEO to another. Earlier this year, the PTC created a program to streamline the transfer process, so long as the SLEO remained working in the same town. Today's guidance now makes it easier for SLEOs to transfer between municipalities as well, making it easier to deploy officers to the communities that need them most.

On March 16, AG Grewal issued guidance to law enforcement that encouraged the use of mutual aid agreements and SLEO IIs to address

officer shortages caused by the pandemic. With that guidance, the Attorney General and PTC announced an expedited process through which a municipality or county could re-designate a SLEO III as a SLEO II, while retaining that officer in its employment.

The new guidance and process announced today adds a new dimension by allowing SLEO IIIs who are not working while schools are closed to change employers and serve as SLEO IIs in a different municipality or county, enabling Shore towns to recruit such officers from other parts of the state.

On April 6, AG Grewal announced additional measures to address police manpower issues caused by the COVID emergency, including steps to facilitate the hiring of retired officers as SLEO IIs.

Over the past two months, the PTC has re-designated over two hundred SLEO IIIs as SLEO IIs, and these officers have been supporting law enforcement operations throughout the state. However, there remain an estimated 200 SLEO IIIs who have not been converted by their employing agencies into SLEO IIs. The guidance issued by Attorney General Grewal today highlights that those remaining SLEO IIIs represent a significant pool of potential hires for Shore resorts, as do the many retired officers who can be hired on an expedited basis using the procedures put in place in April.

All police academies in New Jersey closed to on-site recruit training in March due to the pandemic. However, most academies continued to conduct whatever mandatory training could be performed remotely using virtual classrooms. Beginning in the second week of May, the Attorney General and PTC authorized partial re-openings of police academies, as academies submitted plans to guarantee safe and healthy training environments consistent with the guidance of the New Jersey Department of Health, county health agencies, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Senator, here are some of the things the Task Force has been doing statewide. I will send you our Mission Statement and Tax Information under separate cover. We have nearly 200 career and volunteer members spread amongst multiple EMS agencies throughout all 21 counties. The funding will allow the Task Force to

support ongoing statewide support, replenish supplies and purchase needed equipment. Thanks.

1. National Ambulance Contract –providing the Staging Area Management component.

I have been deeply opposed to S4204 which impacts independent contractors, and over the past few days I have been speaking with the Senate leadership about my opposition to this bill. Leadership has been very receptive to the concerns that I and others have raised about this well-intentioned piece of legislation and I believe they are understanding more and more of the unintended consequences of this bill so I am very pleased that Leadership has worked to make changes with the statement they made tonight.

I will continue to review the bill and the changes outlined below, and I look forward to continue speaking with stakeholders to learn more about the impact of the new language in order to take an informed position on the bill when it comes before the Senate but I wanted to provide you with this update.

Below is Senate President Sweeney's statement on the changes he intends to make to the bill.

Senate Will Amend Employee 'Misclassification' Bill That Codifies Existing Regulations

Trenton – A bill that would codify into law existing regulations that protect the rights of workers against misclassification so the regulations can't be ignored or discarded by future administrations will be amended to ensure the ability of independent contractors to continue to pursue their work under existing rules, Senate President Steve Sweeney said today.

"These bills will simply codify into law existing regulations so that future administrations can't ignore, change or discard the protections already in place to protect workers against the loss of basic rights by being misclassified," said Senator Sweeney, the sponsor of the Senate bill. "We want to put into law the current regulations to ensure their future viability. The amendments to the bill will continue to ensure the ability of legitimate independent contractors to pursue their work at the same time they safeguard against misclassification."

The legislation is not the same as the California law.

The bills will not change the way freelance journalists are classified, for example; those who are classified as independent contractors will continue with that designation. The status of freelance journalists will not change.

The bills will continue the practice of using the "ABC" test to classify workers. The three-part test, adopted by the New Jersey Department of Labor & Workforce Development and affirmed by the New Jersey Supreme Court, is already used to determine whether a worker should be classified as an employee or independent contractor.

The amendments to the Senate bill will restore language in the "B" part of the test so that employees working outside the places of the employers' business will continue to qualify as independent contractors. They will also specify that, in meeting the existing "C" part of the test, the service an individual performs must be "of the same nature" of the business or enterprise in which they are normally engaged.

Senator Sweeney said that he is reviewing other requests for modifications to the bill but will maintain the legislation's focus and emphasis on the protection of workers' rights and the prevention of misclassification.

— A3841: Extends time to file gross income tax or corporation business tax return by one month;

— A3843: Requires health insurance and Medicaid coverage for testing and treatment of the coronavirus disease 2019, and for telemedicine during the coronavirus disease 2019 state of emergency;

— A3844: Concerns business interruption insurance during the coronavirus disease 2019 state of emergency;

— A3846: Creates "Temporary Lost Wage Unemployment Program" to allow persons to claim for lost wages due to the coronavirus disease 2019;

— A3847: Provides paid leave without utilizing accumulated leave for local government employees under certain circumstances;

— A3848: Concerns time off from work in connection with infectious disease;

— A3849: Permits public agency to respond to request for government record within 21 calendar days during period of emergency or other exigency;

— A3850: Allows local government agencies to meet electronically during declared Public Health Emergency or State of Emergency;

— A3851: Extends deadlines for adoption of county and municipal budgets under certain circumstances;

— A3852: Allows conduct of state business and legislative sessions at locations other than Trenton during periods of emergency or other exigency, allows conduct of legislative business using electronic means;
— A3855: Requires food access information be displayed on websites of 2-1-1 system and executive branch departments during public health emergencies;
— A3859: Concerns prohibition of residential tenant eviction and eviction due to residential foreclosure during certain emergency circumstances;
— ACR165: Urges DHS to apply for federal waivers to facilitate and increase access to SNAP benefits during the coronavirus disease 2019 outbreak;
— AJR158: Urges FCC to take temporary measures to secure broadband access for those affected by Covid-19.

Human Services

The Department of Human Services sent to county and municipal welfare agencies guidance on enacting cautionary health and safety preventative measures in response to the Coronavirus disease (COVID-19), specifically as it relates to the temporary cessation of certain requirements for the Work First New Jersey (WFNJ) and New Jersey Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (NJ SNAP). The guidance is attached.

Labor

In accordance with Chief Justice Rabner's COVID-19 Notices to the Bar, and in consultation with Workers' Compensation Executive Committee of the NJ Bar Association, Chief Judge of Compensation Russell Wojtenko, Jr. has closed Workers' Compensation courts to the public in a similar fashion as all NJ Municipal Courts and Landlord Tenant Courts.

While those courts are closed for two weeks, operationally it is more efficient and convenient for all attorneys, litigants and court staff to adjourn all WC matters for three weeks as workers' compensation courts routinely operate in three week cycles. A three week adjournment in workers' compensation is a routine and frequent occurrence and will cause a minimal disruption to the WC system if any.

In addition, Emergent Motions for Medical and Temporary benefits will continue without interruption to the extent possible, including the use of telephonic and video technology. Filings will also continue to be accepted electronically through COURTS On-line.

DEP

Department of Environmental Protection Commissioner Catherine R. McCabe announced today that public may still access the State Parks, forests, recreation areas and Wildlife Management Areas, including roads, parking areas, trails, lakes and other open space areas for healthful passive

recreation. However, campgrounds, visitor centers, nature centers, restrooms and similar facilities at state parks, forests, recreation areas, Wildlife Management Areas and historic sites are closed until further notice in order to protect public health and safety as the state works to address COVID-19.

MVC

New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission Chief Administrator Sue Fulton has announced that all New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission agency and road testing facilities will be closed effective immediately as a measure to mitigate the spread of COVID-19. We anticipate re-opening in two weeks, on Monday, March 30, 2020. All driver licenses, non-driver IDs, vehicle registrations, and inspection stickers expiring before May 31 have been extended by two months. Most renewals, replacements, changes of address, and other transactions can be processed online at NJMVC.gov

OAG

Attorney General Gurbir S. Grewal announced today that, in an effort to protect the public by limiting in-person contact that could result in the spread of COVID-19, multiple divisions within Department of Law and Public Safety are extending by at least 30 days the deadlines for renewing or resubmitting certain licenses. ABC is extending by 30 days any Minor Employment Permits set to expire in March. DCA houses 51 professional licensure boards, which collectively oversee approximately 720,000 active licensed professionals. The licenses issued by those boards have staggered renewal dates. The licensure actions announced today by Attorney General Grewal pertain only to licenses issued by the professional boards that require renewals or resubmission in the coming weeks. The State Athletic Control Board (SACB) is extending for 30 days all Mixed Martial Arts (MMA), Boxing and Kickboxing licenses including: Pro Boxer; Pro MMA Contestant; Amateur MMA Contestant; Pro Kickboxer; Amateur Kickboxer and Amateur Muay Thai Kickboxer

Effective immediately, DCA is extending by 60 days licenses for Home Improvement Contractor, Home Elevator Contractor, Respiratory Care Practitioner and Product Warrantor that are due for renewal during the March renewal period. Similarly, the following CDS licenses are being extended by 60 days: Analytical Lab; Clinic Narcotic Treatment Center; Dog Handler/Trainer; Animal Shelter; Manufacturer; Wholesale Distributor, and Research Facility. DCA is extending by 30 days licenses for Professional Engineers, Professional Land Surveyors and Professional Engineer & Land Surveyors, which are due for renewal during the April renewal period.

Health

Since the establishment of the Hotline, the NJ Poison Control Center has received 8,623 calls. Yesterday alone, NJPIES received 669 calls.

Today, Governor Murphy, the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management, the New Jersey Department of Health, and the United Ways of New Jersey announced today that NJ 211 has been activated to help handle COVID-19 related calls from New Jersey residents. All residents with questions or concerns about COVID-19 and resources available to them can call 2-1-1. NJ 211 is New Jersey's statewide, comprehensive, information and referral service operated by United Ways of New Jersey.

Residents can also text NJCOVID to 898-211 to receive text information and stay informed. To receive live text assistance, residents can text their zip code to 898-211.

These enhancements to 211 will supplement, rather than replace, the existing COVID-19 hotline, operated by the New Jersey Poison Control Center. State residents with questions about COVID-19 illness can continue to call the previously shared numbers for the COVID-19 hotline, but they can also call 211 to get answers about their COVID-19 questions.

Additionally, the Department of Health has a COVID-19 website with resources including CDC updates, guidance for schools, colleges, businesses, long-term care facilities, health care professionals and public health professionals. The website is available at <https://nj.gov/health/coronavirus>.

Human Services

The Department of Human Services's Division of Family Development will implement the following policies, effective immediately:

- Continue to pay child care providers for an extended period of time encouraged for those required to close by the health department, school district, or county executive related to COVID-19;
- Ensure providers commit to clean at the highest level of disinfection cleaning during this period of time;
- Waive parents/caregivers' child care subsidy co-payments for parents who request it due to impacts from COVID-19;
- Provide child care providers who remain open during this critical time a differential of \$100 per child each month above the state reimbursed rate for children enrolled in the child care subsidy program;
- Compensate providers who remain open even if children are absent due to COVID-19;
- Give extended time to working parents to submit verification of work hours for the initial application process;

- Extend recertification timelines for at least three months in order for child care services to remain open;
- Allow parents or caregivers to continue their child care subsidy if their hours are reduced or if they are laid off due to COVID-19; and
- Make grants available for child care providers who participate in the child care subsidy program, including family child care providers, to clean and sanitize their facility or home; or to purchase additional supplies or services necessary to keeping centers and homes safe and sanitary.

Please find attached a press release from the department providing more detail on the actions taken.

Treasury

In order to protect public health, the Department of the Treasury on Wednesday announced the limited closure of a number of its offices that serve walk-in clientele while divisions work to review and revise existing protocols. The offices are expected to be closed through at least March 31, with an anticipated reopening of April 1. Taxpayers, individuals, and businesses will still be able to access these services online, over the phone, or through the mail during these limited closures. Thank you for the information for the conference call yesterday afternoon with the CDC Foundation. Below is a quick summary of info:

- Monica from the CDC Foundation explained that they currently have several donors willing to donate items – anywhere from manufacturers down to “in-kind” donations.

Dear Senator Gopal,

I just sent you an email inviting you to participate in our research study. In addition to participating in our study, I'm reaching out again in hopes that you can put me and my research team in contact with law enforcement officers working in Monmouth County. My colleague, Kathy Williams (cc'd) suggested I reach out to you for help. She also asked me to forward you a detailed description of our research and what the interview process entails.

In general, we're hoping to learn about officer's professional experiences with violence victims (e.g., responding to calls involving violence, repeated calls to the same address/neighborhood) and their thoughts on violence in the community. Given their experience working closely with the community, we're also interested in their opinions on a new violence prevention program, Project HEAL, that recently launched at Jersey Shore Medical Center's Emergency Department.

Project HEAL works to connect violence victims with services/resources to recover from their injury and prevent retaliatory violence. Given the sensitive population this program serves, we believe that law enforcement officers have unique insight on how to best serve this population and may help identify the potential "roadblocks" this program might face.

Interviews will be conducted virtually through Zoom or by phone call. They last approximately 60 minutes and are audio recorded with the participant's permission.
